Motion carried that all unfinished business be referred to Conference President and his Advisory Board.

PERMANENT RESOLUTIONS

- 1. All Trustees of the Oklahoma Conference shall reside within the bounds of said Conference.
- 2. When a pastor provides his own place of residence, all rent from the regular parsonage shall be paid to said pastor.
- 3. The Conference Treasurer shall close his books one week before the opening day of Conference and all money received after that time shall be applied on next year's business.
- 4. The Conference Trustees shall be the Committee on Church and Parsonage Location.
- 5. The Committee on Religious Services shall consist of the Conference President and two Elders, chosen by the Nominating Committee, and their Delegates-elect.
- 6. We recommend that the following orders of business be observed in our Annual Conference sessions:

Tuesday, 3:00 p. m.—Conference convenes.

Tuesday evening—Conference sermon.

Wednesday—Election of officers.

Thursday—Examination of characters.

Friday—Reports of Committees.

Saturday—W. Y. P. S.

- 7. A Nominating Committee be elected, composed of three Elders: one of which shall be the President of the Conference as Chairman exofficio, and the Delegates-elect from two churches designated by the Conference. This committee shall: First, examine the credentials of all Delegates to the Annual Conference. Second, nominate all session committees, not already provided for, and be prepared to report at the first meeting of Conference.
- 8. The Conference fiscal year shall end the second Sunday before the opening day of Conference, and all statistical reports shall be based on monies received up to and including that date. Budget funds should then be sent immediately to the Conference Treasurer.
- 9. Two copies of each written report shall be given to the Secretary of the Conference. These shall be typewritten and double spaced.

Emphasis at this Conference shall be given to spiritual quickening, edification, and fellowship. This committee shall also plan for the coming together of the pastors and their wives, and all interested laymen, for a time of Prayer and Fasting in the interest of the Oklahoma *Conference.

- 12. Conference shall convene annually on the Tuesday following the first Monday of August.
- 13. In the case of a change of pastors, the outgoing pastor shall be paid a salary for the two Sundays of Conference and Camp.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

We submit the following report:

- 1. We recommend that 5% of the CASH DISBURSEMENTS paid for all purposes by each local charge and the TITHE OF THE PASTOR'S CASH SALARY paid through the local church treasurer, be paid to the Conference Treasurer monthly for Conference President's Salary and Church Extension. This fund to be known as the Conference Enlargement Fund.
- 2. That the Conference President's salary be set at \$50.00 per week plus four cents per mile for use of car. He shall be paid for time served in the Conference.
- 3. Since the Conference Trustees have made provisions for a Conference President's Home we recommend the following: That each local church be responsible for the following amounts: Alva, \$123.00; Blackwell, \$50.00; Carwile, \$25.00; Etna, \$35.00; New Hope, \$50.00; Oklahoma City, \$15.00; Ponca City, \$100.00; Cedar Grove, \$50.00; Enid, \$200.00; and Wesleyan Chapel, \$75.00. Let each church respond to this as soon as possible.
- That the Conference Secretary and the Conference Treasurer be paid \$10.00 each for services rendered.
- 5. That the Conference Sunday School Secretary be paid \$6.00 from the Conference General Fund for Promotion Work. Also that an offering be taken for the Sunday School Secretary for expense by each charge visited.
- We recommend the following to be known as Budget Items to be figured according to the members reported in the 1948 report.
 - (a) General Budget: Foreign Missions, \$2.00; Home Missions, \$1.00; Education, \$2.00; Superannuated Ministers' Fund, \$1.50; Orphanage, 25 cents; Administrative Budget, 25 cents; General Conference Travel and Entertainment, 20 cents.
 - (b) Conference Budget: Conference General Fund, \$1.30; Conference Extension, \$1.50.
 - (c) Connectional Sunday School Assessment 5 cents per member based on total members in main school.
 - (d) That the plan of 5% of all cash disbursements paid by the local church, and Pastor's tithe, (see Item I) be a budget item, no budget being considered as paid in full, until this is met.
- 7. That all Conference and General Evangelists who are members of the Oklahoma Conference shall pay at least one-half of the tithe of their cash salary to the local church where they hold their membership.

8. We recommend for our churches as a general financial plan the Scriptural Storehouse Plan of Tithing as instructed in Mal. 3:10. Let each pastor be diligent in presenting this on his charge.

2. That dues be \$1.00 per member a year, each Society remitting quarterly to the Conference W. Y. P. S. Treasurer. The dues to be divided as follows: 50 cents per member a year for Connectional W. Y. P. S. and 50 cents per member a year for Conference W. Y. P. S.

3. That the W. Y. P. S. Conference Fund (50 cents per member) be-

distributed by vote of the Executive Council.

- 4. That each Society have at least one subscription to the Card Call Plan of the Home Missionary Department of the Church for every ten members or fraction thereof.
- 5. That each Society raise 50 cents per member for a Youth Worker at the Annual Camp Meeting.
- 6. That every Society take one offering per month for Foreign Missions.

Report No. 2 COMMITTEE ON GOALS AND METHODS

We recommend:

- 1. That each member of the W. Y. P. S. be assured of the Spirit as to their acceptance of God, and they heed the admonition in Romans 12: 2, "Be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God."
- 2. That there be an organized Society, with certificate of organization, on every charge.
- 3. That one evening each quarter be designated as a definite time for prayer and fasting and at this time a self-denial offering be taken, equal to the amount of the meal.
- 4. That the local President of each Society be responsible for promoting the following:
- a. That the youth become better acquainted with the Wesleyan doctrine by setting aside a definite time to study the Discipline and the

Wesleyan Catechism, and that special emphasis be placed on the study of the constitution and by-laws of the W. Y. P. S.

- b. That each Society through its Devotional and Program Committees endeavor this next year to create greater enthusiasm by membership drives and contests, and that we extend a sincere welcome to all visitors and friends.
- c. That each member be a subscriber to the Wesleyan Youth and that we strive to attain the goal of 100 subscriptions. Also that each member support our other church periodicals.
- 5. That our young people take advantage of our Church schools in preference to other schools and that we make use of the W. Y. P. S. Student Loan Fund. Loans to be recommended by the Student's pastor and paid by the Conference W. Y. P. S. Treasurer after consultation with the Executive Committee. Interest on the W. Y. P. S. Loan is 4%.
- 6. That there be a youth rally in every church in the Conference, and an endeavor made for quarterly district rallies in each district this year.

We further recommend that the Conference W. Y. P. S. President be invited to attend these rallies and that his transportation shall be paid at the rate of four cents per mile.

- 7. That each Committee Chairman prepare two copies of their report. These reports to be typewritten and double-spaced.
- 8. That all recommendations made by the Committees of the W. Y. P. S. Conference be read and studied at the beginning of the Conference year by each local Society.
