### JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Louisville, Ky. Wesleyan Methodist Campground, August 24, 1940. The Kentucky Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church convened for the eighteenth annual session on the Campground near Louisville, Ky., August 24, 8:30 a. m.

The first service was led in singing by Mrs. Helen Fossit. Scripture by the Conference President, Rev. Jacob E. Hunter. Prayer by Fred Bunn.

The Conference with the President in the Chair, according to usual custom elected the Home Missionary Secretary, Rev. Roy S. Nicholson, to preside during business sessions.

The Committee on Credentials was elected. Chairman, E. L. Kerrick. The following Delegates were enrolled: Catherine Harrington, Mildred Kerrick, Ivan Compton, Zella Castinger, Winnie Rothrock, James Stephenson, Dorothy Baumgartel, Audrey Hubler, William Johnson, Rae Hardesty.

Moved and supported that the time of convening be fixed as follows: Mornings, 8:30, adjourn at 11:30. Afternoons, 1:00, adjourn by motion.

The report of the Conference President was read and accepted and his character passed.

According to the Standing Rule, the Conference President appointed the Chairmen of the various committees. This was accepted.

The Chairmen were: Finance, W. G. Stockton. Resolutions, C. H. Mickel. Statistics, Ethel Mickel. Religious Services and Special Orders, E. L. Kerrick. Memorials, John Woodward. Auditing, Olin Pfautz. Pastoral Relations, Jacob E. Hunter.

Committee on Special Orders reported that the election of Conference officers would be August 26 at 10:00 a. m.

The Connectional address to be given by Rev. Nicholson to be at 3:00 p. m., August 24. W. Y. P. S. service each evening at 6:30. Evening services at 7:30, preaching by the Camp Meeting Evangelist, Rev. Rufus Reisdorph. Also an address to the ministers and laity each morning during Conference by Rev. Nicholson.

Adjourned by motion for committee work.

#### Second Meeting Saturday

Roll was called and minutes were read and adopted. Following elders' names were called and reported with characters passed: W. B. Dunkum, Dempsey Fossit, Esther M. Hunter, Jacob Hunter, C. H. Mickel, W. G. Stockton.

A communication was read from Dorothy Comingore, missionary to South America, and her character was passed by vote of the Conference.

The following Conference Preachers gave reports and their characters were passed: Christine Fowler, Kate Hewitt, Walter Johnson, Ora Nanna.

Special Order 3:00 p. m.

Connectional address by Rev. Roy S. Nicholson, Home Missionary Secretary.

Subject, "The Church's Unchanging Message." Brother Nicholson explained the founding and organization of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in 1843, explaining that the Church now ninety-seven years old had for its message liberty for those in the bondage of slavery, and today her message is liberty for those in sin. The Church's big business is to get people to realize the fact of God, to reveal God's way of redemption, explaining the necessity of denominational loyalty to do these things.

Adjourned by motion. Benediction.

#### Monday, 8:30 a. m.

Devotions were in charge of W. B. Dunkum. Special Orders of the Day followed with a special message to the Conference by Rev. Nichol-

son. Subject, "Short Cuts to the Shelf." His main points of consideration being the various "Short Cuts." 1. Instability. 2. Indiscretion. 3. Unwilling to be reproved. 4. Lack of wisdom. 5. Failing to appreciate the cost of leadership.

General Orders then followed, and the roll was called and the minutes of previous meeting were read and adopted.

Moved and supported that the name of William Haycox be enrolled as Delegate.

Examination of characters followed, and the names of Louis Baumgartel, Charles Hewitt, R. E. Bolton, H. L. Barger, Blanche Burris, Florence Burris, J. K. Cole were called and characters were passed.

The names of Charles L. Blanchard and Ross Dugger were called, these being absent, the Conference voted their characters passed. Also the names of Fern Galyon and D. R. Dooley were voted passed.

