PASTORAL RELATIONS—The President read the final report of the Committee on Pastoral Relations. Report adopted. (See report No. 2).

The minutes were read and approved.

The Conference voted to adopt the minutes of the entire session.

VACATION—William D. James presented President Johnston \$104.00 from the Conference with which to take a week of rest and vacation. The Conference gave the president a standing vote of appreciation.

By vote the Conference adjourned *sine die* at 11:10 p. m.

Standing Rules

1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

2. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.

3. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds for an expansion program or to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. Whenever money is borrowed for use of a local church the local church shall agree to and be responsible for its payment.

4. In case of necessity in order that a duly authorized expansion, building, remodeling or relocating program may be carried out; or in case of the claim of a municipal government, state highway department, or any other governmental agency, the trustees of the South Carolina Conference be and they hereby are duly empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which transfer or sale is requested (this writing to become a part of the permanent record of the trustees), and where the sale or transfer of such conference, church, parsonage, or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board, and provided further that the trustees and the President of the said Conference are satisfied that the object for which the transaction is sought is both necessary and desirable. (1961)

5. During the interim of Annual Conference the Board of Church Extension and Evangelism shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Mountain Missions and Conference Missions, for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the

President and at least one-half the other members of the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism, or signed by the President in behalf of the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism.

6. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a church building or a parsonage or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is advised to consult with the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location in the early stages of planning and final plans must be approved by said Board. (1964)

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

7. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.

8. Conference shall convene on Monday, after the second Sunday in July. (1964)

9. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close June 15. (1964)

10. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.

11. The Board of Administration shall appoint the Auditing Committee, the Statistician, and the Apportionment Committee at a proper time before Conference. (1966)

12. The Conference Officers shall be a Committee on Agenda for the annual conference sessions. (1966)

13. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.

14. A watch is to be presented as an award to each minister who has given twenty-five years of active service in God's Kingdom while he is a member of the South Carolina Conference. At the end of each minister's active service in this Conference, a certificate of citation is to be given recognizing the total period of active service, provided it is a minimum of twenty years. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and the Secretary. (1967)

15. During the interim of the Annual Conference, the Committee on

Finance shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Minutes, Conference Entertainment, Conference Parsonage, and President's Salary for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference; and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Committee on Finance or signed by the President by order and in behalf of the Committee on Finance. (1957)

16. The local church officers shall be elected within thirty days of the close of the fiscal year of the local church, and they shall take office at the beginning of the fiscal year. (1958)

17. All pastors shall mail their Statistical Reports to the statistician by June 25. (1964)

18. Anyone employed by the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism shall not be a member of the Board. (1959)

19. The joint committee composed of the President and his Advisory Board, the Board of Trustees, and the Board on Church Extension and Conference Evangelism are authorized to draw on monies available in the Conference Budget for Church Extension and Evangelism to aid churches which, in the opinion of this joint committee, are faced by dire emergency.

20. During the interim of the Annual Conference the Conference Trustees shall be duly authorized to draw on funds for Conference Parsonage Maintenance, for the purpose for which it was raised, as the Trustees deem best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least a majority of the Conference Trustees, or signed by the President in behalf of the Conference Trustees.

21. The Conference Officers, President's Advisory Board, Conference Trustees, Committee on Church Extension and Evangelism, and Committee on Finance shall constitute a Conference Board of Administration as provided in paragraph 245 of the 1963 Discipline.

22. When any pastor in the conference is assigned to a church or charge, he is to move his church membership to said church or charge unless other plans are approved by the President and his Advisory Board. (1966)

23. All pastors are required to attend the Annual Conference session unless excused by the President for providential reasons.

Standing Recommendations

1. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold, if possible, a two weeks' revival during the year.

2. That all ministers faithfully tithe their income and that any minister failing to do so shall be considered delinquent in his duty. (1959)

3. That all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.

4. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation, with pay, each year.

5. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project should be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.

6. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve as Quarterly Conference Clerk.

