DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday, July 15, 2:00 p. m.

The fifty-fifth session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Camp Meeting Association at Greer, South Carolina at 2:00 p. m., July 15, 1947. The devotions were in the form of prayer and praise service with Rev. L. W. Barbee in charge.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. R. C. Mullinax, who declared the Conference Bar to consist of the platform and the first five benches in the three middle tiers of seats.

The roll was called and 26 Elders and 11 Conference Preachers answered present.

Devotions were in the form of a memorial service for the late Rev. M. J. Gaines and Mrs. L. Rigdon. P. C. Lusk presided. Rev. R. G. Cudd, Rev. R. C. Kendrick, Mrs. Hattie Vernon and Mrs. C. H. Mickel spoke regarding the life and work of Rev. M. J. Gaines and Mrs. L. Rigdon.

Conference was called to order by the Vice-President.

Rev. J. R. Swauger was called to the Chair.

The roll was called.

Report—J. B. Hilson gave his report. Report adopted. (See Report No. 12.)

Temperance—A motion prevailed to hear Dr. Betts, Executive Secretary of the South Carolina Federated Forces for Temperance and Law Enforcement, on "Temperance" at once. He gave an address regarding the need of temperance work and expressed appreciation for our interest. An offering of \$29.23 was received for him.

Statistics—Reports were read by C. M. Elrod, W. A. Todd (Evangelist), A. C. Parker, W. S. Allred, C. R. White, H. A. McCutcheon, Curtiss Harris, E. H. Rogers, G. L. Stewart (read by J. Youngblood), L. W. Barbee, J. D. Evatt, J. R. Green, J. C. Byars, George E. Failing (read by W. H. Corn), W. R. French.

Apportionment—The Committee on Apportionment reported. Report adopted, except for two items regarding Ministers' Pension Plan. (See Report No. 14.) These two items were referred to a special committee for study. Committee: Chairman, W. D. Correll; R. C. Mullinax, Talmage Evatt, J. B. Hilson, F. L. Moore, Dan Good, E. L. Gunby.

A motion prevailed that the Conference plan for Superannuate Ministers continue for another year.

A motion prevailed to change the name of Morgan Chapel from Morgan Chapel Church to Morgan Memorial Church.

Curtiss Harris and E. H. Rogers having failed to get their reports to the Statistical Committee on time, the Conference voted by the necessary 2/3 majority to pass their character.

Judiciary Committee—The Judiciary Committee reported regarding the case of Rev. L. F. Hartley, which was referred to it by the Committee on Ministerial Character, stating the L. F. Hartley admits being guilty of high imprudence and unministerial conduct and asks for mercy. The Committee recommended that his character be passed, that he be granted mercy, that he be placed on probation and that he be not assigned work for a year. The recommendations were adopted by vote of the Conference.

The Conference instructed the Secretary to send greetings to Rev. G. E. Crenshaw who is seriously ill.

The Conference voted to excuse Rev. J. R. Green due to the illness of his wife.

Adjourned on motion.

Trustees—The Trustees reported. A motion prevailed to amend the report by referring Item 6 (pertaining to selling of Pelham church property) back to the Board with instructions to retain title to the property. Report adopted as amended. (See Report No. 5.)

Treasurer—The Conference Treasurer reported. Report adopted.

Records—The Committee on Records reported. Motion prevailed to amend the report by eliminating Item 4 of recommendations listed in minutes of 1946. The report as amended was adopted. (See Report No. 7.)

A motion prevailed that a station church (not on a charge with other churches) may keep only one record book and that the church clerk serve as the Quarterly Conference Clerk. This recommendation is to be placed in the Standing Rules.

STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

2. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies.

3. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and also to hold if possible a two weeks' revival during the year.

4. That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.

5. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.

6. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other Church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.

7. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.

8. That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.

9. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.

10. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most earnestly to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. This Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the per-

centage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who are not giving at all. Each pastor and church shall cooperate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.

11. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.

12. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (and this writing is to become a part of the permanent record of the Trustees), and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees of said South Carolina Annual Conference are also hereby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of his entire Advisory Board.

13. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Church Extension and Conference Evangelism, and General Conference Travel, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.

14. Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

15. Any Superannuated Elder shall receive not more than one dollar (\$1.00) per month for each year of service he has given in the Conference.

The widow of an Elder or Conference Preacher shall receive not more than fifty cents (\$.50) per month for each year of service which she and her husband have rendered together in the Conference. It is understood that these are the maximum amounts and dependent of course upon whether or not sufficient money may be available from the fund for Superannuated Ministers.

16. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a. m. Wednesday of Conference.

17. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.

18. Each charge is to give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without getting the consent of his church, or charge.

19. In the ordination of ministers to Elder's Orders, it shall be the policy of this Conference to ordain only those ministers who have passed the course of study as required by our Discipline.

20. All officers and committees shall take up their duties immediately upon election.

REPORTS

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the Fifty-fifth Annual Session of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America now assembled at Greer, South Carolina, I respectfully submit the following report:

Though the Conference year now closing has not been without the difficulties and trials yet we have labored under the special blessings of God. The financial side of the work has never been in better condition, the building program has been unusually good, the attendance has in general been encouraging, a good number of new members have been added to our rolls, and the spiritual condition of the work seems to be good, though we have plenty of room for improvement.

Our pioneer work at Columbia has made splendid progress. We now have a beautiful and substantial church building on Calhoun Street near the Governor's Mansion. The Sunday school has had a splendid increase in attendance, several new members have been added to the roll, there was a good Vacation Bible School conducted, and the church has a good influence in the city. A pioneer meeting was conducted in Newberry by the Rev. C. T. Bryant, who has been conducting a radio broadcast from that city for many months. Good interest was shown in the meeting and it served as a good introduction of Wesleyan Methodism to the people of Newberry. This meeting was partially financed by the State W. Y. P. S. Each of our pioneer churches has made progress in some way but each has had a difficult struggle.

On January 25, 1947 the Rev. M. J. Gaines, then pastor of the Fellowship church, passed to his eternal reward. He will be long remembered as a man of deep piety, with a passion for souls. His prayer was very outstanding.

Improvements

The beautiful parsonages which were begun last year at Landrum and Lyman have been completed, or practically so. Tucapau has built a very attractive parsonage. Columbia has purchased a lot on Calhoun Street and has built a substantial and beautiful church. The Florence church has been veneered with brick and a belfry has been constructed at the entrance. Morgan Chapel will soon be ready to begin services in the new church they are building. Gaffney has purchased two new lots located near the business section of the city and expects to build a church there at some future date. A very successful tent meeting was recently held

on the new lots. This new location should prove a great benefit to the church. Union has added two Sunday-school rooms. Laurens has recently bought and paid for a lot on which she expects to build a parsonage. Two thousand dollars in cash is available for that purpose when construction is begun. Greenville First has purchased a bus valued at \$1,000.00 and this is proving a means of increasing the Sunday-school attendance which is now the highest in the history of the church. Greenville First has also installed a gas heating system in the parsonage at a cost of approximately \$1,000.00. Many other improvements have been made over the Conference, but all cannot be mentioned here.

Services Rendered

Through the mercy and goodness of God I have been able to travel extensively on behalf of the Conference and to engage in abundant labors. I have traveled approximately 16,000 miles in interest of the Conference; preaching, holding quarterly meetings, conducting revivals, and supervising the work. The following is a summary of my activities:

I presided over the Conference Ministerial Institute, served as Delegate to the General Conference at Houghton, N. Y., and attended the following gatherings: two district W. Y. P. S. conventions, the State W. Y. P. S. convention, Y. M. W. B. state convention, state temperance convention at Columbia, S. C., Greer Camp, commencement exercises at Central College, the Southern Area Ministerial Convention, and the fellowship convention for the leaders of the Wesleyan Methodist and Free Methodist denominations held at Winona Lake, Indiana.

