Daily Proceedings

Tuesday, July 18, 2:00 p. m.

The fifty-eighth session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Camp Meeting Association at Greer, South Carolina at 2:00 p. m., July 18, 1950. Rev. W. S. Allred conducted devotions.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. V. A. Mitchell, who declared the Conference bar to consist of the platform and the first six benches in the three middle tiers of seats.

The roll was called and 30 elders and 14 conference preachers answered to roll call.

Committee on Credentials—A motion prevailed that the Conference Secretary be the Committee on Credentials. On motion the Conference voted by the necessary two-thirds majority to make it a standing rule of the Conference that the Conference Secretary be the Committee on Credenials.

Conference adjourned by limitation of time.

Wednesday, July 19, 7:30 p. m.

The Conference W. M. S. held its public missionary service with Mrs. J. B. Hilson, President, presiding. The main speaker was Rev. Carroll Brentlinger, missionary-elect to Haiti. An offering of \$400.00 in cash and pledges was received toward the expenses of his going to the field.

Thursday, July 20, 8: 30 a. m.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. R. C. Kendrick.

Conference was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Conference voted to excuse Rev. R. G. Cudd after the morning sitting, because of a death in his family.

Resolutions—A motion prevailed to have the President appoint a Committee to study and make recommendations regarding revision of the standing rules of the Conference. The President appointed J. B. Hilson, E. L. Gunby and Talmage Evatt.

Because of the date of General Conference it was voted that the next annual session of the South Carolina Conference be July the 24th, 1951.

Superannuate Fund—A motion prevailed that the balance of the Conference Superanuate Fund still on hand be kept for use as follows: Upon the death of an active or superannuated minister the Conference is to pay toward his funeral expenses one dollar for each year of service that he has given within the Conference. The Conference Treasurer is authorized and instructed to hold and disburse this money accordingly.

Superannuate Pension Plan—The Committee to make recommendations to memorialize General Conference regarding the Superannuate Pension Plan reported. The Conference voted to send the following Memorial to General Conference:

- (1) Paragraph 316, Item 4. In Section (1) eliminate words from "And" in line 2 Section (1) to the word "Ordained" in line 4 Section (1) making Section (1) to read as follows: "Elders and Conference Preachers who are giving full time to a Conference appointment and his time of service shall begin with his first full time Conference appointment."
- (2) In Item 5. (Paragraph 317) Section (1) eliminate the first word. In Item 5. Section (2) eliminate the first three words and add to the end of the paragraph these words—"While the wife of a Wesleyan Methodist minister and in addition she shall receive full benefits for any service rendered that is covered by the Pension Plan.
 - (3) To Item 5 (Paragraph 317) add:
- (Section 9) "If a member ceases to be engaged in work covered by the Pension Plan he may discontinue payment of his assessments and upon retirement be eligible to draw benefits on the years of service rendered under the Pension Plan, unless he is proved guilty of immoral conduct.
- (4) Paragraph 319. Item 7. Eliminate all of paragraph after the word "Plan" in next to the last line and add the following words—"Without paying his assessment during the time of his inactivity. The validity of the cause and the duration of this temporary inactivity shall be determined by the Conference Board on Pension Plan. The time of such inactivity shall not count on his service record."

The following resolution was passed and ordered placed in the standing rules: Resolved, that Mr. Talmage Evatt, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, be and he hereby is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

Missionary Board-The retiring Missionary Board reported. Report

adopted. (See Report No. 4.)

A motion prevailed to authorize the President to attend the annual convention of the National Association of Evangelicals with traveling expenses paid.

A motion prevailed to have the President appoint a committee to draw up a resolution to be presented to the President of the United States protesting the matter of sending an envoy to the Vatican. J. B. Hilson, David A. Rees and K. W. Johnston were named to this committee.

Conference voted to postpone the Order of the Day five minutes.

Conference voted to recess to the Orders of the Day.

The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived Conference was called to order and Rev. David A. Rees delivered a very challenging Denominational Address.

Conference adjourned by limitation of time.

Thursday, July 20, 1:30 p. m.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. L. W. Barbee. Conference was called to order by the Vice-President.

Itineracy and Orders—The Committee on Itineracy and Orders made a partial report which was adopted. (See Report No. 5.)

