

DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday, July 16, 2:00 p. m.

The fifty-fourth session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Camp Meeting Association at Greer, South Carolina, at 2:00 p. m., July 16, 1946. The devotions were in the form of a communion service with Rev. L. Rigdon in charge.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. R. C. Mullinax, who declared the Conference Bar to consist of the platform and the first five benches in the three middle tiers of seats.

The roll was called and 28 Elders and 13 Conference Preachers answered present.

Committee on Credentials—C. T. Bryant and F. H. Pressley were elected a Committee on Credentials. The Committee on Credentials reported and the roll of the Lay Delegates was called and 30 answered present.

In the absence of both the delegates and the alternates from the Pickens View and Columbia churches the Conference voted to seat Mrs. Barey Pettit and Mrs. J. A. Giles as delegates from these churches respectively.

The Conference voted to seat Mrs. V. A. Mitchell as delegate for Rev. W. A. Todd from Central Second church.

McCall of the Kentucky Conference were introduced to the Conference and made appropriate remarks. A motion prevailed to seat them (and all others so introduced and of like faith to this Conference) as honorary members with the privilege of speaking on all questions.

The Conference adjourned on motion.

Hours of Business—The President announced the hours of Conference to be 8:30 to 11:30 a. m., 1:30 to adjourn on motion, evening service 7:30. Benediction by W. D. Correll.

Tuesday, July 16, 7:30 p. m.

The Conference Sermon was preached by Rev. J. A. Giles.

Wednesday, July 17, 8:30 a. m.

Devotions were in the form of a Tithing Service conducted by Rev. Mrs. Harriet E. Miller.

Conference was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the minutes read and approved as corrected.

The President appointed F. L. Moore, George Fowler, and W. F. Mullinax as lay members on the Committee of Itineracy and Orders.

Sunday School Secretary—Rev. J. C. Nunnally declined to accept the office of Sunday School Secretary. Rev. E. L. Alexander was elected to this office.

Courtesy—Rev. J. A. Clement of the North Carolina Conference and Rev. O. G. Wilson, Connectional Sunday School Editor, with Mrs. O. G. Wilson, were introduced to the Conference and made appropriate remarks.

Committee on Vacancies—The Committee on Vacancies reported its activities of the past year. Report adopted. See Report No. 10.

Recommendations—G. C. Mason of the Oakway Charge and J. D. Evatt of the Fountain Inn Charge were recommended to study or travel under the direction of the Conference and W. Marshall Rampey of the Piedmont Church recommended to study preparatory to travel under the direction of the Conference. These recommendations were referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

Statistics—Rev. Curtis Harris read his Statistical Report. See Report No. 19.

Evangelism—The Secretaries of Evangelism gave a joint report which was adopted. See Report No. 8.

Secretaries of Evangelism were elected as follows: Eastern District: Rev. W. S. Allred; Western District: Rev. E. L. Gunby.

Conference adjourned on motion.

Wednesday, July 17, 1:30 p. m.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. C. T. Bryant.

Conference was called to order by the President.

The roll was called.

Statistics—Rev. C. R. White read his Statistical Report. See Report No. 19.

Special Orders—The special orders of the day were taken up. K. W. Johnston, V. A. Mitchell, W. S. Allred, Curtis Harris, E. L. Alexander, E. L. Shigley, Jr., W. J. Edwards, and J. J. Miller served as tellers.

Vice-President—Rev. W. D. Correll (Vote 80 of 103, first ballot).

The motion prevailed to suspend the rules of order that the Conference might hear the Committee on Records recommending to change the grading system so that completeness of records would count 20% and permanency of records would count 15% instead of 25 and 20% respectively. The recommendation was adopted.

The Conference W. H. & F. M. S. held its public missionary service with Mrs. Margaret G. Childs, Vice-President, presiding.

Rev. Robert L. Crosby, Missionary to South America, gave the main address and showed pictures of the work in South America.

Thursday, July 18, 8:30 a. m.

Devotions were in the form of a Temperance Service conducted by Rev. Albert D. Betts, Secretary for Federated Forces and Law Enforcement, who spoke on the ill effects of alcoholic beverages. An offering of \$23.01 was received for Brother Betts and his work.

