JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The seventieth annual session of the Kansas Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church assembled in the auditorium at Miltonvale, Kansas, at 2:00 p. m., Tuesday, August 13, 1940, with the President, Rev. Wm. A. Smith, in the Chair.

The devotions were led by Brother Wm. A. Smith, and Brother Wendell Campbell led in the opening songs. The Ministers and Delegates gathered about the altar for a gracious season of prayer. Brothers W. M. Millard and I. F. McLeister led in prayer.

The roll was called and was answered by 37 Elders and 9 Conference Preachers.

Delegates—The names of 51 Delegates-elect were presented by the Nominating Committee, who had examined the credentials.

Resolution Rescinded—By a more than two thirds vote Resolution No. 13 pertaining to evening services was rescinded.

President's Report—The Conference President gave his report. On motion the official portion was adopted and the financial part was referred to the Finance Committee.

Insurance Bill—A motion carried that the Conference bear the expense of insuring Conference Buildings for the past year,

Itineracy and Orders—Brother A. F. Messer's resignation from the Committee on Itineracy and Orders was accepted and S. M. Yonally was elected to fill the vacancy.

Hutchinson—The newly organized class at Hutchinson, Kansas, was presented by W. A. Smith. They were organized in July, 1940, with 14 members.

On motion the Class was received into the Conference and the Delegate was seated.

Adjourned on motion. Benediction by Dr. I. F. McLeister.

Connectional Address.—Rev. I. F. McLeister brought a gracious message Tuesday evening from the words, "I will build my church." He spoke of the underlying rock strata of Christ's divinity as the foundation upon which the Church was to be built, and stressed the fact that God has a plan for the Church which, if followed, insures success against all opposition. He gave an encouraging account of our Connectional interests, and appealed for a good response in subscriptions to the Church publications.

Tithing Hour—By unanimous vote the hour of the Tithing Service was changed from 10:00 to 10:30 Friday.

MORAL REFORM

"Go through, go through the gates; prepare ye the way of the people LIFT UP A STANDARD FOR THE PEOPLE."

Inasmuch as we are living in an age of lukewarmness and are constantly confronted with the lowering of the Bible standards in the holiness movement, we believe that the rules and requirements of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline, as founded on the Bible, should be brought to the attention of the people and more carefully and fully followed.

The purpose of the moral reform is not to cast people into a stupor, to fill their minds with illusion to make them comfortable but to awaken, arouse, and stir their conscience to the dangers they are facing. Therefore, we, as a Committee, feel it is our duty to lift up our voices against the outstanding evils of the day.

We deplore the trend of evil that has gripped our nation. We take our stand against card-playing, tobacco, movies, dance halls, road houses, booze joints and all other sinful and soul demoralizing sins that are flooding our land today. We not only take our stand against national sins but also against the so-called "SMALL SINS" which are sweeping many of our holiness people from the "ancient landmarks." Solomon said, "Remove not the ancient landmarks which our fathers have set." The devil knew that not many holiness people would be caught committing such glaring sins, but knowing the trend of the depraved and carnal heart, he has pressed the fashion craze here a little and there a little until many church members have aped the styles of Paris and Hollywood until they cannot be distinguished from the unsaved. The Wesleyan Methodist Discipline says, "Let the dress of every member of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection be plain-distinguished plainness; plainness which will publicly commit them to the maintenance of their Christian profession wherever they may be." This was Mr. Wesley's views expressed a few years before his death and contained his mature judgment. Therefore, we do not think that it is asking too much of our choir that they wear long sleeves and dresses of modest length. We urge our people to refrain from wearing short dresses, short sleeves, sheer hose, mannish attire, also, the wearing of jewelry which included the wedding ring and other unnecessary ornamentation. The modern hair dress such as permanent waves and all the modern bobs are not conducive to deep spirituality and are not in harmony with God's Word. We feel that women professing godliness should not seek to avoid the reproach of long hair by adopting a style of hair dress which has all the appearance of bobbed hair.

Sabbath desecration is an outstanding sin of this age. We take a definite stand against holiness people taking long unnecessary journeys on Sunday which involve the buying of gasoline and oil on the Lord's Day; against forsaking of the Sunday morning services for family reunions and "BIG"

dinners where joking, jesting, idle and foolish talking fill in the remainder of the day; and against reading the secular newspapers on Sunday which has become a common occurrence in many holiness homes.

