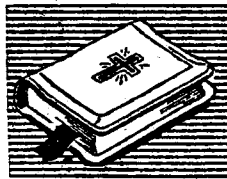

BY-LAWS

SECTION I. Name.

The name of this Conference is The Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

SECTION II. Object.

The object of this Conference is stated in the Articles of Religion, General Rules and Elementary Principles of THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

SECTION III. Members.

The membership of this Conference shall be as stated in the Constitution, Article V, as it appears in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

SECTION IV. Officers.

A. President.

1. He shall be elected by ballot from among the elders on the Annual Conference roll; his term of office shall be one year.
2. The first ballot for Conference President shall be a nominating ballot.
3. He shall perform such duties as outlined in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE and as assigned by the Annual Conference.
4. The principal office of the Conference shall be located in the City of Eau Claire, Eau Claire County, Wisconsin.
5. The Conference shall pay the moving expense of a newly elected President from the Conference Administrative Fund.

B. Vice-President.

1. He shall be elected by ballot from among the elders on the Annual Conference roll; his term of office shall be one year.
2. He shall fill the office of the President in the event that it becomes vacant by death, resignation or otherwise.

C. Secretary.

1. The Annual Conference shall elect by ballot either a layman or a minister as Secretary; his term of office shall be one year.
2. His duties shall be as described in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE and as may be assigned by the Annual Conference.
3. The Conference Secretary shall be the Credentials Committee, and each pastor shall instruct his church clerk to send the delegates' credentials to him immediately after they are elected.

D. Treasurer.

1. The Annual Conference shall elect by ballot either a layman or a minister as Treasurer; his term of office shall be one year.
2. His duties shall be as described in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE and as may be assigned by the Annual Conference.

E. Other Officers.

1. The Annual Conference shall elect other officers as directed by and in

such manner as prescribed by THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE or by the members of the Annual Conference. Their duties and terms of office shall be in accord with THE DISCIPLINE and as assigned by the Annual Conference.

F. Time of Election.

1. The time for election of the Conference Officers shall be at 10:00 a.m. the second day of Conference.

SECTION V. Meetings.

A. Annual Conference Sessions.

1. The Annual Session of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America shall convene on the first Thursday after the third Tuesday of July at 9:00 a.m. in the tabernacle of the Burr Wesleyan Methodist Camp located seven miles west of Hillsboro, Wisconsin, on Highway 33.
2. The time of Conference sessions shall be from 9:00-12:00 noon and from 1:00-5:00 p.m.
3. The Bar of Conference shall be the first ten rows of seats in the center section and the rostrum of the main tabernacle.
4. The Conference President shall bring a "State of the Conference" message at the opening session of the Annual Conference.
5. The Conference fiscal year shall close June 30 of each year and that of the local church on May 31. All money to be applied toward payment of budget shall be remitted undivided monthly by the local church treasurer to the Conference Treasurer. All money for which credit is to be given must be postmarked not later than June 15. Each pastor shall submit to the Conference Treasurer, prior to the close of the Conference year, his statistical blank completed, except for the budget section; the Conference Treasurer, upon completion of the budget section, shall forward the statistical forms to the Statistical Secretary—said form not to be returned to the pastors until the Conference session.
6. Each pastor shall attend the Conference and camps and each institute and convention sponsored by the Conference, unless excused by the Conference President and Advisory Board.
7. Pastors' reports shall be read and the statistical reports shall be posted on a bulletin board at the Annual Conference session.
8. All conference treasurers' books shall be closed and ready for auditing and placed in the hands of the Auditing Committee at the first session of the conference.

B. Special Sessions.

1. Special sessions may be called according to the procedure outlined in

THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

SECTION VI. Committees.

