

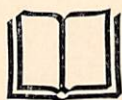

1. All Trustees of the Oklahoma Conference shall reside within the bounds of the Conference.
2. When a pastor provides his own place of residence rent from the regular parsonage shall be paid to said pastor.
3. The Conference treasurer shall close his books on June 20, and the budget funds shall be sent in immediately. No budget credit shall be given after that date. Money received after this date shall be applied on next year's business.
4. The Conference Trustees shall be the committee on Church and Parsonage building and location.
5. The Committee on Religious Services shall consist of the Conference President, WMS president, WY president, and the conference president's Advisory Board.
6. Annual Conference and Camp shall convene concurrently on the third Monday of July at 7:00 p. m.
7. A nominating Committee shall be elected composed of three elders, one of which shall be the Conference President as chairman, ex-officio, and the delegates elect from two churches designated by the annual conference. These churches are to be designated in alphabetical order. This committee shall first examine the credentials of all delegates to the annual conference and secondly, nominate all sessions committees not already provided for and to be prepared to report at the first meeting of annual conference.
8. The Conference year shall end on May 31, and all statistical reports shall be based on monies received up to and including that date. Budget funds on hand by the auxiliary departments of the church should be sent to their respective conference treasurers as soon as possible after that date. Credit for budget funds not paid to the conference treasurer may be given in any of these three ways as the pastor or budget secretary may choose.
 - a. All budget receipts may be sent to the conference treasurer and he will enter them and send them back with a statement of the total credit for each item.
 - b. The pastor or budget secretary may tabulate the receipts he has, then send the conference treasurer a statement of the credit for receipts he desires on each item.
 - c. Instead of sending receipts or a statement, the conference treasurers will give credit by receipt for the difference on each item as shown by the report and his books. In order to do this, it will be necessary for the treasurer to get the reports by June 20. (See standing rule 3&18)
9. Two copies of each written report shall be given to the secretary of the conference. These shall be typewritten and double spaced. Size of paper, 8½ by 11 inches.
10. The conference treasurer shall be a member of the Finance Committee, and an honorary member of the conference body, with a right to speak, but not to vote.
11. The Annual Conference shall elect a Spiritual Life Conference Committee composed of seven members. This committee shall plan for the coming together of Christian workers of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. This committee includes the Conference W.M.S. President, W.Y. President and the

- Conference President. The Conference President shall appoint a chairman of the Spiritual Life Committee.
2. Since considerable expense of transferring automobile title and license attends the moving of a pastor from one state to another, we recommend that where possible the calling church bear this expense.
 3. In case of a change of pastors, the outgoing pastor shall assume his duties on the new field on the Sunday following Conference and Camp. The financial obligations of the previous charge shall terminate the last Sunday of Conference and Camp.
 4. The conference treasurer shall be paid \$50.00 and the conference secretary \$25.00 annually for their services.
 5. The conference president and the conference presidents of the W.M.S. and the W.Y. shall serve as members of the Conference Church Extension and Evangelism Board, with five other members.
 6. The conference president shall appoint the Conference Auditing Committee. This committee shall audit the conference treasurer's books prior to conference. All other conference officials who have financial reports shall submit their account books, receipts, check books cancelled checks, and the latest bank statement to the Auditing Committee on the first day of the conference session.
 7. The Conference body recommends that each pastor and the conference president, while employed as full-time conference president, be given a two-week vacation, exclusive of the Conference and Camp session. This vacation is to include two Sundays with pay.
 8. Each pastor shall send a complete statistical report to the conference treasurer for his signature not later than June 30, and he, in return, will send the complete statistical report to the chairman of the Statistical Committee. All financial statistics, with the exception of budget items, be reported to the nearest dollar.
 9. The chairman of the Statistical Committee, the chairman of Memorials Committee shall be elected a year ahead of Annual Conference and their names included in the Minutes with the standing committees.
 10. Each church shall be entitled to count in local Sunday School attendance the number of their members in attendance at Sunday School at the location of the Annual Conference. The responsibility of identification shall rest with the visiting members and the Sunday School Secretary of the host church.
 11. The budget, not including Sunday School assessments, shall be figured on the full membership as reported in Item III of the Statistical Report of the current conference minutes. The Sunday School assessments shall be figured from the total number in the main school as reported in Item IV of said minutes.
 12. The conference secretary is authorized to prepare short form blanks of pastor's report on conference floor each year.
 13. The Religious Services Committee shall prepare a mimeographed agenda; and a copy of the same to be sent to each pastor prior to conference and a supply to be available at conference time for ministers and delegates. Said agenda to list time