Conference was called to order by J. B. Hilson.

The roll was called.

The minutes were read and approved.

Special Orders—The orders of the day were taken up and the following delegates to General Conference were elected: Laymen: J. B. Childs, Talmage Evatt, E. E. Lusk, George Fowler.

The President was called to the Chair.

A motion prevailed to lay the special orders on the table.

Pastoral Relations—The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its first reading.

Rev. Campbell Speaks—Conference voted to ask Rev. Wendell Campbell, Superintendent of Hephzibah Home, to address the body. He gave an interesting report on the work at the Orphanage.

Special Orders—A motion prevailed to take the special orders from the table.

Special Orders—H. M. Moody was elected first alternate lay delegate.

Courtesy—Dr. McAfee and Rev. Spears of the Nazarene Church were introduced to the body and made appropriate remarks.

Connectional Address—The hour for the Special Orders of the Day having arrived Rev. O. G. Wilson, Connectional Representative, gave the Connectional Address bringing a very forceful and impressive message using Matt. 16: 18 as a text.

Conference adjourned by limitation of time.

Thursday, July 18, 1: 30 p. m.

Conference was called to order by the President.

The roll was called.

Rev. R. C. Kendrick had charge of a Memorial Service for the late Rev. I. O. Gray and Rev. W. L. Miller. He was assisted by Rev. G. L. Stewart.

Special Orders—J. T. Chandler and F. L. Moore were elected alternate Lay Delegates to General Conference.

Missionary Board—The Missionary Board gave its report and recommendations which were adopted. See Report No. 3.

Rev. J. A. Giles gave a report of his work as Pioneer Evangelist.

Rev. O. G. Wilson was called to the Chair.

The President read a letter of transfer of Rev. Silas West from the Allegheny Conference. Conference voted to receive Rev. West as a Conference Preacher. The Secretary read the Statistical report of Rev. Silas West.

Treasurer—Conference voted that the Conference Treasurer close his books on July 1st.

Statistical Report—A motion prevailed that all Statistical reports of pastors must be in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a. m., Wednesday of Conference week, and that standing rule No. 16 shall be amended to this effect.

Pastoral Relations—Committee of Pastoral Relations gave its third reading. Report adopted. See Report No. 2.

The Conference voted to pass the character of Rev. G. E. Crenshaw.

A motion prevailed that the Conference send the Conference Sunday School Secretary to General Conference.

General Conference Expenses—A motion prevailed that the Missionary Board be authorized to vote out money for General Conference travel as it deemed wise.

Rev. J. B. Hilson gave a verbal report.

The minutes were read and approved.

A motion prevailed to adopt the minutes for the entire session of Conference.

On motion Conference voted to adjourn sine die.

STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

2. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies.

3. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and also to hold if possible a two week's revival during the year.

4. That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.

5. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.

6. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other Church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.

7. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.

8. That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.

9. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.

10. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most earnestly to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. This Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the percentage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the

percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who are not giving at all. Each pastor and church shall cooperate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.

11. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.

12. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (and this writing is to become a part of the permanent record of the Trustees), and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees of said South Carolina Annual Conference are also hereby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of his entire Advisory Board.

13. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Church Extension and Conference Evangelism, and General Conference Travel, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.

14. Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

15. Any Superannuated Elder shall receive not more than one dollar (\$1.00) per month for each year of service he has given in the Conference. The widow of an Elder or Conference Preacher shall receive not more than fifty cents (\$.50) per month for each year of service which she and

her husband have rendered together in the Conference. It is understood that these are the maximum amounts and dependent of course upon whether or not sufficient money may be available from the fund for Superannuated Ministers.

16. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a. m. Wednesday of Conference.

17. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.

18. Each charge is to give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without getting the consent of his church, or charge.

19. In the ordination of ministers to Elder's Orders, it shall be the policy of this Conference to ordain only those ministers who have passed the course of study as required by our Discipline.

REPORTS

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the Fifty-fourth Annual Session of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America now assembled at Greer, S. C., I respectfully submit the following report:

This has been a year in which we have labored under the blessings of God. The closing of the war has brought back many of our young men from the battle fields and training camps and it has been a pleasure to have them in our Sunday schools and church services. Though the winter was very severe, many roads were almost impassable, and there was a great siege of illness, yet many of our Sunday schools are reporting splendid increases in average attendance. A few schools have doubled their attendance since last year and a number have had gains of 25% and above. God has sent gracious revivals to some of our churches and reports indicate that we are having an increase in membership.

