# Resolutions

#### NO. 1

Resolved, that the board of trustees of each church be composed of three members elected by ballot by the church and three members elected by the Virginia Conference.

Further, that the trustees of the Virginia Wesleyan Methodist Churches together with the president of said conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the Virginia Wesleyan Methodist Churches needing funds to liquidate conference, church, or parsonage property indebtedness, provided that the part or parties requesting such action shall set forth the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested and that the trustees and the President are satisfied that the object for which the loan or loans is sought is both necessary, legal, and desirable.

Further, that the Virginia Conference require all deeds to buildings for worship, parsonages, and all other buildings, built or purchased, be deeded to the above described board of Trustees, and that all other buildings for conference use be deeded to the three (3) Trustees elected by the Virginia Conference. All property held by the Board of Trustees is to be used by our ministry and membership according to our book of discipline.

#### NO. 2

Resolved, that the President and his Advisory Board be made a deed examining committee for the Board of Trustees and that as soon as a deed is made, before it is recorded, it be sent to this committee for its approval and for the insertion of disciplinary clauses and/or other clauses to make it safe for our denomination.

#### NO. 3

Resolved, That all persons under conference appointment be requested to subscribe to THE WESLEYAN METHODIST.

#### NO. 4

Resolved, That our pastors and churches prohibit any and all preachers from occupying our pulpits, if said preachers cannot show proper license or credentials from some Church organization, which credentials must be satisfactory to the pastor, that the said preacher is in harmony with our church doctrines.

#### NO. 5

Resolved, That in order to properly safeguard the welfare and interests of the local churches and conference, no pastor hold more than (2) revival meetings away from his appointment during any conference year, without permission from his church; a two-thirds majority vote of those members present and voting on such a request from the pastor shall constitute permission from his church.

#### NO. 6

That the duties of the Virginia Annual Conference Treasurer be defined as follows:

First: He shall receive all funds paid in for use of the said Annual Conference at its regular Annual Session. He shall keep the accounts in a substantial book, in proper form, indicating who paid the money and for what purpose it was paid, and shall turn over the books, together with all money and other values on hand belonging to the Conference, to his successors in office. All money must be paid to the Treasurer and be paid by him to the sub-treasurers where there is such, with the following exceptions: If the pastors pay budget money to the sub-treasurers, the Annual Conference Treasurer shall receive all such receipts and give the pastor credit on such items as are indicated on the receipts issued by the sub-treasurers.

Second: All money received by the treasurer or sub-treasurers shall be paid out as the conference shall order and in accordance with our book

of discipline.

Third: On the first day of each month, or as near thereto as possible, the Annual Conference Treasurer shall disburse all monies on hand designated for General Budget items; except such disbursement to be made to the proper denominational departments.

Fourth: He shall pay out all conference funds as directed by the Board of Managers of the Conference and/or upon the receipt of proper

warrants.

Fifth: All money coming into his hands by wills or estates, gifts, or other donations, shall be held in trust by him for the Virginia Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, until the next session of the Annual Conference; and when such gifts, wills, donations, or estates shall be cash, the Treasurer shall deposit this money in a National Bank in his name as Treasurer of the Virginia Annual Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

Sixth: The Treasurer's books shall be submitted to the auditing committee of the Annual Conference at each session.

Seventh: The Treasurer of the Conference shall be required to keep the funds of the conference deposited in a bank that insures the deposits of its patrons.

#### NO. 7

Resolved, That no church property within the bounds of the Conference be encumbered to pay Pastor's salary, current expenses, or budget claims, either General or Conference.

#### NO. 8

Resolved, That the President and his Advisory Board appoint a Nominating Committee composed of three (3) elders and three (3) laymen, and that sufficient alternates be appointed.

Second: The members of this committee shall be rotated each year so that no member will serve on it more than once in three (3) years and that consideration also be given to having as many churches represented on the committee as possible.

Third: The President shall call this committee together one day preceding the opening of the Annual Conference session to nominate all con-

ference committees.

#### NO. 9

Resolved, That all persons receiving Conference appointment be required to practice storehouse tithing and that license of those who do not comply with this request be not renewed.