- various committees are to report; name of one to bring devotion at each meeting, and dates and hours for special services.
24. We recommend that the local churches pay one-half of local pastor's Social Security assessment, based on salary paid by local church.
 25. The pastor of any church in the conference shall be free to hold at least one revival meeting during the year, wherever he sees fit, and it is recommended that his salary be paid to him while he is absent.
 26. We recommend that the expense of printing the Conference Minutes be shared proportionately by the Conference, the W.M.S. and the Wesleyan Youth.
 27. There shall be a Conference Board of Managers of the Oklahoma Conference. The membership shall consist of the Conference President, chairman; the Conference Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary; one member of the following boards: Trustees, Camp Meeting, Church Extension and Evangelism; the latter three members shall be nominated by their respective boards and elected by the conference body. The membership shall consist of not less than four elders and not less than two laymen. No one member shall serve in double capacity, i.e., as a representative of more than one of these groups. They shall act as a Ways and Means Committee during the interim of conference. They shall supervise and direct expenditure of conference working funds. They shall act as a standing committee on finance. They shall receive quarterly reports from the Board of Trustees, Church Extension and Evangelism, and such other reports as the Board shall designate. The Board shall be amenable to the conference body and the Discipline of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
 28. Pastors are required to stay for all of the conference sessions and camp meeting services unless excused by the conference body.

JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Monday July 15, 1963

OPENING: The sixtieth annual session of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America was held at the First Wesleyan Methodist Church of Enid, Oklahoma. The first meeting was called to order by the President, Rev. Joe C. Sawyer, July 15, 1963 at 7:00 P.M. Rev. Howard L. Speas, host pastor, led in a word of prayer.

ROLL CALL: Sixteen ministers and eleven delegates responded to the roll call.

CONFERENCE BAR: The Conference Bar was fixed as the first five rows and the rostrum of the church auditorium

RELIGIOUS SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT: This committee read its report and was adopted by motion. See Report No. 1.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE REPORT: Adopted. See Report No. 2

ADJOURNMENT. Adjournment by motion.

Tuesday July 16, 1963

MESSAGE: Dr. Claude Reis gave a stirring message on Praise.

CALL TO ORDER: The call to order was given by the Conference President.

ROLL CALL: Twenty ministers and nineteen delegates responded to roll call.

VICE PRESIDENT CALLED TO THE CHAIR: The Vice President assumed the chair vacated by the Conference President.

COURTESY COMMITTEE: This committee presented Dr. Paul L. Kindschi, Executive Secretary of Wesleyan Sunday Schools, to the body. He gave words of greeting.

CONFERENCE PRESIDENT'S REPORT: The Conference President, Rev. Joe C. Sawyer, presented his annual report of official acts and was accepted by action of a motion.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT: The Conference President gave a financial statement in regards to his official acts and activities. This was accepted and referred to the auditing committee. See Report No. 3.

MOTION: A motion was supported inviting Dr. Kindschi, Denominational Representative, to take the chair for the remainder of this sixtieth session. Carried.

REPORT: Conference Treasurer, Mr. Raymond Tolle, read his report and was received and referred to auditing committee. See Report No. 4.

REPORT: The Pension Plan Treasurer read his report and was received and referred to the auditing committee. See Report No. 5.

MOTION: A motion to leave the unpaid balance of the 1962-63 pension plan assessments in the hands of the Board of Managers was carried.

REPORT: The Tithing Secretary read his report and was adopted by motion. See Report No. 6.

REPORT: The Spiritual Life Treasurer read his report and was accepted and referred to auditing committee. See Report No. 7.

REPORT: The Conference Sunday School Secretary read his report and was accepted and referred to the auditing committee. See Report No. 8.

REPORT: Secretary of Evangelism read his report and was adopted by motion. See Report No. 9.

REPORT: Burial Association Secretary read his report and was accepted by motion. See Report No. 10.

MOTION: That the conference elect a committee to investigate the possibilities of medical and hospitalization insurance for ministers. Carried.

ELECTION: The following were elected to the committee on ministerial medical and hospital insurance: H. L. Speas, Chairman, and Albert Hughes.

REPORT: The Secretary of the Board of Trustees read his report and was received by motion. See Report No. 11.

MOTION: A motion to recess. Carried.

REPORT: The C.Y.C. Director read her report and was accepted by motion. See Report No. 12.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the delegates, members, and friends of the Sixtieth Oklahoma Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America here assembled, greetings.

Our hearts are lifted to God in gratitude and praise for His help and blessings as we submit to you this our third annual report.

We express sincere thanks to you our esteemed pastors and faithful laymen over the conference for your assistance and cooperation throughout this past year.

A year ago we faced a heavy load as new projects were undertaken. It was a real step of faith, but God has rewarded graciously this venture of stepping out on the never-failing promises of God.

The records will show appreciable gains in membership as well as a good year financially. The obligations were heavy, but the Lord has so wonderfully brought us through. The Lord always meets the needs as the needs are created. We must never hesitate to move forward because of a lack of needed funds; if we did, we would never move. The need must be created in order for God to meet it.

