DENOMINATIONAL ADDRESS—Dr. Harold K. Sheets gave a very inspirational and informative Denominational Address, with special emphasis on the primary benefits resulting from the merged church.

Johnston gave a resume of the first half century of the conference history and Rev. C. T. Bryant gave a resume of the last quarter century of the conference history. Mrs. Margaret Childs gave highlights on the Woman's Missionary Society and Rev. G. Robb French gave highlights on the Wesleyan Youth. Dr. Harold K. Sheets brought a brief but inspiring message on the subject, "The Challenge of the Future." Music was rendered by a male chorus under the direction of Prof. Leonard Brank. Dr. R. C. BOARD ON CHURCH AND PARSONAGE BUILDING AND LOCATION—The District Superintendent nominated and the Conference elected the following as Boards on Church and Parsonage Building and Location: Central District: C. T. Bryant (Ex-Officio); L. L. Jarrard, G. C. Summey; Columbia District: C. T. Bryant (Ex-Officio), A. C. Parker, W. T. Hughey; Greenville District: C. T. Bryant (Ex-Officio), J. B. Hilson, Ross E. Gilstrap; Spartanburg District: C. T. Bryant (Ex-Officio), J. F. McCool, George A. Fowler.

ADVISORY BOARD—The District Superintendent nominated and the Conference elected the following as the District Superintendent's Advisory Board: William D. James, C. G. Shirley, R. C. Mullinax, W. T. Hughey, G. C. Summey, J. B. Childs.

PASTORAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE—The District Superintendent read the final report of the Committee on Pastoral Relations. Report adopted. (See Report No. 2).

The minutes were read and approved.

The Conference voted to adopt the minutes of the entire session.

By vote the Conference adjourned *sine die* at 9:25 p. m.

Benediction by Rev. Karl W. Johnston.

Standing Rules

1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

2. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.

3. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds for an expansion program or to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. Whenever money is borrowed for use of a local church the local church shall agree to and be responsible for its payment.

4. In case of necessity in order that a duly authorized expansion, building, remodeling or relocating program may be carried out; or in case of the claim of a municipal government, state highway department, or any other governmental agency, the trustees of the South Carolina Conference be and they hereby are duly empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which transfer or sale is requested (this writing to become a part of the permanent record of the trustees), and where the sale or transfer of such conference, church, parsonage, or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board, and provided further that the trustees and the President of the said Conference are satisfied that the object for which the transaction is sought is both necessary and desirable. (1961)

5. During the interim of Annual Conference the Board of Church Extension and Evangelism shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Mountain Missions and Conference Missions, for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the

President and at least one-half the other members of the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism, or signed by the President in behalf of the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism.

6. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a church building or a parsonage or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is advised to consult with the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location in the early stages of planning and final plans must be approved by said Board. (1964)

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

7. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.

8. Conference shall convene on Monday, after the second Sunday in July. (1964)

9. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close June 15. (1964)

10. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.

11. The Board of Administration shall appoint the Auditing Committee, the Statistician, and the Apportionment Committee at a proper time before Conference. (1966)

12. The Conference Officers shall be a Committee on Agenda for the annual conference sessions. (1966)

13. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.

14. A watch is to be presented as an award to each minister who has given twenty-five years of active service in God's Kingdom while he is a member of the South Carolina Conference. At the end of each minister's active service in this Conference, a certificate of citation is to be given recognizing the total period of active service, provided it is a minimum of twenty years. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and the Secretary. (1967)

15. During the interim of the Annual Conference, the Committee on

Finance shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Minutes, Conference Entertainment, Conference Parsonage, and President's Salary for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference; and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Committee on Finance or signed by the President by order and in behalf of the Committee on Finance. (1957)

16. The local church officers shall be elected within thirty days of the close of the fiscal year of the local church, and they shall take office at the beginning of the fiscal year. (1958)

17. All pastors shall mail their Statistical Reports to the statistician by June 25. (1964)

18. Anyone employed by the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism shall not be a member of the Board. (1959)

19. The joint committee composed of the President and his Advisory Board, the Board of Trustees, and the Board on Church Extension and Conference Evangelism are authorized to draw on monies available in the Conference Budget for Church Extension and Evangelism to aid churches which, in the opinion of this joint committee, are faced by dire emergency.

