Mc-Carty, Foreign Missionary Secretary relative to the work being done by the Department of Foreign Missions, which was very interesting and instructive. A gift offering amounting to \$55.00 was made at this time to be given to the Carters and Miss Wylie, both of whom are sailing soon for the African field.

The special committee on Sunday School Evangelism reported referring the matter of employing a Sunday School Evangelist to the President and his advisory board and the Sunday School Board.

It was ordered that any item of business overlooked be taken care of by the President and his advisory board.

Sept. 15, 1942, upon request from Rev. Thos. L. Shirk, I transferred him to the Ohio Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

Sept. 30, 1942, I appointed Rev. L. A. Bamburg pastor of the Akron church.

Nov. 15, 1942. On request from the Brent Church there was a mutual agreement made between Rev. G. C. Frederick and Rev. E. L. Shigley, Jr., that they supply the church until further arrangements could be made to secure a pastor for the church.

Jan. 1, 1943, I received the resignation of Rev. Eugene Caddell as pastor of the Friendship church.

I also held six week-end meetings. I have assisted in two pioneer meetings and have put forth special effort to help the weaker churches. I have preached during the year 271 sermons. MORAL REFORM

We, your Committee on Moral Reform wish to submit the following report:

We believe the most effective way to bring about a moral reformation is for the ministers of the gospel and Christian professors to be of the true apostolic type. The fact has been duly attested that the universal moral decline, to a great extent, is traceable to the failure of religious leaders. The proverb, "like priest, like people," is true and God's word teaches that the labourer must first be a partaker of the fruits. Therefore, we urge that the standards of our church be uphelp, taught and practiced by our people that we may set forth an example before the world.

Moral reformation cannot be deep and lasting unless it has its origin in a regenerated heart. Therefore, let us discourage all spurious and su-perficial altar work and urge our people not to stop short of a definite experience of full salvation.

Since John Wesley was successful in bringing about a reformation in a time of moral corruption, let us who bear his name follow his precepts and example especially his admonition to make saints as our primary work. Respectfully submitted,
