Journal of Daily Proceedings

First Sitting, Tuesday, July 24th, 2:30 P. M.

The fifty-ninth session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Camp Meeting Association at Greer, South Carolina at 2:00 p. m., July 24, 1951. Rev. E. L. Alexander, Conference W. Y. P. S. President, conducted devotions and brought an interesting message in interest of the youth work of the Conference.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. V. A. Mitchell, who declared the Conference bar to consist of the platform and the first six benches in the three middle tiers of seats. The hours of business were announced to be 8:30 a. m. to 12 noon; 1:30 p. m. to adjournment by vote, evening service at 7:30.

The roll was called and 25 elders and 12 conference preachers answered to the roll call.

A motion prevailed that they and all others so introduced be seated as honorary members with the privilege of speaking on all questions.

The conference voted to recommend that the Conference President give his report as the first order of business after the opening of conference each year.

The Vice-President was called to the chair.

The President's Report—The president gave his official report. Λ motion prevailed that the report be adopted except for the recommendations which were to be considered separately. The recommendations were all adopted. (See Report No. 1.)

A motion prevailed that the Conference considers it unnecessary for delegates to report regarding the evangelists or other elders who are not in pastoral work and that this practice should be discontinued.

Tuesday, July 24, 7:30 P. M.

The Conference Sermon was preached by the Conference President, Rev. V. A. Mitchell, who delivered a very inspiring message on the subject, "Christ, The Answer."

Second Sitting, Wednesday, July 25, 8:30 a. m.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. L. D. Wilcox who brought a very timely message on the subject, "Our Devotional Life."

Conference was called to order by the president.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Upon motion the Conference voted to make the Missionary Board the

Committee to study recommendation No. 2 of the President's Report.

Amendment to Discipline—Since General Conference voted to amend Article of Religion No. 5, paragraph No. 12 of the Discipline, and as this was handed down to the Annual Conferences to be voted on, this Conference voted to pass the amendment by a vote of 87 yeas and 0 nays. The Conference voted that this be handed down to the local churches and that each church vote on this amendment during the month of October 1951. The amended Article of Religion is as follows:

The Sufficiency and Full Authority of the Scriptures

The Holy Scriptures contain all things necessary to salvation; so that whatsoever is not read therein, nor may be proved thereby, is not to be required of any man, that it should be believed as an article of faith, or be thought requisite or necessary to salvation. In the name of the Holy Scriptures, we do understand the books of the Old and New Testaments. These Scriptures we do hold to be the inspired and infallibly written Word of God, fully inerrant in their original manuscripts and superior to all human authority.

The canonical books of the Old Testament are:

Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, Joshua, Judges, Ruth, I Samuel, II Samuel, I Kings, II Kings, I Chronicles, II Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, The Song of Solomon, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah and Malachi.

The canonical books of the New Testament are:

Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, The Acts, The Epistle to the Romans, I Corinthians, II Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, I Thessalonians, II Thessalonians, I Timothy, II Timothy, Titus, Philemon, Hebrews, James, I Peter, II Peter, I John, II John, III John, Jude and Revelation.

Psalm 19:7; Luke 24:27; John 17:17; Acts 17:2, 11; Rom. 1:2; 15:4; 16:26; Gal. 1:8; I Thess. 2:13; II Tim. 3:15-17; Heb. 4:12; James 1:21; I Peter 1:23; II Peter 1:19-21; Rev. 22:14, 19.

Standing Rules and Resolutions

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.
- 2. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents if they hold membership in secret societies.
- 3. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and also to hold if possible a two-weeks' revival during the year.
- 4. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.
- 5. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship shall not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other Church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.
- 6. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 7. That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.
- 8. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.
- 9. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most carefully to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. The Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the percentage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who are not giving at all. Each pastor and church shall co-operate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.
- 10. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause

of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.

- 11. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees of said South Carolina Annual Conference are also hereby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of his entire Advisory
- 12. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, and Conference Missions, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.
- 13. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

- 14. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a.m. Wednesday of Conference.
- 15. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.
 - 16. In the ordination of ministers to Elders Orders, it shall be the

policy of this Conference to ordain only those ministers who have passed the course of study as required by our Discipline.