Apportionment—The Committee on Apportionment reported recommending that the Conference endorse the Denominational Budget which is as follows per member: Foreign Misions, \$2.00; Home Missions, \$1.00; Education, \$2.00; Orphanage, \$.25; General Conference Expense, \$.20; Administrative Expense, \$.25; Superannuate Pension Plan, \$1.50; Denominational Sunday School Work, \$.05 per member enrolled in the main school; also that the Conference Budget be as follows per member: President's Salary, \$1.55; Conference Work, \$.40; Conference Missions, \$2.50; Conference Entertainment, \$.40; Minutes, \$.15; Mountain Missions, \$.25.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted and ordered wired to the President of the United States:

"Whereas, we the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America wish to express our unqualified belief in the principle of separation of Church and State as guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States and upheld by our best traditions and,

Whereas, we have authentic information that renewed pressure is being brought on the President of the United States by the Roman Catholic Hierarchy to appoint a successor to Myron C. Taylor as Ambassador or Envoy to the Vatican,

Be it resolved that the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, now in session at Greer, South Carolina views with grave alarm this move as well as the ten years illegal Ambassadorship of Vatican which still exists on paper.

Therefore we strongly urge that this appointment not be made and

that the last trace of this sectarian political privilege be now and forever abolished."

Audit—The Auditing Committee reported. Report adopted. (See port No. 13.)

Committee on Fifth Sunday Holiness Convention reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 11.)

An offering in the amount of \$33.87 was received for Mrs. J. C. Nunnally.

Reports—Reports were given by: M. C. King (given by Mrs. M. C. King), C. W. Nalley, A. C. Parker, L. Rigdon, J. D. Evatt, J. R. Hammond, Curtis Harris, J. C. Lackey, H. L. McCall, Rufus Morgan, C. D. Roach, W. A. Wiggins, J. M. Hames (read by Secretary), W. R. French (charcater passed by vote of Conference due to late report), W. L. Benjamin, J. B. Hilson, Mrs. Fred Hughes (character passed by vote of the Conference), K. W. Bauer (character passed by Conference vote), E. L. Shigley, Jr.

A motion prevailed to give the trustees of Tuckasegee Church authority to sign deeds to exchange a certain part of the church property for some adjoining property.

The Spartanburg District Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location reported that it approved the plan to veneer the Lyman parsonage with asbestos shingles.

The Conference voted to instruct the Secretary to have 1,100 copies of the minutes printed.

Courtesy—Professor Stanley Banker of Central College, Professor and Mrs. L. A. Harvey of Central College and elders of the North Carolina Conference and Mrs. David A. Rees of Syracuse, New York were introduced to the Conference and made appropriate remarks.

Conference recessed to the Orders of the Day.

Ordination Service—There was an ordination service with the President in charge. Revs. J. C. Lackey, H. L. McCall, C. V. Marchbanks, Douglas Heffner, Fred Hughes and Gordon H. Carey were ordained to Elders Orders in the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. Rev. David A. Rees preached the ordination sermon.

Thursday, July 20, 7:30 p. m.

There was an educational service in charge of Dr. R. C. Mullinax, President of Central College. Rev. David A. Rees gave the main address.

Conference was called to order at 9:25 by the President.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its first reading.

The following committee was elected to study and make recommendations regarding publishing a Conference paper: J. B. Hilson, C. T. Bryant, J. B. Childs, V. A. Mitchell, K. W. Johnston.

The Educational Secretary reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 9.)

The Committee on Ministerial Meetings of the Central District reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 10.)

Reports-G. H. Carey gave his report.

The Pioneer Secretary gave a verbal report. Report adopted. Conference adjourned by vote.

Friday, July 21, 8:30 a. m.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. P. C. Lusk.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

A motion prevailed to grant Rev. P. C. Lusk a letter of transfer to the Ohio Conference. The Conference gave a rising vote of appreciation for his work in the conference.

Men's Missionary League—K. W. Johnston resigned as Secretary of the Men's Missionary League. The conference voted to accept his resignation. J. B. Childs was elected to fill the vacancy.

A motion prevailed to have the Missionary Board nominate the District Committees on Church Extension and Evangelism.

Memorial to General Conference—The conference voted to propose the following memorial to General Conference:

Paragraph 166, sub-paragraph (2), section (b), after the word "evangelist" insert "and all others on the conference roll not appointed to pastoral work." It will then read, "Each evangelist and all others on the conference roll not appointed to pastoral work should be required to give a complete statistical report of his work to the Annual Conference to which he belongs according to the following plan:"

The conference elected W. D. Correll and V. A. Mitchell a committee (with power to act) to draw up a memorial to General Conference to amend the Discipline so that churches will not be assessed budget for members who are children and that children would not have voting privileges in the business of the church.

