## THE CHAMPLAIN CONFERENCE

### STANDING RULES

---

I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.

II. All visiting members of our own, or other churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.

III. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.

IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.

V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his services in caring for the funds.

VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.

VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the Camp Meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee, or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpected balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.

VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.

IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

### STANDING RULES—Continued

X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.

XI. The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.

XII. In securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church shall be secured, if this can be done.

XIII. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers, and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.

XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.

XV. The offerings for Superannuated Ministers shall be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.

XVI. That the Preachers in reading their reports at Conference read only items in the aggregate.

### Daily Journal of Proceedings

---

The ninety-third annual session of the Champlain Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America, met on the Camp Ground at West Chazy, N. Y., July 3rd, with a meeting called to order by the President, H. N. Robinson, promptly at 7:30 P. M. Our song leader for the camp meeting was present and took charge of the singing. Rev. A. J. Allen offered prayer after which the Houghton Quartette sang, "Walking in the King's Highway". The following business was transacted: A committee on passage of Character was elected, O. M. Finch, Elder; S. Brainard, Layman. The Houghton Quartette sang another selection, "Jesus a Well of Delight". Rev F. H. Wright having been secured to give Bible readings through the Camp and Conference, brought the message of the evening. Scripture lesson from the first chapter of Romans, first 16 verses.

#### Wednesday Morning Meeting

Devotional service was in charge of W. F. Lewis.

Business—Conference was called to order by the President, H. N. Robinson. Roll was called. Report of Committee on Credentials was given. Moved that the report be adopted, and other names be added to the roll as necessary, without a vote of Conference. Motion was carried.

Moved and carried that pastors in reading their Statistical reports read only items in the aggregate. This rule is to become a standing

rule of the Conference. Rev. E. D. Carpenter, and Mrs. Mary L. Clarke, Y. M. W. B. Superintendent, were introduced to the Conference. Rev. W. F. Lewis gave his report as Sunday School Secretary, which report was accepted. See Report No. 2. The Conference gave way to an Order of the Day, the meeting of the Superannuate Society. See Report No. 3. The Conference again resumed business.

Rev. A. O. Northrup was introduced to the Conference. The Committee on Resolutions gave its report. See Report No. 4. The report was adopted. Moved and carried that the matter of the corruption in the movies, as it came up before the Conference, be referred to the Committee on Resolutions. Motion was carried. This is to be designated as Resolution No. 2.

The Conference adjourned at this time by vote. Benediction by A. O. Northrup.

Scripture was read by Rev. W. F. Lewis and prayer was offered by Rev. A. J. Allen, after which the Houghton Quartette sang, "Go Tell Some One About Jesus." Brother Carpenter brought the message. The Committee on Statistics gave their report. See Report No. 12. accepted as corrected. See Report No. 11.

Motion was made and voted that this Conference adopt the Financial Plan as outlined by President Luckey.

Rev. C. L. Hill was elected Conference Educational Secretary.

Conference adjourned by vote.

It was voted by the Conference that our General Conference Delegates' expenses be apportioned at twenty-five cents per member. Brother Sumner Brainard tendered his resignation as Lay Delegate to the General Conference, which was accepted.

Rev. A. J. Allen was elected Delegate to General Conference.

Mrs. Eva Allen was elected Lay Delegate by the Conference to take the place of Sumner Brainard.

Motion was made that the East Corinth Church be left in the hands of the people of the Corinth Church to be used as they may see fit. This motion was carried.

#### PLAN OF WORK FOR LOCAL SOCIETIES

We recommend the following Plan of Work:

1. That each Local Society shall have some Missionary Study or Program at each meeting to enlighten our minds, broaden our vision and inspire our hearts to pray definitely for the missionary work in all its branches.

2. That each Society shall have a Solicitor, who will earnestly endeavor to get new subscribers and keep account of renewals to the Wesleyan Missionary.

3. That all money raised by the Society shall be used for missionary work, and no money be paid out without a vote of the Society.

4. That one of the two Statistical Blanks sent to each Society, after being carefully filled out, is to be given to the Statistical Committee at the beginning of the Conference, the other to be retained by the Delegate and later read to the Local Society. Receipts and disbursements must be made to balance before being placed in the hands of the Statistical Committee.

5. That all missionary boxes be given proper credit, but not in the column with cash receipts and disbursements.

8. That we do not forget the sending of supplies to the foreign missionary fields, such as bandages, religious books, pictures or calendars.

9. That each Society sending money for any branch of the work see that the pastor receives the duplicate receipt so that proper credit may be received on the budget.

10. That each Local Society shall have at least one public meeting during the year in which missionary needs shall be emphasized.
