JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The Lockport Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its seventy-first Annual Session in the Hess Road Wesleyan Methodist Church at 9:00 A. M., the opening sermon being preached the evening previous by Rev. A. A. Hickok, pastor of the Ellicott Charge. God's blessing was upon the service.

The morning's session was called to order by the President and the devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. John E. Bruce.

The roll was called and twelve pastors and seventeen delegates were marked present.

The Bar of the Conference was made to constitute the first six rows of seats across the body of the church.

The time for opening and closing the sessions of the Conference was set as follows: Morning sessions to open at 8:30, and to close at 11:30. Afternoon sessions to open at 1:30, and to close by vote of the Conference.

The Committee on Temporary Organization submitted its report, which was adopted after a few necessary amendments. See Report No. 1.

The Committee on Religious Services submitted its report, which was adopted as read. See Report No. 2.

On motion the election of Conference Officials was made the Order of the Day for Thursday morning immediately following the devotional exercises.

At this time the Vice-President was called to the Chair and the Conference President submitted his report, which was adopted. See Report No. 3.

Conference took a recess for Committee work, to meet again at the call of the Chair. This call was made at 11:25, and the Auditing Committee having O. K.'d the report of the Conference President and the Treasurer of the Conference Board of Trustees, submitted the same. The report was adopted.

Upon reconsidering the time for opening the morning's sessions of the Conference, it was changed from 8:30 to 9:00 A. M.

Adjourned by limitation of time, the benediction being given by Rev. C. I. Armstrong.

First Day, Afternoon Session, April 13, 1932

The Conference was called to order by the President and the devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. M. A. Bateman.

The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

The financial report of the Board of Trustees was submitted through its Treasurer, Rev. Walter Readett, and it was adopted. See Report No. 4.

The following names were called and their characters passed: C. I. Armstrong, J. E. Bruce, G. E. Bathurst, M. A. Bateman, E. L. Elliott, Louise Gifford Henderson, A. A. Hickok, Francis B. Markell, O. G. McKinley.

Rev. J. S. Willett, Connectional Agent, was introduced to Conference and made a few remarks.

A letter was read from Rev. Louise Gifford Henderson and her request for transfer to the Oregon Conference was granted.

The name of A Dow was referred to the Committee on Pastoral Relations.

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, Rev. J. S. Willett presented a very able and inspirational message on 1 Corinthians, chapter thirteen.

The Conference was called to order by the President at four P. M., and adjourned on motion.

Second Day, Morning Session, April 14, 1932

The session was called to order by the President, and the devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. Russel Frase.

The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

The letter of transfer granted Rev. H. H. Schoonover to the Canada Conference and returned by him to the President April 13th, was received by vote of the Conference.

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived the President appointed C. I. Armstrong, J. E. Bruce, Glenn E. Burgess and Lewis C. Dietrich as tellers, and the Conference proceeded with the election of the Conference Officials, which resulted as follows:

On the first ballot for President, Rev. Edward L. Elliott received 32 of 32 votes cast, and was declared elected.

On the first ballot for Vice-President, Rev. Arthur J. Taylor received 29 of 35 votes cast, and was declared elected.

On the first ballot for Secretary, Rev. Francis B. Markell received 33 of 36 votes cast, and was declared elected.

The first ballot for Treasurer was declared an informal ballot, but the deciding ballot gave Rev. John E. Bruce 22 of 34 votes cast, and he was declared elected Conference Treasurer.

On the first ballot for Sunday School Secretary, Miss Josephine Rickard received 28 of 31 votes cast, and was declared elected.

The following were elected by acclamation to fill their respective offices: Tithing Secretary, Rev. Jesse Steves; Statistical Secretary, Rev. Royal Woodhead.

The election of members of the Conference Board of Trustees resulted as follows: On the first ballot for Ministerial Member of the Board of Trustees Rev. Edward L. Elliott received 33 of 34 votes cast, and was declared elected.

For lay members on first ballot Edwin A. Gibbs received 25 of 34 votes cast, and Glenn E. Burgess received 21 of 35 votes cast, and was declared elected. Glenn E. Burgess was elected for a term of one year to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Ernest B. Houghton.