- 17. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission.
- 18. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.
- 19. Conference shall convene each year on the Tuesday nearest July 15.
- 20. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before Conference.
 - 21. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.
- 22. Mr. Talmage Evatt, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
- 23. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one- half of the estimated cost of the project must be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.
- 24. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly conference records and the Church Clerk serve as Quarterly Conference Clerk.
- 25. The President shall appoint an Auditing Committee in time for it to audit the books of the treasurers before Conference.

Reports of Committees

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with a sense of gratitude to God that we are permitted to report to the fifty-ninth session of the South Carolina Conference. It has been a year of hard work, many activities, and numerous decisions. In all of our activities we have sought to please the Lord, be fair to all, and work for the best interest of the conference at all times. To this end we have not spared our time and strength. We are not satisfied with the service rendered, and must beg your forbearance with it. However, the motive, intention, and passion of our heart has been to do our duty as God gave us light to see that duty. We thank you for your patience and help in promoting the work. We do not deserve, nor desire, any praise for what has been accomplished. The efficient and faithful work of both laymen and ministers enable us to report that this has been a year of progress in every way. The records will reveal that this has been an all-time high in most every field. The finances of the conference are in the best condition for some time. The spiritual life of the conference is improving. The revival fires that are burning in several churches are seeping out into the communities and bringing many people into the Kingdom and church. Doctrinal preaching, strict adherence to the old fashion principles of our fathers, a walking in the light, dwelling in the unity of the Spirit, and a spirit of prayer and soul travail will assure us of a Conference-wide revival.

While this has been a year of victory and progress we have likewise suffered a loss in the home-going of one of our loyal ministers, the Rev. C. W. Nalley on December 12, 1950, who served faithfully, humbly, and without earthly reward. A number of our good laymen have gone to be with Jesus since we last met, among whom was Sister Woolbright, a charter member of the conference. This is a warning and a challenge to us who remain.

Improvements

This has been a year of improvements on our property. Anderson redecorated the parsonage inside and the woodwork on the outside, and laid a new carpet in the church. Clemson is to be congratulated for completing their beautiful stone building with only a small indebtedness. Carlisle added to the beauty of their auditorium by a hand-painting of Christ in the Garden. Central, First redecorated the parsonage and added several parsonage utilities. Columbia installed new pews, improved the arrangement of the pulpit, and installed a new heating system. Easley (Ariail) is to be commended for re-roofing the church, adding two new Sunday school rooms that can be used to increase the size of the auditorium, redecorating the inside of the church, brick-veneering the entire building,

and beautifying the church lot. Easley (First) redecorated the church and parsonage inside and out, installed rest rooms and a pastor's study in the church, and installed a Hammond organ. Easley (Glenwood) completed their Sunday school rooms, redecorated the inside of the parsonage. Eden redecorated the outside of their church. Florence redecorated the inside of their parsonage, purchased a power-drawn lawn mower, and installed an oil heater in the parsonage. Fountain Inn installed rest rooms, re-arranged their Sunday school rooms, installed fluorescent lights, redecorated the inside of the church, built a brick entrance to the church, and bricked the entire front of the building. Gaffney sold all of their former property, except the lot at Thickety Creek, and applied the proceeds on the church building purchased in a better location. There has been some progress made under the leadership of their pastor, Rev. A. E. Belk. Glenville installed a bath room and redecorated the parsonage. Golden Grove purchased a new piano. Greenville, First redecorated and made other improvements on their parsonage. Greenville (Woodside Avenue) paid off the last cent of their indebtedness in 31 months, which was under mortgage for 139 months, thus saving a considerable sum in interest. The sacrificial and efficient labors of Sister Stamey, and the help of the people of the church, are deeply appreciated, and they are to be highly congratulated for this unbelievable feat. They now have \$500.00 on hand to build Sunday school rooms. Greer is building about what is equivalent to a new church which will be one of the nicest in the conference. They also redecorated the parsonage on the inside. Greenwood has finished two new Sunday school rooms and laid a new carpet. Knighton Chapel re-roofed their building, installed a gas furnace, put celetex over head, and under pinned their building. Laurens installed a gas furnace. Liberty has built Sunday school rooms in the basement of their church. Lyman purchased a new piano, new pulpit furniture, refinished the inside of the church with celetex and sheet rock, refinished the floors, re-roofed the building, and veneered the church with asbestos shingles. Mount Calvary installed better pews, moved the church back from near the highway, underpinned the building, built four Sunday school rooms in the basement, leveled up the yard, and paid a full budget. Congratulations to pastor and people. Oakway installed a gas heating system. Pelzer installed a new furnace and added some utilities in the parsonage. Pickens View installed new pews and laid a new carpet. Piedmont purchased a new piano and installed new pews and pulpit furniture. Rock Bridge Mission has "hulled in" their building and are now worshiping in it. Rock Hill is veneering the church with asbestos shingles. Smith Chapel paid off all their indebtedness and re-dedicated their building. Welcome has installed a gas heating system. Whitmire treated their church and parsonage for termites and re-roofed the Sunday school rooms. They also have again shown their interest in the extension work of the conference by purchasing a fine lot in a good location in the Oakland Community of Newberry. It is envisioned that a