A. Board of Trustees.

1. The Board of Trustees shall be composed of four elders and three laymen elected in the manner prescribed by THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.
2. The Board of Trustees (or the President and Secretary of the Conference when authorized as hereinafter set forth) of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America is authorized to buy, sell, lease, and mortgage real and personal property of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America and to borrow money for and on behalf of said Conference and to execute the necessary deeds, contracts, notes and mortgages and other necessary documents to effectuate the purposes of this section; the President and the Secretary of the said Conference are given full power to act for and on behalf of said Conference when authorized by said Trustees by motion duly passed by said Trustees and certified to in writing by the Secretary of said Board of Trustees.
3. The Conference Board of Trustees shall be responsible for the bonding of the Conference Treasurer.
4. The Conference Board of Trustees prior to launching of a new church extension project, arrange all conditions and stipulations regarding loan limits, loan payments, subsidies for pastoral support, grants for initial operations and any other financial encumbrances, be typewritten, signed by the legally authorized personnel, and two copies be made, one to be retained by the Board of Trustees, and the other to be retained in the file of the newly formed church.
5. Conference Board of Administration.
 - a. The Conference Board of Trustees shall be designated the Conference Board of Administration, whose duties shall be to coordinate and promote conference planning and programs. This Conference Board of Administration shall not pre-empt specific responsibilities expressly assigned by the Discipline to conference officers or committees.
 - b. Said Board shall meet at least four times a year: during camp meeting, and the second Saturday of October, January, and April.
 - c. All conference, Boards, department heads, and conference officials shall submit quarterly in writing all official actions and plans; all treasurers shall submit brief financial statements to said board quarterly.
 - d. Said Board through its secretary, shall submit quarterly written instructions relative to its actions to each committee, board, department head, and conference official.

6. The Conference Board of Trustsees shall be designated the Conference Board of Church and Parsonage Building. Their duties shall be to advise with the trustees of building committees of local churches on all important investments in the location of lots and erection of church property and extensive remodeling of church facilities. All building plans as outlined above, it is advised, should be approved by this board.

B. Camp Meeting Board.

1. Camp Meetings of the Conference shall be supervised and conducted by a Camp Meeting Board of the Conference to be known as "Burr Wesleyan Methodist Camp Meeting Board of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America."

(a) Said Board shall consist of the following members: Conference President, Conference Secretary, Conference Treasurer, Maintenance Superintendent, and five members elected by the Conference. All members of said Board shall have equal vote and voice. At least three of the members of the Board shall be laymen. All members of the Board shall be members of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

(b) President: The Conference President, by virtue of his office, shall be the President of the said Board. He shall act as Chairman of the Board and have general oversight of the Camp Meeting, and of all the business pertaining thereto. He may appoint someone to act as temporary chairman at his discretion.

(c) Secretary: The Conference Secretary, by virtue of his office, shall be the Secretary of the said Board. He shall keep all records and care for all correspondence relative to the business of the said Board.

(d) Treasurer: The Conference Treasurer, by virtue of his office, shall be the Treasurer of said Board. He shall receive all funds and disburse the same at the direction of the Camp Meeting Board or the Executive Committee of the said Board, as the case may be.

(e) Maintenance Superintendent: The Maintenance Superintendent shall be elected annually by the Conference from a list of two names submitted by the nominating committee. His duties shall be: The oversight of the building and grounds at the Camp Meeting grounds; he shall have charge of all repairs and maintenance and of the upkeep of buildings and grounds under the direction of the Conference or of said Board as the case may be. He shall be foreman of all building projects.

(f) Duties and Powers of the Camp Meeting Board: Said Board shall secure the workers for Camp Meetings, i.e., Evangelists, singers, children's workers and all other help necessary for the carrying on of Camp Meetings. The Board shall also take care of all business of the Camp Meeting between meetings of the Annual Conference. The Camp Meeting Board shall have author-

ity to borrow money for Camp Meeting purposes and to bind the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America therefor and to execute the necessary agreements and promissory notes to effect such borrowing. However, the Camp Meeting Board shall not have authority to mortgage or encumber any of the property, real or personal, of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. The Camp Meeting Board shall have authority to rent Camp Meeting property out for such periods of time as will not interfere with the use of the camp grounds by the State Conference and its auxiliary organizations. The Board shall have the authority to enter into agreements with private individuals who have or may in the future construct cottages or other buildings on said camp grounds regarding construction, use and removal of such buildings but shall have no authority to convey a fee interest in, or deed any such land. The Camp Meeting Board shall submit a summary report and accounting each year at the annual meeting of the Conference. Said Camp Meeting Board shall at times be subject to directions and limitations placed on it by the Annual Conference of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. The Camp Meeting Board shall prepare and print the rates and regulations of the camp and post them in each room, and cottage, and in prominent places on the camp ground, and mail a copy to the pastors.

