REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the Members of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, I beg to submit the following report:

Dear Brethren.—It is with pleasure that I submit this another annual report. These years are fast marking the milestones in our pilgrimage. We are surely made to recognize that we are living in a fast decaying or changing world. Time has put its finger prints upon all earthly things and beings. What we do we must do quickly. The challenges from God's Word are to "Awake," "Go Forward," "Pray the Lord of the harvest," "Bring all the tithes into the storehouse," "Tarry," "Study to show thyself approved unto God." These calls of the Word must be heeded if we stay in our rightful place. God's plan is for victory in every battle. The Church must add to her spiritual powers to be able to meet the world with its hell powers.

I would urge that sane methods be used in all Churches. That Bible doctrines as set forth in our Book of Discipline be taught and practiced, and that more attention be given to the things that are essential.

These are days that the Church needs to be sane, saved, established in holiness, and blessed in order to be able to meet the world's attacks. Logic and reason should be used in presenting the truth, but above all we should have the fire of Pentecost. Paul reasoned of righteousness, temperance and judgment to come.

It has been my pleasure to preach in five revivals and hold the first and last Conferences, as was ordered by the Annual Conference.

Union Church was placed on the Spartanburg charge, and Rev. James Parton was appointed as junior pastor.

Rev. W. E. McIntire was appointed to finish the year for Glendale.

Rev. R. E. Morrison was appointed for Clifton and Gaffney churches, as Rev. L. F. Lance had to resign because of ill health.

Rev. J. M. Merrill was appointed to finish out the year at Providence. Rev. J. E. Simpson was relieved of this work for justifiable causes.

Rev. Clyde Moon was appointed as junior pastor for Williamston Church of the Piedmont Circuit. Rev. W. M. Crymes resigned this work.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

Rev. L. H. Kelley resigned the pastorate of Smith Chapel Church and after some months was reappointed to it after the church agreed to submit to the orders of the Conference. W. A. Garrett was appointed to this church as junior pastor.

Rev. Miss Marie G. Downer's transfer was received from the North Carolina Conference in September.

Rev. L. F. Lance was appointed to do such evangelistic work as his health would permit. Later he was appointed to the Buck Creek Church as pastor.

I recommend that only those preachers be appointed to pastoral work who can qualify according to the disciplinary rules.

REPORT OF MISSIONARY BOARD

We recommend that the President's salary be \$1,350.00 and traveling expenses.

We recommend that the President have general oversight of the work according to our book of Discipline, and that he hold the first and fourth Quarterly Meetings. He is to work in needy churches, or open up work in new fields within the bounds of the Conference. If at any time he should hold meetings outside of the Conference he is to release it from all financial obligation for that period spent elsewhere, unless circumstances warrant such action.

We recommend that our pastors secure Rev. J. M. Hames as their Evangelist as much as possible.

We recommend that all pastors who know of open doors or fruitful fields that can be entered during the year, that they co-operate with the Missionary Board in arranging meetings in such places.

RESOLUTIONS

Resolutions Adopted in 1898

Resolved, 1st. That as a body in Conference assembled, we will not allow our pulpits or churches to be used by those who do not give evidence of being sound in the doctrines of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and true to our polity.

2nd. That as ministers and laymen we will use our best endeavors to prevent the promulgation of doctrines or usages not in accord with the Wesleyan Methodist faith.

Resolutions Adopted in 1905

Resolved, 1st. That the law with regard to complaints or violations of orders and resolutions found on page 37 of our Discipline, and beginning with the words, "When the President," shall apply to all cases of the violators of our Discipline, and no charges shall be entertained by the Judiciary Committee without said previous investigation and labor.

2nd. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

Resolutions Adopted in 1907

Resolved, 1st. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society.

2nd. That we believe that the preaching of Holiness that does not include a clear and distinct opposition to all secret societies is seriously lacking in the essential elements and must be more or less displeasing to God.

3rd. That we believe that the right type of Holiness preaching and teaching is the most effective means by which to induce men to separate themselves from all lodge entanglements; therefore, we will do our best to double our diligence in this line of effort.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

4th. That we affectionately admonish our people to avoid all compromise with secrecy. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday Schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies; furthermore, those belonging to secret orders shall not be allowed to hold services in our churches.

5th. That we seriously urge upon all our brethren and sisters that they may be careful to maintain a consistent, but radical, attitude of opposition to all organizations, secret or open, which are opposed to Jesus Christ and His doctrine and principles of righteousness.

Resolutions Adopted in 1914

Resolved, 1st. That all of our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work be required to preach at least once a month, or twelve times during the Conference year.

2nd. That in addition to the above resolution, we earnestly request all preachers not receiving a regular appointment by the Conference, except those attending school preparatory to the ministry, to hold, if possible, a two weeks' revival during the year.

3rd. That all preachers unemployed by the Conference during the coming year be urged to select a fellow-laborer with whom they can work harmoniously, and go out and try to build up new works as they may have opportunity, and revive the desert places.

4th. That in order that the foregoing resolutions may have the greatest effect possible, and that each preacher may have a higher estimation of the dignity of his calling, and that the burden for souls may be increased, and that they may feel the sympathy of the Church to which they belong, we urge each charge to pass like resolutions.

5th. That it is not only the duty, but binding on each Circuit preacher of our Conference, to receive whomsoever the Conference may designate as Quarterly Meeting Evangelist, and give him their hearty support and co-operation.

Resolution Adopted in 1919

Be it Resolved, That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.

Resolutions Adopted in 1921

Regarding the Orphanage

Resolved, 1st. That we as a Conference continue W. D. Correll as Committeeman until next Annual Conference; also to act as Manager of the institution from this Conference.

2nd. That we meet the balance of \$7,000 on the purchase price of the property. We suggest that \$1.00 per member be asked for throughout the Conference, for 1924.

3rd. That a Committee of two be elected to associate with W. D. Correll as Committeemen.

4th. That this Committee appoint such financial agents or agent as necessary to carry on this work throughout the Conference, and that said agents be secured on such terms as can be agreed thereon by Committee and agents.

5th. That a special effort be made between now and the first of January by the pastors and Financial Agents to collect the amount subscribed during this Conference, and to add to it, if possible, thereby saving interest and deferred payments.

6th. That the Conference Treasurer handle all cash and receipts on both the up-keep and the purchased price of the Orphanage; and that the produce be sent directly to Miss Bettie Tyler.

Resolved, That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.

Resolutions Adopted in 1923

Resolved, 1st. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.

2nd. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided this shall not interfere with previous arrangements between pastor and charge.

Resolution Adopted in 1926

Resolved, That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.