#### NO. 10

Resolved, That every pastor, church, or building committee contemplating making any repairs, erecting new buildings, for either church or investments for buildings, first consult the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings and that the Trustees be directed to withhold the signing of papers for loans until the Trustees are satisfied by a written report of the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings that their instructions have been complied with. It is recommended that the church so called on the aforesaid committee pay the expenses of the committee.

This resolution permits repairs to be made to church property, to restore the same to original condition, free of debt, without contacting the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings. Authorization must be granted by the proper committee for any repairs which incur debt or any alterations of any kind in landscaping and structures of building and property.

#### NO. 11

Resolved, That when a charge or charges are placed in the hands of the Judiciary Committee against a Church, Elder, or Conference Preacher, and the matter is brought to trial, that in the event such charges against a church, Elder, or Conference Preacher are sustained that the conference bear such expenses that may be incurred by the Judiciary Committee in the carrying on the trial and in the event such charges are not sustained after the trial of the case, that the party or parties making such charges bear the expenses of the Judiciary Committee.

#### NO. 12

Resolved, That each pastor settle with the Conference Treasurer by the 15th of July annually.

#### NO. 13

Whereas, Many times appeals are received by pastors and churches for financial assistance on building projects when said pastors and churches do not know whether or not the property is deeded properly, or is in a suitable location or whether the prospects are favorable for a permanent location:

Be it resolved, That in order that pastors and churches may know when it is safe to make contributions when appeals are made, that said appeals bear the signature of at least one member of the Board on Church and Parsonage Building, and one member of the Board of Trustees.

#### NO. 14

Resolved, That all churches, Missions, and Ministers working under the direction of the Conference Board of Managers be required to report monthly to the Chairman of the Board of Managers and that this report be read to the church or Mission before it is sent as above directed, and that the Pastor and the Church Clerk or Secretary sign the above report. Be it further resolved: That all Churches, Missions, and Ministers working under the direction of the Conference President and his Advisory Board be required to report monthly to the Conference President and his Advisory Board, and that this report be read to the Church or Mission before it is sent in, and that the pastor and Church Clerk or Secretary sign the above report.

#### NO. 15

Resolved, That the Conference fiscal year be July 1 through June 30.

#### NO. 16

Resolved, That all new churches, for a period of two years, be exempt from the paying of 50 percent of conference Budget. This to be effective beginning with the Conference of 1960.

#### NO. 17

Resolved, concerning the Sunday School Enrollment, that . . .

- A. Scholars can be enrolled by attending three out of five Sundays.
- B. That scholars can be dropped from the roll:
  - 1. When they absent themselves for eight consecutive Sundays;
  - 2. After they have been visited.
- C. If taken off the roll, they be placed on an inactive roll with their addresses.

Be it further resolved: That the average attendance be based on fifty (50) Sundays, rather than 52 Sundays, permitting the school to leave off the two lowest Sundays.

### RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

To the Second Annual Conference I wish to submit the following recommendations:

(1) That the Conference year 1961-62 be designated "Our Year of

Pastoring," with emphasis in the local churches being on planned visitation; establishing a family altar in each Wesleyan Methodist home; prompt and efficient reports by pastors; raising the full General Conference and Annual Conference Assessments; improving our regular services in their spiritual content by increased planned praying; admonishing our congregations of the value of scriptural healing and urge Christians to exercise faith for physical and mental health.

