JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

. The California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America met for its Thirty-fourth Annual Session in the auditorium of Azusa College, Azusa, California, at 9:00 A.M., June 23, 1958.

The Conference President, Rev. Sherwood Eddy, 1ed the devotions. He read from Exodus 14:10-16 and challenged our faith to not look at obstacles but to look to the Lord and go forward.

The roll was called. Ellen Boudreaux and Roy Mc-Gowan were seated in place of delegates who were absent.

The front nine rows of seats in the auditorium and the platform were constituted the bar of Conference.

The Agenda Committee read its report. It was amended. It was adopted as amended. See Report No. 1.

The Denominational Representative, Rev. 0.G.Wilson, was seated within the bar.

Orval Butcher, Clinton Jones, John Henley, Elzie Gordon, Max Trayer and William Marshburn were elected on the Nominating Committee. The Committee retired for Committee work.

James Judy was elected to act as secretary.

A motion was made and seconded that a wheelchair be provided for Bro. Henley for the Conference Session. The motion prevailed.

The report of the Missionary Board was read by Richard Rossow. The report was adopted with thanks. See Report No. 2.

The report of the Camp Meeting Board was read by Archy Mudgett. The report was adopted with thanks. See Report No. 3. The Sunday School Secretary gave an oral report. He represented the Conference at two Sunday School Conventions, expressed appreciation for the Thanksgiving offering and urged attendance at the Greater Los Angeles Sunday School Convention, September 18, 19, 20, 1958, at Long Beach. A Sunday School traffic lifht has been purchased for the use of the Sunday Schools. The rental is \$1.00 per month. The report was adopted with appreciation for his work.

A motion prevailed that Myrtle Shadwick, Secretary of Child Evangelism, give her report. Miss Shadwick announced the date and place of Junior Youth Camp, August 4-9; the need for three more workers and the blessing youth camp provides for the children of the Junior Department. The report was adopted.

A motion prevailed that the agenda be changed to include in the session the report of the Burial Association Secretary. The Burial Association Secretary gave an oral report. All members of the church are eligible and urged to become members of the Association. The report was adopted.

Conference recessed to meet at the ringing of the bell.

The meeting was called to order.

The Committee on Nominations read a report. It was amended and adopted as amended. See Report No. 4.

The President nominated Phil Mauldin, Ruth Henley and Gwen Whitted to serve on the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders. They were elected.

The Vice President took the chair.

The Conference President read his report. It was adopted with a rising vote of thanks. See Report No. 5.

The President resumed the chair.

The Conference Board of Trustees gave its report. It was adopted. See Report No. 6.

The Courtesy Committee introduced Rev. and Mrs. L. W. Melton.

A motion was made and seconded that Standing Rule 21 be amended to read "Pastor's Statistical Reports shall be read and then posted". Elzie Gordon led the devotions reading James 3.

The roll was called.

The minutes were read and approved.

The Tithing Secretary, Orval Butcher, gave an oral report. It was adopted.

The Educational Secretary, Pauline Ludwig, gave an oral report telling of presenting the interests of Miltonvale College at different places during the year and urging everyone to become an honorary member of Miltonvale College. It was adopted.

The Card Call Secretary, James Judy, called attention to the percentage of Card Call subscribers compared to the total Conference Membership and urged everyone to join the Card Call Plan. It was adopted.

The member of the Board of Trustees of Miltonvale College, Rev. Eddy, reported on the meeting of the Board of Trustees and told of the encouraging outlook and plans for Miltonvale Wesleyan College. It was accepted.

The Promotional Secretary of Wesleyan Men, Malcolm Robertson, gave an oral report. It was adopted.

A motion carried to have a Conference Historian and that Sue Spisak be elected to that office for the coming year,

A motion carried to adjourn to meet at the call of the chair.

Keith McRoberts led the devotions reading Eccl.9: 7-10 and emphazing "whatsoever your hand findeth to do, do it with all thy might". The roll was called.

A motion carried to reconsider the action taken yesterday in the seating of delegates. The motion was amended that Jack Spencer, Hilda Mason and Luther Emery be seated as delegated. The motion as amended was carried.

The minutes were read and accepted.

The Auditing Committee gave its report. It was adopted. See Report No. 7.

