# Standing Rules

- 1. The Conference fiscal year close June 30, and that the local church fiscal year close May 31, and that all money for which credit is to be given must be postmarked not later than June 15, and that the Auxiliary Conference Treasurers' reports be in the hands of the Conference Treasurer on or before June 25, and that each pastor shall submit to the Conference Treasurer, prior to the close of the conference year, his budget check sheet with receipts covering same, and his statistical blank completed, except for the budget section; that the Conference Treasurer, upon completion of the budget section, forward the statistical forms to the Statistical Secretary—said form not to be returned to the pastors until the Conference Session.
- 2. That the President of the Woman's Missionary Society and of the W.Y.P.S. be members of the Missionary Board by virtue of their office
- 3. That a Nominating Committee composed of four elders and the President, ex-officio, be elected by ballot and that this group upon arrival at conference select 2 properly elected delegates elect to serve with them; and that they bring their report at the first session of the ensuing annual conference.
- 4. Regarding the time and place of the Annual Conference. The Annual Conference of the Wisconsin Wesleyan Methodist Church shall convene the Third Monday in July at 8:00 P.M. in the Tabernacle of the Burr Campground—located 7 miles west of Hillsboro on Highway 33.
- 5. That the Election of the Conference Officers be Wednesday morning, 10:00 of Conference Week.
- 6. The Superannuate Ministers' Board be elected for a term of three years. The first member be elected for one year, the second member for two years, and the third member for three years.
- 7. The Missionary Board shall hold a business meeting during Conference and on the first Tuesday of October, January, and April. Any business should be transacted at the call of the Chairman.
- 8. Each church permit its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay, to be absent on vacation over one Sunday.
- 9. If the Missionary Board calls a pastor to hold a revival on a Mission point that his church give him two weeks leave with pay.
- 10. That pastors' reports be read and the statistical reports be posted on a bulletin board at the Annual Conference Session.
- 11. That all local treasurers remit quarterly the money raised by their organization to their proper conference treasurers, who in turn will send a quarterly report to the conference treasurer.

# Journal of Daily Proceedings

Conference Sermon—The Rev. Harold Keller, pastor of the Darrow Road Wesleyan Methodist Church brought to us the conference sermon on Tuesday morning, July 19, 1955.

The subject of the message which God had laid on his heart was "The Challenge of God's Word." Rev. Keller read to us I Cor. 11:28, James 1:22-25, and II Tim. 3:16, 17.

He brought to us thoughts concerning the challenges in the portion read from II Tim. 3:16, 17. The doctrinal challenge, the challenge of reproof and correction, the challenge of instruction, and the challenge to service.

Rev. Keller then brought to our attention some of the commands of God's Word, using examples from Paul's life as illustrations.

- 1. God's command of full surrender-Phil. 3:13
- 2. God's command to love-I Cod. 13
- 3. God's command for faith. Elijah's prayer for drought and then for rain.
- 4. God's command for prayer—pray without ceasing.
- 5. God's command for courage—Moses' message to Joshua when he installed him as leader.

In conclusion he asked the questions, What have we accomplished this past year. How has God been able to use us?

Then the command for the future found in II Chron. 7:14—"If my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and will heal their land."

After the soul searching message by Rev. Keller we met around the tables and partook of the emblems representing the broken body and shed blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Rev. David Peterson, pastor at Appleton, Wis. had charge of this part of the service.

W.M.S.—Occupy Till I Come

W.Y.P.S. — Increased staff

He stated our two greatest concerns should be: That we be Bible Christians and as nearly a New Testament Church as possible.

- 2. That the Conference President's salary be \$50.00 per week and he receive in addition, \$750.00 travel expense, \$400.00 for rent and \$200.00 to be applied on utilities.
- 3. That fees of \$50.00 be paid to the Conference Secretary and \$75.00 to the Conference Treasurer out of the Conference Administrative Fund.
- 4. That the first Sunday of the 1955 Camp be designated for Conference work, and offerings taken that day be for that purpose.
- 5. That the Rally Day Sunday School offering of 1955 be designated for Conference Work Fund.
- 6. That each pastor meet no less than quarterly with his local treasurers (both church and auxiliary) to properly ascertain the amount that each remits for budget credit.

# **Ballinger Educational Fund**

I. **Purpose:** The preparation and improvement of the ministry of the Wisconsin Conference.

### II. Provisions for Disbursement:

- 1. That \$500.00 be maintained as a permanent balance to be placed in a savings account at the highest available interest.
  - 2. That \$1000.00 be available for student loans.
- 3. That the remainder be used for Conference short term loans, payable in one year, at 4% interest.

# III. Policy for Distribution of Student Loans:

- 1. That the applicant's financial status and other contributing factors be primary considerations.
- 2. That the educational committee reserve the right to approve or disapprove all applications.
- 3. That priority be given to those preparing for Christian service.
  - 4. That recipients be pursuing a college course or its equivalent.
  - 5. That each individual receive not more than \$400.
- 6. That applications and declaration of needs be sent to the Educational secretary.

# IV. Payment of Loans:

- 1. That no interest be paid while in school.
- 2. That those entering Christian service pay interest:
  - a) 1% 1st year
  - b) 2% 2nd year
  - c) 3% 3rd year
  - d) 4% 4th and subsequent years
- 3. That those entering secular work pay interest:
  - a) 4% 1st year; b. 5% 2nd year; c. 6% 3rd and subsequent years