class will be organized there and a church erected on this lot. They supported the tent revival we conducted there in June by their presence and finance. By this and the loyal support of the people of the Oakland Community the meeting was held without cost to the Conference. Much good was accomplished and Brother Funderburk, who is in charge of the cottage services being conducted there, reports good attendance and interest.

Activities

I attended the North Carolina Conference, General Conference, Greer Camp Meeting, the opening, harvest day and commencement exercises of Central College, 2 district W.Y.P.S. rallies, 1 district ministers' meeting, 1 district W.M.S. meeting, the state W.Y.P.S. convention, the southern area ministers' convention, the state ministers' convention, the southern area round table meeting, the state holiness convention, and the NAE convention of Chicago, 4 committee meetings of the Christian Council Action, and the state convention of the Christian Council Action, and was one of the workers of the youth convention of the Allegheny Conference held at Stoneboro, Pa. I held two quarterly meetings on each charge, one of which was the fourth. I consulted with stewards of local churches and in many cases raises in pastor salary were realized and vacations granted. I dedicated the Clemson and Greenville (Woodside Avenue) buildings.

Official Acts

The action of the Advisory Board was unanimous in those cases where they acted.

August 11, 1950, I granted W. D. James a letter of transfer to the Indiana Conference as a Conference Praecher.

August 11, 1950, I granted D. T. Winters a letter of transfer to the Kentucky Conference as a Conference Preacher.

August 29, 1950, We appointed W. M. Rampey of the Central District, W. C. Young of the Columbia District, J. A. Giles of the Greenville District, and H. L. McCall of the Spartanburg District as prayer league secretaries. C. H. Mickel and C. T. Bryant were appointed to the Committee on Ministerial Meetings. Upon being nominated by A. C. Clemens, C. M. Elrod and W. S. Allred were appointed members of the Sunday School Board.

September 15, 1950, We approved the sale of the Thickety Creek and Gaffney property. The proceeds to be used in the purchase of the new property at Gaffney.

September 25, 1950, I received the transfers of Rev. & Mrs. G. I. Norman as Elders from the Ohio Conference.

October 2, 1950, We received and accepted the resignation of Rev. J. R. Hammond as pastor of the Mt. Calvary Church.

October 9, 1950, We appointed Rev. W. C. Young pastor of Mt. Calvary church.

October 26, 1950, I granted letters of transfer to Rev. & Mrs. D. C. Webb to the Kentucky Conference as Conference Preacher and Elder respectively.

October 30, 1950, We appointed Rev. C. B. Webster pastor of the Rock Bridge Mission.

November 26, 1950, I organized a Mission church at Converse with 17 members. We appointed Rev. A. C. Parker pastor, and Rev. Lester Padgett assistant. The organization resulted from a tent meeting conducted by Revs. A. C. Parker and C. D. Roach.

December 2, 1950, we approved and authorized the sale of the parsonage of the Calhoun church which was held by local trustees. The proceeds were to be used to pay off the indebtedness on the parsonage and the balance applied on the new church building.

December 18, 1950, we approved the election of all W.Y.P.S. officers, and approved the financial program adopted by the council.

December 23, 1950, we appointed Rev. H. M. Stewart paster of the Fellowship Church at the request of some of the members of the church.

January 4, 1951, we appointed Miss Gertrude Farmer pastor of the Buck Creek with the approval of the Missionary Board.

May 1, 1951, After the Whitmire church had made several attempts to secure a pastor from within the bounds of the conference, and at their urgent request we granted them permission to contact Rev. A. L. Vess as pastor.

July 17, 1951, I received the transfer of Rev. L. D. Wilcox as an Elder from the Ohio Conference.

July 19, 1951, I received the letter of standing of Rev. A. L. Vess as an Elder from the Ohio Conference.