7. We urge all pastors to seek earnestly to raise a full budget and that first consideration be given to the Pension Plan Budget. (1959)

8. That we adhere to Paragraph 132 (2) of our Discipline as long as there are ministers in our Conference who are qualified and who are available to take work. (1959)

9. Any pastor, or church, desiring to invite a convention or rally group other than Wesleyan groups should first secure the approval of the President and his Advisory Board. (1959)

10. It is recommended that all churches have their treasurers bonded.

11. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference, and the church is requested to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary. (1964)

12. The fiscal year of the local church shall end May 31. (1964)

13. All our churches shall use Wesleyan Methodist Sunday School Literature.

14. Any pastor or church desiring to call as evangelist or speaker any who have withdrawn from the Wesleyan Methodist Church, or who have advocated withdrawal from the Church, or who have organized or are serving as pastor of an independent church, or who have advocated or participated in the organization of another denomination, shall first secure the approval of the President and his Advisory Board.

REPORTS

REPORT NO. 1

President's Report

To the 75th annual session of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America: Greetings in the name of our Lord.

It is in the kind providence of God that we are permitted to bring to you our tenth annual report of our activities and a few brief statements as to the condition of the Conference and to make a few observations.

Gladly do I give thanks to God for His presence in my heart, for the measure of health and strength He has given, for protection during many miles of travel, and for His sustaining grace under the pressures of administrative responsibilities. We are also indebted to our fellow conference officials, and many other boards and committees for their advice, counsel and assistance.

STATE OF THE WORK

This year has been characterized by unrest and apprehension. Of necessity, a good part of the year was given to protecting the interests of Wesleyan Methodism rather than expanding these interests.

By action of the Conference Board of Administration and pursuant to the action of the 1966 Conference Session, we terminated Rev. P. B. Pullin's appointment to the Iva church on September 5, 1966. Also, by action of the Conference Board of Administration we assumed the pastoral responsibilities of Iva from September 5 until about February 5, 1967. We made thirty one round trips to Iva, conducted numerous committee meetings, and ministered under pressure and in a tense atmosphere for many weeks.

Following this we assumed the responsibility of the Whitmire, First church whose pastor had resigned and had been appointed to Iva. We preached at Whitmire, and conducted prayer meetings every other week, until Rev. C. R. Tegen was appointed pastor the last Sunday in February.

Numerous trips have been made to try to answer questions as to what merger will mean to us. These questions arose, mainly, in the areas of church government, and standards and practices of Christian living. We sought to correct erroneous reports and to quiet unfounded fears. We thank you for your patience and understanding during these difficult and strenuous days.

The pastor shortage has certainly added to our concern.

SPIRITUALLY

It seems that the resistance against cultivating spiritual living is mounting

in intensity. We must defeat the forces of secularism and materialism that seem to be making inroads into our churches and possibly into our parsonages. This is not meant to be criticism but a note of warning. We must maintain spiritual power in order to do God's work effectively.

In spite of the Laodicean apathy some of our churches seem to have experienced "breakthrough" in revival and harvesting. Four of our churches, together, have taken in approximately seventy five members during this conference year. This is encouraging and we hope it indicates a trend.

NUMERICALLY

We are reporting a loss in full membership of sixty three, or about one member per church. I am not able to evaluate all that might have contributed to this loss. It is a fact that about thirty of those that left us claim the merger as the reason. Also, some who would otherwise be received as full members are received as Junior members in order to save budget payments. Whatever the reason may be, this is deeply disturbing and needs to be corrected. May God help us to pay the required price for an increase.

FINANCIALLY

Forty four churches have paid a full budget this year as compared with 49 in 1966. The total paid for both conference and denominational budgets this year was \$72,129.00 as compared to \$60,050.00 in 1966 which reveals an increase of more than \$12,000 in budget payments.

A glance at previous years statistics of total contributed for all purposes reveals that only about ten per cent of the local church's total receipts go for both the denominational and conference budgets. It seems that a fully paid budget is within the reach of just about all of our churches.

The Rally Day Offering for the purpose of purchasing property in the Mauldin area amounted to \$944.87 making the total amount on hand in the Conference Treasury for this purpose \$5,803.61. The Camp Meeting Sunday offering amounted to \$479.15 in cash.