On motion Rev. Edward L. Elliott was elected as a member of the Local Board of Managers of Houghton College and Lynford Sicard was elected as Conference Superintendent of Young People's Work.

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, Rev. J. S. Willett presented the Connectional interests to the Conference.

The Conference was called to order by the President, and the Secretary nominated Rev. Walter Readett as Assistant Secretary and the nomination was sustained by vote of the Conference.

On motion Rev. and Mrs. M. A. Bateman were excused from the afternoon's session of the Conference.

THE LOCKPORT CONFERENCE

Adjourned by limitation of time, the benediction being given by Rev. Charles Sicard.

Second Day, Afternoon Session, April 14, 1932

The session was called to order by the President, and the devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. Adrian Everts.

The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

The following persons were introduced to the Conference and made a few remarks: Rev. Bates, Pastor of the Free Methodist Church, Lockport, N. Y.; Rev. Franklin, Evangelist of the New York Conference of the Free Methodist Church; Rev. W. H. Marvin of Houghton, N. Y.; and Dr. Pettit, Pastor of the Calvary Presbyterian Church, Lockport, N. Y.

The Conference Sunday School Secretary submitted her annual report through her assistant, Rev. Royal Woodhead, and the report was adopted. See Report No. 5.

The following names were called and their characters passed: George Osgood, William Osgood, James A. Bain, E. H. Johnson, J. R. Pitt, Walter Readett, Charles Sicard, A. J. Taylor.

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, Rev. W. H. Marvin preached a very forceful and inspirational message upon the infinite resources of God. Following this a sacramental service was held with Rev. James A. Bain in charge. God's presence was gloriously manifested and one seeking soul presented herself at the altar for heart purity and became a blessed recipient in Jesus' name.

The Conference was called to order by the President at 4:30, and sang the grand old hymn entitled, "The Old Rugged Cross," and after a few announcements adjourned on motion, the benediction being given by Rev. Royal Woodhead.

Third Day, Morning Session, April 15, 1932

The Conference was called to order by the President, and the devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. E. H. Johnson.

The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

On motion the Committee on Pastoral Relations and the Conference Board of Trustees were excused to confer together with regard to the disposition of Batavia and to draft resolutions to submit to the

Conference. During their absence a testimony service was held with Rev. H. H. Schoonover in charge. God's blessing was much in evidence.

The Conference was called to order by the President at 10:40, and the Secretary of the Joint Committee composed of the Committee on Pastoral Relations and the Conference Board of Trustees submitted the report of their deliberations and its adoption was recommended. Some discussion followed, but before the subject was disposed of the time for the Orders of the Day had arrived, and President Luckey addressed the Conference in behalf of the Educational interests.

Conference was called to order by the President, and adjourned on motion, the benediction being given by Rev. Walter Readett.

Third Day, Afternoon Session, April 15, 1932

The Conference was called to order by the President, and the devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. Freeman Smock.

The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

The unfinished business of the morning session, relative to the adoption of the resolution of the joint committee was taken up, considered, and a motion prevailed to the effect that when the vote is taken thereon it be taken by ballot. After further discussion and some amendment the resolution was adopted by a two-thirds vote of 22 yeas and 5 nays. See Report No. 6. However in case the proposition as contained in the foregoing resolution fails to materialize, and in case of the inability of the Conference President to secure a suitable man for Batavia within three months if Rev. O. G. McKinley is not available, the Board of Trustees of the Lockport Conference are authorized to dispose of the Batavia property at the best possible figure. The interpretation of the raising of Rev. O. G. McKinley's salary is left to the judgment of the Conference President.

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived Rev. J. S. Willett preached a very interesting and effective message on the important theme of love as based on the thirteenth chapter of First Corinthians.

The Conference was called to order by the President, and the congregation joined in singing a few verses of the familiar hymn, "More Love to Thee, O Christ."

The Auditing Committee made a partial report, having examined the books and report of the Conference Treasurer and found them correct. The report was adopted.

A request from the Rich Valley Church as read by the Pastor, Rev. E. H. Johnson was granted. See Report No. 7.

By Conference action the Conference Budget for the coming year was placed at two thousand and five hundred dollars.