Special Orders then followed in the election of Conference officials. The election resulted in the election of the following: President, Jacob E. Hunter; Vice-President, Dempsey Fossit; Secretary, Esther M. Hunter; Treasurer, K. K. Rothrock; Sunday-school Secretary, John W. Woodward; Tithing Secretary, Olin Pfautz; Educational Secretary, Inez Golding. President's Advisory Board, C. H. Mickel, Ivan Compton. Board of Trustees, Ministerial-Jacob E. Hunter, 3 years; Dempsey Fossit, 2 years; C. L. Blanchard, 1 year; Laymen-Fred Bunn, 3 years; K. K. Rothrock, 2 years. Conference Missionary Board, Jacob E. Hunter, E. L. Kerrick, J. M. Butler. Committee on Pioneer Evangelism, Jacob E. Hunter, E. L. Kerrick, John Woodward. Sunday-school Board, John Woodward, W. B. Dunkum, Dempsey Fossit. Local Board of Managers Marion College, Jacob E. Hunter, Ralph Golding (3 years). Conference Librarian, Ralph Golding. Standing Committees: Judicial, W. B. Dunkum, Dempsey Fossit, Louis Baumgartel, W. G. Stockton. Vacancies, Jacob E. Adjourned by motion. Benediction.

#### Monday, 1:00 p. m.

Devotions were in charge of Rev. Clifford Hoover and Rev. Herbert Logston.

Roll was called and the minutes were read and adopted.

Moved and carried that the Articles of Religion be voted on in the next session.

The Chairman then explained that a mission is a group of people being assigned a definite pastor by the Conference or President. This group would not be eligible for a Delegate, but a person assigned to that mission is given full voting privilege in the Conference.

The following names were called, reports read, and characters passed. Hallie Giltner, Florence Hazeltine, James Hodges, Walter Johnson, Olin Pfautz, George Poole, C. C. Hayes, Marvin Smith, John Woodward, Basil Seaton.

Character of Hazel Hutchinson was voted passed by the Conference. Brother Seaton reported two new churches organized, a class of 21 at Simpson Chapel near Marengo, Ind., and at Rock Springs near English, Ind.

Adjourned for committee work. Benediction.

#### Tuesday, 8:30 a. m.

After song and prayer the Special Order of the Day was followed, and Brother Nicholson gave a timely talk on "A Debt That Is Never Paid." His talk was primarily to the laity, and their need of standing by the ministers.

General business then followed and the roll was called and the minutes were read and adopted.

Special Order was then called by the Chair, and it was explained concerning the Articles of Religion and the proposed change in the Discipline of the articles referring to the Second Coming of Christ.

It was explained that the Church's former view in general was not a pre Millennial view, but there is a return to this view as expressed by the General Conference of 1939, hence we as a Conference are asked to vote whether we prefer to adhere to the Discipline as it now is or the proposal made by the last General Conference.

The Conference then voted 28 "Yeas" for the proposal and two "Nos."

Moved and supported that the vote be taken by the President at the first Quarterly Conference this year in each church.

Partial report was heard from the Stationing Committee.

Final report of the Finance Committee was read and adopted.

It was moved and supported that the amendment be added concerning the raising of the deficiency on the salary of \$5.00 per church for Miss Dorothy Comingore, Missionary to South America. See Item No. 16, Finance Report.

The Auditing Committee reported Treasurer's books to be correct.

The Treasurer's Report was then read and adopted. See Report No. 6.

E. L. Kerrick gave his statistical report, also Joseph Myers. The se characters were passed.

An amendment was added to the report of the President concerning the appointing of pastors to Jeffersonville Mission and Simpson Chapel, which was adopted.

Moved and supported to adjourn for committee work.

#### Tuesday, 1:00 p. m.

Devotions conducted by Olin Pfautz, prayer by Esther M. Hunter.

Roll was called and minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

Committee on Courtesies introduced E. S. Davidson of the American Board of Mission to the Jews.

Reports of Susie Britton and Ralph Golding were heard and their characters passed.

Committee on Resolutions gave report which was adopted. See Report No. 2.

It was moved and supported that an offering be taken for the purchasing of books for the Conference Library. An offering of \$3.33 was taken.

Special Order Memorial Service in charge of Committee on Memorials in memory of Rev. Irvin Smith, minister of this Conference, who passed away in September, 1939.

General business then followed and it was moved and supported that a special offering be taken for Miss Dorothy Comingore before the close of Camp.