Total contributed for all purposes in 1966 was \$583,180.91, and in 1967 it was \$679,715.08 an increase of nearly \$100,000.

MATERIAL IMPROVEMENTS

CLEMSON has air-conditioned their sanctuary, installed new windows, redecorated the sanctuary and made other repairs and improvements at a cost of \$7,018.

GREENVILLE, FIRST has installed storm windows and doors at the parsonage, painted the exterior of the church and repaired the church tower at a cost of \$3,100.

They also have plans completed and a commitment of a loan in the amount of \$75,000 for the construction of a Sunday school unit.

SPARTANBURG, FIRST has reroofed the church building, redecorated the sanctuary, razed the old parsonage, graded and fixed the parking area all

at a cost of \$2,555.

GLENWOOD had a ground-breaking service on April 30, 1967, for the construction of a new church that promises to be one of the largest and nicest in the conference.

IVA has liquidated the indebtedness on their parsonage. This was accomplished in approximately six years which was well ahead of schedule.

COLUMBIA has installed two furnaces, replaced the windows, brick veneered the building, changed the main entrance to the side and added a breezeway. The platform has been moved to the opposite end of the sanctuary and the interior is in process of being remodelled. All of this was done at a cost of \$4,109.60 and no debt was incurred in the remodelling. Also, a Wurlitzer organ costing \$2,569.85 was given to the church by a friend.

STARTEX has remodeled and enlarged their parsonage. They added a study, utility room, carport and furnace and brick veneered the entire building at a cost of \$6,761.

CLINTON ROAD has installed a furnace in the church and have done an extensive repair job in the parsonage at a cost of \$2,500.

PICKENS VIEW has enlarged their parsonage at a cost in excess of \$2,000 and has purchased an organ.

GAFFNEY has installed pews at a cost of \$1,670.

EDEN has practically rebuilt its church and Sunday school facilities providing an attractive church edifice. This was done at a cost of \$16,000.

ARIAL has painted its church edifice inside and out and made other repairs at a cost of \$2,500.

BETHANY has added three Sunday school rooms, two rest rooms, two floor furnaces and has made other improvements valued at \$2,400.

For other improvements you are referred to The Challenger.

OBSERVATIONS

We cannot ignore the subtle forces that are at work trying to completely destroy the Christian church in these days. The resistance to the Gospel is increasing. However, it is our firm conviction that we can and must rise above negative thinking and talk victory and progress.

It seems that there are altogether too many signs of a relaxing and lowering our guard against the inroads of a worldly spirit. We can yield to the pressures of the age and discover that when we grow careless at this point we soon become powerless and formal.

During this Conference we will be electing delegates to the General Conference to be held in June of 1968 in Anderson, Indiana. This will be the merging General Conference. It is the responsibility of every Wesleyan Metho-

dist, now that the vote has been taken, to try to make the united church the cleanest, purest, most spiritual and aggressive church that it can possibly be. To that end let us pray and work and be true to God at any cost.

Inasmuch as the Committee on the Observance of the Diamond Anniversary has set up goals for the Conference year, I will not add to them in this report.

LOSS BY DEATH

Four of our elders, Rev. A. D. Horton, Rev. W. R. Padgett, Rev. John Youngblood, and Rev. E. C. Moon, were called home during this conference year. An appropriate Memorial service will be held Wednesday at 3:30 p. m.

REPORT NO. 3
Church Extension And Evangelism

ITEM I.

Business Transactions:

1. We gave \$1,125 to Columbia for the remodeling of the church.
2. The money received from the sale of Buck Creek property, \$700, is to be held in reserve for future development of Mountain Mission work.
3. The Belton tabernacle was sold to Mr. M. T. Haynie, owner of the property that it was located on, for \$300.
4. The Conference President is authorized to proceed with a survey of the Mauldin Area and proceed with the possible organization of a church in this area.
5. Approval was given for the following churches to vote on their pastors: Tuckasegee, C. V. Marchbanks, Sr.; Belton, V. E. Gilreath; North Charleston, J. C. Byars.