20. During the interim of the Annual Conference the Conference Trustees shall be duly authorized to draw on funds for Conference Parsonage Maintenance, for the purpose for which it was raised, as the Trustees deem best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least a majority of the Conference Trustees, or signed by the President in behalf of the Conference Trustees.

21. The Conference Officers, President's Advisory Board, Conference Trustees, Committee on Church Extension and Evangelism, and Committee on Finance shall constitute a Conference Board of Administration as provided in paragraph 245 of the 1963 Discipline.

22. When any pastor in the conference is assigned to a church or charge, he is to move his church membership to said church or charge unless other plans are approved by the President and his Advisory Board. (1966)

23. All pastors are required to attend the Annual Conference session unless excused by the President for providential reasons.

Standing Recommendations

1. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold, if possible, a two weeks' revival during the year.

2. That all ministers faithfully tithe their income and that any minister failing to do so shall be considered delinquent in his duty. (1959)

3. That all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.

4. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation, with pay, each year.

5. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project should be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.

6. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve as Quarterly Conference Clerk.

7. We urge all pastors to seek earnestly to raise a full budget and that first consideration be given to the Pension Plan Budget. (1959)

8. That we adhere to Paragraph 132 (2) of our Discipline as long as there are ministers in our Conference who are qualified and who are available to take work. (1959)

9. Any pastor, or church, desiring to invite a convention or rally group other than Wesleyan groups should first secure the approval of the President and his Advisory Board. (1959)

10. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference, and the church is requested to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary. (1964)

11. The fiscal year of the local church shall end May 31. (1964)

12. All our churches shall use Wesleyan Methodist Sunday School Literature.

13. Any pastor or church desiring to call as evangelist or speaker any who have withdrawn from the Wesleyan Methodist Church, or who have advocated withdrawal from the Church, or who have organized or are serving as pastor of an independent church, or who have advocated or participated in the organization of another denomination, shall first secure the approval of the President and his Advisory Board.

REPORTS

REPORT NO. 1

President's Report

To the Seventy-Sixth Annual Session of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Church: Greetings in the name of the Lord.

This will be my eleventh and final report as Conference President as we are asking that you not consider our name when you elect your new District Superintendent. For eleven years you have honored me by electing me to this office. We have never felt worthy of this office, but we have tried to give our best in the service of Christ and the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

We trust and are sure that you have been praying earnestly and seeking carefully the guidance of the Holy Spirit in the selection of your new Conference leadership. There are a number of men who would serve well in this capacity. Under God we will do our best to stand by whoever is elected.

It has been a real joy to visit in the homes of our pastors and people and in our churches during these years. We would like to thank each of you for every kindness shown. We appreciate the comfortable home and the pleasant office that have been available to us during these years of service. To all Conference officers and Committees for the measure of cooperation given we would express gratitude. Above all, to God for his unfailing and unceasing help across these years of service we give glory and praise.

IN RETROSPECT

1. **SERVICES RENDERED**—During our years of service we traveled 222,953 miles by car, plane, train and bus, without even a minor accident. We spoke 2,239 times or approximately four times a week and conducted 89 revivals in which many souls found God or received spiritual help. Some who were saved during these revivals are now serving in responsible offices in the local church.

2. **NUMERICALLY**—In 1961 the Conference reached a new high in total membership of 2,948 and remained above the 2,900 mark for four years. However, many pastors were receiving some of the new members as Junior members a new membership category that was introduced about 1956. This of course was for the purpose of keeping budget askings down. For example the Junior membership rose from 77 in 1956 to 313 in 1963. We had a serious membership loss reported at our Conference session in 1967. This year we are reporting a nice gain and hope that the trend has been reversed and that in the years ahead growth will continue.

3. **MATERIALLY**—Twelve new churches have been bought or built and ten churches have done extensive remodeling. Fifteen new parsonages have

been bought or built and one has been remodeled extensively. The total number of parsonages has been increased by four. The following comparative statistics may be of interest:

4. CHURCH EXTENSION—The following churches have been organized: Belton, Sumter, Mitchell Memorial, and Mauldin. A special effort has been made to improve our situation in our capital city of Columbia. Under the leadership of the present pastor, William R. French, excellent progress has been made in upgrading the appearance of the church and parsonage buildings. The attractive, air conditioned sanctuary bear testimony to this fact. Also, a good foundation is being laid for future growth while modest gains are being made numerically. The Conference is buying three houses adjacent to our church property to provide for future expansion as needed.

