JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

The fifty-eighth Annual session of the Indiana Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection of America convened in the auditorium of the Wesleyan camp ground at Fairmount, Indiana, August 29th, 1906, at 8 o'clock a.m., with Elder W. J. Seekins, President of the conference in the chair.

The opening religious services of the conference were conducted by Elders, C. S. Smith, J. J. Coleman and W. M. Bailey. The Twenty-seventh Psalm was read, hymns 58, 325, and 140 in "Good News in Song, were sung, and prayer was offered by Brethren Smith

and Bailey.

The roll of Elders and Licentiates was called, the following answering their names at the first roll call: T. P. Baker, W. D. Baker, C. A. Billheimer, A. L. Blake, H. C. Brown, L. H. Carter, J. J. Coleman, B. L. Bouch, F. W. Crowell, W. H. Hopkins, E. H. Kennedy. S. A. Mow, T. J. Pierce, G. Reber, W. H. Seekins, C. S. Smith, M. M. Worth, G. W. Zike, G. W. Brown, F. R. Eddy, W. M. Bailey, J. B. Smith, N. Gilliland, W. W. Noggle, J. T. Loughridge, H. T. Arnold, A. U. Murphy, S. M. Vanblaricom and F. M. Roberts.

The chairman declared the conference opened for business.

It was moved the four seats to the right, left, and in front of the platform constitute the conference bar. Motion carried.

It was moved that the conference meetings open at 8 o'clock a. m., and 1:30 p. m., and that they close at 10:30 a. m., and upon motion in the afternoon.

The committee on Religious Services was elected as follows: W. L. Thompson, C. S. Smith and G. W. Felton.

The following were elected a committee on Statistics: I., G. Beers, W. H. Hopkins and H. T. Arnold.

The following were elected as the Conference Judicial Com-

mittee: G. Reber, C. S. Smith, J. J. Coleman, J. Hester.

The committee on Pastoral Relations was elected as follows: W. J. Seekins, [Ch'n. Ex-offcio], G. Reber, J. O. Baker, S. A. Mow, H. M. Crilley, Hiram Drake and Israel Grunden.

Elders J. O. Baker, L. H. Carter and C. A. Billheimer were elected a committee to fill vacancies.

Elder W. D. Baker was elected to obtain the P. O. address of each member of the conference.

Rev. E. H. Kennedy, H. C. Brown and Grace Sloan were elected a committee on Resolutions and Memorials.

The Rev. F. R. Eddy was elected reporter for conference and camp meeting.

Rev. T. P. Baker was elected to fill the vacancy caused by the expiration of his term on the committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders.

Thursday morning immediately after the adoption of the minutes was set apart by vote of the conference as the order of the day for the election of conference officers and evangelists.

The President of the conference read a timely and carefully prepared address to the conference and made his report, which included his official acts during the interim of the conference sessions.

The address was adopted and ordered published in the Wesleyan and also in pamphlet form. A vote of thanks was unanimously tendered Bro. Seekins for the address. His report was adopted. (See report No. 1).

The committee advised in the president's address in reference to the Conference Bible Training School was elected as follows: E. H. Kennedy, W. L. Thompson, J. J. Coleman, G. W. Felton and W. J. Seekins.

A motion prevailed to elect a committee on apportionment of evangelists salary and for minute fund.

The Rev. S. A. Mow was elected Ch'n. of said committee, E. H. Kennedy was also elected. Conference then adjourned by limitation. Benediction by R. L. Fisher.

First Day-Afternoon Meeting.

Minutes read and approved.

The Rev. J. H. Bowen, Assistant Connectional Agent and Secretary, was introduced to the conference and made an honorary member of the Body.

The regular order of business was called for, and the names W. D. Baker, T. P. Baker, A. L. Blake, J. W. Brown, F. W. Crowell, R.

L. Fisher, W. H. Hopkins, S. A. Mow, T, Pierce, E. H. Kennedy, G. Reber, C. S. Smith, A. Worth and M. M. Worth, were called and their characters passed.