Parental authority is almost obsolete in many of our homes today. Anklets, sunsuits, abbreviated dresses, arched evybrows, finger-nail polish, lip stick, rouge and all the rest of the devil's paraphernalia is included in the daily costume of children from holiness homes. Parents merely wink at such and seemingly see no harm in it. Let us build a wall of prayer around our children.

Some people spend more time listening to worldly, jazzy, ungodly, radio music than they do praying or reading their Bibles. Religious people will tune in on prize fights, baseball games, theatrical programs, Amos and Andy and other things which they condemn as improper for a Christian to attend. Why allow them to come into our homes over the air then? Would you not be embarrassed, to say the least, if Jesus should suddenly come while you were listening to the folly, frivolity and sin of the Christ rejecting world as it comes to you over the air?

We take our stand against the many popular periodicals of a wide circulation which are unsafe for us and our children to read. Let us subscribe for and read our own and as many other good periodicals and holiness books as possible.

Furthermore, we urge that our ministers be free from compromise and warn of these dangers which will lead to "Ichabod" being written across our doors.

Let us as Wesleyan Methodist's come out from the world and be a separate people and God "will be a Father" unto us.

REPORT OF THE AUDITING COMMITTEE

We, the Auditing Committee, have examined the books of the Treasurers of the Missionary Board, Camp Meeting and Campground Committee, Conference Board of Trustees, Superannuate Board, and Kansas Conference Treasurer. Also, the Reports of the Conference President, Sunday-school Secretary and the Tithing Secretary.

RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Evangelistic Help. Resolved, That the Camp Meeting and Campground Committee be authorized, if they see fit to do so, to engage Evangelistic help for the Camp Meeting two years in advance.
- 2. Election of Conference Officers. Resolved, That the election of Conference Officers be held on the second day of Conference at 9:00 a.m.

- Subscription Lists. Resolved, That all subscription lists and monies raised at Conference for all purposes be put through the hands of the Conference Treasurer or the Treasurer of the W. H. & F. M. Society, and that all subscription lists be kept by these Treasurers, and that notice of indebtedness be given all subscribers by means of a list sent to their pastors early in the year.
- Sanctity of God's House. Resolved, That such work as making quilts and disposing of the same be performed in the homes of the people and not in the houses erected for public worship.
- 5. Pastor's Moving Expenses. Resolved, That the class hiring a minister shall within ten days after his arrival pay to him his moving expenses, this not to be applied on his salary.

6. Reporting All Offerings to Pastors. Resolved, That all monies be reported to the Pastors for entry on their Statistical Report in order to

give due credit both to the Charge and to the Conference.

Subscription Lists Record. Resolved, That the Secretary supply the Conference President with a list of all supscriptions taken at Conference. That he also provide each pastor with a list of those from his charge.

8. Unleavened Bread. Resolved, That it be the sense of this Conference that all our churches use unleavened bread in the administration of the Lord's Supper. We suggest the following recipe: 1/3 cup flour, 1 teaspoon butter (heaping), moisten with milk enough to roll. Mark in 1/2 inch squares and bake as pie dough. The above will serve 50 persons.

9. Pastor Nominates Steward. Resolved, That it be the sense of this Conference that the pastor be granted the privilege of nominating one

member to the Board of Stewards from each church on his charge.

10. To Hold Quarterly Meetings. Resolved, That the Conference President shall travel the Conference and care for one-half of the Quarterly Meetings.

11. Inspection of Church Property. Resolved, That it is the sense of the Annual Conference that the Conference President should inquire at each Quarterly Conference whether the local church property is properly

repaired and insured.

- 12. Nominating Committee. Resolved, That we elect a Committee of five Elders, including the President as Chairman ex-officio, and three Delegates-elect from three churches designated by the Conference to: First, examine the credentials of all Delegates to the Conference. Second, nominate all sessional committees and be prepared to report as the first item of husiness.
- 13. Theological Institute. Resolved, That the traveling expenses of instructors to and from the Institute be paid from the Conference Fund, and also such books as may be needed for Institute work.
- 14. Superannuate Service. Resolved, That one public service in each Annual Conference Session be set aside in honor of the Superannuate

Ministers and for the purpose of creating interest in the Superannuate Fund, and that it be the duty of the Second Vice-President to arrange for such service.