The Camp Meeting Treasurer read his report. It was adopted. See Report No. 8.

The Pension Plan Treasurer read his report. A motion carried to take an offering to make up the deficit in the Pension Plan Budget. A motion carried to accept the report as amended. See Report No. 9.

The Conference Treasurer was given an honorary seat within the bar. The Conference Treasurer gave his report. It was adopted. See Report No. 10.

The Committee on Ministerial Character read its report. It was adopted. See Report No. 11.

The Transportation Secretary gave an oral report. It was adopted.

The Denominational Representative, Rev. O.G.Wilson, was asked to take the chair during the election of officers.

James Judy and DeVere Wilson were appointed distributing tellers and Richard Rossow and Keith McRoberts were appointed canvassing tellers.

A motion carried that the first ballot for Conference President be a nominating ballot.

Clinton Jones received a majority of ballots cast for Conference President and was declared elected. Archy Mudgett received a majority of ballots cast for Conference Vice-President and was declared elected. Archy Mudgett tendered his resignation with regrets. It was accepted.

The following officers were elected by ballot for their respective offices:

Arthur Depew was elected Treasurer of the Pension Plan.

The Nominating Committee read a report. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report with the amendment that Keith McRoberts be the nominee for the Missionary Board. A motion carried that the item on the Commission on Child Evangelism be referred back to the Nominating Committee. The motion to accept, as amended, was carried. See Report No. 12.

At the evening service at 7:30 P.M. in the Arrow Highway church the installation of Conference officers for the coming year was held. Also at this service Rev. O. G. Wilson, the Denominational Representative, gave the Denominational Address, calling our attention to some of the perils endangering the church, the progress made in reaching the goal for the new international headquarters building and other of the accomplishments of the church.

The Nominating Committee recommended that the Commission on Child Evangelism be discontinued and that the work of Child Evangelism be carried on under direction of the Sunday School Board according to paragraph 331 of the Discipline. The recommendation was adopted.

The President nominated Keith McRoberts and William Marshburn on the Advisory Board. They were elected.

The Courtesy Committee introduced Mr. John Wright, of the Skyline Church, and Dr. Fred Ross, President of the Southern California Holiness Association.

A partial report of the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders was read. A motion was made and seconded to adopt the report. The first five items were voted on and adopted. The sixth item was also adopted by a separate action. See Report No. 13.

In answer to an invitation from Azusa College to elect members on the Board of Trustees of Azusa College, the following was approved as Standing Rule 25: "The Conference shall elect annually two members to serve on the Board of Trustees of Azusa College."

A motion carried to ask the Missionary Board to edit the Standing Rules and present them at the next annual conference for approval.

Recessed to meet at the call of the chair.

Continuation of the Fourth Meeting.

DeVere Wilson led the devotional period.

The Statistical Committee read its report. It was adopted. See Report No. 14.

The Itineracy and Elder's Orders Committee gave a partial report. It was adopted. See Report No. 15.

The Finance Committee read its report. A motion was made and seconded to adopt the report. A motion carried to amend Item 7 to read that the "500" Plan be under the supervision of the Missionary Board. The amended report was adopted. See Report No. 16.

Recessed for Committee work.

FIFTH MEETING, Thursday A.M.

The Wesleyan Conference Youth Waiters sang for us during the opening of the meeting.

The roll was called.

The minutes were read and accepted.

The Nominating Committee nominated Archy Mudgett and Sherwood Eddy as members of the Board of Trustees of Azusa College. They were elected.

The Memorials Committee read its report. It was accepted. See Report No. 17.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations read its report. It was adopted. See Report No. 18.

A motion carried that there be included in the report of the Finance Committee that the Conference President's salary be established at \$40.00 per week and that the President be allowed 6¢ per mile for travel expense.

A motion carried that the General Conference Expense Fund Budget be 50¢ per member.

A motion carried to adjourn sine die after the reading of the minutes with any unfinished business left in the hands of the President and his Advisory Board. The minutes were read and corrected.

An ordination service was held Thursday night, June 26, 1958, in the Arrow Highway church, at which time William G. Butcher and Bud B. Jillson were ordained elders in the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. The ordination sermon was preached by Rev. O. G. Wilson. He read from John 17:1-9 and spoke of the pastor's preparation, the pastor in his parish, the pastor's message, the pastor in prayer and the pastor and his work.

