"Be it Resolved by the Alabama Conference assembled at Tuscaloosa, Ala., November 7-9, 1917, that we will not receive as ministers any man or woman with two living companions.

- 2, That while we believe that adultery is scriptural grounds for divorce, and that such sins are forgiveable, yet when a person who has been divorced offers themselves for membership we will only receive them as associate members until they furnish sufficient evidence that they did have a scriptural ground for divorce.
- 3, In order to discourage the practice of divorcement we require that our ministers refuse to marry divorced persons without clear evidence that the divorced party is innocent."

An itemized statement of all receipts and expenditures must be rendered with each report.
