1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of the local church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable papers. The Conference shall pay for rent on space.

The President and Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee.Deeds for churches, parsonages, or other Conference property are to be submitted to them for examination before recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses

are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.

3. The Conference shall convene annually on Monday following the last Sunday of July, subject to the approval of the board of administration. The Conference sermon shall be preached Monday night, with the business session beginning Tuesday morning. Camp Meeting shall begin on the following Thursday evening, continuing through two Sundays.

4. The local church fiscal year shall end June 30th. Pastors shall report membership as of this date. The conference treasurer shall close his books July 10th. The

pastoral year shall end with the closing of camp meeting.

5. Near the end of the fiscal year the Conference secretary shall forward one copy of each pastor's statistical blank to the Conference treasurer, who after closing his books will fill in Item No. IX "Disbursed for budget", forwarding the same to each pastor. The pastor shall complete the report in full, make a second copy and be ready to read it the first day of Conference.

6. Pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their

report.

- 7. The following items of the Pastor's Statistical report shall be read each year on the Conference floor: Pastor's calls; Wesleyan Methodists, Wesleyan Missionary, and Wesleyan Youth subscriptions; present membership, gain or loss; Average Sunday School Attendance; number of church Buildings, Value and Insurance; Item VII Complete; Total Contributed for Church; Item II Complete; Total Benevolence; and the Contributed totals.
- 8. Each local church is responsible for paying the moving expense of the pastor whom they have called.
- 9. The Conference Secretary and Conference Treasurer shall each be paid ten dollars (\$10) annually from the Conference Treasury.

10. No Treasurer is allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.

- 11. The Standing Rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference Minutes from year to year.
- 12. The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer shall be a member of the Superannuate Pension Fund Committee.
- 13. The Camp Meeting Board shall consist of seven members: the President of the Annual Conference, W.M.S. President, W.T. President, and Camp Meeting Treasurer who will be members by virtue of their offices; and that the other members be elected from the floor after the election of Conference officers.

14. The Conference W.Y. President and the Conference Treasurer and the Conference W.M.S. President will be members of the Conference Board of Church Extension and

Evangelism, by virtue of their offices.

15. The pastor of each charge shall send to the Conference President written notice of the names of each delegate-elect from his church, said notice to be sent immediately following the official election of said delegate or delegates.

16. All who are taking the Course of Study shall acquaint themselves with the requirements thereof, and the Conference officials and all pastors shall keep these regulations in mind in helping their young people plan this important preparation for service.

17. The bar of conference shall consist of the first four rows of seats in the tabernacle and the platform. Rules continued on back cover.

CONFERENCE SERMON:

The sixty-minth Oregon Annual Conference opened with the conference sermon delivered by Rev. Herman A. Smith of Seattle, Washington. Rev. Smith used the text found in Ephesians 2:h as a basis for his thoughts and remarks to the conference. He emphasized that men and women are used as channels of God's blessing, 'But God' giveth the increase. We are made aware of our need for total dependence upon God for the coming year.

DENOMINATIONAL ADDRESS:

Dr. Rufus Reisdorph, a General Superintendent of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, delivered the denominational address on Tuesday evening the 31st of July, 1962. He gave a clear picture of the total work of the denomination and presented a challenging appeal to move militantly though lovingly ahead.

The Conference President asked each pastor to state the names of the delegates from their respective churches insofar as delegate blanks had not been prepared.

This report was adopted on motion.

The roll call was given with 12 Elders, 1 Conference Preacher, and 15 Delegates responding.

The Nominating Committee gave its report. It was adopted on motion. (Report #1)
The Courtesy Committee presented Rev. J. Franklin Heer, missionary to Columbia,
South America. He expressed appreciation in being able to attend the conference
meetings.

The Conference President turned the chair over to Dr. Reisdorph while he read his report. The Report was adopted on motion. (Report # 2)

It was moved, with support, to allow Gordon Bennett, associate pastor at Aums-

ville, to vote in the conference business.

The provision of Paragraph 170, section 5 was presented and considered by both Rev. Cline and Dr. Reisdorph.

The motion lost.

The Courtesy Committee presented Rev. William Gale, the new pastor at Emmanuel church. Bro. Gale greeted the conference.

