STANDING RULES

- No. 1 On Literature: Inasmuch as our denominational literature, because of its loyalty to the doctrines of our Church and because of its position on all questions of reform, is of such a nature as to promote and more fully establish our principles; and inasmuch as we consider it the duty and privilege of pastors and lay members of our denomination to extend its distribution: Therefore be it Resolved, That we as a Conference pledge ourselves to extend our literature as much as possible, that we use our best endeavor to place our lesson helps and papers in all our Sabbath Schools.
- No. 2 Board of Trustees Report for Final Action: Resolved, That all matters involving the expenditure of money to be appropriated from the Conference Treasuries, be referred to the Board of Trustees for their consideration and to be reported back by them to the Conference for final action.
- No. 3 General Conference Delegate: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that no person should accept the position as delegate to the General Conference unless he expects to be present during the entire session. The President is requested to communicate this resolution to the delegates three weeks before the General Conference begins.
- No. 4 Evangelists' Report: Resolved, That it is the sense of this Conference that all Conference and General Evangelists be requested to report their work and financial receipts to each Annual Conference.
- No. 5 Closing Treasurer's Books: The Conference Treasurer is hereby authorized to close his books two weeks before the Annual Conference convenes, therefore all receipts and monies should be in his hands by that time if credit on Statistical Report is desired.
- No. 6 Salary: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that the minimum salary of an ordained minister on one of our Charges shall be parsonage and one thousand dollars.
- No. 7 Temperance: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that we are definitely committed to the maintenance of the Eighteenth Amendment and to the rigid enforcement of the same according to the Volstead Act.
- No. 8 Pastor's Finance: Resolved, That a pastor is justified in refusing to accept a call to any Charge refusing to assume financial obligations.

- No. 9 Reporting Sunday School Statistics: The pastors in reporting the Sunday School Statistics under item IV shall give actual number of officers, teachers and scholars on lines 2, 3, 4; on line 5 the total number of persons in the school, exclusive of the Cradle Roll and Home Department; on line 9 the sum of lines 5, 7, 8 and 12.
- No. 10 Reading of Reports: Resolved, That in the reading of the Pastor's Statistical Report it is obligatory to read only items 3, 9 and 10.
- No. 11 Adjustment of Pastor's Salary: Resolved, That churches which enter into a financial agreement with the pastor shall when needful, make adjustment of this obligation at each quarterly meeting. A full settlement of the pastor's salary shall be made before the time of the Annual Conference.

JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Pre-Conference Sermon

The opening sermon of the Conference was preached the evening of April 6, 1937 in the Houghton Church by Rev. Maurice A. Gibbs from Judges 18:10 on, "The Best Place in the World."

Wednesday Morning Meeting, April 7, 1937

The Lockport Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its Seventy-sixth Annual Session at the Houghton Wesleyan Methodist Church in Houghton, New York on April 7, 1937 at 9:00 a. m.

Opening.—The President, Rev. Edward L. Elliott, called the Conference to order and conducted the devotionals.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and 18 ministers and 12 delegates were marked present.

Substitution.—The name of Mae Wolfer was substituted for that of Hazel Wilklow as delegate from Higgins charge.

Bar of Conference.—The bar of Conference was fixed as the first five rows of seats across the front of the church.

Time of Meetings.—The time for opening and closing of the meetings of Conference was fixed as follows: Morning meeting opening at nine and closing at noon; the afternoon meeting opening at one-thirty and closing by vote of the Conference.

Temporary Organization.—The Committee on Temporary Organization submitted its report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 1.)

Committee on Religious Services.—The Committee on Religious Services submitted its report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 2.)

Orders of the Day.—The election of Conference Officials was made an Order of the Day for Thursday morning following devotionals.

Substitution.—The name of Charles Sicard was substituted for that of J. S. Luckey on the Committee for Auditing the Statistical Reports.

Recess.—A recess was voted for Conference work.

Called to Order.—At 11:35 the Conference was called to order by the President.

Standing Rule Rescinded.—It was voted to rescind Standing Rule No. 9.

Adjournment.—After a few announcements the meeting was adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction was given by Rev. Walter Readett.

Wednesday Afternoon Meeting, April 7, 1937

Opening.—The President called the meeting to order and the devotions were conducted by Rev. William Osgood.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Committee Reports.—The Committee on Ministerial Character made a partial report.

Names Called.—The names of C. I. Armstrong, Lynford Sicard, C. H. Dow, Price Stark and Helen Stark were called, communications were read from them and their characters passed.