- 15. Superannuate Constitution. Resolved, That the Constitution of the Kansas Superannuate Association be printed in the Conference Minutes once in five years, and that a note be carried regularly in the Resolutions stating the year of last publication. (Published in 1938 Minutes, amended in 1939.)
- 16. 1 Per Cent Assessment. Resolved, That we require all active ministers to pay 1 per cent of their cash salary to the Superannuate Fund, this not to be applied on the Budget.
- 17. Conference Loans. Resolved, That the Conference Treasurer shall issue no loans from any Conference monies except by sanction of the Conference Board of Trustees.
- 18. Additional Delegates. Resolved, That when more than one Delegate from any one church presents credentials to this body, there shall appear in the credentials the name of the Elder that entitles the church to the additional Delegate.
- 19. Fiscal Year. Resolved, That the fiscal year of the local church close one week before Conference and that the statistical report be made on the basis of money received up to that time.
- 20. Pastor Paid Through Conference. Resolved, That the church's financial obligation to the pastor, whether he be leaving the field or not, be extended throughout the Conference and Camp Meeting period.
- 21. Orders of the Day Committee. Resolved, That the Camp Meeting and Campground Committee be permanently the Committee on Orders of the Day, to prepare ahead of time the Conference Program for publication in the "Visitor."

Modern magazines are paid to present adultery, divorce, drinking, cigarette smoking, dancing and card playing as the perfectly na-

tural normal activities of life, the only road to true success. The thief cometh to steal the virtue of your dear ones with corrupted literature. Allow no reading matter to enter your home which has not been carefully censored.

Guard your home with your life. The downfall of many young folk begins within the four walls of the home. Promiscuous relations, petting and various irregularities among the youth are often permitted in the living rooms of so-called Christian homes. Boys and girls are even allowed to loll over one another during church services. Those so engaged fall into temptation, sensible folk are disgusted and the spirit is grieved. Wives, mothers, sisters, you have a charge to keep and never dying souls to save from the clutches of the thief of hell. Eternal vigilence and unceasing prayer will be the price you must pay if you are to succeed. A mere prohibition will not always satisfy that wide awake laddie or that blossoming lassie; therefore, be studious, inform yourself, be ready to give a reason.

Irreverence in the house of God is increasing so rapidly. Holiness folk seem to forget that His house is holy. Let us ask God to forgive us for our carelessness in this particular and to help us, by a clear cut personal example, provoke others to keep the place of worship sacred and holy.

- 3. That October 11 be observed as Harvest Home Day. We urge each society to send cash or make donations to the Dormitory and report same to Harvest Home Committee to receive credit on the Educational Budget.
- 4. That all local dues be sent to our Treasurer, Mrs. Bertha Wilson, 709 Watson Ave., Topeka, Kansas. One half of the same to be used for Missionary work and be applied on church budget. Please designate specifically where this credit is desired. (See Treasurer's book Item "C" under Number 4.) That honorary membership dues be applied on Missionary Budget.
- 5. We recommend the use of a monthly envelope system for the collection of dues, the Treasurer to keep record of the amounts paid in.
- 6. That each Society contribute 10 cents per active member to pay General Conference Delegates expenses.
- 7. That each Society contribute at least \$6.00 for Home Missions Connectionally supported.
- 8. We urge each Society to contribute at least \$5.00 to the Hepzibah Orphanage, except in cases where church budget is less than \$5.00, such contributions to be applied on church budget.
- 9. That each society be responsible for the raising of \$5.00 for the new W. H. & F. M. S.-W. Y. P. S. tabernacle.
- 10. That each Local President appoint a committee whose duty shall be to visit the sick and to work in harmony with the pastor in rendering assistance that will help in reaching souls and building up the kingdom of God.

We recommend that formation of Prayer Circles, where possible, or prayer chains to encourage faith and united prayer.

