Journal of Daily Proceeding

The forty-fifth session of the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church convened at the St Johns Church, Portland, Ore. at 7:45 Wednesday evening, August

3Ist. I938. Rev. I.F. McLeister of Syracuse, N.Y., editor of the Wesleyan Methodist, who was present to represent the Connection, preached the conference sermon, using as his text Romans I:I6 and having as his subject "The Spirit of the Pioneer". He broughthelpful thoughts on the spirit, the Gospel, and the work of the pioneer.

Sister McLeister, who came with her husband in the interest of the missionary work of the Connection, spoke a word of greeting to the conference before the sermon.

The first business session of the conference was held Thursday at 9:00 a.m. Rev. Betzer, Conference Pres, read the Scripture lesson and Rev. D.H.Scott led in prayer.

After being tendered the chair by the president, Rev. I.F.McLeister spoke of his pleasure in being allowed to visit the Western Conferences and then opened the session for busiress. (4)

Resolutions

We, the Committee on Resolutions, submit the following: Viewing with alarm the declension of spiritual life and moral integrity, and sensing our responsibility to God and humanity in this our day and generation, let it be resolved:

(I) To reaffirm our faith in the Bible as the inspired Word of God, and in its procepts and teachings as the proper rule and standard

of life and conduct.

I2) To reaffirm our confidence in the Discipline and standards of our church, and deplore any tendency to compromising in such matters as desecrating the Lord's Day, immodesty in dress, wearing of gold and superfluous adornment or other forms of worldliness.

(3) That we "lift up our voice like a trumpet, cry aloud and spare not, show my people their transgressions, and the house of Israel their sin." That we view with alarm the increase of intemperance and sensuality, the breaking down of moral standards, the falling down of family alters, the prevalence of parental disrespect, the lack of reverence for the house of God even among Christian people.

(4) That we denounce anew the movies and all worldly amusements, popular music, and such literature as tends to distroy the finer sensi-

bilities of the soul.

(5) That we remember to observe fervent love for one another, endeavoring to keep the unity

of the spirit in the bond of peace.

(6) That we seek to carry on an intensive program of evangelism within our conference boarders to meet the false teachings of this day.

(7) That we take a bold stand against the isms of today, that seek to undermine men's faith in God and tear down the fundimental principles upon which our nation was founded; for let us remember "Righteousness exalteth a nation but sin is a reproach to any people."

Report No. 6 Plan of Work Committee

We, the Committee on Plan of Work hereby recommend the following:

(I) This plan of work be read quarterly in

each society.

(2) That we observe the "Red Letter Days" by holding a special service for each occasion.

(a) Harvest day for educational work.

Month: ctober and November, and that each society raise one fourth of the church educational budget.

(b) Easter - Programs and offerings for Hephzebah. Months: March and April, and that each society raise the assignment of five dollars for this occasion.

(c) Each society observe the "World Day

of Prayer"

- (d) May Day For nome missions. Months May and June and each society raise the assessment of six dollars as far as possible.
- (e) Wesleyan Missionary Day Month, July. Each hold a public service for the purpose of presenting the "Wesleyan Missionary" in effort to secure subscriptions.
- (3) Twenty-five cents per member be sent through the conference treasurer for general fund. Also twenty-five cents per member be retained in the conference treasury and the remaining fifty cents be used directly for missionary work and be applied on the church budget. We urge that all money be sent through the conference treasurer.
- (4) All books be closed and money sent in fourteen days before the opening of the annual conference sessions. No money will be received after the conference and local treasurer's books are closed.

(5) All members pay their dues directly to

the local treasurer.

(6) We continue the use of quadrenhial books and that they be brought to conference with all receipts to be graded by a committee authorized to do so. Also strive to measure up to the efficiency standard in our societies and put the grade on the report.

(7) We urge the use of programs printed in the Vesleyan Missionary and other tracts as

they are supplied from headquarters.

(8) That each society elect a solicitor

for the Wesleyan Missionary.

(9) We urge that each teacher of the Sunday School use Y.M.W.B. membership cards for the purpose of raising dues. Arrange with the S.S. Supt. for a Y.M.V.B. march on Missionary Punday, and we advocate the use of interesting methods to encourage S.S. pupils in giving Y.M.V.B. offerings.

(IO) That each society contribute two vegitable bowls and one milk pitcher or cash for same, also canned goods and vegitables

for dinning tent.

(II) We suggest that each society appraise their canned goods and vegitables according to the price set by the camp association. Presidents of societies may secure a price list from the dining room clerk.

(I2) We urge that the prayer cycles supplied by the conference president be used in each

society.

(I3) That the president of each society appoint a committee of two to visit the sick.

(I4) We suggest that the president of each society arrange with the pastor for one public prayer meeting each month to pray especially for the mission work both home and abroad.