A LOOK AT THIS YEAR

1. DIAMOND ANNIVERSARY GOALS—Goals were set at the last Annual Conference session. Listed first was "a spiritual revival in each church." A goodly number of our pastors report what they feel were outstanding revivals. A look at the statistics of the churches they represent would tend to confirm this. Beyond a rather superficial evaluation that I might be able to give, each pastor and church member would have to report personally as to their spiritual growth during this year. I do know that we have some of the most dedicated, committed and consistent pastors and people in the entire Wesleyan Church.

We reached our goals in number of tithers gained and in increase in subscriptions to the Wesleyan Missionary Magazine. In Membership, Churches organized, and subscriptions to the Wesleyan Methodist and Wesleyan Youth we made some gains. Only in Sunday School average attendance did we suffer loss instead of gain.

2. NUMERICALLY—We thank God for a gain of 113 in total membership. This represents a gain of 57 in full members, 8 in Associate members, and of 48 Junior members.

3. FINANCIALLY—Forty-four Churches paid a full budget which is the same number of churches that paid a full budget in 1967. The total budget assigned was \$71,928.50 and the total amount raised was \$72,547.25. This represents a loss of budget income as compared with \$73,208.08 paid for budget in 1967. More than \$600.00 of this decrease was in the Conference budget.

A PROSPECTIVE VIEW

The historic merging General Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and the Pilgrim Holiness Church is now past and we meet in our first Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Church. Just what shape or form the new church will take remains for the years ahead to reveal. It was evident from the

fine devotional messages brought at the General Conference that we are not to look to numerical increase or material gains brought about by the merger as our hope for victory in the future. "ONE—THAT THE WORLD MAY BELIEVE" was adopted as the theme for our evangelistic emphasis during this quadrennium.

Adjustments will be necessary as we will be working with a new Discipline. Adjustment does not necessarily mean compromise. You will be working with a new method of raising the General Budget. It is called the United Stewardship Fund and will be raised on a percentage basis.

As we give ourselves to prayer, God will open our eyes to the fields, "white already to harvest" and we may glean a good harvest of souls before our Lord's return.

MAULDIN

The Mauldin work was organized on May 12, 1968, with 17 enthusiastic members under the pastoral leadership of Rev. W. A. Dilling. At present they are worshipping in a temporary but an attractive chapel. We have five acres of land and approximately \$4,300 on hand in different funds for a building for this work. Your prayers are solicited that this group will fulfill their mission in one of the fastest growing communities in the state.

MATERIAL IMPROVEMENTS

GREER—Put a new roof on their church, redecorated the basement, and made other major repairs at a cost of about \$1,700.

ALICE—has installed new pews and pulpit furniture, wall to wall carpet, and has purchased a house and two lots adjoining the Church for future development. All this was done at a cost of \$11,400.

WELCOME—has renovated the interior of the sanctuary by sheet-rocking the ceiling, wainscoting the walls, placing new light fixtures, carpeting from wall to wall, and painting the interior at a cost of \$3,400.

ARIAL has recently installed new pews, wall to wall carpet, and new drapes for the choir. The total cost of these improvements was approximately \$6,500.

WILLIAMSTON has installed new pews, pulpit furniture, and a new furnace heating system at a cost of \$5,100.

WALHALLA has liquidated their indebtedness which stood at \$2,800 at the beginning of the Conference year.

GLENWOOD has built one of the most beautiful buildings in Wesleyan Methodism. The church covers an area of 33,000 square feet with a seating capacity of 500 including the balcony. There are nine Sunday School rooms downstairs with equal room upstairs, a modern nursery, and pastor's study. At the present, plans call for a total cost of \$90,000 with plans to finish as the need demands. Pews and pulpit furniture were installed at a cost of \$6,600.

EASLEY, FIRST has liquidated the indebtedness on their church which stood at \$2,250 at the beginning of the Conference year. They have also air conditioned their building at a cost of \$2,350.

PICKENS VIEW has constructed a new building in memory of the late

Rev. John Youngblood. This building is of brick construction and houses an assembly room which will seat approximately 150 people and which provides three classrooms when the accordion doors are in use. It also includes a nursery, pastor's study and foyer. The original building was also brick veneered. This was done at a cost of \$20,661 and the balance due at the time of dedication was \$13,450.

BETHANY has installed new pews.

