The thirty-sixth session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America met in the Greer Wesleyan Church November 13th, at 2:30 P. M.

The devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. J. T. Carey, who read Luke 22:15-53. Then the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was observed.

"Be it Resolved, That the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America assembled at Greer, S. C., in regular annual session November 14th, 1928, does hereby petition and authorize the Board of Trustees of the Hephzibah Orphanage, Macon, Ga., to transfer the property of the said Hephzibah Orphanage, with all appurtenances thereto, to such department or Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America as deemed best by the Book Committee, and upon the same terms and conditions as it was received from its founder, Miss Bettie Tyler, and her co-workers. The presentation of the property to be gotten up in legal form and made with a warranty deed in fee simple. The Grantee to assume all standing liabilities against the Hephzibah Orphanage, Macon, Ga.

REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

My Dear Brethren:—"May grace and peace be multiplied." Through the providence of God and your kindness I am here to submit the following report:

My plans and efforts have been much like those of other folks. They have not all been a glowing success. I have had some visions, plans and ideas that I believe would add much to our progress as a Church, but no President or any one else can revolutionize a church or circuit in one or two sermons. Growth is a slow process and must be looked for in periods of years rather than at the end of a sermon or revival meeting, or even the first year's pastorate.

I am more and more convinced that permanent success comes to the Church or Conference largely through the efforts of the Pastors, who hold the key to the condition. Every charge rises or submerges according to the qualities of leadership of those in immediate contact with the people. All our failures as a Church date back to our inadequate methods or plans as leaders.

There is no better way of financing our Church than the systematic tithe. The Churches that are following this plan are making the greater progress. I would urge all Pastors and laymen to work hard to place our Church paper, The Wesleyan Methodist, and the Sunday School periodicals in every home. I would further exhort that our Book of Discipline be read and practiced by all our people.

I would now recommend:

- 1. The grouping of our churches into permanent circuits.
- 2. That the Conference appoint only those preachers to pastoral work who are qualified according to the disciplinary rules.
- 3. That we encourage all our young preachers to pursue our course of study by taking at least one to three years schooling at Central College.
- 4. That the Conference endorse at least two men as Conference Evangelists. That they be paid from the offerings of the Churches where the meetings are held, and if the Missionary Board should secure them to hold meetings in new fields that they be paid by said Board where their offerings are not adequate.
- 5. That the Pastors work the budget system as far as possible through the tithing bands.

The following business has been transacted:

- 1. Revs. R. H. and Oneida Gleason resigned their pastoral work at Central First Church and Calhoun immediately after Conference.
- 2. Rev. G. E. Crenshaw was appointed Pastor of the Central First Church, and Rev. G. L. Stewart was appointed Pastor of Calhoun Church.
- 3. Rev. F. B. Williams was appointed Pastor of the Carlisle Church. He has done a splendid work in this his first year as Pastor.
- 4. Rev. George Anna McDaniel suffered a break in health and Rev. C. R. Porter was appointed to finish out the year as Pastor of Pickens View Church.

November 17, 1928.

We, the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, wish to submit our annual report:

1. On January 12, 1928, we secured a loan of \$1,097 to pay off a mortgage held by the Converse College on the Wesleyan parsonage in Spartanburg, S. C.

2. We signed a deed of sale for the plot of land in Oconey County,

as was ordered sold by this Conference at its last session.

3. We were successful in securing a permanent charter for our Conference, through the Honorable Hoke B. Black, of Greenville, S. C., who so kindly gave us his services in the General Assembly in Columbia, S. C.

4. We recommend that we be privileged to borrow \$100 from the Superannuated Ministers' Fund for the Trustees of the Gaffney Church if they can furnish good security and interest at 8%.

5. We complied with the law and sold to T. D. Edwards the old Landrum Church property, as ordered by the last Annual Conference.

