Journal of Daily Proceedings

Wednesday, 9:30 a. m., March 8, 1950

The members of the Wesleyan Methodist Churches in the state of Florida and a great host of friends met at Rainbow Trailer camp on this day to start the organization of a new conference. The service was called to order at 9:30 a. m. by our Home Missionary Secretary, Rev. J. R. Swauger. The song service was led by Foster Piatt of the Pinellas Park Church. Rev. Swauger invited all around the altar for a season of prayer. The Scripture lesson was favorite verses of Scripture quoted by the brothers and sisters.

Rev. Swauger then gave an invitation to all Elders and Conference Preachers that cared to join the new conference to register their names and the conference of which they were a member. Eight Elders and four Conference Preachers registered. The elected delegates from the churches of the state were then registered. Eleven delegates in all registering, making a total of twenty-three (23) who expressed their wish to become members of the new conference.

Rev. Swauger set the bar of the Conference as the first four seats on the right side of the tent. C. V. Earnhart appointed secretary Pro-Tem.

Congratulatory remarks were made by the following: Rev. J. M. Merrell, President of the South Georgia Conference; D. W. Jones, member of the Board of Administration of the Wesleyan Methodist Church; Sister Stella Wood, Editor of THE WESLEYAN MISSIONARY; Sister Grace Wood, missionary from India and Australia.

Monday Night

The Rev. D. M. Lighty of Indiana brought the message of the evening.

Tuesday Morning

The Florida Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened for its second Annual Session at Tampa, Florida, 9:00 A. M. February 6, 1951. The president, Rev. J. I. Rambo called the session to order. Devotional singing led by Rev. Foster Piatt.

We all gathered around the altar for prayer. The Lord came our souls to meet while glory crowned the mercy seat. The President read Exodus 33:7-23. He gave a very helpful and encouraging message stressing the need of the presence of God with us.

It was agreed upon that the President appoint a secretary pro tem. Mrs. J. I. Rambo was appointed.

The Roll was called—4 Elders and 1 Conference Preacher responded.

On motion the Conference Bar was determined. The platform and the first three tiers of seats.

By nomination Rev. J. T. Strickland and Mrs. H. D. Coile were elected on Credential Committee.

By common consent of the Conference Mrs. George Davis was seated as delegate from Clearwater, Florida, by request of the delegate.

Credential Committee reported names of ten (10) delegates. Names were placed on roll and called.