Moved and carried that K. K. Rothrock be authorized to solicit churches for the Conference Mission Fund, this fund being a very important one for the development and sustaining of Conference Mission Work.

It was moved and supported that the Conference convene next year on Tuesday, August 12, 1941, at 9:00 a. m.

Miss Florence Hazeltine then gave special greeting from Hope Mission. An offering was taken of \$9.50 for canned food supplies for the mission.

Adjourned by motion.

#### Wednesday, 8:30 a.m.

Devotions in charge of John Woodward, Olin Pfautz, Pearl Enters.

Rev. Nicholson gave the special talk to the Conference, his subject being "Perils of the Ministry." They were enumerated and discussed as follows: 1. Professionalism. 2. Popularity. 3. Prosperity. 4. Promotion. 5. Complacency. 6. Superficiality.

The roll was then called and the minutes were read and adopted.

Report of Statistical Committee was read and adopted. See Report No. 7.

Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders Report was read and adopted. See Report No. 4.

Committee on Pastoral Relations gave final report which was adopted. See Report No. 5.

Adjourned by motion.

#### Wednesday, 2:30 p.m.

At this time a special service was conducted, at which time the ordination sermon was delivered by Rev. Nicholson, after which Rev. Olin Pfautz was ordained an Elder.

#### STANDING RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Let it be a standing rule of this Conference that each pastor, whose total receipts exceed \$700.00 a year, shall seek to organize a new class, or to give his services in a revival meeting to one of the weaker churches whose total pastors receipts are less than \$450.00 to help establish the weaker, or new organizations; furthermore, that the church which he pastors grant him such privileges without censure and with full remuneration of salary in his absence; provided further, that such services shall be under Conference President's directions.
- 2. That pastors report in open Conference only the number of Wesleyan Methodists and Wesleyan Missionaries and Young People's Journals taken, loss or gain in membership; the totals in item IX and also item X.
- 3. It shall be the duty of the pastors to look after the insurance of our churches and parsonage properties. All insurance shall provide for the losses caused by fire and lightning, hail and tornado. A failure on the part of the pastor to do so shall be a censureable offense, unless it is impossible from a financial standpoint to do so, when in such a case, the pastor shall report this to the Conference President who shall see that the Conference shall provide the insurance, by assessing the churches, and in case of loss the insurance collected shall be used for church extension work in the Conference.
- 4. The Conference year, for the local church officers, shall be from midnight of the last Sunday of Camp Meeting, to the same time the following year.
- 5. The Conference President shall appoint the Chairmen of the temporary organization with the approval of the Conference.
- 6. Evangelists shall report to the Annual Conference according to the Discipline. See page 166, (2).
- 7. The President and his Advisory Board be hereby designated a deed examining committee for the Conference; church or parsonage property and they shall examine deeds before the same is recorded, the deed shall be sent to this committee for the insertion of such clauses as may be necessary to make the property safe for the cause.
- 8. To permit unwise moves in locating and building Wesleyan Churches and parsonages all local committees shall secure the approval of the Board on Church and Parsonage Location before proceeding with the same. This board being the Conference Trustees.
- 9. We recommend that we concentrate our pioneer efforts on establishing church societies.

#### Report No. 1

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Under the direction of Almighty God we have tried to mind our convictions during the last year in the Kentucky Conference.

The task has been somewhat abnormal in carrying different responsibilities and looking to the natural, but looking up the outlook was just as bright as the promises of God.

We have been made to realize in working in the various parts of the Conference the essential needs, such as consecrated laborers, men and women with a vision and conviction to carry out a thorough pioneer evangelistic program, a hearty coöperation with the Conference program, all doing their best to bring up each arm of the work assigned to us as Weslevan Methodists.

Realizing that a well equipped and spiritual Camp Meeting would be a great asset to our Conference, much of our time and effort has been spent in raising means for this purpose and assisting in the development of the same, preachers and workers from various parts of the Conference helping for which we are thankful.

There has been marked spiritual and material progress in most of the older churches during the past year, and three new ones organized.

