Journal of Daily Proceedings

Opening—The forty-second session of the Oklahoma Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America assembled on the Free Methodist Campground at Perkins, Oklahoma at 2:00 P. M., Wednesday, August 8, 1945 with the president, Rev. Glen C. Cockrell, in the chair.

The service opened with songs led by Rev. James Harris. Brother J. M. Batman and C. L. Cummings offered prayer after which devotions were led by Rev. W. C. Brannon. The Scripture text was from the sixth chapter of the Book of Acts.

The roll was called and answered by eight Elders and five Annual Conference Preachers.

Credentials—LaVerne Tolle and C. L. Cummings were elected the Committee on Credentials. The names of the following delegates-elect were read and by vote were seated together with all who should later present credentials to this body. Enid—Mary Croft, C. L. Cummings, Mrs. Florence Atkinson, Robert W. Atkinson; Alva—LaVerne Tolle, Mrs. Mattie Fisher; New Hope—Mrs. Brogleman; Wesleyan Chapel—Mrs. Alice Harris; Blackwell—Mrs. Bessie Moore; Oklahoma City—Goldie Mae Sheldon; Ponca City—Ira Hickman; Cedar Grove—Mrs. Fred Hada.

Conference Bar—On motion the first four rows of seats and the platform were made the Conference Bar.

Committee on Courtesy—Sister Effie Ross and Brother Robert Atkinson were elected Committee on Courtesy by vote of the Conference body.

Report—The Courtesy Committee presented Rev. Roy S. Nicholson, our Connectional Editor from Syracuse, N. Y. and Camp Evangelist to the Conference body. He brought words of greeting and testimony and at the request of the Conference body, by vote, he took the chair for the remainder of the Conference session.

Report—The Courtesy Committee presented Rev. and Mrs. W. C. Brannon, new members of the Oklahoma Conference and formerly of the Dakota Conference. Both gave words of testimony.

Nominating Committee—The report of the Nominating Committee was read and on motion with its support was adopted.

Motion made and supported that permanent rule on election of officers be suspended and the election of officers be set for Thursday afternoon immediately after devotions.—Carried.

Motion made and supported that the Connectional address be Thursday, August ,9 1945 at 11:15 P. M. Carried.

Motion made, supported and adopted that the remainder of the permanent resolutions be followed as recorded in the minutes with all business being completed by Friday evening.

Committee on Special Religious Services was voted to be Glen C.

Cockrell and James Harris to work with the Free Methodist Committee.

Motion made to meet at 9:00 a. m. each morning to adjourn on motion after announcement by the chair as to time of meeting in the afternoon sessions. Adopted.

Report-Rev. Glen C. Cockrell, president of the Conference, gave his report and on motion with its support the part on official acts was adopted.

H. V. Brannon, Christie Stites, and Ira Hickman were elected tellers for the election of officials.

Motion supported and carried to adjourn for committee work. Benediction by Rev. James Harris.

THURSDAY MORNING

Opening-Songs were led by Rev. James Harris. Prayer and Devotions, II Cor. 1 and 12, by Rev. Pinkerton. Roll was called and minutes read and approved.

Courtesy Report-Sister Grace Davis, returned Missionary from Africa of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, and Sisters Vanderhoofeun, Mattox, Watkins, Catron, and Cooper of the Free Methodist Church were presented to the Conference body. Each gave words of testimony.

Motion-made, supported, and carried to refer the latter from the Secretary of the Oklahoma Free Methodist Church to unite with them in a joint Camp and Conference at Perkins in 1946 to the Camp Meeting Committee.

Report-On motion with its support the report of the Committee on Resolutions was adopted.

Motion-made, supported and carried that this Conference adopt the petition to the next General Conference to change the name of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America to the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

THE RESOLUTION IN FORM:

RESOLVED, that the Oklahoma Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America, in session this 9th day of August, 1945, hereby petitions the General Conference next to be held in June 1947, that since,

The Word "Connection" in the church name has ceased to have a clear meaning and is burdensome in legal papers,

Therefore, we do petition the General Conference to change the name of the denomination to read "The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America," and that the General Conference instruct the Trustees of the Coporate Body to take necessary steps to correct the Articles of Incorporation in harmony with this action and,

That in the revision of the Discipline all parts of the same shall be

made to agree with this section.

Signed, G. C. COCKRELL, President. FRED W. GROVES, Secretary. A portion of a letter from Rev. H. K. Sheets requesting to retain his membership in the Oklahoma Conference was read. Motion made and carried that his character be passed.

Motion—made and supported to adjourn for Committee work was carried. Benediction by Sister Grace Davis.

PERMANENT RESOLUTIONS

- 1. All Trustees of the Oklahoma Conference shall reside within the bounds of said Conference.
- 2. When a pastor provides his own place of residence, all rent from the regular parsonage shall be paid to said pastor.
 - 3. The Conference Treasurer shall close his books one week before

the opening day of Conference and all money received after that time shall be applied on the next year's business.