The work of nominating the Standing Committees was referred to the Committee on Temporary Organization, and the President appointed Rev. Charles Sicard a member of the Committee to fill the vacancy caused by the absence of Rev. Jesse Steves.

Adjourned on motion, the benediction being given by Rev. A. O. Northrup.

Fourth Day, Morning Session, April 16, 1932

The Conference was called to order by the President, and the devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. Walter Readett.

The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

A letter was read from Rev. F. H. Wright conveying to the Conference the greetings of the School of Theology at Houghton, N. Y. The message was appreciatively received and the Secretary instructed to write a letter of response.

The Committee on Temporary Organization to whom was referred the matter of nominating the Standing Committees submitted its report, which was adopted as a partial report. The Committee was further instructed to nominate an Executive Committee for Young People's Work. See Report No. 8.

The Committee on Budget submitted its report, which was adopted. See Report No. 9.

The Committee on Post Office Addresses submitted its report, which was referred back to the Committee for corrections. The report was submitted later and adopted. See Report No. 10.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders submitted its report. The case of Nelson Taylor was referred back to the Committee for further consideration. This was done and the report adopted as first submitted. See Report No. 11.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

At this time Rev. James A. Bain tendered his resignation from the Board of Trustees and requested a letter of transfer to the Allegheny Conference. His resignation was accepted and the request for transfer was granted. After this a rising vote of thanks was tendered Brother Bain for his faithful service rendered the Conference during his ministration of the affairs of the Conference.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations submitted its report, which was considered, amended and its adoption postponed. See Report No. 12.

The name of George I. Norman was called and his character passed. He then presented two petitions to Conference; one in favor of the reception and establishing of a mission among the Indians at Red House, N. Y. The other a request signed by the members of the Olean Church for Conference endorsement regarding a program of expansion. The minutes of the Board of Trustees regarding their action as touching this matter were read for the information of the Conference.

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived a memorial service in charge of Rev. Charles Sicard was held in honor of Mr. Ernest Houghton an earnest and faithful lay member of the Cattaraugus Church and of the Lockport Conference. Rev. Charles Sicard, President J. S. Luckey and Rev. A. J. Taylor spoke very appreciatively of his labors and memory. The service was closed in prayer by Rev. J. S. Willett and Rev. J. A. Bain.

The time of adjournment having arrived it was extended sufficiently long enough to elect a trustee to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Rev. James A. Bain. The deciding ballot gave Rev. Charles Sicard 18 of 34 votes cast and he was declared elected.

On motion the W. H. & F. M. Society were given ten minutes following the opening of the afternoon session to conduct a memorial service in honor of Miss Anna Freeman for many years a Matron of the Bethesda Rescue Home of Bradford and the Bethshan Home of Canton, Ohio.

Adjourned by limitation of time, the benediction being given by Rev. Melvin Taylor.

Fourth Day, Afternoon Session, April 16, 1932

The session was called to order by the Secretary, and the time ordinarily given to the opening exercises was given to the W. H. &

F. M. Society to conduct a memorial service in honor of Miss Anna Freeman. Mrs. Nettie Readett and Rev. C. I. Armstrong spoke very appreciatively of her life and labor.

The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

The following names were called and their characters passed: Royal Woodhead, Jesse Steves, Charles L. Horton, H. H. Schoonover, Price Stark, Helen Stark, W. W. Rolf, C. M. Dudley, C. E. Woodhead, W. A. Backus, Henry J. Bullock, C. H. Dow, Olga Norman, Lulu Tanner, Nelson Taylor, Sarah Wilcox, Florence Yorton, Gordon Thurbur.

A letter was read from C. H. Dow conveying greetings to the Conference and the Secretary was instructed to write a letter in reply.

The reports of the Allegany and Brocton charges were read by their supply Pastors.

On request Rev. H. H. Schoonover was excused from Conference.

The report of the Conference Treasurer was read by the Secretary on account of the absence of the Treasurer who was ill. The report having received the O. K. of the Auditing Committee was adopted. See Report No. 13.

It was moved and supported that ninety dollars (\$90.00) be appropriated from the Conference Budget to meet part of the deficit on the Educational Budget.