#### Report No. 2

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

Be it Resolved, That:

- 1. Our pastors shall instruct the church in our General and Special Rules of Discipline, furthermore, our pastors shall follow the Discipline in the managing of their churches.
- 2. Each pastor shall be responsible in securing at least one book in the Course of Study and send to the Conference Librarian who shall write the respective pastors designating the book the pastor is to furnish.

- 3. In addition to disciplinary provisions for the evangelists and pastors, such persons shall take the Wesleyan Methodist, the Wesleyan Missionary, the Young People's Journal and tithe their income.
- 4. All persons recommended to the Conference to study or travel shall remain members only when employed by the Conference.
- 5. No church (including member or committee) shall employ or advocate any preacher of other denominations to hold revivals or appointments, except by consent of the President, and our Conference evangelists shall be used as far as possible.
- 6. Our churches shall employ preachers of our own Conference as far as possible.
- 7. Each pastor shall conduct, if possible, at least one revival annually, either in the local church, or elsewhere, unless the Conference President shall determine otherwise.
- 8. Be it Resolved, That unorganized missions are not obligated to raise Conference budgets and they are not represented in the Conference by a lay Delegate.
- 9. All Conference Preachers, pastors, evangelists and officials give full financial report to the Conference.
- 10. In as much as there is a great wave of Anarchy or disrespect for proper authority we recommend that our Conference support our constitutional government and also the government and authorities of our Church in the Connection, Conference and local interests.

#### Report No. 3

#### REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE

We, the Committee on Finance, submit the following report:

- 1. We recommend that all charges paying less than \$700.00 salary per year, seek earnestly to raise the salary of the pastor to that amount as soon as possible.
- 2. In order to support our Foreign Missionary work it is necessary that \$2.00 per member be raised for this purpose.
- 3. We also recommend that this Conference pay the budget of \$.50 per member for Home Missions; \$.25 per member for Hephzibah Orphanage; \$1.50 for Education.
- 4. We recommend that each member pay \$1.00 for Conference Missions and that the Sunday-school offering of the first Sunday of each

month be applied on this, the same to be sent to the Conference Treasurer subject to disbursement by the Conference Missionary Board.

- 5. We recommend (1) that each member pay \$1.00 to the Conference President for serving the Conference, and that this be raised in advance of each Quarterly Meeting. (2) Each pastor shall pay the tithe of his cash salary to the Conference President, the same to be sent in monthly by the pastor. The President will send the pastor a receipt to be given to the local church treasurer. This shall not apply on the membership assessment.
- 6. We recommend that each pastor be responsible to send an offering to the Conference Treasurer equal to \$.10 per member to pay for the Conference Minutes.
- 7. We recommend the Storehouse Plan of tithing according to Malachi 3:8-10 as the general financial plan of the Church.
- 8. That the Conference Treasurer be paid a salary of \$20.00 a year, and the Secretary receive \$20.00, the same to be paid at the end of the year.
- 9. For the assistance of disabled pastors the President shall be empowered to ask offerings from the various churches on the basis of membership, and at a rate, and for a time the need shall demand.
- 10. We recommend the Church Extension Card Plan, and urge all pastors to push the same.
- 11. All churches shall pay the current or outgoing pastor his salary or offering in advance or send when due for the Conference and Camp Meeting Sundays.
- 12. The Finance Committee endorse the Young People's plan of assisting the workers of Hope Mission and Jamestown Mission. (\$1.00 a month per society.)
- 13. Immediately after Camp Meeting each year the pastor shall call the stewards and agree on a set salary for the coming year.
- 14. Every new pastor's moving bill should be paid by the new church.
- 15. All churches paying less than \$700.00 cash per year shall give monthly donations above the salary.
- 16. We recommend that each pastor shall immediately take up an offering and send it to the Conference Treasurer to make up the deficit on their \$5.00 apportionment for Miss Dorothy Comingore from last year. Also that each church send the Conference Treasurer \$5.00 on or before January 1, 1941.
- 17. We recommend that in accordance with the action of the Book Committee that all newly organized churches and organized missions be exempted from the Connectional Budget for the first two years. Also

that they should be exempted from the Gonference Budget the first year and take free will offerings for the Conference Budget the second year.