(g) Executive Committee: The Executive Committee of said Board shall consist of the Conference President, the Conference Secretary, and the Maintenance Superintendent, and shall have full authority to act for and on behalf of said Board when authorized by said Board by motion duly passed by the Board and certified to in writing by the Secretary of said Camp Meeting Board.

C. Nominating Committee.

1. There shall be a Nominating Committee composed of four elders elected by ballot, and the President ex-officio, and two lay delegates rotated on an alphabetical basis according to churches.
2. No elective member shall serve on the Nominating Committee two years in succession.
3. They shall meet and bring their report of session committee nominations at the first session of the ensuing Annual Conference.
4. The Nominating Committee shall submit to the Conference floor, to be voted on by ballot, two names for each office, except the office of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, and a list of names consisting of one more than the required number for each Standing Committee, where it does not conflict with the requirements of THE DISCIPLINE. They shall submit, as prescribed above, names for the chairman of the Resolutions and the Finance Committees, one year in advance.

D. Board of Church Extension and Evangelism.

1. The members of the Board of Trustees shall be the Conference Board

of Church Extension and Evangelism. The President of the Conference shall be ex-officio member and president. The duties of this board shall be as outlined in THE DISCIPLINE.

E. Other Committees.

1. The Annual Conference shall elect other committees as directed by and in such manner as prescribed by THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE or by the members of the Annual Conference. Their duties and terms of office shall be in accord with THE DISCIPLINE and as assigned by the Annual Conference.

SECTION VII. Seal.

This Corporation shall have no official corporate seal and all documents signed on behalf of the corporation may designate that the corporation has no seal.

SECTION VIII. Amendments.

The By-Laws may be amended at any regularly called session of the Annual Conference by a two-thirds vote of those present at said session and entitled to vote.

SECTION IX. Enforcement.

The enforcement of the By-Laws shall be in the hands of the Character Committee as prescribed in Paragraph 218 of the Discipline.

Standing Rules

I. Pertaining to Annual Conference.

1. A time of fasting and prayer for the Conference and Camp Meeting shall be observed during the week preceding the Conference and Camp Meeting by each local church, and an announcement shall be made in The Wesleyan Methodist with the announcement of the Camp Meeting, and the Conference Secretary shall notify each pastor preceding this date.

2. The pastors shall send the name, age and number of members of his family and of his delegate's families, if any, to the person in charge of rooms before Conference convenes.

II. Pertaining to Local Churches.

1. Each church shall permit its pastor a three weeks vacation with pay, to be absent on vacation over two Sundays.

2. The pastoral vote shall be taken on each charge within the first ten days of the month of May unless permission is received from the Conference President and his Advisory Board to do otherwise.

3. Each outgoing pastor shall be responsible for the services of his church until the closing of Camp Meeting, and he shall begin receiving salary from his new charge after the close of Camp Meeting.

4. Each charge shall pay the moving expense of the incoming pastor within the Conference bounds.

5. The local church's Board of Trustees and the pastor shall annually review and set the evaluation of the parsonage rent, and the pastor shall include this amount in all his annual reports.

6. The Conference shall have a committee of three composed of the Conference President, the chairman of the Itineracy and Elders Orders Committee, and one elected member to arrange for a ministers retreat or institute.

7. No receipts shall be sent from the Conference Treasurer's office unless requested.

III. Enforcement.

The enforcement of the Standing Rules shall be in the hands of the Character Committee as prescribed in Paragraph 218 of the Discipline.

CONFERENCE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

TO THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE — Greetings in the name of the Lord. Nearly a year ago we left camp sensing that this was probably our last year in the conference presidency but looking forward to doing our best. We entered as a part-time pastor and part-time president. After renting the conference parsonage, loading our early possessions, we traveled to Spooner on Aug. 17, 1966. The next day I left the family to arrange the home and I left for Waterloo, Wisconsin where we engaged an Engineer to draw plans for a new tabernacle. Then on to Hillsboro and the wedding of Rev. John Grover.

