3 Resolved; That we will continue the effort commenced at this session, to secure subscriptions to their stock at all our appointments -- and that we will endeavor to secure one from every church within our bounds.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted <u>Resolved</u>; That when his term of office as Editor of the True Wesleyan shall expire we cordially invite Bro. Luther Lee to unite with the Rochester Conference.

As follows. -

The Fugitive Slave Bill.

Resolved: That, the so called "Fugitive Slave Bill" which has now become a law of this nation, originated with the father of lies, who taught our first parents to disobey God; and therefore to obey it, is to make war with heaven – to declare our allegiance with hell – and to proclaim our infidelity to the world.

On Secret Societies

Resolved: That, "Secret Societies" of whatever name, are wrong in themselves; antichristian [sic] in their tendency, and ruinous in their final results: therefore Christians & christian [sic] ministers should not only refuse to countenance them, but throw the entire weight of their influence, individual and associate, against them.

On Temperance.

Resolve: That as christians, [sic] and christian [sic] Ministers, we are bound by considerations high as Heaven, deep as hell, and broad as eternity, to give our entire influence, religious, political and social, against the sale, and use of intoxicating liquor as a beverage. –

Fifth Day.

April 28.

On Slavery.

Whereas American human chattleship [sic] is a system of such attrocious [sic] wickedness, so contrary to the word of God, and destructive to all the rights of one class of the inhabitants of these United States. Therefore Resolved, That it is inconsistent to acknowledge as christian [sic] Churches those who allow their members still to continue the practice of either trading in the persons of their fellow men, or of holding them in bondage, and that it is also wicked to act with those political parties, who help to make and give countenance to such wicked laws. —

On Tobacco.

The use of Tobacco is filthy, expensive, injurious to health, and he who uses it, enslaves his reason, by a silly habit, and a vile appetite.

On Moral Purity.

Keep thyself pure – know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost – if any man defile the Temple of God, him shall God destroy.

Licentiousness has been, and is still the great and damning sin of the world. It stealthily mingles itself in the Social intercourse of every grade of Society, and effectually poisons the cup of human happiness.

The word of inspiration positively affirms that, fornicators and adulterers shall not inherit the Kingdom of God – It is therein plainly and emphatically enjoined as the duty, of all ministers of the Gospel of Christ, to lay aside false modesty

in reference to the crying sin of sexual impurity, and publicly enforce from the pulpit, the strict observance of the seventh commandment.