President's Report.—Brother Sicard was called to the Chair and the President, Rev. Edward L. Elliott, made his official report. (See Report No. 3.)

Considering Report.—It was voted to consider the report item by item.

Recommendation Referred to Committee.—It was voted to elect a committee to consider the first recommendation of the President. The committee elected was as follows: N. R. Shaffer, Chairman; E. L. Elliott, Maurice A. Gibbs, Charles Sicard, David Anderson.

Recommendation Adopted.—It was voted to adopt the second recommendation of the President's report.

Official Acts Accepted.—It was voted to accept the President's Official Acts.

Communion Service

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived the meeting was turned over to Rev. A. A. Hickok who had charge of the communion service and was assisted by various pastors of the Conference.

Adjournment.—Adjourned by vote of the Conference. Benediction by the Rev. George N. Osgood.

Wednesday Evening Service

At the religious service Wednesday evening Rev. G. I. Norman preached a sermon on the "Holy Spirit."

Thursday Morning Meeting, April 8, 1937

Opening.—The Conference was called to order by the President and Rev. E. H. Johnson conducted the devotionals. Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

Substitution.—The name of Mae McClenahan was substituted for that of Doran Moore as delegate from the Rich Valley Church.

Floral Tribute.—It was voted to take an offering to buy flowers for Dr. J. S. Luckey. Brother Wyman was made committee in charge.

Courtesies.—Dr. and Mrs. I. F. McLeister and Rev. J. B. Cowan were introduced to the Conference and made a few remarks.

Committee Reports.—The Committee on the President's first recommendation made a partial report.

Election.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, the President appointed Adrian Everts, Arthur Osgood, Millard Luce and Elmer Hudson as tellers and the Conference proceeded with the election of its officials which resulted as follows:

President.—On the first ballot for President E. L. Elliott received 28 of 40 votes cast and was declared elected.

Vice-President.—On the first ballot for Vice-President A. J. Taylor received 29 of 39 votes cast and was declared elected.

Secretary.—On the first ballot for Secretary James R. Redstone received 37 of 39 votes cast and was declared elected.

Treasurer.—On the first ballot for Treasurer George N. Osgood received 38 of 42 votes cast and was declared elected.

Sunday School Secretary.—On the first ballot for Sunday School Secretary Adrian Everts received 23 of 42 votes cast and was declared elected.

Tithing Secretary.—On the first ballot for Tithing Secretary Maurice A. Gibbs received 38 of 42 votes cast and was declared elected.

Educational Secretary.—On the ballot for Educational Secretary Arthur Osgood received 27 of 40 votes cast and was declared elected.

Statistical Secretary.—On the first ballot for Statistical Secretary George Failing received 37 of 42 votes cast and was declared elected.

Itineracy and Orders.—On the ballot for member of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders A. J. Taylor received 40 of 43 votes cast and was declared elected.

Trustees.—For the ministerial members of the Board of Trustees Joseph R. Pitt received 31 of 42 votes cast and David Anderson received 35 of 43 votes cast and they were declared elected.

Educational Service

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, the service was turned over to the representatives of Houghton College who conducted the Educational Service.

Adjournment.—After a few announcements Conference was adjourned by limitation of time,

Thursday Afternoon Meeting, April 8, 1937

Opening.—The President called the Conference to order and Rev. J. B. Cowan conducted the devotionals.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Election Continued.—The election was continued which resulted as follows:

Trustee.—On the first ballot for lay member of the Board of Trustees Orval H. Howard received 23 of 30 votes cast and was declared elected.

Assistant Secretary.—It was voted to have the Secretary nominate his own assistant. He nominated Walter Readett. It was voted to approve the nomination.

Standing Committees.—The nominations of the Standing Committees was referred to the Committee on Temporary Organization.

Courtesies.—Rev. and Mrs. John Mann, Rev. Alfred E. Payea and Rev. O. G. McKinley were introduced to Conference and made a few remarks

Committee Reports.—The Committee on the President's Recommendation on Evangelism made its report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 4.)

President Excused.—The President called the Vice-President to the Chair and was excused from Conference.

Excused from Conference.—Rev. E. H. Johnson was excused from Conference.

Characters Passed.—The names of James R. Redstone, David Anderson, Maurice A. Gibbs, A. A. Hickok, G. I. Norman, William Osgood, Olga Marie Norman, E. H. and Zelia Johnson were called and their characters passed.

