DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Conference Opening—Conference convened May 30, 1933, at 8:00 P. M., with Sister Ruby Reisdorph leading the singing. "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name," "How Firm a Foundation," and "My Faith Looks Up to Thee" were sung with much grace and glory being manifested.

President Rufus Reisdorph then spoke with much feeling on the grace of God that had been wrought in our lives in bringing us to this opening night of this, another conference.

Brothers W. J. Leyh and R. J. Eling led in unctuous prayer, followed by singing, "Faith Is the Victory."

Rev. Arthur Calhoun then brought us a special number in song.

Rev. J. E. Spry preached the Conference Sermon using the text found in Eph. 5: 25-27, beautifully stressing the doctrine of preparation for bridehood namely, entire sanctification, a doctrine that is being still held before the people of our Connection, as a whole and by our own Dakota Conference.

The message was blessed of God and graciously received by the assembled audience which was believed to be the largest of any of the first nights of the conferences yet held. The service closed by singing "Just As I Am," and the benediction by L. D. Harris.

BUSINESS SESSION

Devotionals—The devotional service was conducted by Brother R. J. Eling reading from 2 Timothy, second chapter, with comment. The President called the meeting to order. Roll was called.

Election—A Nominating Committee was elected, composed of J. F. Simpson, chairman; J. E. Spry, R. J. Eling, Mrs. Fred Solmonson and August Wagner.

Recess—Recess was declared by the President for Committee to prepare their report.

Report-Nominating Committee read their report and it was accepted. (See Report No. 1.)

Addition to Pastoral Relations Committee—Motion prevailed that we add two more names to the Pastoral Relations Committee and the following were elected: Frank Martin and J. F. Simpson. Bar of Conference—The first nine seats in the middle section of the tabernacle were made the Bar of Conference.

Appointments—President appointed R. L. Scandarett and Thomas Calley to Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

Recess-The President declared a recess for committee work.

Thursday Morning

Devotionals—Devotionals were conducted by H. H. Turner who read and commented from the third Psalm. A time of refreshing prevailed.

Business-Roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Courtesies—Rev. Floyd Hester, President of the Miltonvale College, was introduced and spoke a few words of greeting.

Brother E. F. McCarty, Foreign Missionary Secretary, was introduced and addressed the conference briefly.

Reports—The Treasurer's Report was read and referred to the Auditing Committee. (See Report No. 2.)

Secretary-Treasurer of Ministerial Relief Fund read his report, and it was referred to the Auditing Committee. (See Report No. 3.)

Camp Meeting Treasurer read his report, and it was referred to the Auditing Committee. (See Report No. 4.)

The President's Report was read and his financial statement was referred to the Auditing Committee. (See Report No. 5.)

Recess—Recess declared and Orders of the Day called for which was an Educational Program by Brother Floyd Hester and a group of students from Miltonvale. A very inspiring and helpful program was given, and a deeper appreciation for Miltonvale and its work was instilled in the hearts of the members of the conference.

Friday Morning

Devotionals—Devotionals were conducted by Rev. Ivan Calhoun reading and commenting from the 34th Psalm.

Connectional Address—Rev. E. F. McCarty brought the Connectional Address to the conference. The conference received with interest the information regarding our Connectional interests.

Business-Roll was called; and on motion delegate from Brentford was seated.

Minutes read and approved.

Election of Officers—Officers for the ensuing year were elected which resulted as follows:

Registrar's Record—On motion registrar was authorized to purchase a suitable book to care for records of licentiates.

Publishing of Minutes—The Secretary was instructed to have 250 copies of our Minutes printed.

Motion prevailed that pastors take free will offerings on their charges to defray expense of publishing the Minutes.

Conference Date—Time of next Conference Session was set to begin on Tuesday evening, June 5, 1934.

Adjournment-Adjourned by limitation of time.

Opening-Session opened by prayer.

Business-Roll call; minutes read and approved.

Conference Delegates—On motion the question of Conference Representation was referred to Judiciary Committee.

Stationery—Purchase of Conference Stationery was referred to the President and his Advisory Board.

Report—Committee on Railroad Expense read their report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 9.)

Conference Fund Assessment-It was decided to continue the five

per cent plan for maintenance of Conference Fund, namely, five per cent of pastor's salary by the pastors and a like amount received from the charges.

Reports-The Committee on Itineracy and Orders read their report and it was adopted.

The Auditing Committee read their report and it was adopted.

Conference Treasurer. (See Report No. 2.) Ministerial Relief Treasurer. (See Report No. 3.) Camp Meeting Treasurer. (See Report No. 4.) President's Financial Report. (See Report No. 5.)

Passage of Character—The Committee on Passage of Character read their report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 7.)

Resolutions—Resolutions Committee read their report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 6.)

Sunday School Rally—The hour from 11 to 12 o'clock was devoted to a Sunday School Rally in charge of Rev. W. D. Shelor. Some helpful and very interesting papers were given relative to our Sunday School work.

Adjournment-Adjourned by limitation of time.

Business-Roll call and minutes eliminated.

Report No. 8 MISSIONARY BOARD

We, the Missionary Board, offer the following recommendations:

We recommend that the Conference be responsible, with what the Missionary Society appropriates, for \$100.00 toward the moving expenses of Sister Gertrude Clocksin.

We further recommend that the Conference Treasury be responsible for \$7.50 a month toward the rental of a house for the pastor of the Mobridge Charge.

We also recommend that the President receive \$100.00 per month and traveling expenses for the time employed within the Conference.

We recommend that the President, the pastor of the church at Bushnell and the chairman of the local board of trustees compose the committee to care for the property of the Bushnell charge.

We recommend that the pastors and the churches be urged to raise a liberal offering for the Conference President on each visit to the charge, this to be applied on President's salary.

Further we recommend that inasmuch as Sister Frank Traver is incapacitated for the work as assistant pastor, she be paid \$10.00 per month from the Superannuated Ministers' Fund.