It was moved and seconded that Rev. Royal Woodhead be elected as Conference Budget Secretary to assist the Conference President in raising the Conference Budget. The motion was lost by a vote of 7 for and 22 against.

The second reading of the report of the Committee on Pastoral Relations was called for. The report was adopted. See Report No. 12.

It was moved and supported that the Board of Trustees of the Lockport Conference be authorized to dispose of the Church and parsonage in Olean at such a time as seems best in the judgment of the Board and that said Board be fully authorized to carry forward such expansion program as will be proper for the enlargement of our work in that city. It is understood that the Lockport Conference shall not be financially obligated in this matter. The motion prevailed.

The report of the Board of Trustees was submitted by its Secretary and adopted on motion. See Report No. 14.

The Committee on Temporary Organization to which was referred the work of nominating an Executive Committee for Young People's Work submitted their nominations which were received. The request of Rev. C. I. Armstrong to be excused from the Conference was granted.

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived Rev. W. H. Marvin preached a very effective and touching message on the Love of God.

The Conference was called to order at 4:00 P. M., and the President nominated Rev. Charles Sicard and Glenn E. Burgess as the members of his Advisory Board. These nominations received the Conference endorsement.

The Conference received a cordial invitation from the Levant Charge to hold its next Annual Session in the Levant Church, and the invitation was accepted by vote of the Conference.

The Secretary was authorized to secure 250 copies of the Conference minutes printed and sent pro-rata to the various Charges.

The Committee on Thanks read its report, which was adopted and requested read in the Sunday morning's service. See Report No. 15.

The Committee on Post Office Addresses submitted its report, which had been referred back to them for corrections. The report was adopted.

By Conference action the item entitled Isolated Members was ordered stricken from the Statistical Report. The report was then submitted by the Committee and adopted. See Report No. 17.

The report of the Committee on Tithing was read and adopted. See Report No. 16.

Rev. Simpson, Superintendent of the Buffalo District of the Free Methodist Church, was introduced to the Conference and made a few remarks.

Mr. Hurley Baker, who has been working among the Indians at Red House and Salamance, reported on the condition and prospects of the work there, giving a very interesting and touching appeal for help. After this the Conference President was authorized to visit the field, investigate and use his judgment relative to the bringing of that work under the jurisdiction of the Lockport Conference.

Minutes were approved as read.

Conference adjourned to meet at the call of the Chair, the benediction being given by Rev. A. O. Northrup.

Report No. 3

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the Members of the Lockport Wesleyan Conference, Greetings. This is a time to "Look up and lift up your heads." To the world it is a time of uncertainty and fear. The foundations have been slipping. But the foundation of the church "Standeth sure."

During the past year the churches constituting our Conference have been carrying on. Bank failures, unemployment and the low price of produce have affected the income of many. Nevertheless our people purpose to go forward. God is blessing us in our loyal purpose and the way ahead is bright.

At the last annual session the President was assigned some definite duties. The churches at Ransomville and Batavia were left in his care. He was instructed to visit Brocton, N. Y., and, if considered feasible, to organize a Wesleyan church. The plan also included one or two visits to each church in the Conference.

In harmony with my instructions I visited Brocton and on my second visit was accompanied by Rev. Charles Sicard, a member of my Advisory Board.

We organized a Wesleyan Church with sixteen members. Later in June, I appointed a young man, Russell Frase, as supply Pastor of this new work.

Immediately following Conference, twenty-four persons withdrew from the Batavia Church, and began conducting a mission in the city. This created a situation which was difficult to provide for. However, services were held regularly in the church until the end of the month of June when it seemed best to close the church. On March 13, 1932, at my request, Rev. O. G. McKinley went to the city of Batavia to conduct a fifteen-day revival meeting in the Wesleyan Church. The response was favorable, and we hope arrangements may be made to continue such evangelistic effort.

In the matter of visitation of the churches, I have visited all the groups at least once except Bradford which visit was prevented, but our good Vice-President supplied the need. During June and July, I visited Brocton, Ransomville, Ashwood, Chestnut Ridge, Hess Road, Scranton, North Tonawanda, Batavia, Machias, Allegany and Higgins. September and October found me at Driftwood, Emporium and Ellicott. In December and January, I visited Fillmore, Higgins, Allegany, Houghton, Cattaraugus, Olean, Forestville and East Leon. The only churches visited in March were Brocton and Forestville. The special needs connected with Brocton and Batavia consumed more than a proportionate amount of time, since several trips were made in connection with each place.