On motion conference adjourned. Benediction by Rev. G. Reber.

Second Day-Forenoon Session.

August 30, 1906

Devotions were conducted by Rev. S. M. Van Blaricom.

The roll was called and the names of Anna Pitts, N. Sylvester, C. G, Fryar, John Jessup, S. C. Kinnison, Allie Raney were added to the roll of delegates.

The minutes were read and approved.

The Rev. Belle and L. W. McClure were received into conference by transfer from the N. C. conference, and placed on the stationed list of Elders and Licentiates respectively. The committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders made a partial report recommending Revs. F. R. Eddy, W. M. Bailey, A. U. Murphy, Lydia Murphy, and A. P. Fooshee to Elders Orders. The partial report was adopted. (See report No. 2.)

By motion of E. Teter, the order of the day was suspended to receive a church organized by Rev. J. W. Brown at Lagro. The church of twenty members was presented by Rev. J. W. Brown, and received by vote of the conference. Brother E. Breeding was received as delegate from said charge.

The special order of the day was then taken up, and conference began the election of officers. Revs. L. H, Carter, and F. R. Eddy were elected tellers. For president, missionary secretary and evangelist, Rev. W. J. Seekins received a majority of the votes cast, and was declared elected. For vice president, educational secretary and evangelist, Rev. T. P. Baker received a majority of all votes cast on the first ballot, and was declared elected.

For secretary, Rev. J. J. Coleman received a majority of all the votes cast and was declared elected.

For church extension secretary and evangelist, J. J. Coleman recieved a majority of all votes cast, and was declared elected. On motion of Rev. J. W. Brown, Rev. A. Worth was elected general evangelist.

For conference trustee, Brothers J. E. Smiley, J. L. Rigsbee, G. W. Eelton were nominated. On the first ballot John L. Rigsbee rereceived a majority of all the votes and was declared elected.

For conference trustee to fill the vacancy of D. L. Shidler, Geo. W. Felton received a majority of all votes cast and was declared elected.

On motion conference adjourned, Benediction by Rev. E. Teter.

Second Day-Afternoon Meeting.

Devotions by Rev. G. W. Brown of North Liberty.

The secretary was given liberty to choose an assistant, and Rev. F. R. Eddy was chosen.

Roll was called and the names of Wm. Beyler, Clarence Sellers, Edward Wishing, Mattie Scott and George Rager were added to the roll.

The minutes of the forenoon session were read and approved.

Recommendations to pursue the course of study for Wm. Endaly, J. C. Caldwell, Luther Burns, Chas, G. Payne, Jos. H. James, and Mayme Green were read and by motion these and all other such papers which might be presented and read by the secretary, were referred to the committee on Itineracy and Orders.

A resolution was presented by W. L. Thompson concerning educational funds. Moved and supported to adopt, moved as an amendment to refer to committee on resolutions. Amendment catried. Original motion as amended carried.

By motion Friday afternoon was made the order of the day to hear Bro. Bowen on Connectional Interests.

Order of the day was called for and the names of D. H. Yountz, Ester L. Dickey and D. F. Gordon were called and their characters passed. Moved and supported that the conference trustees be ordered to pay the sum of \$25 out of the Superanuated fund, to Bro. Gordon as a love offering.

The names of L. G. Bears, C. A. Billheimer, H. C. Brown, J. J. Coleman, B. L. Couch, H. T. Hawkins, Jacob Hester and W. L. Northam were called and their characters passed.

Rev. J. L. Benton, general educational secretary, was introduced to the conference and spoke a few encouraging words. By motion the time following the address of Rev. J. H. Bowen was made the order of the day to hear Bro. Benton on Educational Interests. Motion prevailed making Bro. Benton an honorary member of the body.

The names of W. J. Seekins and E. Teter were called and their characters passed. Moved and supported to adjourn.

Third Day-Forenoon Meeting.

August 31, 1906.

Conference convened at 8 o'clock.

Devotions by D. H. Yountz.

Roll called and the names of Miriam Slack, Henry Hamma and Chas. T. Ballard were added to the roll of delegates.