Standing Rules—The committee elected to make recommendations regarding revision of the Standing Rules of the conference made the following recommendations: Delete Rules 4 and 15 as printed in the Minutes of 1949. Revise Rule 13 by taking out the words "Church Extension and Conference Evangelism and General Conference Travel" and insert "Conference Missions." Revise Rule 18 by substituting the word "should" for the words "is to" in line one and substituting the words "a vote of the church or charge, giving permission" for the words "getting the consent of his church or charge." Revise Rule 20 to make it read "all officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected." Revise Rule 21 to make it read "Conference shall convene each year on the Tuesday nearest July 15." Add the

following Rule: "The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before conference."

Sunday School Secretary—The Sunday School Secretary read his report. The report was adopted except the recommendations which were voted on separately. The recommendations were amended and adopted by vote of the conference. (See Report No. 12.)

Courtesy—Miss Mary Baker from Brainerd Indian Training School in South Dakota and Rev. Miss Dorothy Shook of the Tennessee Conference were introduced to the conference and gave words of greeting.

Statistics-The Statistical Committee reported. Report adopted.

Memorials—The Committee on Memorials reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 7.)

S. Irving Keeler and J. J. Miller reported.

On motion the conference voted to grant Rev. J. J. Miller a letter of standing and express its regret upon his leaving and a statement of confidence in his Christian character is to accompany his letter.

Trustees—The Board of Trustees reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 6.)

Adjourned by limitation of time.

Friday, July 21, 1: 30 p. m.

After brief devotions conference was called to order by J. B. Hilson.

A motion prevailed that the balance on hand for General Conference Travel at the close of conference in 1947 be transferred to the Conference Work fund and that it be used for painting the Conference President's parsonage, and the balance, if any, be used where the Missionary Board deems best.

Memorial to General Conference—The conference voted to memorialize General Conference to amend the Discipline as follows: Paragraph 357, sub-paragraph (2), Delete the last question, "Do you use tea or coffee?"

Reports were given by George James, W. H. Pittman (read by R. V. Fox), C. A. Powell (read by secretary).

A motion prevailed to pass the character of O. D. Bowling and Mrs. Marie Downer Clement who were unable to attend conference.

Edit Minutes—A motion prevailed to authorize the secretary to edit the Minutes.

Unfinished Business—The conference voted to authorize the President and his Advisory Board to take care of any unfinished business after conference adjourns.

The Prayer League Secretary of the Spartanburg District gave a verbal report.

Treasurer—The report of the Conference Treasurer was read. Report adopted. (See Report No. 14.)

Conference Sermon—On motion conference voted that V. A. Mitchell preach the Conference Sermon in 1951 and that W. S. Allred be the alternate to preach the Conference Sermon.

Conference recessed to the call of the Chair.

Conference was called to order at 6:30 p. m. by the President.

The Judiciary Committee reported that it had taken no action during the year.

Advisory Board—The President nominated and the conference elected Rev. R. C. Kendrick and Mr. Talmage Evatt as the President's Advisory Board.

Boards on Church and Parsonage Building and Location—The President nominated and the conference elected the following Boards on Church and Parsonage Building and Location: Central District—E. L. Gunby, G. C. Summey; Columbia District—E. L. Shigley, Jr., Dan Gambrell; Greenville District—C. T. Bryant, W. F. Mullinax; Spartanburg District—C. M. Elrod, J. T. Chandler.

The conference voted to elect the Conference President the official delegate to the convention of the National Association of Evangelicals.

The conference voted that the committee elected to study and make recommendations regarding the publication of a conference paper continue to study the matter during the year and make report with recommendations to next conference.

A motion prevailed to pass the character of W. E. Bowie and J. H. Miller.

The Vice-President was called to the Chair.

V. A. Mitchell reported.

The President resumed the Chair.

Missionary Board—The Missionary Board reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 3.)

Pastoral Relations—The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its second and final reading. Report adopted. (See Report No. 2.)

Boundary—The Committee on Pastoral Relations recommended "That the Missionary Board be a committee with power to act in making an adjustment of the boundary between the North Carolina Conference and the South Carolina Conference where the church on the Cherokee Indian Reservation is involved." The recommendation was adopted.