GREENVILLE, FIRST has completed their Educational Building and made extensive improvements in the Church building. The new unit consists of a three-story building thirty by ninety feet. It has 17 Sunday School rooms, music studio, pastor's study, church office and two rest rooms. The basement floor is terrazo, and the other two floors are carpeted. It is air conditioned. The sanctuary has been air conditioned and a new Allen organ has been installed. The total cost of the building program as of June 16 was \$93,749 and the indebtedness stood at \$67,260. The new addition is a beautiful and functional addition to an already beautiful property.

CLEMSON has installed new pews.

FOUNTAIN INN has installed an organ at a cost of \$2,000.

COLUMBIA continues to improve their building. They replaced the ceiling in the sanctuary with new, exposed beam ceiling, rewired and placed new light fixtures and air conditioned, and painted the sanctuary. Half of the cost of the air conditioning was donated by a friend. The cash expenditure on all these improvements was \$3,457.

CHESNEE has completely remodeled and enlarged their sanctuary and have added an Education building which will house, when completed, seven Sunday School rooms and an assembly room and a restroom. In the sanctuary they have added a nursery, and pastor's study, and have installed a baptistry and new piano; all of this has cost approximately \$23,000 to date.

LOSS BY DEATH

Will H. King, a charter member of the Conference, died at the age of ninety during this year. Mrs. R. C. Mullinax, the wife of Dr. R. C. Mullinax, went to be with the Lord on July 13, 1968. They both made a fine contribution to the work of the church.

January 12, 1968—Granted a letter of transfer to J. Paul Hilson, an elder, to the Florida Conference.

February 25, 1968—C. R. Tegen was appointed pastor of the Greer church.

March 20, 1968—At the request of the Church we appointed Milton Todd assistant pastor at Central, Second.

March 24, 1968—Appointed Leslie Barr, supply pastor at Community.

May 12, 1968—Dr. V. A. Mitchell organized a new class of 17 members at Mauldin. This group was later officially received into the South Carolina Conference.

June 8, 1968—Granted permission to Central, First, to vote on Lyman Lance as pastor. This was done with the knowledge that Brother Lance would not be transferring his Conference membership.

July 15, 1968—Roy L. Newton voluntarily surrendered his Elders credentials, with definite signs of genuine repentance, according to paragraph 492 of the Book of Discipline (1963).

REPORT NO. 3

Church Extension And Evangelism

ITEM I

Business Transactions:

The committee:

1. Authorized the Conference President to have the trailer at Union re-
paired and relocated at Community.
2. Paid moving bill for Landrum pastor.
3. Paid Rev. R. E. Turner \$100.00 per month for (5) five months to assist
him until he can find work.

4. Supplemented the Sumter pastor \$50.00 a month for living quarters.
5. Instructed the Conference president and Rev. Jack Funderburk to investigate the possibility of purchasing a trailer for Sumter.
6. Elected a sub-committee for the Mauldin project: K. W. Johnston, W. M. Rampey, Earl J. Hucks, C. T. Bryant. This committee met Oct. 6, 1967.
7. On October 16, 1967, a tract of land on East Butler Street, Mauldin, was approved and purchased later for a Mauldin church site. This property was \$1200.00 per acre, 5 acres.
8. On January 2, 1968, began the payment of \$150.00 per month to Sans Souci church on mortgage, since church is unable to pay.
9. Transferred the Belton Tabernacle fund of \$521.24 and \$30.00 in memorial fund to the Mauldin project.
10. Approval was given for the following churches to vote on the following pastors: Glenville, Donald Alexander; Belton, V. E. Gilreath; Mauldin, W. A. Dilling; Sumter, C. V. Marchbanks, Sr.; North Charleston, Sam Hanvey.

ITEM II

We recommend:

1. That when it becomes necessary for the Conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by this committee. We further recommend as long as a church receives aid from the Conference, it shall consult this committee before calling a pastor, or before borrowing additional funds.
2. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from this committee before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his church during the year.
3. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference and who desires to move or to live away from said church or change his relation to the charge in any way must first consult this committee.
4. That when this committee is making payments on loans on church property the payments shall be made directly to the mortgagee.
5. That the Conference President be Sales Manager of the Conference history book.
6. That we continue to assist in the payments on the loan on the North Charleston Parsonage.
7. That we give \$100.00 per month to Belton for payments on the church building, with the understanding that the church, as they are able, assume as much of the payments as possible.
8. That we pay \$150.00 per month on the Sans Souci church building.
9. That we pay the pastor of Glenville \$35.00 a month from the Mountain Mission Budget.
10. That we pay the pastor of Tuckasegee \$35.00 a month from the Mountain Mission Budget.
11. That the Sunday School Rally Day Offering be for church extension or other recommended conference projects.