ITEM II.

We Recommend:

1. That when it becomes necessary for the Conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by this committee. We further recommend as long as a church receives aid from the Conference, it shall consult this committee before calling a pastor, or before borrowing additional funds.
2. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from this committee before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his church during the year.
3. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference and who desires to move or to live away from said church or change his relation to the charge in any way must first consult this committee.
4. That when this committee is making payments on loans on church property, the payments shall be made directly to the mortgagee.
5. That the Conference President be Sales Manager of the Conference history book.
6. That we continue to assist in the payments on the loan on the North Charleston Parsonage.
7. That we give \$100 per month to Belton for payments on the church building, with the understanding that the church, as they are able, assume as much of the payments as possible.
8. That we pay the pastor of Tuckasegee \$35 a month from the Mountain Mission Budget, effective July 1, 1967.
9. That we pay the pastor of Glenville \$35 a month from the Mountain Mission Budget, effective July 1, 1967.
10. That the Sunday School Rally Day Offering be for church extension or other recommended conference projects.

ITEM III.

Secretary of Church Extension and Evangelism:

1. His duty is to conduct rallies and cultivate interest in church extension and explore prospective fields, and he shall work with and under the direction of this committee.

2. That the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee nominate the Secretary of Church Extension and Evangelism and the Conference elect, and further nominations may be made from the floor.

3. This committee nominates Rev. A. W. Padgett as secretary.

REPORT NO. 4

Finance Committee

We, the Committee on Finance, present the following Denominational Budget per member: World Missions \$2.00; Australia \$0.25; Brainerd \$0.25; Church Extension and Evangelism \$1.50; Pension Plan \$7.00; Church Administration \$2.15; General Conference Expense \$1.00; Hephzibah \$0.50; Education \$5.00; Seminary Foundation \$0.50; Sunday Schools \$0.25 per member in main school; and Wesleyan Youth \$2.00 per active W. Y. member.

We recommend that the Conference Budget be as follows per member: Conference Church Extension and Evangelism \$2.50; Conference Administration \$3.00; Conference Work \$0.75; Conference Entertainment \$0.50; Conference Minutes \$.50; Mountain Missions \$0.25; Conference Parsonage \$1.25; Conference Group Insurance \$1.00; Conference Sunday School Work \$0.05 per member in main school.

We further recommend:

1. That the Conference President receive \$125.00 per week salary, one-half social security tax, parsonage rent and utilities, that he be given two weeks' vacation with pay. If the Conference Administration Fund has an adequate balance available at end of conference year 1966-1967 the president is to be paid a bonus up to \$260.00.

2. That the President be given the privilege of holding two weeks of meetings outside the Conference and retain the offerings.

3. That the President hold one quarterly meeting or visit each charge at least once during the year and at other times as often as he is able.

4. That the President advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising plans for the better payment of pastors, including the church helping with their social security taxes and utilities and

that he also shall counsel with the boards of stewards relative to the superannuate budget item.

5. That the Statistician's salary be \$100.00 to be taken from the Conference Work Fund.

6. That the Treasurer's salary be \$250.00 and the Secretary's Salary be \$150.00 to be taken from the Conference Work Fund.

7. That the President be authorized to draw on funds of Conference Work for secretarial help, printing blanks, other such items, and also for flowers for the funeral of a minister or a minister's wife or widow, children or parents.

8. That all proceeds from sale of Conference History Books be put into Conference Work Fund.

9. That the President have the privilege of representing the Conference at meetings of the N. A. E. and N. H. A. with the expense being paid by the Conference.

10. That the Finance Committee meet at the call of the President.

11. That the Finance Committee continue to sponsor a tithing promotional program with the tithing secretary under the supervision of this committee and that funds be made available for literature and printing; also that Rev. C. G. Shirley be re-elected as tithing secretary.

12. That the Conference continue its Purchasing Agency to purchase for ministers and laymen in the Conference such items as sets of books, Bibles, watches, etc. and awards, on a cash basis; also that Rev. J. B. Hilson continue as Conference Purchasing Agent.