Recommendations

- 1. That more business-like and safer methods be employed in the book-keeping system in local churches in order to protect the church treasurer as well as the church. In order that this be done I recommend, where deemed advisable and feasible, that a part or all of the following plan be followed:
- (a) That an assistant treasurer from the board of stewards be elected who shall count the money along with the church treasurer and shall keep a record of all money received.
- (b) Where banking facilities are available that all disbursements be made by check.
 - (c) That all treasurer's books be audited quarterly.
- (d) That a proper ledger be used so that proper entries can be made and a proper balance be obtained.

(e) That a central treasurer be used.

- 2. In order that a constructive program of church extension can be launched I recommend that a committee be designated to study and propose definite recommendations to the conference regarding the possibility and feasibility of putting a man in the field to solicit funds from churches, friends, and business firms in ways of cash, pledges, annuities, and bequests to be used to build up our weaker churches with a greater program of evangelism as well as to open up work in new fields.
- 3. That Friday, September 28; Tuesday, January 1st; Friday, March 28th, and Friday, June 27th, be observed as days of prayer and fasting. Also, that the prayer-league secretaries arrange appropriate services for these occasions in their respective districts.
- 4. That the name of the Calhoun Church be changed to Clemson and the name of the Tucapau Church be changed to Startex in order to comply with the change in the names of these towns.

MISSIONARY BOARD, 1951-1952

The Missionary Board submits the following report:

We recommend:

1. That the Conference President receive \$65.00 per week salary, parsonage rent and five cents per mile traveling expense.

2. That he be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside

the conference and retain offerings from two meetings.

3. That he hold, or cause to be held, two quarterly meetings on each charge, one of which shall be the 4th.

4. That he advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose

of encouraging, and devising plans for better payment of pastors.

5. We recommend that the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 from funds for Conference Work.

6. That the Secretary's salary and Treasurer's salary be \$100.00 each, to be taken from Conference Work.

7. That the president be authorized to draw on funds for Conference Work for the purpose of printing blanks and other such items.

8. That when a church invites the Sunday School Secretary for a service an offering be received for him.

9. That the Missionary Board be privileged to formulate plans for

Church Extension Work for the following year.

- 10. That when it becomes necessary for the conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by the Missionary Board, and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said Board, and in no case shall a church receive aid longer than four years, without a vote of the Annual Conference upon petition of said church. We further recommend that as long as said church receives aid from the Conference, it shall consult the Missionary Board before calling a pastor.
- 11. That the pastor of any church receiving aid from the Conference shall secure permission from the Missionary Board before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his church during the year.
- 12. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference, who desires to move or to live away from said charge, or

change his relation to charge in any way, must first consult the Board.

- 13. That the Missionary Board study recommendation No. 2 of the President's Report and report to next conference.
 - 14. That A. E. Belk be guaranteed a salary up to \$1900.00

Report No. 4

MISSIONARY BOARD, 1950-1951

- 1. After the death of Rev. C. W. Nalley, who was pastoring the Buck Creek and Fellowship Churches the board noted to appoint Miss Gertrude Farmer to the Buck Creek Church, salary to be the same as was paid Rev. Nalley. The Fellowship Church requested that Rev. H. M. Stewart be placed at this church which request was granted.
- 2. At the urgent request of Brother J. B. Hilson the board made a trip to the community of the atom plant looking out for some locations for future Wesleyan Methodist Churches, but made no definite plans for such.
- 3. On March 27, 1951 the Missionary Board made a trip to North Charleston to make a survey of conditions at that place. We found the church building very badly in need of improvement if we ever expect to make an impression on the people. By vote we recommended that the Conference trustees negotiate a loan for this purpose. These plans are still in the making.

At the same time we voted to accept the offer of trustees of Smokey Mountains Tabernacle in conveying same to South Carolina Conference. Also during this year we voted to pay Rev. A. E. Belk the fifty dollars per month for the two months he served the Gaffney Church before moving to same, this action was taken in view of the fact that he had made several long trips to Gaffney in looking after the work and looking for a house to live in.

During this year we made Rev. F. H. Pressley a promise to pay the Fountain Inn Wesleyan Church a sum equal to the amount of their budget for Conference Missions, provided they raised a full budget. This they did and the check has been mailed them. This to be used on their building improvements.