July 23, 1946, I appointed the Rev. E. M. Turner pastor of Tuckasee church.

August 1, 1946, I received the transfer of the Rev. H. L. McCall as a Conference Preacher from the Kentucky Conference.

August 30, 1946, I received the resignation of the Rev. Silas West as pastor of the Eastatoe church.

September 6, 1946, I appointed the Rev. J. C. Byars pastor of the Eastatoe church.

December 2, 1946, I received the transfer of Mrs. D. C. Webb as an Elder of the Kentucky Conference and the transfer of the Rev. D. C. Webb as a Conference Preacher from the Kentucky Conference.

On the same date I appointed them as workers at Rock Bridge Mission in Jackson County, North Carolina.

December 2, 1946, I received the resignation of the Rev. W. J. Edwards as pastor of the Greenwood church.

December 7, 1946, I appointed the Rev. John D. Evatt as pastor of the Greenwood church.

January 25, 1947, the Rev. W. A. Young ceased to be a Conference Preacher by having joined another religious body.

February 14, 1947, I appointed the Rev. M. C. King pastor of the Fellowship church to fill the vacancy made by the death of the Rev. M. J. Gaines.

February 26, 1947, I received the transfer of the Rev. C. H. Pickel as an Elder from the Alabama Conference and on the same date he was appointed "to choose his own field of labor."

March 14, 1947, I received the resignation of the Rev. L. F. Hartley as pastor of the Landrum church.

March 23, 1947, I assisted in the formal opening of the Columbia church.

April 2, 1947, I appointed the Rev. George James pastor of the Landrum church.

July 14, 1947, I granted a transfer to the Rev. Silas West.

July 14, 1947, the Rev. J. F. Parton, an Elder in good standing, voluntarily withdrew from the Conference and surrendered his credentials.

Report No. 3

MISSIONARY BOARD

We recommend:

1. That the President receive \$55.00 per week salary, parsonage rent, and three cents per mile traveling expenses.
2. That the President be given the privilege of conducting two revival meetings per year outside the Conference without affecting his salary.
3. That the President have the oversight of the work according to our book of Discipline, and that he hold the first and last Quarterly Conferences. He is to work in needy churches or open work in new fields within the bounds of the Conference.
4. That the President consult with the Boards of Stewards of the local churches, especially the weaker churches, as he makes his Quarterly Conference rounds, for the purpose of encouraging and devising methods and plans for the better payment of pastors, and thereby building up the work to make it self-supporting.
5. That the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 from the fund for Conference Work.
6. That the Treasurer's salary be \$90.00 and the Secretary's salary be \$90.00. This money is to be taken from the fund for Conference Work.
7. That the President be authorized to draw on the fund for Conference Work for printing of Conference stationery and such incidentals as blanks, etc.
8. That any established church who uses the tent pay \$1.50 per day rent, except by special consent of the Missionary Board.
9. That we pay the parsonage rent at Florence.
10. That we pay moving expenses, parsonage rent, and salary of \$25.00 per week to the pastor at Charleston, provided he gives full time to the work.
11. That we continue the monthly payments on Columbia parsonage.

12. That we pay all back payments on the Charleston church.
13. That we pay Florence pastor the back salary of \$85.00.
14. That Rev. J. A. Giles be employed as Pioneer Evangelist and that the Conference supplement his salary to the amount of \$50.00 per week. He is to receive three cents per mile for traveling expense for any trip he is directed by the Missionary Board to take away from the city in which he is living. His labors are to be under the direction of the Missionary Board.
15. That we pay \$5.00 per week for pastor's salary at Greenville Second church, provided he gives full time to the work.
16. That all the Conference file of Church Periodicals now owned by the Conference be donated to Central College Library.
17. That each church be requested to pay its budget on Conference Mission quarterly.
18. That we refund Rev. J. R. Green \$30.00 that he advanced on lot for Greenville Second church.

Item I. Ordination:
