The Allegheny Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its ninetieth session in the Wesley Methodist Episcopal Church, 311 Eighth Street, S. W., Massillon, Ohio, at 9:00 A. M., June 7, 1933. The Massillon Wesleyan Methodist Church, Elder H. A. Markell, Pastor, entertaining the Conference. Conference was called to order by president A. L. White. Devotional, President Emeritus, P. B. Campbell. Singing, "Love Divine." Prayer by D. B. Hampe. Scripture, I Cor. 13. Remarks, sketching his service in Allegheny Conference. 18 Elders were present in whose Ordination Brother Campbell had assisted.

Recessed at close of Conference Sermon for Committee work.

Third Day, June 9—Friday A. M.

Called to order at 8:30 by president, at close of early morning Fast and Prayer service led by Sister Moyer. Singing, "In the Cross."

Roll Call: 26 Elders, 12 Conference Preachers, 26 Delegates.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Committee Meeting called by Elder P. B. Campbell. Committee consisted of Elders and Conference Preachers of the Conference. Committee discussed matter of division of opinion as to teaching concerning "Consecration" as applied to Regeneration and Sanctification. Voted to withhold a decision in the matter until convening of Stoneboro Camp, at which time evidence might be presented in substantiation of each position. Agreement was unanimous to abide by the predominance of Biblical and Wesleyan evidence presented. Each Elder and Conference Preacher in the meantime to thoroughly inform himself on this subject.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. Evangelists shall, in their reports, make a statement of the amount of salary received.

2. A Committee on Auditing and Finance of not less than three shall be elected, to which all action regarding disbursements of funds, except missionary, shall be referred.

3. We advise our pastors and people to make special effort to get persons saved, sanctified and brought into church membership during quarterly meetings.

4. The order and manner of electing trustees shall be the same in local churches as it is and has been in our Annual Conference, namely, to include a series of years in keeping with the number of Trustees.

5. We advise our elders and Conference preachers to observe the Lord's Supper on quarterly meeting occasions immediately proceeding the preaching at that time.

6. All persons received into membership in the churches of our Conference, excepting those whose life of Christian fidelity has been of sufficient long standing, shall be received at first as associate members only.

7. When it becomes necessary for any church to call a pastor, it shall be the duty of the calling church to make provision for the expense

the pastor incurs in removing to the new field of labor. Money raised for this purpose shall not be applied on the pastor's salary.

8. The Conference Sunday shall be the closing Sunday of the Conference year, and the outgoing pastor shall be paid his salary for that Sunday by the charge he is leaving.

9. The Conference President will be expected to direct the attention of each Quarterly Conference attended to the various interests of the Church, including the Conference Budget, Church Extension, Missions, Education, and Sunday School work, and to stimulate interest in our Church Literature, especially the Wesleyan Methodist. In the general financial program of the Conference he will be expected to give such oversight and assistance as may be needed to develop every arm of the work.

10. At the opening of the Conference Session the President shall appoint a Nominating Committee of not less than three members, two elders and one layman, to bring to the Conference a slate of Nominations for Committees, etc. for the Conference Temporary Organization. Delegate's Credentials shall be mailed to the Conference Secretary not later than ten days before convening of Conference.

REPORTS

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the Allegheny Annual Conference now assembled, greeting!

Only thru the abounding grace and Mercy of God are we privileged to assemble in this ninetyeth session. The year just past has witnessed the collapse of well organized principles and enterprises designed to serve the mortal needs and tastes of men. More and more do we find that the only principle of abiding worth is the principle of Divine Love. Thrice happy are we who are sustained by and in this unfailing Treasure. Without it the millionaire is poor indeed.

Furthermore, we are rich in the heritage of our spiritual forbears. Ninety years of faithful toiling, conflicts and tears have made Allegheny Conference a very potent factor in shaping the policies and spiritual life of our Wesleyanism. The last forty years especially have been signally successful in this respect, as a number of living witnesses could testify. During these years sound policies of leadership have been fashioned and practical spirituality has been kept to the front.

We are passing through a period of distress, but we "have not yet resisted unto blood" as did the church fathers. Every emergency of the past, in our Conference life, has been successfully met with a courage bold, and by God's help we will not falter now. The toil and tears of those who have wrought before us, many with armor laid down and others yet living, will not admit of retrenchment nor compromise. We dare not desecrate the trust reposed in us, but press the battle on with renewed vigor. If ever we needed concentration of effort and unity of operation with the golden chords of love to keep us true to God and our fellow travelers to eternity, it is now. Let every deliberation of this Conference be with a view to that end. May our spirits unite at once in an unselfish resolve to enact co-operative measures looking toward the best year in our history!

1. During the year the Lord has called home Elder I. A. Grise. Let us arrange for a fitting memorial service.

2. **Stoneboro Camp:** Camp meeting of 1932 was considered by many an outstanding session. Evangelists Whitecotton and Wise were mightily used by the Holy Spirit in proclaiming God's eternal truth, and many souls bowed at the altar of prayer. The Young People's meetings also witnessed many demonstrations of convicting, converting and sanctifying power. Our very efficient Superintendent of Children's and Young People's meetings, Mary E. McLeister, loved and appreciated for many years in this capacity, has been called to her reward. We suggest that her name be referred to the Committee on Memoirs.