STANDING RULES

1. The Conference shall convene at the call of the Chair. The President shall announce the date of its meeting sufficient time before the opening in conformity with the Denominational Board.

2. As soon as possible after the last Quarterly Meeting on each charge the pastor shall forward the Delegate's credentials to the Conference Secretary. The Secretary shall then compile the roll of Conference to be ready for the opening of each session.

3. The quorum of this Conference shall be twentyfive per cent of its possible enrollment. Ministerial or lay members of the Conference must not leave the bar of Conference without consent of the chair, nor withdraw from the Conference session permanently without consent of the Conference.

4. The Conference shall elect a Nominating Committee which shall bring in nominations for Sessions Committees as early in the first meeting as possible and nominations for Standing Committees at the time of election of Conference officers.

5. All recommendations to study, to travel, to receive Elders' Orders or to be received on credentials shall be handed to the secretary as early as possible and he shall pass them to the proper committee without vote of the Conference.

6. Pastors shall not drop any of their appointments without consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

7. All charges shall pay the moving expenses of the incoming pastor within the bounds of the Conference.

8. While we believe in and will practice ministerial courtesies yet it is the sense of this Conference that our churches shall not be opened to other denominations to maintain a regular appointment as such is likely to scatter the flock.

STANDING RULES (Cont.)

. 9. It shall be the duty of the pastors to see that all property is properly insured. Failing to do so the Conference will do it and in event of fire collect the monies.

10. No person making application for membership on letters of dismissal shall be received until impediments in the way of granting a letter of good standing shall have been removed by proper adjustment.

11. The fiscal year of the Conference shall close May 31 each year and the Conference Treasurer shall close the Conference books on that day. The local Treasurers shall close their books at the same time and have their statistical reports made out and in the hands of the Statistical Committee at least five days before Conference. Each church shall pay salary to the outgoing pastor for two Sundays following adjournment of the Annual Conference. Any arrangement contrary to this rule shall be cleared with the Conference President and his Advisory Board.

12. Examinations on the Course of Study shall be taken before an Elder of the Conference unless permission is obtained from the chairman of the Committee on Itineracy and Elders' Orders to do otherwise.

13. The President and his Advisory Board and the Board of Trustees are to be the Board on Church and Parsonage Location and Plans.

14. The President and his Advisory Board are designated as a Deed Examining Committee for the Conference. When deeds to Conference, Church or Parsonage property are received, before being recorded, they shall be submitted to this committee for examination and the insertion of such disciplinary clauses as necessary to make the property safe for the Conference.

15. The Agenda Committee for the Conference shall be composed of the President, the Vice-president, the Secretary, the President of the Women's Missionary Society and the President of the Conference Wesleyan Youth.

STANDING RULES (Cont.)

16. All pastors are required to subscribe to THE WESLEYAN METHODIST and the WESLEYAN MISSIONARY.

17. The Conference Secretary and Treasurer shall each be reimbursed to the amount of \$50.00 for each year's labor:

18. Each church shall adopt and practice the store-house tithing plan as set forth in the Bible and Discipline.

19. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of four elders, elected in rotation for a term of four years each, and two laymen, elected in rotation for a term of four years each, with the President of the Conference, the President of the Women's Missionary Society and the President of the Wesleyan Young People's Society members ex-officio.

20. The Camp Meeting Committee is empowered to employ evangelistic help up to and including three years in advance.

21. Pastors shall read the following items of the Statistical Report with the time limited to five minutes for the reading of each report:

22. The Missionary Board shall be composed of the Conference President, the W.M.S. President, the Wesleyan Youth President, the Conference Treasurer, one elected member and the Conference Board of Trustees. All Church Extension as to location, planning, policy and promotion shall be under the direction of this Board.

23. All officers, Boards and Standing Committees shall take office as soon as elected except the Statistical and Auditing Committees, whose term of office shall be from the rise of the Conference in which they are elected until the rise of the following conference.

24. It shall be the duty of each pastor to get his Progress Report in the mail by the 5th of each month. All others under Conference appointment shall report to the Conference President monthly.

25. The Conference shall elect annually two members to serve on the Board of Trustees of Azusa College.