6. We recommend that our Treasurer collect interest on all notes up to date.

Following is a copy of the Bill renewing the Conference Charter:

No. 765

AN ACT to renew the Charter of "The Wesleyan Methodist Conference of South Carolina" and to Validate all Acts and Contracts made since the expiration of its Charter.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina: That D. O. Powers, of Spartanburg, S. C., R. C. Kendrick, of Pickens, S. C., and J. R. George, of Spartanburg, S. C., and their associates and successors be, and they are declared a body politic and corporate under the name of "The Wesleyan Methodist Conference of South Carolina," and under that name shall succession of officers and members perpetually, the right to adopt by-laws, to adopt and use a common seal, to sue and be sued, to lease, hold and enjoy property for the purposes of the corporation, and to encumber, lease and convey the same at pleasure. The purposes of the corporation being religious

educational, missionary, charitable and elemosynary, it shall have, exercise and enjoy all immunities accorded and all rights usually conferred upon such corporations, and shall be subject to all the restrictions and limitations provided by the laws of this State.

- 2. That all acts done and performed by this corporation since the expiration of its original charter be, and the same are hereby validated, confirmed and made legal in all respects and shall have the same force and virtue as if its said charter had not expired.
- 3. That this corporation hereby incorporated shall be in perpetuity.
 - 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor.

RESOLUTIONS

Resolutions Adopted in 1898

Resolved, 1st. That as a body in Conference assembled, we will not allow our pulpits or churches to be used by those who do not give evidence of being sound in the doctrines of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and true to our polity.

2nd. That as ministers and laymen we will use our best endeavors to prevent the promulgation of doctrines or usages not in accord with the Wesleyan Methodist faith.

Resolutions Adopted in 1905

Resolved, 1st. That the law with regard to complaints or violations of orders and resolutions found on page 37 of our Discipline, and beginning with the words, "When the President," shall apply to all cases of the violators of our Discipline, and no charges shall be entertained by the Judiciary Committee without said previous investigation and labor.

2nd. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

Resolutions Adopted in 1907

Resolved, 1st. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society.

2nd. That we believe that the preaching of Holiness that does not include a clear and distinct opposition to all secret societies is seriously lacking in the essential elements and must be more or less displeasing to God.

3rd. That we believe that the right type of Holiness preaching and teaching is the most effective means by which to induce men to separate themselves from all lodge entanglements; therefore, we will do our best to double our diligence in this line of effort.

4th. That we affectionately admonish our people to avoid all compromise with secrecy. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday Schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies; furthermore, those belonging to secret orders shall not be allowed to hold services in our churches.

5th. That we seriously urge upon all our brethren and sisters that they may be careful to maintain a consistent, but radical, attitude of opposition to all organizations, secret or open, which are opposed to Jesus Christ and His doctrine and principles of righteousness.

Resolutions Adopted in 1914

Resolved, 1st. That all of our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work be required to preach at least once a month, or twelve times during the Conference year.

2nd. That in addition to the above resolution, we earnestly request all preachers not receiving a regular appointment by the Conference, except those attending school preparatory to the ministry, to hold, if possible, a two weeks' revival during the year.

3rd. That all preachers unemployed by the Conference during the coming year be urged to select a fellow-laborer with whom they can work harmoniously, and go out and try to build up new works as they may have opportunity, and revive the desert places.

4th. That in order that the foregoing resolutions may have the greatest effect possible, and that each preacher may have a higher estimation of the dignity of his calling, and that the burden for souls may be increased, and that they may feel the sympathy of the Church to which they belong, we urge each charge to pass like resolutions.

5th. That it is not only the duty, but binding on each Circuit preacher of our Conference, to receive whomsoever the Conference may designate as Quarterly Meeting Evangelist, and give him their hearty support and co-operation.

Resolution Adopted in 1919

Be it Resolved, That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.

Resolutions Adopted in 1921

Regarding the Orphanage

Resolved, 1st. That we as a Conference continue W. D. Correll as Committeeman until next Annual Conference; also to act as Manager of the institution from this Conference.

2nd. That we meet the balance of \$7,000 on the purchase price of the property. We suggest that \$1.00 per member be asked for throughout the Conference, for 1924.

3rd. That a Committee of two be elected to associate with W. D. Correll as Committeemen.

4th. That this Committee appoint such financial agents or agent as necessary to carry on this work throughout the Conference, and that said agents be secured on such terms as can be agreed thereon by Committee and agents.

5th. That a special effort be made between now and the first of January by the pastors and Financial Agents to collect the amount subscribed during this Conference, and to add to it, if possible, thereby saving interest and deferred payments.

6th. That the Conference Treasurer handle all cash and receipts on both the up-keep and the purchased price of the Orphanage; and that the produce be sent directly to Miss Bettie Tyler.