Many splendid things could be said concerning the faithful work of our Pastors on the various charges. Many revival meetings have been held and some good fruitage. The men in the new fields have manifested good courage and God is blessing.

SUNDAY SCHOOL SECRETARY'S REPORT

During the year three Sunday School Conventions have been held, one for the Southern District (a combined Sunday School and Holiness Convention) on June 16 at Olean, for the Central District on June 17 at Fillmore, for the Conference on October 8, 9 at Levant. The first two emphasized the Word of God in its relation to the Sunday School, the third, our great opportunity. The Olean Convention was very well attended, the other two poorly attended by the outlying charges, but in all three there was much of spiritual inspiration.

We visited eighteen Sunday Schools at Sunday School hour. (This includes three lately organized by established schools.) We regret that we were unable to find opportunity to visit the remaining ten (likewise including three new ones).

Where we have been able to compare reports by reason of their being complete we notice that seven Sunday Schools have made a gain in main school enrollment, while eight have lost; that nine have gained in average attendance while five have lost. The greatest gains in the first have been in Olean (119), Driftwood (23), Emporium (22), Fillmore (15); in the second, at Olean (56), Driftwood (15). The most startling success it at Olean, which has thus brought herself up above the hundred mark in average attendance, enjoying this honor with Houghton, Levant and Bradford.

B. and on Harvest Day by the W. H. & F. M. Society may count toward this Budget.
- 2. The part of the Budget for Foreign Missions is \$2,400 and all money paid for current expenses for Foreign Missions, all money appropriated for this purpose by the W. H. & F. M. Society, and all money paid by the Y. M. W. B. may count toward this Budget.

- 3. The part of the Budget for Home Missions is \$478, and all money paid for Home Missions and all money appropriated for this purpose by the W. H. & F. M. Society or the Y. M. W. B. may count toward this Budget.
- 4. The part of the Budget for Hephzibah Orphanage is \$246, and all money paid for the Orphanage or appropriated for this purpose shall count on this Budget.
- 5. The part of the Budget for Sunday School work is \$175, half of which is for Connectional Sunday School work and half of which is for Conference Sunday School work.
- 6. We recommend that the part of the Budget for Conference be \$2,400, and nothing but cash may count toward this Budget. We recommend that this Budget be distributed as follows:

The Board of Trustees of the Lockport Conference, having been called to order by the Chairman, Rev. James A. Bain, during the session of the Lockport Conference held at Hess Road, April 13, 1932, submitted to the Conference the following recommendations:

That Edwin A. Gibbs be authorized to represent the Board of Trustees of the Lockport Conference in securing from the Bradford Bond and Mortgage Company a bond, or other paper or papers, to show that the Brandford Bond and Mortgage Company has assumed responsibility for the payment of interest on the mortgage, and of the mortgage, which is held by the Board of Trustees of the Lockport Annual Conference against the Bethesda Home property in Bradford, Pa.

That disbursements be made as follows:

The payment of the following appropriations from the Superannuated Fund: To Rev. Charles H. Dow, \$100.00; to Mrs. J. H. Woodhouse, \$50.00; to Mrs. J. R. Babcock, \$50.00; to Miss Florence Yorton, \$50.00.

That when the mortgage held by Henry M. Wolcott of Batavia, N. Y., shall become due the Chairman of the Board of Trustees shall pay the interest on the mortgage, and whatever, in his personal judgment, may then be available on the principle.

That \$25.00 per month be paid by the Conference Treasurer to Rev. A. O. Northrup for his personal services during the coming year

in North Tonawanda, N. Y.

That the sum of \$33.45 be paid from the Conference treasury on the note in the Falconer Bank at Falconer, N. Y., and that the remaining \$200.00 due on said note be met by a loan from the Superannuated Fund of the Lockport Conference, said loans to be secured by a note to the Conference Treasurer, signed in behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Lockport Conference.