The minutes were read and approved.

J. W. Wood of the North Liberty charge was recommended to

the conference as a suitable person to be received to study preparatory to travel under conference direction. Referred to committee on Itineracy and orders.

The committee on "Plan of conference Bible Training School, made its report. The report was adopted. (See report No. 3.)

Motion prevailed that Rev. F. R. Eddy who had been chosen assistant secretary, be elected a committee to edit and publish the conference minutes.

The hour of 10:30 a. m. Saturday was made order of the day to hear from Rev. E. Teter, our connectional missionary secretary, in reference to our general missionary interests. Sister Grace Sloan of the Amboy charge, and Chas. T. Ballard of the Kokomo charge, were recommended suitable persons to be received to pursue the course of study preparatory to travel under the direction of the conference.

The hour of 7:30 p. m. Friday was made the order of the day to hear the Hon. Mr. Burwell of Indianoplis on the subject of Prohibition.

A resolution in reference to the remuneration received by pastors outside their circuit work being counted as salary created earnest and prolonged discussion, but was lost.

Conference adjourned for committee work. Benediction Geo. Reber.

Third Day-Afternoon Meeting.

Devotions Rev. T. J. Pierce.

Roll was called.

Minutes read and approved.

The examination of characterwas taken up and the names of Elders S. Gettig, J. B. Shadle, L. Shatford, W. Talbert and F. G. Walter were called and their characters passed. The name of W. G. Moon being called, a communication was presented, complaining that Bro. Moon had violated the law of the discipline in that he entered upon the charge of Pastor Mow over his protest, and at various times and in various places, which detracted from the labors of the pastor in the interests of the church.

The matter was referred to the conference president and his advisory Board for action.

The Rev. Enos Harvey, pastor of the Friends church of Fairmount, was introduced to the conference, made a few cheering remarks, and was voted an honorary member of the Body.

Hon. David Burwell of Indianoplis was introduced and made a short address encouraging to all lovers of the Prohibition Reform.

The motion prevailed that the order of the day for the address of Rev. J. L. Benton be changed from Friday afternoon, to Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

The order of the day for the address of Assistant General Agent and Secretary, Rev. J. H. Bowen arrived, and he spoke in reference to the publishing interests of the church. The address was timely and earnest in emphasizing the necessity of patronizing the literature of the church.

The examination of character was resumed and the names of L. H. Carter, W. W. Clay, were called and their characters passed. Bro. Clay asked for a transfer the Illinois conference, and upon mothe request was granted. The names of G. H. Babcock, Emma Swisher, W. L. Thompson, R. A. Carter, A. Kilburn, J. F. Pressnal, M. Moore, G. W. Brown, F. R. Eddy, J. O. Baker, W. M. Bailey, J. B. Smith, A. P. Fooshee, Newton Gilliland, W. W. Noggle, J. T. Loughridge, H. T. Arnold, A. U. Murphy, Layda Murphy, S. M. Van Blaricom, Franklin Gunn, A. B. Dipert F. M. Roberts, C. P. Dilts, Sarah Dilts, L. W. McClure, Belle McClure were called and their characters passed.

A motion prevailed to adjourn.

In harmony with a previous arrangement of the conference, the evening of August 31st, was devoted to the cause of prohibition. The meeting was presided over by Rev. A. Worth. A large congregation gathered filling the auditorium long before the hour arrived for the speaking to begin. The singing was conducted by Revs. G. Reber and S. A. Mow. Levi T. Pennington, prohibition candidate for Congress from the 11th District spoke for five minutes, after which Bro. Worth introduced the speaker of the evening, Hon. David Burwell of Indianopolis. For an hour and twenty minutes, the speaker engaged the thought of his audience with the claims of truth upon this most vital theme, the Prohibition of the Legalized Liquor Traffic. The address was so full of logic as not to fail of good results for the cause. An offering of \$20 was taken, and the meeting adjourned.

Fourth Day-Forenoon Meeting.

September 1, 1906.

Devotions were conducted by H. T. Arnold.

