CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

1. All statistical reports shall be filed with the committee not later than the second day.
2. Every pastor shall make a duplicate of his statistical report and shall read the same to his charge at the first meeting after Conf.
3. Pastors shall equalize the amounts required for budget before over-reaching any one item and it shall be the pastor's duty to inform his people at the beginning of the year concerning the amount to be raised, and he shall at once proceed to raise the amount assigned to his charge.
4. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attention and the attendance of all its elders and licentiates, therefore we will not employ as pastor or evangelist any elder or licentiate or pass the character of any elder or licentiate except by vote, who does not attend the entire session of conference.
5. Any member leaving conference must present his excuse to conference.
6. The conference treasurer, with all persons introduced to the conference, shall be honorary members of the conference, and shall be accorded a seat within the conference bar.
7. No preacher or licentiate who fails to attend the Ministerial Association, except for just cause, shall have his character passed at the next annual conference except by vote.
8. Any minister accepting work on a charge at the hands of this conference, who resigns or abandons it before the year is out without a good excuse or lawful reason, shall be considered by said conference and it shall take a vote of conference to pass his character.
9. All candidates taking the conference course of study shall appear before the Committee Itineracy and Orders, some member of the Committee, or some one whom the Committee may designate.

10. When an elder resides outside the bounds of the conference but retains his membership with a church within the bounds of the conference, a delegate shall be elected from this church to represent said elder, the seating of said delegate in the annual conference depending upon the attendance of said elder at the annual conference.
11. Friday preceding conference shall be set aside as a day of prayer for the conference.
12. Robert's Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary guide of this body.
13. We recommend that pastors, Sunday Schools, W.H. & F.M. societies and Y.M.W. Bands remit all funds raised, quarterly
14. Pastors shall preach on the subject of church benevolences at least once a year.
15. The first Sunday in October shall be set apart as a day for special prayer to be offered and efforts made to interest and enlist the young people of our church in its work.
16. All charges receiving a new pastor pay the moving expenses, the amount being agreed upon by the pastor and the church.
17. We order that no money be paid from the conference Missionary Fund except by written order of the Missionary Board.
18. Be it required that all pastors of the Ohio Conference attend all sessions of the camp meeting unless providentially hindered.
19. The secretary shall send a statistical blank to the clerk of each charge having no pastor, requesting that the same be filled out with all available statistics and returned to the conference secretary
20. We interpret Rule 4 to mean that the Committee on Pastoral Relations shall not give employment to any preacher who does not meet the requirements of this standing rule, without bringing his excuse before the conference for its action in the matter.

21. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attendance of delegates as well as preachers, therefore we discourage the election of any person as delegate to annual conference who does not intend to attend the entire session. Information of the delegate's intentions shall be incorporated in their credentials.

22. The Secretary shall prepare blanks for delegate's credentials, including the statement required by the last resolution. Said blanks are to be mailed to the pastors shortly before conference, and when filled out by them, to be sent to the chairman of a standing committee on credentials, who, if possible should receive the same at least a week before conference in order that they may be able to inform the chairman of the Board of Trustees as to the number of delegates expected at conference; and in order that they may be able to report immediately after the opening of conference. Said Committee shall be composed of two members appointed by the President.

23. For the future the conference shall observe the disciplinary rule requiring each pastor to read his statistical report on the floor of the conference.

24. Wednesday afternoon and evening of conference week shall be designated as Young People's Day.

25. Thursday evening of conference shall be set apart for the public missionary service.

26. Each year there shall be incorporated in the minutes a list of those who have died in the various churches during the year, the pastors being asked to provide the Secretary with the necessary information.

27. We authorize the closing of the Treasurer's books one week before conference.

28. We recommend that each church pay two dollars toward the board of each delegate and pastor at conference, said amount to be sent in with the delegate's credentials. Also that

each church pay the pastor's and delegate's traveling expenses to and from conference.
29. Each occupant of the dormitory during conference is to furnish his own bed linen and towels.

As a part of the business of the Conference of 1933, the Missionary Board was given two special duties to perform; it became the Committee on Aggressive Evangelism, and the Committee to purchase a Conference tent, and supervise its use.

Concerning evangelism; we have visited most of the churches in the conference, seeking, first to inspire and stir the already established churches, and secondly, prospecting for new territory. God has blessed the services held; in many instances souls were saved or sanctified. We have found much territory not occupied by other holiness bodies, or, in large cities room for us, without crowding or interfering with sister denominations.

Our first visitation was with the North Olmsted church, while there we rented property and secured a worker to conduct a Sunday School. This work is promising. Next we visited the Belmont church in Dayton. We rented a room in West Dayton, and appointed a worker. Later in the year a class was organized, which bids fair to become a strong church. While visiting the Athens church our Conference President was called to organize a class at Baker Corner. Recently we visited Milfield and arranged for services to be held by Fred Fields or others from Athens.

The tent has been purchased and is a possession of the Ohio Conference. It has been used in Fairview Village and Delaware. We suggest that a charge of ten dollars and transportation, to our own churches; and twenty dollars and transportation to others, be made for a ten days or two weeks meeting; such fees to be reserved as tent fund, available when necessary to purchase another tent.

Our financial report. is as follows: During the year we have traveled more than 4000 miles. Received in offerings, \$134.41. Paid out, Traveling expense, \$106.08. Rental at West Dayton, \$17.00. Incidentals \$11.33. Total disbursements, \$134.41.

Be it resolved that we extend to the Deaconesses of our Church to vote in the deliberations of the Conference, and furthermore to maintain the balance of power sought in our form of church government, be it resolved that each church elect one delegate to the Annual Conference for each Deaconess serving said church by Conference appointment.
