# Standing Rules

- 1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of his church property in the hands of the Conference president, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable Conference papers. The Conference shall pay rent on space.
- 2. The President and his Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for churches, parsonages, or other Conference property to be submitted to them for examination before recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.
- That each pastor is to bring his statistical report in full ready to be read the first day of Conference.
  - 4. All pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their reports.
- 5. Our members are solicited to faithfulness in tithing and our churches are to consider the storehouse plan.
- 6. The Campmeeting and Conference are to be held together with the date of Conference to be set by the Board of Administration. If possible, it shall be incorporated at the beginning or at the close of campmeeting.
- 7. The Annual Conference Body shall elect a Committee on Committees whose duty is to nominate the Session and Standing Committees.
- 8. The following items of the Pastor's Statistical report shall be read each year on the Conference floor: Pastor's calls, Wesleyan Methodist, Wesleyan Missionary, Wesleyan Youth subscriptions, Present membership, gain or loss, Average Sunday School attendance, No. Church Buildings, Value and Insurance, Item VI Complete, Total Contributed for Church, Item VIII complete, Total Benevolence, Contributed totals.
- 9. That each local church be responsible for paying the moving expenses of the pastor whom they have called.
  - 10. Conference Secretary be paid ten dollars annually from the Conference treasury.
- 11. The Conference Treasurer's books be closed one week before the opening session of the Annual Conference. amended 1944 to read three weeks.
  - 12. No Treasurer be allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.
- 13. The Standing Rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference minutes from year to year.
- 14.The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer be a member of the Superannuate Pension Plan Committee.
- 15. The Campmeeting Board shall consist of seven members. The President of the Annual Conference, President of the W. M. S., and President of the W. Y. P. S. be members by virtue of their office and that the other members be elected from the floor after the election of Conference officers.
- 16. The Conference W. Y. P. S. President and the Conference Treasurer be members of the Missionary Board by virtue of their office.

# Report No. 1 Conference President

Today we meet in the Sixtieth Annual Conference of the Oregon Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. The years have gone by swiftly, and this year that we have just closed is no exception. It seems just a short time ago that we met in annual session. This has been a good year despite the fact there has been many problems and an unusual number of things to take care of.

During the year our church property at Seattle has been sold, and new property in a new section of the city has been purchased. We believe this move will prove wise, with greater opportunity to reach the unchurched. The exchange of deeds has been completed, and our deed has been properly signed by the Conference Board of Trus-

tees, and as such duly recorded.

We have also completed the sale of the extra lot at Crawfordsville.

By request, I have held fourteen Quarterly Conference meetings. These meetings for the most part has been well attended, and an excellent spirit manifested at each one.

On March 22, I organized a Church at Portland, known as the Holgate Church. We

need to build the superstructure there immediately.

During the year I received the transfer, from the Indiana Conference, of Ira C. Gross, a Conference Preacher. About March he was voted pastor of the St. Johns Church. He arrived on the field July 8, we welcome him into the Conference.

In May I attended the Conference Presidents and Leaders Meeting at Miltonvale,

Kansas. I have traveled about 14,000 miles during the year.

Early in The Conference year we arranged a revival meeting at Washougal, Washington. Rev. Pearl Poe helped me in this meeting. We were forced to use two different community halls during the meeting and this added to the difficulty. We continued three weeks with no particular results. We still think there is a good possibility if we had a suitable building in which to conduct services. Several other trips throughout the Conference has revealed the same difficulty.

- 10. Send letters to Viola Gjesdal at Brainerd Indian School at least three times during the year and insist on each member writing their prayer partner often.
- 11. Revitalize our monthly meetings with interesting program material, such as maps, news items, guest speakers, The Wesleyan Missionary, and the study book.
- 12. Read the Plan of Work and Efficiency Standard at least three times a year in the monthly meetings.
- 13. All officers, committees and delegates be elected before the Annual Conference convenes.
- 14. Measure up to Standard of Efficiency in our societies, putting the grade on the report.