Itineracy and Orders—The Committee on Itineracy and Orders reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 5.)

The Minutes were read and approved.

A motion prevailed to adopt the Minutes for the entire session.

The conference voted to adjourn sine die.

Standing Rules and Resolutions

STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.
- 2. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents if they hold membership in secret societies.
- 3. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and also to hold if possible a two-weeks' revival during the year.
- 4. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.
- 5. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship shall not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other Church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.
- 6. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 7. That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.
- 8. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.
- 9. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most carefully to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. The Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the percentage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who are not giving at all. Each pastor and church shall co-operate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.

- 10. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
- 11. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees of said South Carolina Annual Conference are also hereby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of his entire Advisory Board.
- 12. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, and Conference Missions, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.
- 13. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our building projects.

- 14. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a. m. Wednesday of Conference.
- 15. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.

- 16. In the ordination of ministers to Elders Orders, it shall be the policy of this Conference to ordain only those ministers who have passed the course of study as required by our Discipline.
- 17. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission.
- 18. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.
- 19. Conference shall convene each year on the Tuesday nearest July 15.
- 20. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before Conference.
 - 21. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.
- 22. Mr. Talmage Evatt, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
- 23. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project must be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.

Reports of Committies

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Through the providences of God we are permitted to assemble for this fifty-eighth session of the South Carolina Conference. We are here to report our activities, worship the Lord, renew Christian fellowship, and to devise plans that will mean better days in the future. It is hoped that this session will be characterized by the presence of God, Christian courtesy, brotherly love, and unity in all of our deliberations and aggressiveness and efficiency in all of our planning.

It is with a sense of unworthiness that this report is given. The services rendered has fallen short of what you and I desired. However, in spite of this the Lord has given a wonderful year materially, financially, numerically and spiritually. The Lord has verified the promise He gave me at the beginning of the year: "When thou goest thy way shall be opened up before thee step by step." (Proverbs 4: 12 free translation.) To Him be all the glory!

Appreciation

I feel that I have been sent "To reap that whereon I bestowed no labour: other men laboured and I am entered into their labour" (John 4:38). As I traveled the conference I was impressed with the godly life, good influence, and the great work done by Brothers Keeler, Correll, Kendrick, and Mullinax, as well as others who have preceded me. They did a good work and today we are reaping the harvest as a result of the efficient sowing done by these brethren. All officers have been most co-operative and helpful. As far as I know every committee, pastor, and layman have blended their efforts to make the work prosper. The unity that has existed among the brethren has been like "the precious ointment that was poured forth on Aaron's beard."

At the time of this gathering we have seen the "cold war" which has existed more or less since "V. J. Day" between Communism and democracy turn into a hot war. The blood of the American Youth is again being spilt upon foreign soil. It is sincerely hoped that this shall soon cease and that a third world war shall not develop. In spite of the international crisis, the leveling off economically, and the threats of another war the Lord is giving some gracious revivals throughout the United States.

In our own Conference we have seen revival fires that fell on our camp meeting sweep out over the conference to reach a number of our churches. These revivals not only brought spiritual victories to the

churches, but there was a goodly number added to our church rolls. The Sunday schools have had a fine increase likewise.

Many churches have engaged in building programs. The value of our property will show a great increase, but since some of the property involved considerable indebtedness the indebtedness on church property will likewise show a decided increase. Greenwood has built a fine brick church on Phoenix Street. The building is 30 x 70 with Sunday school and rest rooms. The building is valued by some at \$25,00.00. There is some indebtedness. Calhoun has recently begun erecting a new church in a new location. Carlisle added additional Sunday school rooms, built a youth chapel and rest rooms, and redecorated the interior of the church, at a cost of \$9,000.00. Westminster re-roofed the church, added Sunday school and rest rooms, re-arranged the auditorium, installed a gas heating system and bricked-veneered the entire building. There is considerable indebtedness. Smith Chapel has added Sunday school rooms, brick veneered the entire building, installed new pews and a gas heating system with only a small indebtedness. Pickens View has added additional Sunday school rooms and installed an oil furnace. Eastley, First has added additional Sunday school rooms without any indebtedness. Easley, Greenwood is adding additional Sunday school rooms and have installed a Hammond organ. Spartanburg has redecorated the auditorium, laid a new carpet, and installed an oil furnace. Central, Second; Easley, Alice and Clifton have installed gas heating systems. Greer has installed a Hammond organ and re-decorated the parsonage. Providence and Knighton Chapel have installed new pews. Greenville, First has laid a new carpet. Welcome and Mountain View each is adding Sunday school rooms. Florence has purchased a parsonage. The payments to a little more than the rent they were paying on the apartment occupied by the pastor. Buck Creek has erected a new parsonage. Lyman improved their parsonage by weather boarding with asbestos siding. Piedmont is to be congratulated on paying off the indebtedness (\$1,805.83) on their church. Improvements have been made by Fountain Inn, Chesnee, Whitmire, Glendale, Iva, Tucapau, Liberty, and perhaps others that I do not recall.