Tulsa has enjoyed a good year. Better days are yet ahead for the church there. Guymon has made good strides, and the future is very bright for Wesleyan Methodism in the Panhandle. Shreveport is beginning to show signs of some progress. Some odds have been against them due to the need of a proper place of worship. The conference has two registered CYC groups Cadets and Heralds, and two Directors who have passed the requirements of ten hours study for certification. Much interest is evidenced in several churches with prospects for new units to begin in the Fall.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE BOARD OF MANAGERS

This is a report of the Conference Board of Managers as it pertains to recommendations on finance, orders on the treasury, and official acts.

September 16, 1962 Enid, Oklahoma

Recommendation that this year's conference budget be considered paid in full if only 11/12 of it is paid. This is due to the eleven month year.

Moved and supported to pay the balance of the 1961-1962 Pension Plan deficit, that the balance in the Pension Plan Fund be used, and the remainder of the deficit be taken out of the Camp Meeting Fund.

It was moved and supported to pay the \$40. moving expense of Rev. John Newell to Dallas and the balance of \$84. for moving expense of Rev. David Kellin to Etna.

The Conference Treasurer was directed to pay the October, November and December car payments for Rev. Richard Ernst, pioneer pastor at Guymon; and that this be paid out of the Pioneer Fund.

It was moved and supported to set Rev. Richard Ernst's salary at \$50.00 a week, and to begin when he moves to Guymon field.

January 15, 1963 Alva, Oklahoma

It was recommended that the \$50.00 per week salary for the Guymon pastor be continued along with all utilities. It was also recommended that the Guymon Church pay $\frac{1}{2}$ of the salary and all of the utilities.

It was moved and supported that the Conference pay the first annual premium of the Guymon Church building.

It was moved and supported that after the Tulsa fund is exhausted that the care for the Tulsa obligations be taken out of the Reserve Building Fund.

April 25, 1963 Enid, Oklahoma

In view of the financial strength of the Guymon Church, it was moved to adjust the pastor's supplemental salary to \$15 per week and that the local church pay \$35. per week.

It was moved and supported that a short loan be made from the Conference Endowment Fund in an amount sufficient to pay off the delinquent Blackwell-Jamieson note.

June 10, 1963 Enid, Oklahoma

It was moved and supported that in the case of death of one of our conference pastors, officials and/or their wives, that a memorial or flowers be given in behalf of the conference. The amount was set at \$5.00.

It was moved and supported that we accept payments on principle ahead of the due date on the Tolle (\$1500) note. Such payments are to be placed in a Revolving Building Loan Fund.

(Board of Managers Cont)

The Conference Treasurer was instructed to transfer enough funds from any available funds to cover any deficit which may occur at the end of the conference year.

July 10, 1963 Enid, Oklahoma

It was moved and supported that we recommend to the Conference that the conference budget be set for the coming year as follows;

- We recommend that the Conference President be paid a basic salary of \$3,000 per year, and be furnished a home to live in wherever he feels it to be best located for his work. Furthermore, we recommend that all utilities be paid. We further recommend that the Conference President be given the privilege to supplement his salary by holding up to four revivals outside the conference and as many as he feels advisable within the Conference.
- We recommend that the following be added as a standing rule: "We recommend that the expense of printing the Conference Minutes be shared proportionately by the Conference, the WMS and the Youth."
- That the Conference President, Vice President, and Advisory Board be paid 8 cents per mile for all miles traveled, regardless of how they are traveled, on official conference business; and that all others be paid 5 cents per mile for all miles traveled on official conference business.
- We recommend that the Conference President and Conference Secretary be authorized to secure secretarial assistance and needed office supplies.
- We recommend that the Conference (1) Tithing Secretary, (2) Secretary of Evangelism, (3) CYC Director, (4) Card Call Secretary, (5) Wesleyan Men Secretary, (6) Temperance Secretary, (7) Secretary of the Burial Association, and (8) Educational Secretary be given permission to request needed funds for their departments, and that an offering be taken by each church visited for their expense.
- We further recommend, beginning with the sixtieth session of Annual Conference and the 1963 Minutes, that the reporting of the Conference Board of Managers to the Annual Conference include:
 1. Recommendations on finance
 2. Orders on the treasury
 3. And all unreported official acts.

Each society and church of our conference has had a part in carrying the gospel message to fields abroad and fields at home. The thrill of giving is reflected in the grand total receipts this year of \$9,887.00. This is just below last year's total, but this year we had only eleven months.

In total W.M.S. membership we saw a gain, thanks to your good response to the last membership drive of the year.

Your wholehearted acceptance of the missionary conventions was certainly wonderful. The fall tour with the Heavilins covered ten of our churches.