. Roll was called.

Minutes read and approved.

The committee on apportionment made its report. Report was adopted. (See report No. 4.)

The committee on Memorials and Resolutions made its report. It advised against adopting the resolution in reference to the educational fund, inasmuch as provisions already made involved all that was suggested. The report was adopted. (See report No. 5.)

Conference adjourned by limitation.

After a brief recess, the meeting convened for the special order of the day, the address of Rev. E. Teter, Connectional Missionary Secretary, in reference to the missionary interests of the church. The address emphasized the fact of the obligation resting upon the church for missionary activity, and included a very clear, and interesting outline of missionary work, being conducted by the connectional board. Meeting adjourned with the benediction by Rev. T. J. Pierce.

Fourth Day-Afternoon Meeting.

Devotions were conducted by the Rev. W. W. Clay. Roll was called.

Minutes read and approved.

Rev. T. P. Baker, conference educational secretary, took the floor in behalf of the Conference Bible Training School, and in a very short time secured in subscription for the school for the year, \$633.84, of which \$108.76 was cash.

The order of the day was called for, and Rev. J. L. Benton of Houghton, N. Y. addressed the conference on the need of a trained ministry.

The committee on Statistics made its report. Report adopted. (See report No. 6.)

The committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders made its report. The report was referred back for correction. The Rev. A. T. Jennings was introduced to the conference.

The camp meeting committee was elected as follows: W. J. Seekins, T. P. Baker, J. J. Coleman. Moved and supported that the Camp Meeting Indebtedness committee be excused from reporting at this conference session, their work being not yet fully completed, and that the committee be continued another year.

The secretary of the Board of Trustees read the minutes of their sessions during the year. The minutes were approved. (See Journal.)

The committee on Institute fund reported. Same was adopted. (See report No. 7.)

The treasurer of the conference Board of Trustees made his report. The reported was adopted. (See report No. 8.

The Minister's Wives Association made its report. The report was approved and ordered spread upon the minutes. (See report No. 9.)

The committee on Elders Orders made its report. Report adopted. (See report No. 2.)

The Stationing committee made its report. Same was adopted (See report No. 10.)

The W. H. and F. Missionary society made its report. Report

was approved and ordered spread upon the minutes. (See report No. 11.)

The president nominated and conference elected T. P. Baker, and H. M. Crilley as his advisory board.

It was moved that the next annual conference be held in the auditorium on the camp ground at Fairmount, Ind., just previous to camp meeting. Same to begin on Wednesday morning. Carried.

It was moved and carried that Rev. S. A. Mow be elected to preach the opening sermon of the conference next year. On motion conference adjourned.

The evidence of Divine favor was very manifest in the closing moments of the session, and all departed conscious of a year of great victory.

No. 3. Bible Training School.

Your committee on Bible Training School submits the following report:

Section I.

The school shall be known as the Wesleyan Methodist Institute and Bible Training School of Indiana.

Section II.

- The object of this school shall be the training of our licentiates and other Christian workers in a working knowledge of the Bible.
- To secure for God and the church on the part of each scholar a thorough, stable, Christian experience, and to prepare them for faithful aggressive effort for the salvation of men.
- 3. The Conference Board of Trustees shall be the trustees for said school. The superintendent of the school, if not a member of the board of trustees shall be an honorary member in all the work of the board relative to the interests of the school.
- 4. The school year shall consist of three terms of eight weeks each. The first term to be held during the months of October and November. The second term during January and February. The third term during May and June. The same, subject to change, if necessary.

The time herein not specified shall be given in the development of a correspondence course by the superintendent.

- 5. The work of the conference committee of itineracy and elder's orders shall be arranged for and done by their cooperation with the superintendent of the school, and they with the superintendent shall constitute the conference educational faculty.
- All rules for the government of the school and conditions for entering the same shall be formulated by the Board of Trustees and the conference educational faculty.

The school shall be located on the camp ground at Fairmount,

Indiana, and the trustees shall confer with the directors of the Camp meeting Association to provide a home for the superintendent and a building on the grounds for the recitations.