The total raised for all purposes no doubt will be the highest in our history. Our pastors are being paid an all-time high, but this is not as much as it should be. Many of our churches raised the salary of their pastor during the year and others plan raises for the new year. We raised 98% of the total budget, but certain items were over while others were under. We increased the amount for pension plan to 85% which will give our retired ministers an increase of 11% in their income.

Admonitions

If our pastors and churches will be more diligent, systematic, and aggressive in this matter a full budget can be raised. The Conference can-

not successfully operate without a full budget. Our ministers need to be better trained, better paid, more sacrificing, and harder working. There should be a better understanding of, and a better discharging of the duties of the pasterel office as is required by our book of discipline. There must be a closer adherence to the discipline and conference rules. As one example: attention is called to paragraph 168B in our book of discipline and standing rule 14 of the conference. If our pastors will consult the proper officials before engaging non-Wesleyan evangelist it will save embarrassment. Several churches disregarded or overlooked the matter of having the plans approved by the proper committee before improvements were made on the church property. The churches should give attention to better care of church property, and pastors and churches should fully co-operate with the entire conference program.

I attended the North Carolina Conference, Greer Camp Meeting, the formal ground breaking and opening service of the Greenwood Church, the opening, harvest day, and commencement exercises of Central College, 6 district W. Y. P. S. rallies, the state W. Y. P. S. convention, I W. Y. P. S. council meeting, the southern area W. M. S. convention, the southern area Youth Bible Camp, the southern area Ministerial Institute, the Leaders' Conference, 2 district ministers and missionary conventions, the state Ministerial Institute, assisted in the Alabama Conference Ministerial Institute, and was convention speaker of the South Georgia Conference W. Y. P. S. Hours have been spent in private and business consultations, committee meetings, and putting up and taking down the tent. I held two quarterly meetings on each charge, one of which was the fourth. I have consulted with the stewards of local churches and in some cases raises in pastor's salary were realized and vacations were granted to pastors.

Advancement

The W. Y. P. S. of the conference showed their interest in and concern for the conference advancement program. When given the opportunity to purchase a tent they gave in cash and pledges enough to buy the best tent that is made. The pledges came in sufficiently to enable the W. Y. P. S. Council and the Missionary Board to make arrangements to purchase a 40 x 60 steel cable tent. We are counting on the balance of the pledges coming in which will enable us to take care of the money for which we had to arrange. The Columbia District W. Y. P. S. made it possible to hold a tent meeting at Newberry by contributing the major part of the finances of the meeting. Brothers Elrod, Johnson, Alexander, and Lackey were the efficient workers. There was considerable expense involved, but they served for their expenses and were given a small love offering. Some of the party have already volunteered their services in a further extension program. The Missionary Board supplemented the meeting to the amount of \$138.00. A preaching point has been started as a result of the meeting, and we are hopeful that eventually a Wesleyan work can be organized. The Cateechee-Central Second Charge used the tent in Pendleton for 18 days. The meeting did not accomplish what we had hoped, but the charge is to be commended for their evangelistic fervor. The Spartanburg and Carlisle churches will be using the tent in a new field in Spartanburg immediately after conference, and other churches have expressed a desire to do like work in territory adjacent to their churches. It is hoped that other churches will imbibe this spirit and go and do likewise.

We are still giving aid to some of the new churches. The time should soon come when they are able to finance their own program, but until such is the case some aid will have to be given. Brother Giles has been most helpful and co-operative in the extension program. The pastor and good people of Whitmire did much to make the Newberry meeting successful.

Official Acts

The action of the Advisory Board was unanimous in those cases where they acted.

July 25, 1949, I gave the Laurens Church permission to secure Rev. Wolf of the Pilgrim Holiness Church as evangelist.