The week of Sept. 5-9 was again on conference business, going to the pastorates where new changes had occurred. Business meetings were held and all seemed to be fine. Especially were we encouraged to find some faith yet

at Milwaukee and Janesville. The balance of Sept. was spent on the charge with the exception of parts of 3 days which were used on conference business.

Two days in October, one for Trustee's meeting at Wisconsin Rapids on Oct. 8, and one in traveling to Eau Claire to arrange a loan, were the only days used for conference affairs.

November started our away from home, traveling to Madison and Kenosha which necessitated being gone 3 days. This was business growing out of the Trustee meeting in October. It seemed best that the Kenosha work be closed. This was not a hastily made decision but at the time the proceeds began. Some souls will be in heaven because of Rev. Sander's labors of love in a field of his calling.

On December 5, I traveled to Marion, Indiana and the Ladies' Conference with our conference Vice-President, Rev. John Heavilin. On the return trip we stopped at the Milwaukee and Waukesha parsonages.

On December 12, I received the elders credentials of Rev. Harry Johnson from the Indiana Conference.

The M. W. C. Board meeting in January took a week with centennial meeting on the Saturday of the same week in Eau Claire.

A trustee meeting on Jan. 21, and two trips to Stone Lake and Hayward conference affairs finished a cold month in the north.

February found me traveling to M. W. C. and Bartleville, Okla to meet with the two boards on the possibility of merging the pilgrim and Wesleyan schools. I arrived home on Friday and on Saturday attended a northern youth retreat at Rice Lake.

February 14-17 were used in the Milwaukee area for our Mid-year retreat, Milwaukee church business meeting, and camp board meeting.

February 27- March 2- took me to LaCrosse, Eastman, Millville, Mt. Pisgah and Madison Good Shepherd. These were council days for our new Madison work. One man sought to influence a church against its pastor and conference. It appeared that personal ends were in mind by the individual and proper steps were taken to curb the attack upon the church.

On March 31 we assisted in the funeral of one of the saints of God - Mrs. Isaiah Butcher. God has given strength to Rev. Butcher to carry on with a faith that holds.

April 4 and 5 we traveled to Minong, Gull Lake and Stone Lake seeking information on former churches. We enjoyed the fellowship of some of the old timers as they shared the past and its blessings. On the 8th we met in centennial meeting in Eau Claire.

April 15 was Trustee meeting and on the 19th we helped in an evening service at the Rice Lake Church.

May 8 started out like a good work week at camp. Rain dampened the work but not the spirits of our brave crew. Finally, however, we gave in to

elements and went home. Saturday was Marion Alumni Day at Eau Claire and we enjoyed the fellowship greatly.

May 15 found us in Appleton, then on to Wisconsin Rapids, Hancock and Milwaukee and while in Milwaukee, we met with the new lawyer and Jack Wynn.

Hales Corners, Janesville, Madison 1st., Waukesha and Baraboo were our next stops the following week.

On June 2nd I met with the pilgrim Holiness Superintendent and then with the two Hillsboro Churches to effect the merger of the Pilgrim and Wesleyan Churches in Hillsboro. The merger is completed and all is well.

On June 7 we held the Gull Lake annual meeting and on the 8th was in Eau Claire.

Crusaders Camp then Youth Camp where each night an annual meeting was held in a church took 9 more days. We finished out the year with business meeting at Hayward, Darrow Road and Spooner.

On June 3 I received the slders credentials of Rev. Donald Olmstead from the Nebraska Conference.

With the conference and camp times included I have been gone over 100 days from the Spooner Church. In addition to this there were many half days, a vacation of 4 days, and many days spent in the study writing pastors and others, phoning, and planning.

I doubt the statement — I was a part time president, but I am sure I was a part time pastor. I am looking forward to a full time pastorate. The loads will not get lighter — only heavier. Problems will continue to come. Next year appears to be the year of pastoral shake-up. There is a lawsuit pending in Milwaukee, a Merging Conference and general conference in Anderson, Indiana, and a NSSA. Convention in Minneapolis.