- 4. The Conference Trustees shall be the Committee on Church and Parsonage Location.
- 5. The Committee on Religious services shall consist of the Conference President and the Pastor and Delegate of the church entertaining the Conference.
- 6. We recommend that the following orders of business be observed in our Annual Conference sessions:

- 7. A Nominating Committee be elected, composed of three elders; one of which shall be the President of the Conference as chairman exofficio, and the delegates-elect from two churches designated by the Conference. This Committee shall: First, examine the credentials of all delegates to the Annual Conference. Second, nominate all session committees, not already provided for, and be prepared to report at the first meeting of Conference.
- 8. The Conference fiscal year shall be from August first to the next July 31st inclusive, and all statistical reports shall be based on monies received and disbursed during that period, except when Conference shall convene before August 10th, in which case the Conference year shall end ten days before the opening day of Conference. In order to eliminate errors and to expedite the business of the Conference it is recommended that each pastor send a COPY of the BUDGET section (item VIII) of his statistical report together with receipts to the Conference Treasurer not later than one week before the opening day of the Conference.

REPORT NO. 8

PLAN OF WORK

The Committee on Plan of Work submits the following plan of work:

- 1. That we send to Mrs. Ava Tolle, Treasurer, the specified budget, together with all receipts for gifts and boxes to home and foreign work.
 - 2. That the Conference Society be divided into three districts:

District No. 1-Alva and Cedar Grove.

District No. 2-New Hope, Carwile and Wesleyan Chapel.

District No. 3-Blackwell, Enid, Okl, ahoma City and Ponca City.

The president to choose one person from each district at Conference to be responsible for arranging the rally.

District No. 1 Chairman, Mrs. Dorothy Kaiser.

District No. 2 Chairman, Mrs. Grace Groves.

District No. 3 Chairman, Mrs. Daisy Cockrell.

- 3. That we hold one convention in the Conference during the year to be held jointly with the Ministerial and W. Y. P. S. Concentions.
- 4. That we arrange with the pastor for our missionary prayer service, the first week of each month, the same to be preceded by fasting.
 - 5. That we hold twelve meetings during the year in which prayer service and business is conducted.
 - 6. That there be five Red Letter Days:
 - (a) Harvest Day-Educational day.
 - (b) Thanksgiving—Programs, gifts and offerings for Home Missions.
 - (c) World Day of Prayer—That we observe the World Day of Prayer.
 - (d) April-Self-Denial Month.
 - (e) May Day—Gift Day. Bandages and such as can be sent without-going missionaries or used in our Home Mission Field.
 - 7. That we use the Study Book.
 - That we read the Conference Plan of Work and Efficiency Standard twice each year, and read the Connectional Plan of Work once each year.
 - 9. That we take a definite position against the use of tobacco and alcoholic beverages and their advertisements.
 - 10. That we pay twenty-five cents per member for general delegate fund, to be based on 1945-46 membership, for the expense of our

representatives to General Conference, one of whom is expected to visit each local Society later, her traveling expense to be borne by the Conference.

- 11. That each society render a public program at which time an offering is taken for Missions.
- That we continue the support of Ruth Nichols Sanchez at Oceanside, California. (Applies on benevolent objects—not on budget.)
- 13. That the Conference Treasurer pay the registration fee for the Conference Officials out of the Oklahoma general fund.
- 14. That the local delegate shall check the statistical report with the conference treasurer before the same is read publicly.
- 15. That we fill a gift box for Orphanage and Home Missions.
- 16. That each society plan during the year to bring provisions to the Annual Conference.
- 17. That each society contribute materials to the Missionary exhibit to be displayed at the Annual Conference.
- 18. That each society cooperate with the Home Missionary Secretary by subscribing to the Card Call Plan.

REPORT NO. 9

EFFICIENCY STANDARD

Each of the following items count ten, making a possible score of 150

- 1. Arrange with Pastor for one Missionary prayer service one week of each month at which service a missionary offering is taken.
- Ten meetings held during the year in which prayer service is held and business transacted.
- 3. Red Letter Days:
 - (a) Harvest Day-Educational work.
 - (b) World Day of Prayer—That we observe the World Day of Prayer.
 - (c) Self-Denial.
- 4. One public meeting.
- 5. Correspond with Missionaries through corresponding secretary of each society.
- The President, Secretary and Treasurer a subscriber to the Wesleyan Methodist and Missionary Magazine and 50 percent of the members taking the magazine. A magazine solicitor elected for each local society.

- Report blanks properly filled out on time and sent to the Conference Treasurer to be checked before Conference.
- 8. The local society instruct the delegate the amount to pay for the society for current conference and camp meeting expense. The same to be paid to the camp meeting committee.
- 9. A superintendent and fully organized Y. M. W. B.
- 10. A five percent gain in membership.
- 11. All money must be sent in and purpose designated twelve days before conference.
- 12. Pay missionary budget in full.
- 13. Reach money goal.
- 14. Pay Ruth Nichols Sanchez salary in full.
- Each Society appoint a representative to attend the Mid-year Convention.
- 16. That we pay twenty-five cents per member for general delegate fund based on 1945-46 membership. (See item 10 in Plan of Work.)
