ITINERACY AND ORDERS COMMITTEE

We, your Committee on Itineracy and Orders, beg leave to submit the following report:

We have carefully considered the several candidates which have been brought to our attention according to the disciplinary requirements which direct the actions of this committee. The results of these considerations are hereby given, in three different groups, according to the candidate's compliance with disciplinary standards, in the Course of Study or under Conference direction.

I. Those recommended to be received or continued only for study, no licenses being granted:

We recommend that Leslie D. Smith and Lester Meyers, having been duly recommended by the Watford City Quarterly Conference, be received to study, preparatory to travelling under the direction of the Conference.

We recommend that Lawrence Countryman be continued in the studies of the first year.

We recommend that George Robbins be continued in the fourth year of study.

We recommend that Ben Findlay be received to continue his studies of the second year.

II. Those recommended for licenses, or renewal of such:

We recommend that Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Calhoon, L. L. Knapp, F. J. Traver, and A. C. Buell be continued in the studies of the first year and that their licenses be renewed.

We recommend that Isla Knight, having been recommended by the Aberdeen Quarterly Conference as a suitable person to travel under the direction of the Annual Conference, be licensed and placed in the studies of the first year.

III. Those having met sufficient standards for authorization by this Conference in the three following items: (1) Ordinary voting in the Conference, (2) Administering the Sacraments, (3) Solemnizing matrimony.

We recommend that Wayne Cretsinger and Chester Reed be continued in the second year of study, and their licenses be renewed.

We recommend that Allen Regan be advanced to the third year of study and that his license be renewed.

We recommend that Marvin Jones be placed in the studies of the third year and that a license be granted to him.

We recommend that Mrs. Laura Raymer be advanced to the studies of the fourth year and that her license be renewed.

We recommend that Hazel Carter be continued in the fourth year of study and that her license be renewed.

IV. Election to Elder's Orders:

We recommend that George Thomas, having in the mind of the committee met the disciplinary requirements, be elected to Elder's Orders at this session of Conference.

Motion prevailed that Rev. F. R. Eddy be chosen to deliver the ordination sermon.

V. We most urgently request that the books for the examiners and the reading books for the candidates, be immediately purchased, as has been and still is demanded by a standing order of the Conference, and that they be placed in the care of the Conference Secretary for distribution, (the reading books) according to the plan before passed upon (a charge of ten cents and postage being collected from the candidate).

SPECIAL REPORT ON MINISTERIAL RELIEF FUND

We, your Committee, recommend that the following be substituted for the present by-laws:

Purpose—To provide financial assistance for Elders and Conference Preachers in times of serious illness or death in their families.

The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive funds and disburse them according to by-laws.

Each minister on the Conference roll shall be assessed one dollar on due notice from the Secretary, excepting both husband and wife are preachers. In such case, only one is assessed. Each pastor shall collect one dollar from his church or charge each time an assessment is made.

The secretary shall, on receipt of the worthiness of a case, pay out of said fund forty per cent of the amount of the expense incurred, provided the expense is more than twenty dollars, and furthermore providing that no payment shall exceed fifty dollars. (Normal maternity cases excepted.)

Members who are delinquent in the payment of the last two assessments prior to claims for help shall be ineligible.

In case the Secretary is in doubt as to the worthiness of a case he shall advise with the Conference President.

Postage and necessary expense shall be deducted from said funds.