#### Report No. 4

### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON ITINERACY AND ELDERS ORDERS

- 1. Nanna, Florence Hazeltine, Homer Barger, George Poole, Florence Burris, Blanche Burris, Walter Johnson, Ross Dugger, Joseph Myers, Hallie Giltner, James Hodges, J. K. Cole, E. L. Kerrick, D. R. Dooley, Marvin Smith, John Woodward, Levi Cherryholmnes, Edwin Henderson, Earl Pommerehn, Kate Hewitt and Fern Gaylon be granted Conference license and be required to pursue the Course of Study.
- 5. We recommend that George Hutchinson be returned to his local church.

#### COMMITTEE ON PLAN OF WORK

Your Committee on Plan of Work respectfully submits the following report:

## I. Home Work

- 1. Continue the payment of one dollar for the support of each of the following Home Works, by each local society, the same to be applied on budget: (a) Blue Ridge Mountain Workers. (b) Alabama Mission School. (c) Zion's Hill Mission. (d) Onondaga Indian Reservation. (e) Mexican Mission. (f) Hephzibah Orphanage. Also five dollars for the Hephzibah Orphanage to apply on the budget.
- 2. We recommend the Bethshan Rescue Home to the kindly consideration of the women of the Kentucky Conference, and that each local society send an offering or clothing to the same, not to be applied on the budget.
- 3. We recommend that each local society write to Jamestown, Ky. and Hope Mission, Ky and secure some of the needs of the workers and work and try to supply that need.
- 4. We recommend that each of the local societies sign one of the Church Extension Cards, the same to be secured from the Home Missionary Secretary, Rev. Roy S. Nicholson, Kernersville, N. C.

#### II. Foreign Work

1. We recommend that each member of the W. H. & F. M. S. pay 10 cents for the support of Dorothy Comingore, Emboscada, Paraguay, South America, not to be applied on the budget.

#### III. Local Society

- 1. We recommend that 10 cents per member be raised for the General Conference Delegate Fund, the same to be sent to Mrs. Ora M. Nanna, 2812 W. Kentucky Street, Louisville, Ky.
- 2. We recommend that each member of the W. H. & F. M. S. pay 25 cents for the Missionary Tabernacle, the same to be sent to Mrs. Nanna.
- 3. The Women's Societies would appreciate the coöperation of the Y. M. W. B., Sunday-school Classes and W. Y. P. Societies in raising funds for the erection of the above named building on the Kentucky Campground, to be used for Missionary, Young People's and Children's Services.

- 4. We recommend that we do our best to enlist the men of our churches as honorary members of our societies.
- 5. We recommend that our President send a list of articles needed for the campground to each local society.
- 6. We recommend that our Conference Treasurer close her books on July 31st.

#### IV. Literature

- 1. Wesleyan Missionary—In order to obtain active interest in our missionary work, it is essential that every member read the Wesleyan Missionary. Elect a solicitor in every local society to secure subscriptions and renewals.
- 2. Leaflets—Be familiar with our supply of leaflets and urge the generous use of them. The same to be obtained from our Corresponding Secretary.
- 3. Use the study book designated each year with programs and helps. Societies being able to secure such literature from our Publishing House.
- 4. Since posters emphasize truth and tend to create missionary knowledge, zeal and activity, we urge the making of posters for missionary meetings and conventions.
- 5. We urge the use of our treasurer's books, which may be obtained from our Corresponding Secretary for 25 cents.

### V. Standard of Efficiency for W. H. & F. M. S.

- 1. Arrange with the pastor for one missionary prayer service each month.
- 2. A minimum of ten meetings during the year in which prayer service is held and business transacted.
  - 3. Red Letter Days:
    - (a) Harvest Day for Educational work.
    - (b) Easter—programs, gifts and offering for Home Mission work.
- (c) World Day of Prayer—that we coöperate in observing the World Day of Prayer.
- (d) May Day—to be known as gift day, bandages and such gifts as can be sent with outgoing missionaries or used in our Home field.
- (e) Wesleyan Missionary Day with program to secure Wesleyan Missionary subscriptions.
  - 4. One public meeting.
  - 5. Correspondence with missionaries.
- 6. The President, Secretary, Treasurer, and 50 per cent of membership to be subscribers to the Wesleyan Missionary.
- 7. A solicitor elected for the Wesleyan Missionary, gaining not less than two new subscribers a year.