- (2) That an "All Conference Scheduling Committee" be composed of the Conference President, Vice President, W.M.S. President, W.Y. President, Conference S. S. Secretary, District Chairmen, and Chairman of Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders, and they be authorized to meet after the Conference Sermon to draft a schedule of all Conference wide activities giving date and time, and this schedule be published in the Conference Minutes.
- (3) That another District be formed to be called South Virginia District to be composed of Aiken Summitt, Minnie's Chapel, Raven Rock, Stuart and Galax Churches. The Conference Vice President to set the time and place of a caucus meeting during this Conference and conduct an election for the leaders of this District according to our District By-Laws.
- (4) We begin to age before we are born and continue to age until we die, and while none of us want to grow old, the only alternative is to die young. Life span in America is 69. In view of these facts I recommend that the Virginia Conference begin a study within the Board of Managers toward establishing a home for senior citizens. This study should cover the entire scope of:
  - a-Location
  - b-Incorporation
  - c-Receiving gifts of Real Esate, cash, bequests, and annuities
  - d-Personnel and management.
- (5) We recommend and approve the Buckingham Tabernacle Association goal of 600 dues paying members and recommend that we set a goal of "600 Pledged Pray-ers" in Virginia Conference. These "Pledged Pray-ers" to be recruited by the Pastors with promotional materials to be provided by the Conference. Estimate cost of promotion—\$48.00.
- (6) That the Pastor be requested to receive an offering at the time of the visits of the Conference President in the Fall and Spring to be applied toward Conference Work Fund and Conference Missions and Church Extension, and the Conference President be authorized to issue receipt for same. Such special offerings will not apply toward budget credit, but will be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer by the Conference President. The pastor is free to request the Conference President to make appropriate remarks concerning projects to which these offerings would support in the Virginia Conference under the Direction of the Board of Managers.
- (7) I recommend that a Budget Study Committee be set up composed of the Conference President, Conference Treasurer, Chairman of the Apportionment Committee and Layman Robert Graham to draft a more equitable basis of budget assessment, possibly upon percentage rather than membership, to be brought back to the 1962 Annual Conference. Expenses of the same to be referred to the Board of Managers for action and instruction for the Conference Treasurer to pay.

#### CONFERENCE GOALS

1. A force of 600 Pledged Pray-ers.

2. At least two revivals in each church and one evangelistic effort with youth emphasis.

3. Each member witnessing daily for Christ.

- 4. Each church endeavoring to "mother a church" and promote the special offerings for the same at the time of the Conference President's visit. Further, each church seek to conduct prayer meetings, evangelistic meetings and cultivate contacts in new communities looking toward new church organizations.
- 5. Each church paying all General Conference and Annual Conference Budget Assessments.

#### Report No. 2

#### DECLARATIONS AND AFFIRMATIONS

The Virginia Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, meeting in Annual session August 8-10, 1961 submits the following declarations and affirmations:

#### REVIVAL IN OUR CHURCHES

We deplare the spiritual dearth throughout America. We affirm the need and place of REVIVAL in our churches. I restate our thinking from an editorial in "The Virginia Vision" February-March, 1961 issue, which was reprinted in July, 1961 "Herald Of His Coming," ". . . Revival is the beginning of a new obedience toward God. Our greatest task is to now maintain disciplined obedience-to retain this degree of revival among us. If prayer produced it-we must intensify our praying. If obedience brought it-we must insist upon continued obedience in more and more humility, confession, and yielding hearts-especially our individual hearts. LET'S KEEP IT UP -THIS SEEKING THE LORD! TREAD SOFTLY! DON'T CRITICIZE, CENSURE OR CONDEMN OTHERS. BE HARDER ON YOURSELF THAN ANYONE ELSE! A church filled with people who do not know the spiritual lessons of brokeness and bleeding, will never know revival! An ease-loving parish sees little of the conscience-ease that comes from repentance, confession and forgiveness of the unsaved! A few churchs have had just enough of real revival to want more. We must have revival! We must have revival! We must have REVIVAL!

Frankly, we see no substitute for the word Revival in its meaning and results.

#### BREAKDOWN OF OUR SOCIETY

We deplore the moral breakdown of our society, as evidenced in a recent release by FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover in which "The surge of lawlessness reflected an astounding 98 per cent increase in crime over 1950." Statistics in this release reflects our need for more disciplined living, closer parental supervision of children and a higher regard for law and order. Our pulpits need to "cry aloud" against the sins of neglect, immorality, dishonesty and

greed. Let each Wesleyan Methodist pulpit in Virginia become a voice calling the sinner to repentance, the home back to God and the Christians to a surrendered service.