We have been fortunate indeed in securing the Rev. J. A. Giles as our pioneer evangelist. He comes to us as a spiritual and capable man with a splendid record to his credit. He has had experience in the pioneer type of work and is a man of vision, labor and prayer. Those who know him seem to agree that he is God's man for the place. In December of 1945 the Missionary Board purchased a large and substantial dwelling in a fine location in the city of Columbia at a cost of \$6,750.00. Many of our churches responded with a liberal offering to make this purchase possible.

In January of 1946 Brother Giles moved his family to the new parsonage and began activities in the city. God has blessed his faithful labors and the work has made a steady growth. On March 3, 1946 the First Wesleyan Methodist church of Columbia was organized. In April and May a tent meeting was sponsored in the city with the Rev. and Mrs. H. Robb French and the Rev. and Mrs. Kenneth Knapp as workers. Splendid financial help in this undertaking was received from the Conference W. Y. P. S. Our Sunday schools also gave a special offering for the Columbia work. The congregation has now outgrown the small chapel which was located in the parsonage, the Missionary Board has taken an option on a lot which is well located, and plans are being made for the construction of a church building. The cost of the lot was \$1,000.00.

On August 26, 1945, the Rev. I. O. Gray, one of our highly esteemed elders, who had been in declining health for some months, passed to his eternal reward. On September 24, 1945, the Rev. W. L. Miller, who had been a faithful pastor among us for about thirty years and who was Chairman of our Board of Trustees, was instantly killed when the tractor

he was driving overturned. We shall miss the fellowship and labors of these departed brethren, but we bow in humble submission to the will of our Heavenly Father and look forward to clasping hands with these beloved brethren in a land where hallowed gatherings of the saints never break up.

Improvements

During the Conference year which is now closing three new parsonages have been added, a fourth is nearing completion, and a fifth is under construction. The value of these buildings, when all are completed, will be not less than \$29,000. This gives the Conference an increase of near 25% in the number of homes for our pastors. These buildings are located at Greer, Lyman, Ariail Mill, Columbia and Landrum.

Pickens View and Clifton have added new Sunday-school rooms. Carlisle has built Sunday-school rooms at the rear of the auditorium, refinished the auditorium inside, and veneered the entire structure with brick. It is now one of the most beautiful country churches in the state. The cost was about \$10,000, and there is no indebtedness. Anderson has built a two-story apartment at the rear of the auditorium and veneered the building with brick. The annex contains Sunday-school rooms, rest rooms, pastor's study, and furnace room. The cost of these improvements was about \$12,000 and the indebtedness is less than \$2,000. This is one of the most attractive churches in the city of Anderson. Charleston has finished the church inside with sheet rock and cleotex and made other improvements. Greenville, First has installed attractive new pews and donated their former pews to Greenville, Second. At least seven other churches have several hundred dollars each in their building funds and contemplate remodeling or building new churches soon. Tucapau has several hundred dollars for the purpose of building a parsonage.

Services Rendered

God has graciously blessed me with good health and enabled me to engage in abundant labors and extensive travel, for which I am thankful. I have traveled approximately 12,600 miles in interest of the Conference, preaching, holding Quarterly meetings, conducting revivals, and looking after the general interests of the work. The following is a summary of my activities:

the State Temperance Convention, and two meetings of the Executive Committee of the South Carolina Federated Forces of Temperance and Law Enforcement. These temperance meetings were held at Columbia, S. C.

October 13, 1945, I appointed the Rev. O. B. Stewart as pastor of the Golden Grove church, which was made vacant by the death of the Rev. W. L. Miller.

October 15, 1945, I appointed the Rev. W. A. Todd as an evangelist of the Conference.

January 1, 1946, I received the resignation of the Rev. E. L. Shigley, Jr. as pastor of Providence.

January 25, 1946, I appointed the Rev. H. A. McCutcheon as pastor of Providence church.

January 28, 1946, I received the transfer of the Rev. J. A. Giles as an elder from the Kentucky Conference.