ITEM III

Secretary of Church Extension and Evangelism:

1. His duties are to conduct rallies and cultivate interest in church extension and explore prospective fields, and he shall work with and under the direction of this committee.

2. That the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee nominate the Secretary of Church Extension and Evangelism and the conference elect, and further nominations may be made from the floor.

3. This committee nominated Rev. A. W. Padgett as secretary.

REPORT NO. 4**Finance Committee**

We, the Committee on Finance, present the following Denominational Budget:

Pension Plan—\$3.50 per member to cover one-half year to January 1, 1969, at which time the new plan of 12% of the Pastor's cash salary will become effective.

General Stewardship Fund—4½% of total income of church and all departments and auxiliary organizations, excluding money borrowed, money received from sale of property, and building funds, also parsonage rent and utilities.

Education—2.2% of total income as specified above.

We recommend that the Conference Budget be as follows per member: Conference Church Extension and Evangelism \$2.50; Conference Administration \$3.50; Conference Work \$1.00; Conference Entertainment \$.50; Conference Minutes \$.60; Mountain Missions \$.25; Conference Parsonage \$1.25; Conference Group Insurance \$1.00; Conference Sunday School Work \$.05 per member in main school.

We further recommend:

1. That for 1967-1968 the President be paid a bonus of \$260.00 if funds are available.

2. That the District Superintendent receive \$125.00 per week salary, one-half social security tax, parsonage rent and utilities, and that he be given two weeks' vacation with pay.

3. That the District Superintendent be given the privilege of holding meetings up to 15 days outside the Conference and retain the offerings.

4. That the District Superintendent hold one quarterly meeting or visit each charge once during the year and at other times as often as he is able.

5. That the District Superintendent advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising plans for the better payment of pastors, including the church helping with their social security taxes and utilities and that he also shall counsel with the boards of stewards relative to

the superannuate budget item.

6. That the Statistician's salary be \$100.00 to be taken from the Conference Work Fund.

7. That the Treasurer's salary be \$300.00 and the Secretary's salary be \$200.00 to be taken from the Conference Work Fund.

8. That the District Superintendent be authorized to draw on funds of Conference work for secretarial help, printing blanks, other such items, and also for flowers for the funeral of a minister, a minister's wife or widow, children or parents.

9. That all proceeds from sale of Conference History Books be put into Conference Work Fund.

10. That the District Superintendent have the privilege of representing the Conference at meetings of the N. A. E. and N. H. A. with the expense being paid by the Conference.

11. That the Committee on Finance meet at the call of the District Superintendent.

12. That the Committee on Finance continue to sponsor a tithing promotional program with the tithing secretary under the supervision of this committee and that funds be made available for literature and printing; also that Rev. Ned Hunnicutt be elected as tithing secretary.

13. That the Conference continue its Purchasing Agency to purchase for ministers and laymen in the Conference such items as sets of books, Bibles, watches, etc. and awards, on a cash basis; also that Rev. J. B. Hilson continue as Conference Purchasing Agent.

14. That the Treasurer be authorized to put any temporarily surplus funds in a government guaranteed institution on interest at his discretion.

15. That Rev. J. B. Hilson be re-elected as Group Leader to administer the Conference Hospital Insurance Program.

16. That Church Treasurer's Records be sent in for grading by a Conference Committee.

17. That we offer a Physicians' Mutual Policy to all authorized personnel who do not qualify for Minister's Life Insurance with the Conference paying one-fourth of the premium.