Last year it cost the Conference \$20.00 per week for a president. I don't know what it will cost next year but whether it be part time or full the cost is great.

Really, what we vote to do will probably affect me little. I'm lost in the jackpines. The Spooner Church just raised my salary to \$90.00 per week which is the same salary I'm getting as Conference President and pastor. This amounted to a \$20.00 per week raise. Even Spooner can figure that \$20.00 per week is a good price for one hundred days work. After this year it is difficult to persuade my church that they owe the Conference.

Whatever way this thing goes, I'll stand by the Conference.

Well, some encouraging notes — over \$1,000.00 was received in the Easter offering for Camp. The Conference parsonage indebtedness is reduced to \$3,462.99. And we just received notice that the renters are moving out August 15. Over \$16,000.00 was raised on 10% and Pension. We are still short \$2,000.00 on Pension and the Conference share in the budget was

\$1,000.00 less than a year ago. It appears we have sold a portion of our Big Bend property and reduced our payments by \$100.00 per month. The 5% of pastors salary amounted to \$3,547.61. We must raise special money this next year.

I traveled 18,500 miles in Conference interests.

We have centennial observance before us — Let's make the most of it, opening our hearts for a fresh outpouring of God's spirit.

Thanks to all who helped to make this Centennial observance possible. Especially to those who wrote the histories, compiled the data and spent many hours to make this occasion possible.

I granted preacher's licenses to Charles Anderson, John Grover, Ard Blomberg, and Maurice Higgins.

Gull Lake's 50th anniversary is to be held August 3 at 2:30 P.M. in the Gull Lake Church. Everyone welcome.

THE WISCONSIN CONFERENCE

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the committee on finance, recommend the following:

1. That each elder and pastor on the Conference Roll be responsible for paying at least quarterly, 5% of his cash salary from the church into the Conference Administrative Fund, or that the church pay an equal amount for its pastor; this is nonbudget.

2. That the Conference President be paid by the Conference, a salary of \$90.00 per week, that he be paid 6¢ per mile on travel, plus expenses, that his moving expenses be paid, and that \$40.00 per month on utilities be paid by the Conference.

3. That the fees of \$75.00 be paid the Conference Secretary and \$125.00 the Conference Treasurer from the Conference Administrative Fund.

4. That the auxiliary organizations employing the pages of the Conference Minutes pay a proportionate expense in their printing, and that the price of the minutes be \$1.25 per copy, and that each church be sent at least ¼ as many minutes as church members, and that each church be responsible for paying for these.

5. That the churches be assessed 25¢ per person on the subscription list of the Wisconsin Wesleyan and that Conference Finance be promoted in its columns.

6. That the Conference Treasurer be instructed to insert a quarterly financial statement in each issue of the Wisconsin Wesleyan.

7. That each church pay dining hall and other expenses: \$5.00 per delegate, whether they attend Conference or not, and \$5.00 per pastor and family, payable before the end of the conference year to the Conference Treasurer. Any minister attending Conference whose assessment is not paid by the church shall be personally responsible.

8. That the undivided budget be apportioned at \$27.65 per full member, divided as follows:

3. Brainerd Indian School25 per full member
4. Church Extension and Evangelism	1.50 per full member
5. Church Administration	2.15 per full member

b. That the pension budget of \$7.00 per member be assigned in addition to the 10%.

12. That envelopes imprinted Conference Extension (Home Missions) Fund be used the first Sunday of each quarter. That these be handed out to everyone the previous Sunday and promoted by the pastor.

13. That the Conference Board of Trustees, prior to launching of a new church extension project, arrange all conditions and stipulations regarding loan limits, loan payments, subsidies for pastoral support, grants for initial operations and any other financial encumbrances, be typewritten, signed by the legally authorized personnel, and two copies be made, one to be retained by the Board of Trustees, and the other to be retained in the file of the newly formed church. REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

WISCONSIN CONFERENCE, WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

To the 100th Annual Conference of the Wisconsin Conference:

The Board of Trustees wishes to submit the following summary report of its activities during the past year:

1. The Board met five times during the year. It held quarterly meetings near the dates as set forth in the By-Laws, Section VI, Paragraph a, Sub-paragraph 4b. All elected trustees attended these regularly scheduled meetings.