March 3, 1946, I organized a church at Columbia, S. C. and appointed the Rev. J. A. Giles as pastor.

March 27, 1946, I appointed the Rev. P. C. Lusk as Chairman of Greenville District W. Y. P. S.

March 31, 1946, I dedicated the Sunday-school rooms of the Pickens View church.

May 20, 1946, I received the resignation of Rev. Edward Payne as pastor of Morgan Chapel.

Report No. 3

MISSIONARY BOARD

We recommend:

1. That the President receive \$50.00 per week salary, parsonage rent, and three cents per mile traveling expenses.
2. That the President be given the privilege of conducting two revival meetings per year outside the Conference without affecting his salary.
3. That the President have the oversight of the work according to our book of Discipline, and that he hold the first and last Quarterly Conferences. He is to work in needy churches or open work in new fields within the bounds of the Conference.
4. That the President consult with the Boards of Stewards of the local churches, especially the weaker churches, as he makes his Quarterly Conference rounds, for the purpose of encouraging and devising methods and plans for the better payment of pastors, and thereby building up the work to make it self-supporting.
5. That the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 from the fund for Conference Work.
6. That the Treasurer's salary be \$75.00 and the Secretary's salary be \$60.00. This money is to be taken from the fund for Conference Work.
7. That the President be authorized to draw on the fund for Confer-

ence Work for printing of Conference stationery and such incidentals as blanks, etc.

8. That Rev. J. A. Giles be employed as Pioneer Evangelist with a salary of \$50.00 per week. He is to receive three cents per mile for traveling expenses for any trip he is directed by the Missionary Board to make away from the city in which he is living. His labors are to be under the direction of the Missionary Board.

9. That the fund for Conference Entertainment be paid to the Camp Meeting Association for entertaining the Conference.

10. That the Treasurer pay for the subscription of the "Wesleyan" for 1947.

11. That we pay Landrum church \$100.00 for the building of a new parsonage.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

We, the Trustees of the South Carolina Conference, respectfully submit the following report:

1. On August 2, 1945 we signed a mortgage against the Greenwood church for a loan of one thousand, three hundred dollars (\$1,300) to apply on the purchase price of the church.
2. On August 22, 1945 we received the deed to the Greenwood church.
3. On September 22, 1945 we signed a mortgage against the Charleston church to secure a loan from T. B. Nalley of \$477.75 to pay for material used in building said church.
4. About October 15, 1945 we received from the local trustees the deed to the old Greer parsonage.
5. About October 15, 1945 we signed the deed to the old Greer parsonage which sold for \$2,700.
6. Upon request of the Home Mission Board and authority from the Conference President and his Advisory Board on December 31, 1945 we signed a mortgage against the Columbia parsonage property on Anthony Street to secure a loan of \$4,000 from the Federal Home Loan Company of Columbia. Said loan to apply on purchase price of said property. On the same date and same authority we signed a second mortgage to Mrs. Emma Kelly for a loan of \$500.00 to apply on purchase price of said property.
7. On December 31, 1945 we received the deed to the Columbia parsonage property.
8. About February 3, 1946 we signed a deed to a lot from the Landrum church property. The price, \$450, to be used in building the Landrum parsonage.
9. About March 10, 1946 we signed a mortgage against the new Greer parsonage to secure a loan of \$2,000 to be used in construction of said parsonage.
10. On April 1, 1946 we recorded an option to buy within five years from date of option the lot joining the Second Wesleyan church of Greenville. We paid \$250.00 which will apply on the purchase price of \$2,250.00. If no purchase the earnest money is forfeited. The option is dated January 27, 1945.
11. About May 20, 1946 we signed a mortgage against the Airail parsonage property to secure a loan of \$3,600.00 to be used in the building of said parsonage.
12. On July 2, 1946 we paid \$100.00 as an option on a church lot in Columbia on Anthony Street. We are to pay the balance \$900.00 within ninety days.
13. On July 19, 1946 we signed a mortgage against the Landrum parsonage property to secure a loan of \$1,800.00 to be used in building said parsonage.
14. We recommend that all our churches insure their church buildings

and parsonages for an amount of at least two-thirds of their appraised value.