August 15, 1949, we appointed Rev. A. D. Horton pastor of the Providence Church after a unanimous vote of the church.

August 15, 1949, we received and accepted the resignation of Rev. A. E. Farmer of the Davis Chapel Church. A few days later he voluntarily surrendered his credentials, the reason for such is found in the files of the secretary and conference president.

September 27, 1949, we appointed Rev. F. L. Elrod pastor of Davis

Chapel Church after a unanimous vote of the church.

October 13, 1949, Rev. W. A. Todd voluntarily surrendered his credentials as an Elder of the Wesleyan Methodist Church after confessing to violating paragraph 408 of our book of discipline.

October 14, 1949, I received the transfer of Rev. K. W. Bauer, a conference preacher of the Michigan Conference.

November 1, 1949, after I learned and called the attention to the fact that the church organized by the North Carolina Conference on the Cherokee Indian Reservation is in Jackson County, North Carolina, which is a part of the South Carolina Conference, and upon the request of the President of the North Carolina Conference we gave the North Carolina Conference permission to operate the said church until further study and consultation can result in some definite proposal to fix a boundary or to settle the conditions on which it might be operated by the North Carolina Conference.

December 13, 1949, we approved the election of all W. Y. P. S. officers, and approved the financial program adopted by the Council.

January 15, 1950, I gave the Florence Church permission to secure Rev. J. W. Jones of the Nazarene church as evangelist.

March 6, 1950, we gave Rev. A. E. Belk permission to pastor the Shady Grove Charge of the Methodist church of Waynesville, North Carolina, Route 2.

March 22, 1950, I granted Rev. G. E. Failing a transfer to the Lockport Conference.

April 5, 1950, we gave the Central First Church permission to contact Rev. W. A. Smith of the Kansas Conference as pastor.

April 5, 1950, we submitted the names of Revs. G. I. Norman, John Cole, and H. N. Hoggle on the available list of pastors.

June 17, 1950, we gave the Central First Church permission to vote on Rev. Leslie D. Wilcox of the Ohio Conference as pastor with the following statement accompanying: "Since this is the third person from the same conference who has considered coming to the South Carolina Conference and inasmuch as one person from the same conference has already agreed to serve a charge in the South Carolina Conference, we wonder if it is wise to receive so many persons from the same conference in the same year.

June 29, 1950, I granted Rev. J. V. Smith a transfer to the Tennessee Conference.

July 6, 1950, I received the transfer of Rev. D. T. Winters a Conference Preacher of the Kentucky Conference.

July 17, 1950, I received the transfer of Rev. G. H. Cary, a Conference Preacher of the Indiana Conference.

Recommendations

- 1. That the conference be divided into four districts to correspond to the W. Y. P. S. Districts.
- 2. That a committee of three, of which one shall be a layman, be elected from each District to be known as a District Committee on Church extension whose duties will be to survey fields, create interest, and cooperate with the Missionary Board in church extension.
- 3. That the conference year be divided into four quarters which shall end on September 30th, December 31st, March 31st, and June 30th.
- 4. That this conference elect a Committee to investigate the advisability of publishing a conference paper and propose definite recommendations to the Conference regarding this.
- 5. That the Trustees be instructed to secure up-to-date information on all of our church property.
- 6. When a church engages in a building or re-modeling project that at least one half of the estimated cost of the project be on hand before said project is to be undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve it before it is considered satisfactory. I further recommend that this become a standing rule of the Conference.

Report No. 3

MISSIONARY BOARD, 1950-1951

The Missionary Board submits the following report:

We recommend:

- 1. That the president receive \$60.00 per week salary, parsonage rent, and five cents per mile traveling expense.
- 2. That the president be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside the conference without it affecting his salary, and confer with the Missienary Board with respect to meetings within the conference.
- 3. That the president hold two quarterly meetings on each charge, one of which shall be the fourth.
 - 4. That the president advise with the Board of Stewards of local

churches for the purpose of encouraging and divising methods and plans for the better payment of pastors.