13. That the Treasurer be authorized to put any temporarily surplus funds in a government guaranteed institution on interest at his discretion.

14. That Rev. J. B. Hilson be re-elected as Group Leader to administer the Conference Hospital Insurance Program.

15. That Church Treasurer's Records be sent in for grading by a Conference Committee.

16. That we offer a Physicians' Mutual Policy to all authorized personnel who do not qualify for Minister's Life Insurance with the Conference paying one-fourth of the premium.

REPORT NO. 6

Board Of Trustees

We, the Board of Trustees of the South Carolina Conference, submit the following report:

1. October 11, 1966, we consented for the Allen Mitchell Memorial Church to add an additional \$3,500.00 to their present loan to finish their building program. This will increase their loan to \$40,500.00 with monthly payments of \$290.00.

2. October 11, 1966, we authorized the refinishing of the conference parsonage hard wood floors with the best material and the pouring of a concrete floor in the garage and a concrete driveway to the street.

3. November 5, 1966, we signed a second mortgage against the Allen Mitchell Memorial Church to secure an addition of \$3,500.00 to the original loan of \$37,000.00 from the Greer Federal Savings and Loan Association.

4. November 5, 1966, we voted to authorize the conference president and the chairman of the Board of Trustees to appraise the value of the Buck Creek property (both real and personal) and to arrange for the sale or disposal thereof.

5. February 4, 1967, we signed a mortgage to secure a refinance loan of \$7,223.76 from the Newberry Federal Savings and Loan Association for the Clinton Road Church for parsonage improvements, finishing Sunday School

rooms and installation of a furnace in the church. This increases their indebtedness by the amount of \$2,500.00. We had previously given permission for this addition to their loan.

6. February 4, 1967, we signed a deed to the lot that had been purchased for the Allen Mitchell Memorial parsonage. It was deeded to Mr. Carl W. Lane for the price of \$1,500.00.

7. We recommend that the Buck Creek property be sold.

REPORT NO. 8

Committee On Records

We recommend:

1. That whenever possible the church use a well-bound book which will

be suitable for permanent records, of a size not less than eight inches by ten inches.

2. That the title page appear in the front of each book giving the name of the church, and also designating whether it is a church record book or quarterly conference book. If both records are combined in one book, please state this on the title page. If it is only a roll book designate this.

3. That a table of contents be placed on the second or third page of each record book. If no space is available, a sheet may be inserted with cloth tape.

4. That the proceedings of each business meeting of the church be recorded in the form of minutes.

5. That the minutes be placed in chronological order.

6. That the church clerks read carefully paragraph 131, 270 (10) of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline.

7. That the roll be kept up to date and that it include as completely as possible the following information: the names of members, dates received, how received and removal.

8. That if a church fails to send a record, its grade becomes zero.

9. That all pastors call attention to their church clerks and quarterly conference clerks to these recommendations.

10. That the following method of grading be used for the church and quarterly conference records: completeness of records, 20%—divided as follows: for quarterly conference books—title page, 5%; completeness of minutes, 15%; for church or combined books—title page, 5%, completeness of minutes, 10%; church roll, 5%; binding, 10%; table of contents, 10%; permanency of records, (ink or typewritten), 10%; cleanliness and neatness, 10%; penmanship, 10%; date at top of page, giving day, month, and year, 10%; composition and grammar, 10%; spelling, 10%.

REPORT NO. 12

Christian Action And Moral Reform

Recommendations:

1. That our Sunday Schools pay ten cents per member for the total enrollment in the main school for the Christian Action Council and that the second Sunday of September be designated as the day for this special offering. This offering is to be sent to the Conference Treasurer.

2. That the Committee on Christian Action and Moral Reform receive

up to fifteen dollars of the above offering for promotional expenses.