#### THE GOVERNMENT SPENDING PROPOSALS

We deplore the government spending proposals already submitted to Congress that total 10 billion dollars, some 8 billion dollars of which would go for non-defense purposes. (A billion dollars in one dollar bills would make a stack 59 miles high, it is reported.) Feeling the fiscal responsibility of such non-defense spending we call upon our people to write to their respective Congressmen and Senators requesting their vote and influence in favor of reduced spending to make our nation more solvent in its finances.

#### OUR TRUE AMERICAN HERITAGE

We are unalterably opposed to Communist ideologies, to Catholicism as a political entity and to Socialism as a way of life and hereby dedicate ourselves to our true American heritage as prescribed by the Constituition.

#### SUPPORT OF PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEMS

We advocate the continuance and support of public school systems and hold that they should be kept and maintained on a state, county and city level of administration and finance; that the Federal government should cease to tax citizens for federal support of education, but leave that part of the tax dollar for education in the tills of state and local governments. Educational advantages should be made to children and youth of our country irrespective of their race or creed.

#### WESLEYAN METHODISTS IN VIRGINIA

We call upon each Wesleyan Methodist in Virginia and in the District of Columbia to become one the "600 PLEDGED PRAY-ERS" this year, to participate in the "Operation Outreach to WITNESS to 100,000 persons," to maintain a family altar in each home, to devote your time and talents to the increase of God's Kingdom here on earth through support of the Church.

#### Report No. 4

#### REPORT OF VIRGINIA CONFERENCE TRUSTEES FOR 1960-1961

July, 1960 through June, 1961

December 12, 1960—Signed the "petition" of the First Wesleyan Methodist Church, Roanoke, Virginia, requesting the Circuit Court to execute a loan in the amount of \$8,800 to purchase additional house and land in Northwest Roanoke.

December 19, 1960—Received a note in the amount of \$3,000 marked paid from the Department of Church Extension and Evangelism, Marion, Ind. This represented a loan for the construction of the sanitary building at Buckingham Tabernacle Grounds which was paid from "Bonds For Buckingham" money.

January 13, 1961—Signed "Report and Recommendations of the Committee on Church and Parsonage Building and location" approving the following:

1. First Wesleyan Methodist Church, Roanoke, Va., proposed fellowship building—Amount \$10,500.00;

2. Wesleyan Methodist Church, Blacksburg, Va., proposed purchase of a parsonage—Amount \$18,950.00;

3. Minnie's Chapel Wesleyan Methodist Church, Stuart, Va., erection of a parsonage—Amount \$7,000.00;

4. Wesleyan Methodist Church, Chantilly, Va., two city lots for expansion—Amount \$2,500.00.

February 9, 1961—Signed Deed of Trust for the Wesleyan Methodist Church, Galax, Va., in an amount of \$1,425.00 which represents the balance due in the purchase of the building, this amount to be paid in three equal amounts of \$475.00 annually for the next three years.

March 14, 1961—Cancelled the rental contract on the property at 3020 Mansfield Street, N. E., Roanoke, Va., at the instruction of the Board of Managers.

. March 28, 1961—Executed Note in the amount of \$13,000.00 and signed a Deed for Trust for same, and signed the "Petition" to the Circuit Court for the First Wesleyan Methodist Church, Falls Church, Va.

April 15, 1961—The Board of Trustees met at the site of the proposed Conference parsonage, 6044 Thornrose Road, N. W., Roanoke, Virginia "... to handle further details, including utilities, deposits etc..." as instructed by the Board of Managers. The Board of Trustees has submitted a detail report to the Board of Managers. See Board of Managers file.

April 24, 1961—Signed the "petition" of the Virginia Conference requesting the Circuit Court to negotiate loan of \$17,400.00.

April 24, 1961—Signed note in the amount of \$1,500.00 which is an advance on the contribution from the Department of Church Extension and Evangelism. The Card Call is to cover the principal while the Virginia conference is to pay the interest until settlement by the card call funds.

May 6, 1961—Signed the note and Deed of Trust in the amount of \$17,400.00 for the Conference parsonage with the Southwest Virginia Savings and Loan Association, Roanoke, Virginia.