18. That Standing Recommendation No. 10 be deleted and those following it be renumbered.

REPORT NO. 8

Committee On Records

We recommend:

1. That whenever possible the church use a well-bound book which will be suitable for permanent records, of a size not less than eight inches by ten inches.
2. That the title page appear in the front of each book giving the name of the church, and also designating whether it is a church record book or quarterly conference book. If both records are combined in one book, please state this on the title page. If it is only a roll book designate this.
3. That a table of contents be placed on the second or third page of each record book. If no space is available, a sheet may be inserted with cloth tape.
4. That the proceedings of each business meeting of the church be recorded in the form of minutes.
5. That the minutes be placed in chronological order.
6. That the church clerks read carefully paragraph 131, 270, (10) of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline.
7. That the roll be kept up to date and that it include as completely as possible the following information: the names of members, dates received and removal.
8. That if a church fails to send a record, its grade becomes zero.
9. That all pastors call attention to their church clerks and quarterly conference clerks to these recommendations.
10. That the following method of grading be used for the church and quarterly conference books—title page, 5%; completeness of minutes, 15%; for church or combined books—title page, 5%, completeness of minutes, 10%; church roll, 5%; binding, 10%; table of contents, 10%; permanency of records, (ink

The speaker for the evening was Rev. Glenn Barnett. Pictures of Haiti were shown after the message by Rev. and Mrs. Barnett.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 17, 1968, 8:30 A. M.

The Wednesday morning session opened with the song service being conducted by Naomi Hughey with Mary French at the piano.

Mrs. Sylvia Gentry sang a special number "How Great Thou Art."

Mrs. Barnett continued the devotional talks using Matt. 14:24-31. "To be totally involved in the Lord and His work is really being a Christian. Problems or storms are the lot of all of us. The disciples were in a storm but one stepped out on faith. He had a vision of the Lord.

"The Haitians have their problems but some of them have seen a vision of the Lord. We have the challenge to 'come.' Jesus is saying to the world as He said to Peter 'Come unto me.' Total involvement or total commitment gives the victory over the problems."

After the devotional period, Mrs. Barnett conducted a question and answer period about the Haitian work.

The conference was called to order by the President.

The Courtesy Committee reported. Mrs. H. K. Sheets, Miss Mary Hammond, and Rev. Glenn Barnett were introduced. Mrs. Sheets and Miss Hammond gave testimonies, and Rev. Barnett spoke briefly bringing greetings from Haiti.

Roll was called.

The Woman's World Fellowship Secretary reported. Report adopted. (See Report). A rising vote of thanks was given Mrs. Benjamin.

The Statistician's report was given. Report adopted. (See report). A rising vote of thanks was given Mrs. Hughey.

The President spoke a few words regarding the 1968-'69 emphases.

The Literature Secretary presented the remaining literature.

A small gift of money was received for Mrs. Lola Harris who was absent this year for the first time. The secretary was asked to send words of appreciation along with the gift.

A small token of appreciation and sympathy was also to be sent to Miss Martha Bloom who was absent from the conference due of her brother's death. Miss Bloom was in charge of refurnishing and cleaning the workers' cottages on the camp ground during the year. The district ladies rallied to this cause and much was accomplished.

Committee on addresses reported. (See Report).

All officers for the coming year were installed. A very compassionate and humble prayer was offered by Sallie Evatt for a very profitable year.

The president called to our remembrance our theme "Hitherto—Henceforth."

The Remembrance Committee reported. The group stood in a moment

of silence honoring those who have passed from our presence. Prayer was offered by Mrs. Clara James.

Words were expressed by the president admonishing us to pray for our missionaries who will be coming home on furlough as well as for those going out.

Martha Evatt spoke uplifting words of Mary Hammond, who was in our audience. Her adherence to a long educational period and willingness to do menial tasks to acquire it are recognized and praised.

Community Missions report was read. Report adopted. (See Report).

A few words summarizing the business were spoken by Mrs. Childs.

Adjourned sine die.

Mrs. Benjamin dismissed the Conference with prayer at 11:30 a. m.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.

2. The W. M. S. dues for this Conference will be one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per member. Fifty cents (50c) of this to be retained in the Conference treasury for working fund.

3. Y. M. W. B. dues will be sixty (60c) per member for this Conference. Fifty-two cents (52c) is to be used for Foreign Missions, five cents (5c) for desk expense, and three cents (3c) for General Conference travel expense of the Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.

4. All money must be in the hands of the Treasurer by midnight on June 5. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by June 15.

5. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study Group, and a large Women's Fellowship Circle.

6. The Executive Board will serve as a nominating committee to nominate secretaries and committees as deemed necessary before the opening of Conference.

7. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the honor roll.

8. Each district will elect the following officers: Chairman, Secretary, Magazine Solicitor, Mission Study Promoter, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.

9. Each district should plan at least three district meetings annually—one each quarter in which workshops will be held for: local presidents, treasurers, magazine solicitors, Women's World Fellowship secretaries, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendents.

10. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists, and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expense on said visits.