- 11. That the President of each Local Society be made responsible to arrange with the pastor for one evening of the third week of each month to pray especially for Mission work, the same to be preceded by a day of fasting. We also recommend that an offering be taken at each of these services as follows:
 - A. September, October and November for Education.
 - B. December for Orphanage.
 - C. January and February for Kansas Conference Missions.
 - D. March and April for Home Missions.
 - E. May for Bethshan Mission.
 - F. June and July for Foreign Missions.
 - 12. In harmony with the recommendation of the General Society we

urge that our ladies observe Friday of each week as a day of fasting and prayer for a Connection-wide revival, until it comes.

- 13. We urge the use of the Programs printed in the Wesleyan Missionary, also the Study Book, "Sierra Leone—Facts, Figures, Faith," by Zola Dee Birch. Supplementary books recommended are: "After C. T. Studd" and "Miracles in Black."
- 14. That all money be disbursed through our Local and Conference Treasurers. That all money or receipts applying on Budget be sent from the Local W. H. & F. M. S. Treasurer to the Conference Treasurer quarterly.

This money should be in the hands of the Conference Treasurer at least two weeks before Conference.

- 15. That the annual report be reported by the President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Local Society, one copy to be sent to Committee on Statistics, N. Mae Clark, 709 Watson Ave., Topeka, Kansas, two weeks before Conference, the duplicate copy to be brought to Conference by the Delegate. The names of the newly elected President and Secretary should appear on the back of the Report Blank.
- 16. That each Society grade themselves by the Efficiency Standard, which is to be read at the last business meeting. A grade of 10 per cent will be given on each of any ten points chosen. Societies making a grade of 90 per cent will receive honorable mention and those making a grade of 100 per cent will be placed on the Honor Roll.
- 17. That the president of the society be responsible for the reading of the report on Moral Reform at one public church service during the year.
- 18. That each Society have a Committee of two to see to the gathering of food stuffs for the Conference dining hall. The minimum for each Society shall be: 10 quarts of fruit spread, or fruit, 5 quarts of pickles, relish or catsup; 10 pounds of noodles, two aprons, 10 quarts of vegetables, or fill quota with cash. The surplus donations shall be given to the dormitory and will receive credit on educational budget.
- 19. That the President of each Local Society appoint a Committee to coöperate with the Temperance Superintendent of the Sunday school in observance of Temperance Sunday and distribution of Temperance literature.
- 20. November-Mens and Missions month. Program to be sponsored by the men.
- 21. That our Conference goal for the coming year be 600 members, 400 magazines, and \$6,000.00 apportionment. We urge that each society make a gain in each of the above mentioned.

Division II. Conference Work

22. That the W. H. & F. M. S. Conference begins Tuesday Aug. 7th at 3 p. m.

- 23. That the President and District Organizer arrange the time and recommend the worker for the Conventions, also that they prepare the schedule for the visitation of our worker.
- 24. That each District be supervised by the District Organizer under the direction of the Conference President.

The Organizer shall be Prayer Secretary and Magazine Committee of her District and shall report the conditions of her District to the President quarterly.

We suggest that each organizer meet with each Local Society once during the year.

25. The Districts are as follows:

District No. 1—Kansas City, Mo.; Kansas City, Kans.; Easton, Ottawa, Fairview, Lawrence, Willis, Topeka, First; Topeka, Gage Park; Topeka, Quinton Heights; North Topeka, Williams Chapel, Eskridge and Manhattan.

District No. 2—Clay Center, Wesley Chapel, Bethany Chapel, Abilene, Antioch, Miltonvale, Salina, Idana, and Milford.

District No. 3—Concordia, Hall, Bellville, New Hope, Morgan Chapel, Heber, Hollis, Union Valley, and Greenleaf.

District No. 4-Wichita, Wichita Mission, Grace Chapel, Hopewell, Hutchinson.

District No. 5-Mankato, Wesley Center, Formoso, Victor, Hardy, Nebr.; Red Cloud, Nebr.

District No. 6—Cedar, Phillipsburg, Iowa Union, Inglewood, Gaylord, Naponee, Neb.

26. That the Gleaners each pay their dues of one dollar, observe the monthly prayer hour, read the Missionary Magazine and correspond with the mission fields and the President of the Gleaners.