Christian Action:

1. Participation in the Churchmen's Legislative Seminar, Inter-Church Conversations on Alcohol Problems, and The South Carolina Citizens Committee.
2. Membership on the Education Committee, Christian Action Council.
3. Two mailings were sent to pastors with information and sample literature

on the liquor referendum. The Wesleyan Youth carried out most of the actual work, distributing almost 19,000 pieces of literature, meeting with the Governor of the State, and press releases.

Statement of Moral Concern:

We declare ourselves in full accord with the principles of Christian living as set forth in our Book of Discipline. We consider these more than archaic statements but Biblical standards to be practiced and promoted.

As a Conference, we raise our voice against the popular teaching called Situation Ethics and affirm that there is an objective standard of moral principles based on the divinely inspired Word of God to which each individual is responsible; therefore, we urge our people to live according to this revelation.

We deeply regret the recent action of the South Carolina General Assembly in setting aside the will of the people and passing the new "brown bagging" law. Because alcohol is an ever increasing health menace, a very great safety hazard, and a major pressure on the family life, we reaffirm our position of "total abstinence from all intoxicating liquors as a beverage to be the duty of all Christians." We heartily disapprove of the patronage of all places of business where intoxicants, including beer, are sold.

With the alarming increase in the non-medicinal use of drugs, we oppose any effort to liberalize our laws regulating their use and pledge our cooperation to finding better answers to this great problem.

We alert our people to the demoralizing trend of fashion. Let us not yield to the sloven dress of men and women that is prevalent today but dress as becometh a Christian; modestly—abstaining from the current fad of physical exposure; economically—avoiding the pressure to extravagance; and humbly refraining from extremes. Let us appear in such a manner as to bring glory to God as a creature reflecting His image.

The Lord's Day is both a sacred blessing and obligation for every Christian. Let us respect it as a day of rest and worship. We oppose the operation of secular business of any kind on Sunday and also all worldly entertainment, amusements, and athletics.

We urge our pastors and people not to simply decry the current moral decay but rouse themselves to action by studied preaching, effective counseling, and persuasive pastoral and parental instruction.

Solicitor Of Periodicals

It is with regret that we report a loss in subscriptions to all three of our church periodicals. *The Wesleyan Missionary* has 759 subscriptions which is a loss of 13, and the *Wesleyan Youth* 441, a loss of 15. After three years of steady increase *The Wesleyan Methodist* fell off 80 subscriptions to a total of 891.

The Alice church leads the conference in subscription gains, both in number and percentage with a gain of 23. The church with the largest subscription lists are Greenville, First, 73; Spartanburg, First 50; Golden Grove, 50; and Alice, 44.

Six churches have a hundred percent: Alice, Golden Grove, Mitchell Memorial, Seneca, Columbia, Greenwood; ten churches were on the honor roll with fifty percent or more: Davis Chapel, Glenville, Mt. Olivet, Sans Souci, Spartanburg, Westminster, Woodside Avenue, Cateechee, Chesnee, Clemson.

It is just as important as ever for our church paper to come into the homes of the members. Now we will have to redouble our effort to bring this up to

the goal of one-half of full membership of our conference.

Some of the reasons for our drop may be the busy fall season into which the subscription campaign falls and which was especially busy this past year with the state-wide referendum concerns, lack of a workable plan in the local church, and careless reporting in the campaign.

We can correct these and thereby improve the subscription list. First, by starting early on the campaign; second, by adopting the plan of approach, workable in your local church situation (the conference solicitor will help with suggestions and personal effort if you will contact him); third, reporting your results to the editor of *The Wesleyan Methodist*. Only about half of our pastors even report. Please, let's do better than that!

Finally, let me urge the local churches that are low to put forth a real honest effort toward your subscriptions. About ten churches are extremely low and these could almost put the conference over the top. Will you check how your church stands?

TUESDAY, JULY 11, 1967, 8:30 A. M.

The South Carolina Conference Woman's Missionary Society met at Greer in the Youth Tabernacle on Tuesday morning at 8:30 for its sixty-first session.

After a period of singing, Mrs. Margaret Childs, President, called the Conference to order and introduced Miss Bertha Smith, returned missionary to China, as the ladies' special guest, to be the devotional speaker.