Near the beginning of this year, at the suggestion of Brother Shigley, the Board and Trustees negotiated a loan to take care of the indebtedness of the North Charleston Church, and at his suggestion, his help from the Board was reduced to \$25.00 per week in order to take care of the loan.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees of the South Carolina Conference met July 25, 1951 at Greer Campground and ratified the following report which is respectfully submitted to the Conference:

September 4, 1950 the Board went on record as authorizing the Missionary Board to mortgage the North Charleston Church property to secure a loan for the improvement of the church building if said Board sees fit to do so.

September 4, 1950 we voted to cut off a lot at the rear of the North Charleston Church lot for a parsonage lot before any other mortgage is signed against church property.

August 21, 1950 we signed a mortgage to Federal Loan Association of Florence against parsonage property at Florence to secure a loan of \$4,500

for payment on purchase of said parsonage.

September 11, 1950 we signed a second mortgage to Rev. Douglas Hefner against same property to secure a loan of \$1,000 to apply on pur-

chase price of said parsonage.

October 9, 1950 by vote we agreed that when the North Charleston Church has raised in cash one fifth (1/5) of the estimated amount needed to complete their church and pay off the present indebtedness (the amount not to exceed \$7,500). We will sign a mortgage to secure a loan for the other four-fifths needed. In November, 1951, we borrowed \$1,350.00 on a note without mortgage for the North Charleston Church.

March 29, 1951 we voted permission for the Greer Church to mortgage church and/or parsonage property to borrow as much as \$9,000 to finish their church building project.

May 2, 1951 we signed a mortgage against Greer Parsonage for \$7,000 for said purpose.

June 1951 Anderson Church property was deeded to the Conference.

Report No. 9 EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

We call attention to the fact that each church which raises a full educational budget and sends at least one student per twenty-five members to Central College will be placed on the Central College Honor Roll and will be awarded a suitable banner for display with a certificate signed by the college president and the chairman of the Board of Trustees. We urge the churches of the South Carolina Conference to strive to qualify for this honor.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

- 1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.
- 2. The W.M.S. dues of one dollar (\$1.00) per member are to be divided as follows: Foreign Missions, \$.25; Home Missions, \$.25; General Fund, \$.25 and Unspecified Fund, \$.25.
- 3. The Y.M.W.B. dues are fifty-five cents (55¢) for our Conference. The fifty-two cents (52¢) is to be used for foreign missions, one cent (1¢) desk expense and two cents (2¢) for General Conference travel expense of the Y.M.W.B. Superintendent.
- 4. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by July 1st of each conference year.
- 5. Each local society should pay annually an amount equal to twenty-five cents (25¢) per active member to be used as a general administrative fund, not to apply on budget.
- 6. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study group and a large Prayer Partner Circle.
- 7. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists and giving help which she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expenses on said visits.
- 8. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society make work to be placed on the Honor Roll.

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the members of the South Carolina Conference W.M.S. now convening in this forty-fifth session, greetings in the name of our risen Saviour! With the Psalmist we exclaim, "O Lord, our God, how excellent is thy name in all the earth," and then "What is man that thou art mindful of him? And the son of man, that thou visiteth him?" Any good that has come from the labor of the year is because of the health and strength He has given me as I have endeavored to serve Him and you.

I have endeavored to keep in close touch with the Executive Committee and any major decisions and disbursing of funds have been done with their approval. We appreciate the way you respond to any appeals that we find it necessary to present to you. We endeavor to disburse your funds carefully and wisely.

We secured the services of Rev. and Mrs. A. J. Calhoon, missionaries

to Haiti, to speak in several of our churches. Miss Roberta Wylie, R.N., missionary to Africa, toured the Conference for a month. We trust that these services have proved to be a real challenge to the work in the year before us.

Your Mountain Mission pledges have covered the small amount that we have been able to pay our laborers. I recommend that you pledge as liberally as possible for the furtherance of this work.

My correspondence during the year has been exceedingly heavy but it has been a delight to correspond with you in your various fields of labor. I attended the Work-shop held in Ohio last October and the General Conference held at Fairmount, Indiana this summer. It was a delight to serve as your representative, for these contacts are indeed beneficial to any one in a place of leadership. The theme for our Work-shop and General Conference was vividly portrayed to us in a drawing "Where hast thou gleaned today?" One missionary suggested that we bend over a little more and thereby glean more earnestly. "This generation of Christians will face this generation of heathen at the harvest." What will our answer be? Will we be faithful in this great task of making Christ known to all on the fields in which we serve or may serve in the future?