Conference Sermon

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, the President, Rev. Edward L. Elliott, brought the Conference Sermon.

Substitution.—The name of Gertrude Verbridge was substituted for that of Louise Wolfer and the name of Millard Luce for that of Iva Avers on the Committee on Post Office Addresses.

Adjournment.—Adjourned by vote of the Conference. Benediction by Rev. A. A. Hickok.

Thursday Evening Service

At the evening service Rev. Charles Sicard preached on "Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

Friday Morning Meeting, April 9, 1937

Opening.—After devotions conducted by Rev. Gordon Thurber the President called the Conference to order.

Committee Reports.—The Committee on Standing Committees made their report which was adopted as read. (See Front of Minutes.)

To Preach Opening Sermon.—Rev. Adrian Everts was elected to preach the opening sermon at the next session of Conference with Rev. George Failing as alternate.

Next Annual Session.—The Conference voted to accept the invitation to hold their next session of Conference at Fillmore to be assisted by the Higgins Church.

Places of Future Conferences.—A committee on the places of future Conferences was elected as follows: N. R. Shaffer, Chairman; M. A. Gibbs, A. J. Taylor, Frieda Gillette and Louise Wolfer.

New Books.—The Secretary was instructed to purchase a new Secretary's Journal and a new Treasurer's Cash Book.

Minutes Printed.—The Secretary was authorized to have 325 copies of the minutes printed and distributed.

W. Y. P. S. Minutes.—It was voted to invite the W. Y. P. S. to print their minutes and statistics in the printed Conference Journal.

Record of Attendance.—It was voted to print the record of attendance in the Journal.

Standing Rule No. 9.—It was voted to accept the resolution of the Statistical Committee to be the new Standing Rule No. 9. (See Report No. 5.)

Name Called.—The name of C. E. Woodhead was called and his character was passed.

Courtesies.—Rev. J. F. Wright of the Champlain Conference was introduced to Conference and made a few remarks.

Name Called.—The name of J. E. Bruce was called and his character was passed.

Ransomville Reports.—Mrs. Beulah Markell read the Statistical Report from Ransomville and gave a report of the work.

Name Called.—The name of J. R. Pitt was called and his character was passed.

Connectional Address

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, the meeting was turned over to Dr. I. F. McLeister who gave the Connectional Address.

Adjournment.—Adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by Rev. J. R. Pitt.

Friday Afternoon Meeting, April 9, 1937

Opening.—After devotions conducted by Rev. Arthur Osgood and special prayer for Brother Thompson the President called the Conference to order.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Committee Reports.—The Budget Committee made its report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 6.)

Names Called.—The names of N. R. Shaffer, Charles Sicard, Mae K. Shaffer and A. J. Taylor were called and their characters were passed.

Religious Service

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, the meeting was turned over to Dr. I. F. McLeister who preached on "The Fire of God."

Adjournment.—Adjourned by vote of the Conference. Benediction by Rev. George N. Osgood.

Friday Evening Service

At the evening service Rev. N. R. Shaffer preached on "Nevertheless I have something against thee." Rev. 2:4.

Saturday Morning Meeting, April 10, 1937

Opening.—After Rev. Maurice A. Gibbs led the devotionals and gave an oral report as Tithing Secretary the President called the Conference to order.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the Members of the Lockport Conference, Greetings:

We are gathered in the name of our Lord Jesus to review the works of the past year and to plan for the year ahead. I believe we should set definite goals. We should lay our plans to do definite things and then make our best attempt to accomplish. I know that certain of our pastors have done this in relation to the contributions to the benevolences and they have succeeded. We may well fix objectives to achieve as students and as evangelists.

I desire to express at this time my appreciation of the courtesy and cooperation which has been shown to me during the six years past. I shall ask you, when the election is held, to choose some one else to fill the place of President.

RESOLUTION TO THE SENATORS FROM NEW YORK

Whereas the President of the United States has requested the Congress to enact a measure empowering him to reorganize the Supreme Court by appointing six new and additional Judges, and

Whereas, the clear and evident purpose of this enactment is to render the Court subservient to the will of the Chief Executive and thus destroy the judicial independence of the great division of our government. Be it therefore resolved:

- 1. That we do hereby solemnly protest against this unamerican method of enlarging the power of the President and laying the foundation for a dictatorship which would inevitably destroy our American way of life.
- 2. That we do hereby request the United States Senators from our State of New York to vote against this destructive measure, and do all in their power to defeat its passage.
