Resolved That we believe the Bible fully recognizes the existance [sic] of human governments both Civil & Ecclesiastical, and are designed by God for the benefit of man, and for ministers or churches in the Wesleyan Connection who have pledged themselves to enforce vigourously [sic] but calmly, all the rules and tests of the Connection, and then declare to the world they never will administer such tests of Christian Character as the discipline requires in the receiving of members into the Churches, to us is evidence of a want of a sound judgment, or a rapid advance

toward Anti-government principles, with which we have [insert: no] sympathy, Resolved Therefore that we respectfully request the Rochester Annual Conference, that in the reception of Ministers into said Conference, that the y should be definite in their questioning the men who make application to be received, to know whether they agree with the doctrine and Discipline of the Connection, so [insert: that] when churches shall apply to said Conference expecting to have a Wesleyan Minister, that they may not be deceived, by having one sent who neither believes the Doctrines of the Discipline nor will administer its tests or rules in the reception of members into said churches.

Selah Paine & G. F. Needhams [sic] character referred to committee on Ministerial Character Voted To have an afternoon session to commence at 3 P.M. Voted To adjourn. Conference closed by prayer. Second day Afternoon Session April 25th '49. Conference assembled at the hour appointed and was opened by reading the Scriptures, singing & prayer. After calling the Roll the minutes of the last session were read, corrected and approved. Voted That Cyrus Gregg's name be placed on the unstationed list. Noble A. Spooner was received into full connection in the Conference. Resolved That a list of the unstationed Ministers be made out. Adjourned. Benediction by the President. 8

Third day Morning Session Apl 27th '49

Conference met at the hour appointed and was opened with the usual religious services.

The Roll was called over. The minutes of the last session read & approved.

William Nipper an unstationed Elder in the St. Lawrence Conference; was transferred to the stationed list

Resolved That it is the duty of each Unstationed Elder in this Con. to report himself to the Conference Annually, or in case of unavo[i]dable absence, to furnish the Preacher in charge, or delegate with such report; and if he fails to do so for three years in succession, he shall be liable to a charge for neglect of duty.

Committee on Obituaries report, report received & accepted as follows Seth Crawford was received on trial in the Rochester Conference in 1847 and appointed to travel on the Pike & Herrick Circuits. He had previously spent eight years on Grand River Upper Canada, and three years at Green Bay, as a Missionary among the Indians. In these Missions he was employed by the Wesleyan Methodists of Upper Canada. He was a man of deep piety, he seemed to move & breathe in the atmosphere of prayer, practical religion was the theme of his soul. His health began to fail in the winter of 1848. in consequence of over exertion, and exposure to cold in prosecuting his labors as a herald of Salvation to Sinners. He retired to his father's residence in Clay Ondaga [sic] Co- N. Y. where on the 13th day of May 1848. In the 50 year of his age, he died in great peace leaving [insert: behind him] the clearest evidence that he had gone to enjoy a home in Heaven. He has left a wife and several children to mourn his loss.

Miles Dunbar was born at Plymouth Conn. Feby 21st 1786 of his early history little is known. He embraced religion in middle age, united with the M. E. Church, and by that Church was licensed to preach, Jany 3rd 1830, He seceded from the M, E. Church, and joined the New York Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection of America 1844, His last appointment from this body was to Oran N. Y, where he successfully laboured [sic] up to the time of his that disease fastened upon him its mortal grasp. His disease was cancerous stomach, and in Ten days severed the fond union of Soul and body. His death was peacful [sic] and triumphant, and clearly exhibited

The excellency of [insert: and] power of the Christian religion. He has left four children to mourn his loss. Your committee appoint our President Bro. J. Watson to reach a funeral sermon on the death of the [insert: above] brethren next Sabbath at 2. P.M. Resolved That this Conference deeply sympathise [sic] with the Afflicted families of these deceased brethren, in their Sad bereavement, and in prayer we commend them to the protection of Him who is a father to the fatherless and the widows God.

<u>Resolved</u> By the Rochester Yearly Conference, that it is irregular for persons joing [sic] our Churches, and quarterly Conferences in Elders orders, from other denominations, to

exercise the functions of his their offices without being received by the President of this Conference as provided by the Discipline.

Resolved That all the members, of this Conference be requested to inform all persons of whom they may have knowledge, who are exercising the office of Elders as above, of the fact set forth in the above resolution, and to urge them to present themselves for reception by the authorities of the Church at their earliest convenience.

<u>Voted</u>. That the papers of Ira West and Ervin Wilder be returned to them; they having applied for admission into Conference, without satisfying this body of their agreement with us in doctrine and Discipline

Committee on Reforms report as follows, report recd. adopted

The committe [sic] on reforms beg leave to report.

That in the opinion of your Committee, the Great head of the Church designed that his disciples should be the light of the world, and the salt of the earth and have [insert: no] fellowship with the unfruitfull [sic] works of darkness, but to the contrary should in the spirit of love oppose sin in all its forms, and be always ready to every good work. And your Committee would further report & advise the propriety of constantly keeping before the people in a Judicious, & Christian, manner, those great questions of

Moral Reform that are now before the Christian public and in which the happiness of our race, and the Glory of God are so intimately connected. We further recommend the adoption of the following Resolutions.

On Slavery.

Resolved. That our position as a denomination is that of non-fellowship with Slaveholding, therefore to acknowledge as Evangelical Christians those persons or churches, who hold Slaves, or apologise [sic] for Slaveholding, or to elevate such persons to civil office, is a palpable departure from our elementary principles & disciplinary regulations.

On Temperance.

<u>Resolved</u>. That the cause of temperance, or total abstinance [sic] from all intoxicating drinks, is intimately connected with vital godliness, and we earnestly urge our ministers and members to an increase of energy in the Support of the temperance cause.

On Secret Societies.

<u>Resolved</u>. That Secret Societies avowed pledged to do good, are unnecessary in a Country where liberty of speach [sic] and of the press is secured to all its Citizens, and from the evidence of the past such institutions, are dangerous to the liberties of a free people.

On Peace.

<u>Resolved</u>. That a strict, and conscientious observance of the great law of love, and the other Provisions of Christianity would effectually prevent the practice of war, and that Christians are morally [insert: bound] by their allegiance to the prince of peace, to guard against those dispositions of minde, [sic] and those customs in life; which tend to foster and perpetuate a war Spirit.

On Licentiousness.

<u>Resolved</u> That we hail with unmingled delight, and approbation any instrumentality of a moral character that can be employed to suppress the sin of impurity, and prevent the breach of the Seventh Commandment, and it is expected that all our ministers will treat this sin as the Gospel requires, viz as a prominent work of darkness.

<u>Voted</u> That the delegates to the last General Conference be requested to report to the next session of this body their expenses, and the Amount received. Also that the Treasurer present his report.

Resolved That the Rochester Conference of the Wesleyan M. Connection of America, petition the Legislature of the State of New York, to wholly abolish the license law, and also to enact a law making it a penal offence to Manufacture or deal in alchoholic [sic] liquors, except for Mechanical, Medicinal, or chemical, purposes.