Her stirring message was based on God's leadings of the Children of Israel. "The only way He could lead the Israelites to go out and do exploits, God had to dwell in their midst. Adjourned by motion. Dismissed by Mrs. Lola Harris.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 12, 1967, 1:30 P. M.

After a congregational song "The Kingdom Is Coming," led by Mrs. Ruth Rampey, Miss Smith, conference guest, continued the devotional talk. She spoke about another reason why we must be holy—Christ lives in us.

"After the temple was destroyed, God had no dwelling place with man until the Holy Spirit came to dwell—not in temples made by man—but in the hearts of men."

She encouraged our hearts to believe in God and rest in Him when she told a personal experience which required perfect trust.

"With Christ in me, Christ around me, God around Christ, why should I fear?"

"God will make us equal to any situation if we are dwelling in Him and He in us."

"God has put us in this condition to live *Him* and turn people from darkness to His marvelous light."

"Christ lives in us because that is the only way He can get to others."

Closed with prayer.

The President called the conference to order.

The Courtesy Committee introduced Dr. Marilyn Birch, returned missionary to Africa, who spoke briefly.

A special song "The King Is Coming" was beautifully sung by Mrs. Naomi Hughey and Mrs. Martha Evatt.

Miss Martha Bloom recommended that the districts accept the challenge to clean and refurbish the workers' cottages on the camp ground. This was voted unanimously.

The Vice-President was called to the chair.

Motion prevailed to give Miss Bloom the privilege of purchasing the needed materials, not to exceed \$100.00 per district.

Mrs. Sylvia Gentry, Greenville District Chaiman, reported. Report adopted.

Roll was called with 11 officers, 19 presidents, and 29 delegates answering.

Miss Daisy Cleveland read a communication from Mrs. James Wiggins, our own missionary in Sierra Leone, West Africa.

A letter of greeting to the conference from Marie Evatt, another one of our own missionaries in Africa, was read by Martha Evatt.

Volunteers were asked to send greetings to our missionaries now on the field; Naomi Hughey to Bernice Quarles, Ethel Quarles to James and Lois Wiggins, Mae Belle Eargle and Sallie Evatt to Virginia Hooker, and Clara James to Marie Evatt.

A question and answer period was conducted by Mrs. Naomi Hughey, Statistician.

Final presentation of items of literature was made by the Literature Committee.

Mrs. Ellen Hilson presented the report of the "Pause to Remember" Committee. She read the names of those who were called Home and whose memory and service were honored in a memorial period. (See report for list of those remembered) Mrs. Ruth Rampey sang "Wonderful Morning." Mrs. Pauline Smalley led the group in prayer.

The President resumed the chair.

Minutes were read and adopted.

A committee to audit the Treasurers' books was elected. Mrs. Logan Jarrard and Mr. Talmadge Hughey were elected to serve.

Mrs. Ethel Childs was appointed to write Mrs. Carrie McKee, Magazine Solicitor, and express regrets at her not being able to attend conference.

By vote, the Secretary was given permission to edit the minutes.

Adjourned sine die.

Dismissed by Mrs. Logan Jarrard.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.
2. The W. M. S. dues for this Conference will be one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per member. Fifty cents (50c) of this to be retained in the Conference treasury for working fund.
3. Y. M. W. B. dues will be sixty (60c) per member for this Conference. Fifty-two cents (52c) is to be used for Foreign Missions, five cents (5c) for desk expense, and three cents (3c) for General Conference travel expense of the Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.
4. All money must be in the hands of the Treasurer by midnight on June 5. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by June 15.
5. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study Group, and a large Women's Fellowship Circle.
6. The Executive Board will serve as a nominating committee to nominate secretaries and committees as deemed necessary before the opening of Conference.
7. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the honor roll.
8. Each district will elect the following officers: Chairman, Secretary, Magazine Solicitor, Mission Study Promoter, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.
9. Each district should plan at least three district meetings annually—one each quarter in which workshops will be held for: local presidents, treasurers, magazine solicitors, Women's World Fellowship secretaries, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendents.
10. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists, and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expense on said visits.