We were adjourned on motion and Mrs. Ruth Watt dismissed in prayer.

Meeting (2) - Tuesday - July 31, 1962 - 1:30 p.m.

Devotions were conducted with Tom Porter leading in the song, "Stepping in the Light", and Rev. Bisel reading from James 2:1 and offering prayer.

The roll was called, 29 being present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

It was moved we hear the report of the Conference Treasurer. Motion carried.

It was moved we hear the complete report on Conference Work and the totals only on general items. Carried.

The report was read by the Conference Treasurer. (Report # 3)

A motion to adopt and refer to the Auditing Committee was made. It Carried.

It was moved that we hear the Committee on C. E. & E. report as instructed in

the 1961 Minutes page 7. Motion carried.

The Conference President stated his feeling that it was impossible for this committee to project a plan of work and that related decisions should come from this conference body; therefore the committee did not meet to prepare a report.

It was moved we hear the minutes of C. C. E. & E. Committee's work during the

past conference year. Carried.

It was moved we allow time for the secretary of this C. C. E. & E. Committee to prepare a report. Carried.

On motion we adjourned to the call of the chair. We were dismissed in prayer by Mrs. Rosalind Yates.

Meeting (3) - Wednesday - August 1, 1962 - 9:00 a.m.

Devotions were conducted with the singing of "Glory to His Name," led by Tom Porter and the reading from Philippians 2:2,13 and offering prayer by Ralph Jones.
The meeting was called to order by the president.

The roll was called, 28 present, and the minutes read and approved. The chair was turned over to Dr. Reisdorph for the election of officers.

The Conference President was instructed to appoint tellers. Dennis Brenner and Burdette Edwards were appointed to distribute and John Ehr and Douglas Bacheller to collect.

Adjourned on motion. Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Cline.

The song, "He owns the cattle on a Thousand Hills", was led by Rev. Porter . Rev. D. O. Bacheller directed devotions from Acts 15:35-41 and exhorted us to praise God for His all-sufficiency and His knowledge of and control over the works of man. Rev. Bacheller followed with prayer.

A motion was made to adopt the report.

Another motion was made to table the motion and request that the proposed budget be posted in a conspicuous manner for general observation. Carried.

Rev. Cline suggested we adjourn to permit Dr. Kindshi some time for Sunday School promotion. Motion made and carried for same. Rev. Cline led in prayer.

Meeting (6) - Thursday - August 2, 1962 - 1:45 p.m.

Meeting called to order by the Conference President.

The song, "Down at the Cross" was led by Bro. James Bisel. Devotions led by Bro. Cline emphasizing the importance of 'Brothren - Believing in God'.

Roll Call was given.

Minutes of the last meeting were read, corrected and adopted.

A memorial service was scheduled at 2:00.

MEMORIAL SERVICE

This service was held in memory of Dr. McCarty and others of the faithful church members who have passed on to their eternal reward. Those mentioned to honor were: Dr. McCarty, Mrs. Hinkly, Mrs. Mitch, Mrs. Mundres, and Mrs. Clark. Dr. Reisdorph read from Acts 11:22-21 concerning Barnabas. He pointed out three outstanding characteristics of Barnabas. They were: 1) His devotion to God, 2) His exhortation to the people and 3) He being a good man full of the Holy Ghost.

Sister Reisdorph was requested to recite a poem in memory of the departed.

Walter Stamm led in a closing memorial prayer.

The Courtesy Committee introduced Dr. Thomas Leupp of Cascade College to the conference meeting. Dr. Leupp greeted us and gave us his testamony.

The Resolutions Committee report was given. A motion to adopt was carried. (Report # 13)

The Thanks Committee report was given. A motion to adopt the same carried. (Report # 14)

The Committee on Itireracy and Elder's Orders gave a report. By a supported motion this report was adopted. (Report # 15)

The Sunday School Board nominated Rev. Douglas Bacheller for C. Y. C. Director. No other nominations were received. Rev. Bacheller was elected.

The Sunday School Secretary gave his annual report. It was moved that we accept this report. This motion carried. (Report # 17)

A motion was made to consider the tabled motion concerning the proposed projected budget. It was supported and carried.

A vote was then taken on the previous motion. A majority vote in favor of adopting the proposed budget.followed.