- 8. A delegate elected to the Annual Conference W. H. & F. M. S.
- 9. Report blanks properly filled out on time.
- 10. At annual meeting instruct Delegate the amount to pledge for Society at Conference.
  - 11. Officers elected at last meeting of Conference year.
- 12. All money received as dues be sent to the Conference Treasurer, designating where 50 per cent of same be applied on Missions. (See par. 293 of Discipline.)
  - 13. A Superintendent and fully organized Y. M. W. B.
- 14. Every woman of the church a member of the society or a twenty per cent gain in membership.
  - 15. Money sent to Conference Treasurer on time.

Ten points each.

In conclusion:

We recommend the formation of prayer circles in each local society, also the reading of the Efficiency Standard quarterly. All societies making a grade of one hundred points be placed on the Honor Roll.

#### VI. Standard of Efficiency for Y. M. W. B.

Let us emphasize the work of the Y. M. W. B. and take great care in training our children and encouraging our youth by interesting them in mission study and by Conference Conventions. We urge the adoption by each Band of the Standard of Efficiency.

- 1. Held twelve or more services.
- 2. Sent in Band funds quarterly or oftener.
- 3. Used Thank Offering boxes or envelopes.
- 4. Memorized two of the selected hymns, memorized three of the selected scripture portions.
  - 5. Learned facts about five great missionaries.
- 6. Learned names and a few facts about our active missionaries, learned the names of stations at which each is located.
  - 7. Sent in an offering for Home Missions.
  - 8. Sent in an offering for Education.
- 9. The Superintendent and President of the Band readers of the Wesleyan Missionary.
- 10. The value of prayer, God's Word, and personal service were stressed.
  - 11. Can report increase in membership, and in funds raiseo.
  - 12. Sent in the annual report by or before December 31.

Note: All Bands of 100% grades are listed as Honor Roll Bands in

Year Book. It is not required that more than one fourth of the active membership do the memory work, though all would profit by same.

## REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

We, the Committee on Resolutions, submit the following report:

We wish to express our gratitude and praise to our Heavenly Father for His mercy and loving kindness bestowed upon us during the past year. Therefore be it resolved:

- 1. We do urge our women to intelligently familiarize themselves with the teachings of the Church: First, concerning doctrine and personal experience. Second, that we conscientiously devote ourselves to the promotion of our Church interests, that we become familiar with our Plan of Work, and that we set ourselves to the task of efficiently applying said Plan. Third, concerning dress as instructed by Peter and Timothy (1 Peter 3: 3, 4; 1 Tim. 2: 9, 10). And as exemplary Christian mothers, we train our children and youth to modesty and proper respect for the sacredness of their bodies; that we teach them not to wear the low cut, sleeveless dress and the short skirts which expose the limbs of children; that we teach them the facts of life. Deploring the tendency to nudity of body and limbs at bathing beaches and pools, on the streets, in the schools, and even in the churches of our land—we do urge that our children avoid all garments which accentuate the suggestiveness of sex.
- 2. We do deplore the low standard of morals existant in the common ranks of society which destroys the sanctity of marriage and encourages divorce which tends towards promiscuity and free love. We do deplore the present attitude toward sin, Sabbath desecration, drinking, cigaret smoking and the increasing use of the Marijuana drug.
- 3. We deplore the anti-Christian and blasphemous trend of the modern school program, wherein God is insulted and despised, and in which natural appetite is deified; the tone of the present day literature which lifts the degrading practice of smoking and drinking on to a plane of legitimate art; and which features flirtation and courtship between the married as a matter of course. We urge our strongest opposition to profane literature and ungodly amusements which do now corrupt our land.
  - 4. We pledge to refrain from patronizing restaurants and stores that

sell liquor if it be possible, and in every effective way show our disdain for the liquor traffic.

5. That we urge our women to recognize intercessory prayer as the most important phase of our missionary work, not forgetting to uphold our suffering sisters throughout the world in this time of distress and war.