3. We have preached during the year in nearly every church in the Conference and held many extra business sessions. We have carefully observed the labors of all our splendid pastors, and greatly rejoice with them in the many excellent revivals that have marked the year as one of special accomplishment.

Official Acts

4. Authorization to administer the Sacraments granted to: Erwin Enty, Harold Webb, T. A. Robertson, C. A. West, T. W. Comadoll, A. F. Mahler and Rex Brickell.

5. Received by letter of transfer: Elder Geo. B. Clay, from the Ohio Conference.

6. Granted to Elder David Anderson a letter of transfer to the Lockport Conference, and to Elder Hulbert Marvin a letter of transfer to the Nazarene church.

7. (1) Received the church letters of John L. and Beulah Landrey, local preachers from the Michigan Conference of the Free Methodist church, and in July appointed them pastors of the Rochester church. (2) Accepted resignation of Elsie E. Moyer as pastor of East Springfield and East Conneaut charges, and in August appointed Elder Geo. B. Clay to these pastorates. (3) Harbor church community having been somewhat revived last fall we asked Sister Myrtle Crosby to look after the work. (4) Appointed Mrs. Lillie Merrifield to look after the interests of Canal Church on Sugar Creek charge. (5) Approved the release of Noah R. Shaffer from the Dixonville charge, and because of his call to Erie, appointed him to fill out the unexpired year of David Anderson whose release from the Erie work we had granted.

8. **Pioneer Work:** (1) In spite of restricted finances there has been marked development in the pioneer field. A number of real prospects are knocking at our door, and several new churches are in the process of formation. The opportunities before us are many, and we should give this department very special attention. (2) On May 9th we organized a church of 35 members in the North East suburb of Canton, Ohio, received the church into the Conference and appointed Sister Sarah Redding the pastor. The outlook here is very bright. (3) Owing to the fact that Annandale church may still be considered in a pioneer state, and owing to their inability to pay even interest on their building indebtedness, and owing further to their faithfulness in offerings to Conference Missions and Self Denial, we granted them until further notice the privilege of retaining said offerings to apply on their indebtedness.

Recommendations

9. We recommend the following as a standing resolution: "All persons recommended to Conference to study or travel shall be made members of Conference only when given employment.

10. **Self Denial.** In the Self Denial work, which has amply proven its worth already, there is great need of a simplified plan made adaptable to any church; one that will reach the church members and others as well, and not require constant public announcement. The plan outlined by Wm. Leyshon, Supt. of New Castle Sunday School, and used by that School, has been very successful. We believe it to be the ideal method. We therefore recommend that this plan be adopted by the Conference.

An outline and description of the plan will be found on the bulletin board, and if adopted, samples will be furnished every Sunday School of the Conference.

11. Budget Tabulation. In tabulation of budget we recommend that a new column be inserted between "Membership" and the yearly apportionment of "Undivided Budget," and be given this heading: "Monthly Undivided Budget." Also, that these words be printed below tabulation: "Let each pastor endeavor to raise their Conference Budget each Month."

12. Home Missions. (1) We recommend that in all general Missionary meetings Home Missions be given equal representation with Foreign Missions, when possible, and provision be made for offerings to same. (2) We also recommend that the Sunday School offerings to Conference Missions be retained for Conference use. Provided, however, that when and if the offerings from other sources to Connectional Home Missions do not equal 50 cents per Conference Member, the Missionary Board shall be authorized to order out of the Conference Missions fund any amount up to one fourth of its year's receipts to more fully balance the Home Missions Budget.

13. Local Church Finances. We recommend that Conference ask every church, where practical, to adopt an envelope system for church offerings, one side of envelope for Pastor's salary and incidental expenses, and the other side for Conference Undivided Budget. And where such a system is not advisable, we recommend that small coin envelopes, properly stamped, be provided for weekly budget offerings. By either method provision is made for consistent payment of Conference Budget in amounts that will not be missed, and might otherwise be lost to good use.

14. Plan on Conference President's Salary and Division of Conference Budget. (1) We recommend that Conference ask all pastors to divide their tithe. Half to be retained for personal distribution and half to be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer to be applied on President's salary. These offerings to be forwarded with Conference Budget, but reported separately as "Pastor's Tithe," and credited to President's salary on statistical report. Provided, however, that pastors receiving from all sources \$10.00 cash or less per week be permitted to retain all their tithe if they so desire. (2) Contingent upon adoption of above recommendation, we further recommend that the Conference Budget be divided as follows: For Superannuated Ministers' fund, 30%; for Ministers' Aid fund, 20%; for all other purposes, 50%.

15. Finances. From Treasurer on last year's salary, \$60.29. On present year; from charges, \$900.99; from Treasurer, \$465.47; Total, \$1366.46. Expenses: Traveling, \$217.94; Postage and printing, \$11.57; Part on telephone, \$8.00; Lock Box, \$3.30; Total, \$240.81. Net receipts on salary, \$1125.65. Salary in arrears, \$464.35.