- 5. That the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 from the funds for Conference Work.
- 6. That the secretary's salary and treasurer's salary be \$100.00 each, to be taken from fund for Conference Work.
- 7. That the president be authorized to draw on the fund for Conference Work for the purpose of printing blanks and other such items.
 - 8. That we pay the Florence Church \$10.00 per week.
- 9. That A. E. Belk be paid a maximum of \$50.00 per month until such time as his salary exceeds \$20.00 per week, provided that if a suitable house can be rented for less than \$50.00 the difference is to be deducted from the payments.
- 10. That when a church invites the Sunday School Secretary for a service, an offering be lifted for him.
- 11. That the Missionary Board be privileged to formulate plans for church extension work for the year following its term of office.
- 12. That when it becomes necessary for the conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid will be determined by the Missicnary Board, and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said Doard; and in no case shall a church receive aid longer than four years without a majority vote of the Annual Conference, upon petition of said church. We further recommend that as long as said church receives aid from the conference it shall consult the Missionary Board before calling a pastor.
- 13. That the pastor of any church receiving aid from the conference shall secure permission from the Missionary Board before he may conduct more than two revivals away from his church during the year.
- 14. That the pastor serving a church which is receiving aid from the conference, who desires to move or make any change in relation to his work must first consult with the Missionary Board.
- 15. That the North Charleston charge receive \$50.00 per week and moving expenses of pastor, provided that if the salary exceeds \$60.00 per week and house rent, the difference is to apply on the \$50.00.
- 16. That the Piedmont Church be paid \$100.00 and Knighton Chapel be paid an amount equal to that paid in by said church up to the amount of their apportionment for Conference Missions.

MISSIONARY BOARD, 1949-1950

On November 5, 1949 a majority of the members met with the Conference Trustees to consider a petition from the Florence Church, asking that the parsonage lot be deeded to the pastor in order that a larger loan be secured for building.

After due consideration the Board decided not to grant such request, but that the regular proceedure be carried out. It was also the mind of several members of the Board that the cost of building was not to exceed \$6.000.00.

On February 7, 1950 the Missionary Board met at the First Church in Greenville, S. C. (all members present except Rev. W. D. Correll) and the following business was transacted:

By motion the Board voted to buy an electric switch box for electric stove at president's parsonage.

The Conference President and the Conference Treasurer were instructed to make needed repairs on the President's parsonage and have same repainted as soon as able.

The Conference President was authorized to draw on the treasury for South Carolina Conference's part of expense of Leaders' Meeting. This money to come from Conference work.

The matter of paying the Williamston Church \$100.00 on their improvements was discussed. It seemed somewhere in the past they had been led to expect such help. After due consideration the Treasurer was instructed to pay this as soon as able.

The Board voted to allow the Conference President to retain his evangelistic offering above his regular salary provided he spent all of his time inside the Conference.

By motion the Treasurer was instructed to pay traveling expense of Brother Giles which had been incurred in interest of Conference up to this date February 7, 1950. After this if he is called to a place that church shall pay his expense.

On March 30th, 1950 the Board was called to meet at the home of the Conference President.

After prayer the following business was tran acted. The Conference

President was instructed that if the Florence Church asked any further advice as to building parsonage, that he advise them to go ahead provided they be responsible for the deal and that we as a Board would continue to aid in the amount of \$15.00 per week until Annual Conference.

The Board voted to be responsible to the extent of \$200.00 if necessary for a tent meeting at Newberry.

By motion the Joint Board and W. Y. P. S. Council made the Conference President and President of W. Y. P. S. Custodian of the tent and also voted that an established church who uses the tent be charged \$1.50 per day except by consent of the Missionary Board and W. Y. P. S. Council.

J. A. Giles and E. L. Shigley, Jr. were elected a committee to purchase tent.

EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY

We must save our Church for the cause of spreading scriptural holiness. If we save our Church we must save our youth. If we save our boys and girls for the future of the Church, we must preserve our schools as feeders for the Church. To save our youth we must assist them to get a Christian education. Central College is rendering a valuable service to the South Carolina Conference and to the Church at large. In order to accomplish some worthy objectives for Central College and to make it a stronger force for God and Holiness, It is recommended:

- 1. That you pray for a deepening of spirituality.
- 2. That you pray for and stand by the constituency of the school.
- 3. That you inform your people of the program and work of the school.
 - 4. That you urge your people to visit the school as often as possible

and that you arrange to have musical groups, etc., from the school to visit your church.

- 5. That your church raise a full educational budget.
- 6. That you use your influence and assist in securing prospective students in reaching the 300 goal set by the Board of Managers for the school year opening September 5, 1950.
- 7. That you PRAY-BOOST-GIVE-in the continued effort to liquidate its final indebtedness.
