Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Part I

Brother Swauger Chairman:

To the members of the Florida Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America now in session at Clearwater, Florida, March 19, 1953.

We thank God for His care and love to us this past year. Also we want to thank each pastor who has so wonderfully labored and co-operated with us throughout the year. I could not ask for any better spirit than I have found among all of the workers of the Conference. Dr. Swauger, our Home Missionary Secretary has been a real blessing to me, especially in advising in many ways. It seems like I have not accomplished much this year but by the help of God I have done my best.

Part II

Official Acts of the year:

Immediately after conference, I began to work on the Incorporation of the Florida Conference. I contacted a lawyer who wrote up the Incorporation papers for \$25.00. Because of the absence of one of the trustees for six (6) months and later the death of this one I did not get the Incorporation of the Conference completed.

Another project I worked on was the transferring of the church deeds from the South Georgia Conference to the Florida Conference. Since a matter of this kind requires a great deal of time all of the work on this matter is not completed.

Due to the fact that John I. Rambo, a trustee transferred to the Allegheny Conference his office became vacant. On June 23, 1952 with the aid of the Committee on Vacancies we appointed Raymond S. Taylor to take John I. Rambo's place as trustee for the remaining part of the year.

We met Mrs. Elizabeth Jones who lives at Cocoa, Florida. She is a member in good standing in the South Carolina Conference. She desires to transfer to the Florida Conference and to pursue the course of study, with the intentions of starting a new church in Cocoa, Florida.

On July 19, 1952 E. F. Houck who was pastoring the Greenville Charge resigned from being pastor. The Advisory Board gave their consent that Cecil and Anna Shaffer fill the vacancy as pastors for the remaining part of the year.

We corresponded with Rev. C. W. Robb of Wyomissing, Pa. Rev.

Robb is a preacher in good standing in the Pilgrim Holiness Church, but feels led to transfer to the Florida Wesleyan Methodist Conference. He plans to build a Wesleyan Methodist Church at Gulfport, Florida.

During our recent revival at the Clearwater Church I became acquainted with Rev. John and Mary Swentzel, elders in the Pilgrim Holiness Church. They too feel led to transfer to our Conference. These folks are filled with the spirit of God and have been very successful in pioneer work.

On July 16, 1952 I received the transfer of James F. Myers from the Ohio Conference to the Florida Conference.

On March 23, 1952 Rev. L. E. Francisco was appointed to the Taft church as pastor for the coming year.

On March 24, 1952 a transfer was granted Walter Johnson, Conference Preacher, to the South Carolina Conference.

Death—In His wisdom our Heavenly Father saw fit to remove from our midst this past year, Charley E. Murphy who served 3½ years on the Advisory Board and also as a trustee of the Florida Conference. He will be greatly missed as a good worker in the Conference.