May 17, 1961—Completed transaction with the First National Exchange Bank of Roanoke, Va., for Deposit Box No. 3376 as per instruction of the Board of Managers.

June 12, 1961—Signed "report and Recommendation of Committee on Church and Parsonage building and locations" for Lynchburg Wesleyan Methodist Church approving purchase of site in the amount of \$11,000.00. Signed "Report" also for Clement Memorial Wesleyan Methodist Church, Altavista, Va., approving the purchase of house and lot adjoining present property in an amount of \$5,050.00.

June 23, 1961—signed the deed for the First Wesleyan Methodist Church, Washington, D.C., selling the lot they owned, which was felt to be too small for the future needs of the church. Funds received from this transaction will be used to settle with the Department of Church Extension and Evangelism, Marion, Indiana who had loaned the church the money to buy the lot. The balance is to be administered by vote of the church with the advice of the Board of Trustees.

The transaction represented in the acts of the Virginia Board of Trustees represents vision, foresight and faith for future growth, in the area of our local churches. There has been around \$110,000 worth of property added to the total value of Churches and parsonages this year. The total value of churches, parsonages and youth-fellowship buildings is more than \$875.000.00.

Let us endeavor to be faithful stewards of these possessions.

#### SUMMARY OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The Second Annual Session of the Virginia Conference Women's Missionary Society was privileged to meet in the newly constructed dormitory chapel at Buckingham Tabernacle Grounds, Buckingham, Virginia, August 8-10, 1961, with Mrs. Eulalia Gentry, President, presiding. Mrs. Margaret Wood, music director, introduced the theme song, "The Call for Reapers." The conference theme, "Harvest Hands for Needy Lands" was beautifully developed by Mrs. Dorothy Thomas as she opened each session with a devotional talk.

The first session opened Tuesday, August 8, 1961 at 2:30 p.m. After a brief business session to receive delegates credentials, set the bar of conference and adopt the report of the nominating committee, Rev. Floyd Banker, returned missionary to India, delivered the missionary address. The remainder of the day was given to District Caucus meetings and a class on "The Art of Witnessing" taught by Mrs. Doris Powers.

The second session began Wednesday, August 9, 1961, at 8:30. Business of the session consisted of the election of officers and reports from various committees. We were dismissed at 11:00 a.m. to hear the denominational

address by Rev. E. L. Kierstead.

The third session opened Wednesday afternoon at 1:30 with a Y.M.W.B. service, arranged by Mrs. Dorothy Thomas and Mrs. Evelyn Smith due to the illness of Superintendent Mrs. Margy King. Using children on the campgrounds they presented a skit "Heading for the Mission Field" written by Mrs. Thomas. After this service the Plan of Work was presented, discussed, accepted and pledges were received for society projects. Mrs. Marie Wheeler, Treasurer, conducted a treasurers' symposium and then we listened to the very picturesque travelog of Miss Roberta Wylie on her return trip to Africa.

The Public Missionary Service was at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, August 9. Special music was arranged by Mrs. Margaret Wood and Mrs. Betty McKinley. Miss Roberta Wylie led in devotions and the missionary message was given by Rev. Floyd Banker. An offering was received in the amount of \$38.27.

Rev. Banker showed slides following this service.

Thursday, August 10, 1961, at 9:00 a.m., the fourth session began. Following preliminaries, Dr. R. C. Mullinax reported on Central College. Then reports were accepted from the statistician and resolutions committees. Awards were presented and two district chairmen elected. We then recessed for the second class on "Witnessing" and the first class on "The Art of Soul

Winning" by Rev. Charles King.

The fifth session followed at 1:30 p.m., Thursday, August 10. Following a workshop for local president, Rev. King conducted the second class on "Soul Winning." Unfinished business consisted of a partial report from the Y.M.W.B. Superintendent; literature sales reported as \$103.34; individual societies reported on their year's activities. The session came to a close with a special song by Mr. and Mrs. Sickles and a very impressive Installation Service for new conference officials and local presidents.