2. The Board during the year authorized the following loans to be extended and/or refinanced: Baraboo Church note at the Baraboo National Bank; Conference Parsonage note with the First Federal Savings and Loan Association of Eau Claire, Wisconsin; Madison First Church note with the Anchor Savings and Loan of Madison; and the Janesville Church note with the Merchants and Savings Bank of Janesville.

3. The Board reviewed the financial status of each church receiving conference extension aid and set up a policy whereby each will be phased off conference assistance at the earliest possible date.

4. The Board recommended the phasing out of the Kenosha Pioneer work for the present and received funds from that work to be held in reserve in the Conference Extension Endowment Fund until such a time that work will be reopened in the Kenosha area.

5. The Board authorized the securing of a new legal counsel in Waukesha to handle the legal matters pertaining to the personal property of the Milwaukee West Allis church.

6. The Board authorized the following actions:

- a) Payment of moving expenses for the Janesville pastor.
- b) Rental of the Conference Parsonage and purchase of airconditioning and dehumidifying units in the same.
- c) Approval of the proposed building at the Oak Ridge Church.
- d) Maintaining of the regular Conference and Camp meeting dates.
- e) Proposed terms for the sale of the Big Bend property.

7. The Board fulfilled its duties as the Board of Administration and reviewed quarterly the actions and plans of all conference officials, committees and auxiliaries. Through its secretary it sent to each any recommendations and other communications that it made.

The secretary of the Board mailed a summary report of each quarterly meeting to the editor of the WISCONSIN WESLEYAN for publication in its pages.

REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE WORLD MISSIONS SECRETARY

To the 100th Annual Conference of the Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

The following is the summary report of my activities during the past year:

1. I arranged the schedule for the 1966 Fall Missionary Tour of Paul Dekker of Sierra Leone, West Africa, from September 10 through 26. A total of 27 churches reported participating in this tour schedule.

2. At the close of his itinerary, Paul Dekker reported the following response from the churches: subscribed in cash and faith promises, \$6,659.02; of this \$1,331.26 was received in cash. The total cash and faith promises increased \$2,666.00 over the previous year. The Conference WMS treasurer reports that a grand total of \$5,002.27 cash raised by the end of the conference year or 75% of the total pledged. This percentage raised is the same as one year ago. In addition a total of \$345.50 was received toward the 1965 project pledged.

I have distributed the "Wesleyanagrams" quarterly to most of the local churches.

4. Plans are being finalized for the 1967 Missionary Tour with Rev. Henry Ortlip of Haiti from September 9 through October 15. Most churches will have the opportunity of two services instead of one as in previous years.

5. My expenses have been cared for by the expense fund and the balance of \$79 in this fund placed toward the support of Dr. Bogart.

Your statistical secretary, in addition to presenting the complete statistical report for the 1966/1967 Conference Year, begs leave to submit the following observations:

1. All reports, **BUT FOUR**, were sent in on time this year.
2. **Twelve** of the reports required correction because of errors in addition or misplaced amounts.
3. Wesleyan Methodist subscriptions showed an **increase of 46**.
Wesleyan Missionary subscriptions showed an **increase of 13**.
Wesleyan Youth subscriptions showed an **increase of 23**.
4. The full membership in the Conference showed an **increase of 132**.
The total membership showed an **increase of 139**.
5. The Sunday School average was 61 compared to 63 last year.
Total enrollment showed a **decrease of 32**.
6. Wesleyan Youth showed a **gain** of 3 locals.
Wesleyan Youth membership showed a **loss** of 15 members.
7. Church property is valued at \$1,029,700, an **increase** of \$17,000.
Parsonage property **decreased** in value by \$8,700.
The total indebtedness of churches and parsonages is \$367,036, a **decrease** of \$93,718.
8. Net income for pastors shows an **increase** of \$5,649.
9. Total money disbursed for churches shows a **decrease** of \$5,025.
10. Benevolent giving shows an **increase** of \$4,395.
11. Six churches paid **no budget**.
The budget income **decreased** by \$2,285.
12. Five churches did not contribute to the **Pension Plan**.