Section III.

The curriculum of said school shall be as follows:

FIRST TERM.

Bible I. Wesley's Plain Account, Binney's Compend, Theology, First Half, Church History, Mental Philosophy.

SECOND TERM.

REPORT NO. 5.

Memorials and Resolutions.

Your committee to whom was referred the matter of Memorials and Resolutions beg leave to submit the following report.

I. James Matheny.

Whereas in the providence of God, our esteemed brother, Elder James Matheny, has been called to his heavenly reward during the past year, we desire to record our submission to the heavenly father's will, our sympathy with the bereaved family, and our conviction, he who has gone from us, was one of God's noble men.

Brother Matheny was one of the charter members of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, going into the organization some time in the 40's.

We found one license issued by the Pleasant Grove Church, of

Camden Circuit, dated Sept. 1st. 1849. This license bears the name of Daniel Worth as president, and William Gladding, secretary of the Quarterly Conference.

The aged widow was unable to find his ordination, parchments, but he was ordained doubtless in the early 50's.

He traveled a number of circuits under the direction of the conference, supporting himself by working on the farm, asidid many of the pioneer ministers of the Indiana Conference: but few people realize at this present time, what the early ministers endured, following blazes on trees through the woods, and preaching in cabins and barns; but our beloved brother continued faithful until the infirmities of age compelled him to relinquish the work that had been so dear to his heart for more than half a century.

He had an unflinching fidelity to his convictions, and no power of earth could turn him from the path of duty, when it was made plain by the word of God.

He was one of the pioneer abolitionists of Marshall Co., and the bond-men of the south had no truer friend than was "Uncle Jim," as he was familiarly called.

He was faithful to answer roll call at conference until too old to travel, and meet his brethren in their annual gatherings.

The world has been made better by his consecrated life, and his influence will be a power for God through all the coming years; his spirit lives in the paradise of God, the body, resting in the grave, will some day come forth to be clothed with glorious immortality.

2. The state of the country.

We regret and deplore the fact that degeneracy still exists in an alarming degree in the government, and that by political intrigue and manipulation, great and distressing inequality exists.

This was not the design of the founders and early leaders of this great country, but rather that all should be free, and be given equal opportunity, physically, mentally, and spiritually.

Therefore be it resolved:

- That we deplore, and will lift our voice, vote, prayer and influence against the accursed Liquor Traffic, which the government is not only very evidently and effectually in partnership with, but miserably and hopelessly enslaved unto.
- 2. We as a church, and especially as ministers and representatives of Jesus Christ (by whose precious blood, were made sacred to him the bodies and souls of men, the peace of the home and the purity of the church) ought to be in the front rank in an unrelenting warfare, using every possible weapon apainst this Goliath of Heil who stands with drawn sword and contemptous scorn against the womanhood, manhood and childhood; against God, his church, and his holy day. In a word, we believe every man should, and he

who does as God wants him to do, will cast his ballot with that political party whose emblem is the Rising Sun, whose watchword is Probibition.

We favor that an hour be set apart in our next annual conference

for a public discussion of this subject.

3. Too much can not be said in regard to the official corruption and graft in the dominant politics from the lowest to the highest departments of the government: the fearful and appalling increase of divorce cases: the trifling respect that both men and women have for marriage vows, and family ties: the disobedience of children to parents, the lack of natural affection of parents toward children: in that for their own pleasure's sake, the parent neglects the child, the world forsakes it, and the devil destroys it. These all tell us that the prophetic "perilous times" are here: will we not for humanity's sake, for Jesus' sake, for heaven's sake, as voters, as Americans, as a church, as Christians, use every force and agency and grace to defend the weak, to protect the helpless, to tear down the kingdom of the devil and to build up the glorious kingdom of God.

4. We believe in the principle of settling all questions of state and nations by arbitration, and sincerely pray for the time when the nations shall learn war no more, but with the Prince of Peace enthroned, the kingdoms of this world shall become the kingdom of

our Lord and his Christ.