Motion to adjourn was carried. Mrs. Elodie Downer dismissed the meeting with prayer.

Meeting (7) - Thursday - August 2, 1962 - 4:40.p.m.

Meeting called to order by the conference Predisent.

Apportionment Committee Report was given. Motion, to adopt report carried. (Report # 16)

The Courtesy Committee introduced Rev. Neal Phipps. Bro. Phipps greeted the conference.

Dr. Reisdorph took the floor to express himself concerning certain items of business handled by the conference and its committees. He also exhorted us to stand by our church and conference.

The minutes of the meeting were read and approved.

A motion was made to adjourn. Carried.

Greetings to the 69th session of the Oregon Annual Conference. With thankful hearts we give praise unto God for His many mercies which have attended our ways during this Conference year. We magnify His Dear Name for this manifestation of His Power and Presence in services and souls won across the Conference. Excellent gains have been made in some churches, and it is with a great degree of expectancy for greater things from God that we face the future.

Camp Maintenance

During this year we have labored to do our best and do acknowledge our efforts to

be in vain, but God has worked and we glorify Him for His goodness.

We have held twenty-six quarterly meetings and set in an advisory capacity at seven others. Along with our good Sunday School Secretary we have labored in four revival meetings, three in the Conference and one with Brainerd Indian School, Hot Springs, South Dakota.

Many hours have been spent in maintaining the camp ground.

Report # 11 - PLAN OF WORK NO. 11 We Recommend:

1. That the Efficiency Standard be read in the society the first meeting after conference (5% credit) and that arrangement be made for one missionary prayer meeting each month. (5% credit)

(5% credit) That the President, Secretary, Treasurer, and the equivalent of 75% of the active members be subscribers to the Wesleyan Missionary. (5% credit)

5. That a Mission Study Secretary be elected and she report to the Conference Mission Study Secretary by January 15th. (5% credit) That 10% of the active members read at least four of the recommended books. (5% credit)

6. That a delegate be elected to the annual conference W.M.S. and that she be instructed by the local society regarding the amount to be pledged by that society at the annual conference session (5% credit), and that the Y.W.W.B.Superintendent be seated in the annual session and be granted the privilege of speaking, and provision be made by her society for such representation. (5% credit)

7. That the \$ 1.00 membership dues be sent to the Conference W.M.S. Treasurer and be forwarded to the General W.M.S. Treasurer for the general fund.

^{4.} The Executive Council shall be the plan of work committee. They shall bring a projected budget and work plan to the first session of the Youth Conference.

18. The time of meeting for the conference sessions shall be as follows: mornings 9:00 a.m. to adjourn at 11:30 a.m., afternoons 1:30 p.m. to adjourn by motion.
19. The time for the election of conference officers shall be set for 9:00 a.m.

the first Wednesday of conference.

20. There shall be a nominating committee whose duties shall be to present nominations for all the regular session committees of the conference. This committee shall consist of the conference President as chairman, and three Elders elected annually by the conference. The conference shall, each year, designate two churches whose delegates shall also be a part of this committee. Said committee shall meet prior to the opening of each annual conference at a time and place designated by the president. It shall nominate session committees and may serve to nominate special committees as the conference may request.

21. Churches shall give consideration to the payment of pastor's utilities and a gasoline allowance. When these are paid they shall be reported in Item VII of the pastor's Statistical report on separate lines. When the parsonage is used for Sunday School and other church activities, the pastor and board of stewards shall agree on the proportion of the total utilities to be reckoned as used by the pastor.

22. There shall be an Annual Ministerial Institute. The time, place, program, and

entertainment to be arranged by a committee of two Elders elected annually.

23. It shall be the duty of the Conference President and Secretary to arrange for

the printing of the conference minutes.

24. The publication of a Conference Paper shall be placed in the hands of a committee consisting of the Conference President and two Persons elected by the conference. This committee shall select an Editor and Publisher and arrange for the financing of siad paper.

25. The Conference President's report shall include a statement of all official acts, a summary of church business meetings held, personal and phone consultations, and a financial statement listing gifts, marriage and funeral fees received, and

travel and office expense.

26. The C. C. E. & E. Committee shall be designated as a Board of Managers.
