STANDING RULES

- 1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of his church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable Conference papers, the conference to pay rent on space.
- 2. The President and his Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for the churches, parsonages, or other Conference property to be submitted to them for examination before being recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.
- 3. That each pastor is to bring his statistical report in full ready to be read the first day of Conference.
- 4. All pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading of their reports.
- 5. Our members are solicited to faithfulness in tithing and our churches are to consider the storehouse plan.
- 6. The Campmeeting and Conference are to be held together, with the date of the Conference to be set by the Board of Administration with the suggestion that if possible it be incorporated at the beginning or at the close of Campmeeting.
- 7. That each year there shall be held at least one Ministerial Institute.
- 8. The Mid-year Convention Committee be composed of three ministerial members, the President of the W.M.S. and the President of the W.Y.P.S.
- 9. That each local church is responsible to pay moving expenses of the pastor whom they have called.
- 10. Conference Secretary and Treasurer each be paid ten dollars annually from the Conference Treasury, for their services.
- 11. The Conference Treasurer's books be closed one week before the opening session of the Annual Conference.
- 12. No treasurer be allowed to pay out funds without the proper authorization.
- 13. The standing rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference minutes from year to year.
- 14. The treasurer of the Superannuate Pension be a member of the Superannuate Pension Plan Committee.

The Fifty-seventh Annual Session of the Oregon Conference opened Monday evening, July 24, 1950, 8:00 p.m. at the Multnomah County Holiness Campground, 10801 S. E. Holgate Ave., Portland, Oregon. Henry B. Aarhus, Conference President, led the song service and presided. Prayer was offered by the Reverend J. R. Swauer, Denominational Representative. A. G. Yates and Glenn Hoerner brought a special number in song after which Donald H. Cline, pastor at Russellville, brought the message. The scripture read was Exodus 14:5-18. Brother Cline used as his subject "God's Command" which is "Go forth." He stressed the facts that obedience is necessary to faith, and that the responsibility of this worlds salvation is upon us. We were challenged to go forth with God and strive to give salvation to the world.

To the members of the 57th session of the Oregon Annual Conference greetings in the name of Him whose work engages our attention. Today we call the Conference to join in gratitude and praise to God for the many blessings which have marked our way throughout the past months since we last met in Annual session. Through the manifold blessings and the mercy of Almighty God we have been permitted once again, to assemble in this 57th session.

This year has not been without its problems. Many times we have been driven to our knees in earnest supplication. But God has been good to us, has over-ruled the difficulties, has given increase to the work and has given blessing to the workers. We believe the prospects for the future look bright in spite of conditions that face the whole world. A. As: Jail services, Hospital services, street meetings
etc. (per meeting) 10 points B. A youth sponsored revival 50 points
D. 11 Journ sponsored revivar

- C. A visiting committee active and functioning. (Per call)..1 point (Excluding pastoral calls.)
- D. One youth sponsored social per quarter _____ 5 points
- E. New active members gained. (Per member) 25 points
- It is recommended that the conference pay the expense of having forms printed to make the efficiency standard workable.

The societies be graded as A-B- or C each quarter per number of points earned. A conference banner be awarded yearly to the society earning the largest number of points.

NOTICE

Additional notes on the Efficiency Standard.

To compute the net total of points in Section I, divide the total number of points by members keeping personal record. All active members must keep a report, associate members may.

Society Grading:

- An "A" society must gain 85 points in Section I, 42 points in Section II, and a total of at least 250.
- A "B" society must gain 80 points in Section I, 42 points in Section II, and at least a total of 190.
- A "C" society is one that falls below the standard set above.
