JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

Hayward Campground, July 11, 1944.

The first sitting of the Seventy-fourth session of the Wisconsin Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or church) of America, convened in the Tabernacle on the Hayward Campground at 9:30 A. M., Tuesday, July 11, 1944.

Rev. Orval Butcher led the Conference in singing "Faith of our Fathers" and "I Will Follow Where He Leadeth".

Rev. Charles Butcher led in prayer.

The conference sermon was delivered by the Rev. Carl Olander, Pastor of the Hayward Church. His message, "The Divine Portrait", inspired our hearts as he pictured Christ as a portrait expressing (1) invitation and pleading (2) compassion and mercy (3) suffering (4) authority and wrath (5) holiness and glory.

Following the conference sermon the Conference President, Rev. J. B. Clawson, called the conference to a season of prayer.

The business session was called to order by the President.

Upon motion Rev. Carl Olander was elected as Committee on Credentials.

The report of the Committee on Credentials was given and accepted.

Roll call showed 25 ministers and 22 delegates present.

Upon vote the bar of conference was set as the first two sections on the north side of the tabernacle.

It was voted that the time for conference sessions be from 9:00 to 11:45 A. M. and 2:00 to 4:30 P. M.

The report of the Conference President was given and accepted upon motion.

Upon motion the Committee on Nominations was elected as follows: G. M. Hahn, chairman; Charles Butcher, J. B. Clawson, Norma Mortimer, and Dr. Gerald Wesche.

The Conference adjourned for committee work subject to call of the chair.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON

The conference session was opened by the song, "Lead Me Higher".

Devotions were in charge of Rev. Henry Clark. He used as a scripture lesson, Matt. 17:14-21. Rev. Kenneth Hintz led in prayer.

The President called the conference to order.

Roll call showed 24 ministers and 19 delegates present.

The omission of the appointment of Rev. Raymond Warren as pastor of the Burr and Valley charge was added to the President's report.

The report of the Committee on Nominations was read and accepted item by item and as a whole.

Mrs. Grace Kauffman read the Hillsboro statistical report.

Upon motion it was decided to accept the sealed votes of Mrs. Grace Kauffman for Conference officials. She was called away by the death of her father-in-law.

Rev. Daren Durey was presented to the Conference by the Committee on Courtesy.

Conference adjourned for committee work subject to the call of the chair.

TUESDAY, 4 P. M.

Conference was called to order by the President.

The minutes of the former sessions were read and approved.

A partial report of the Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day was read and accepted.

The credentials of Wm. Armstrong of the Beulah Charge were presented and accepted.

A partial report of the Committee on Ministerial Character was read and accepted.

A motion was made that the pastors read their statistical reports individually rather than as a group. Motion carried.

Rev. Oscar Hovland read the Beloit statistical report.

Rev. Kenneth Hintz read the Baraboo statistical report.

The President appointed Mrs. Cecil Asplin, Myrna Bakke, and Mr. Chester Finley as lay members of the Itineracy and Orders Committee.

Upon motion it was decided that the time of this session be extended to hear the Statistical report from Valton read by Rev. G. M. Hahn.

Upon motion it was decided that if Bro. Swauger did not arrive for the evening service that another session of conference be called at 8 o'clock.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

WEDNESDAY MORNING

Conference was opened with a song service. Bro. Oscar Hovland led the devotions using II Tim. 4 as a scripture lesson.

Roll was called showing 26 ministers and 22 delegates present.

The Credentials of George Rumppe, delegate from Oak Ridge charge, were presented and accepted.

The Committee on Courtesy presented Rev. Swauger, Connectional Home Mission Secretary, to the conference. Upon motion he was given an honorary seat in the conference. The following were also presented to the conference throughout the session: Bro. W. H. Titus, member of the Iowa Conference; Mr. and Mrs. Luther Emery, laymen from Baraboo; Mrs. Daren Durey, wife of the Beulah pastor; and David Peterson preaching at Angelo by appointment of the Conference President under the direction of Rev. E. V. Perkins.

The following co-pastors reports were given: Mrs. I. J. Butcher, Spooner; and Mrs. Orval C. Butcher, Appleton.

A report from Edward A. Clark was read by the secretary and a request given that an honorary eldership be conferred upon him, Upon motion his request was referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

Letters of report and greeting were read by the secretary from Rev. George Nofsinger and Rev. S. S. Hotchkiss.

Conference adjourned by limitation of time.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

Conference opened with devotions led by Mr. David Peterson.

Roll call showed 24 ministers and 23 delegates present.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved as corrected.

The Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day reported. The report was accepted.

The Committee on Courtesy presented Mr. and Mrs. George Rump of Oak Ridge charge, to the conference.

The following co-pastors reported: Mrs. Lloyd King, Eau Claire; Mrs. G. M. Hahn, Valtcn.

An oral report of the Bethel Sunday School near Eau Claire was given by Mrs. Harry Johnson.

The report of their labors as Conference Evangelists was given by Rev. and Mrs. Charles Butcher.

The conference was adjourned for committee work.

THURSDAY MORNING

The conference session was opened with devotions led by Rev. Clarence Mason.

The business session was called to order by the President.

The Credentials of the following delegates were presented and accepted: Charles Bakke, Myrna Bakke, Chester Finley, all of Rice Lake.

Roll call showed 26 ministers and 27 delegates present.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved as read.

The order of the day, election of officers, was called for.

Upon motion it was decided that the first ballot for President be a nominating ballot. Those nominated were: J. B. Clawson, C. H. Butcher, Lester Buckman, G. M. Hahn, Lloyd King.

Rev. J. B. Clawson was elected as president.

A nomination ballot was called for by the conference for Vice

President. Those nominated were: Charles Butcher, Lloyd King, Lester Buckman, G. M. Hahn, I. J. Butcher, Grace Kauffman, Mrs. J. B. Clawson.

Rev. Charles H. Butcher was elected as Vice President.

Mrs. Orval C. Butcher was elected as Conference Secretary.

Mrs. Norma Mortimer was elected as Conference Treasurer.

The Committee to Fill Vacancies was elected as follows: Ministerial Members—I. J. Butcher, G. M. Hahn, Charles Butcher. Lay members—Chester Finley, Norma Mortimer.

The Advisory Board was appointed by the President as follows: I. J. Butcher, Charles Bakke.

Mrs. G. M. Hahn was elected as Conference Sunday School Secretary.

The following were elected as the Conference Sunday School Board: Mrs. Josephine King, Clarence Mason, Mrs. G. M. Hahn.

Rev. I. J. Butcher was elected as member of the Judiciary Committee to succeed himself and to be a member for four years.

Dr. Gerald Wesche was elected as a member of the Conference Board of Trustees to succeed Charles Bakke and to be a member for five years.

Rev. Carl Olander was elected as member of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders for four years. Upon motion his election was withdrawn and Rev. Lloyd King was put on the Committee in his place.

The Missionary Board was elected as follows: G. M. Hahn, Lloyd King, Orval Butcher, Norma Mortimer.

The Conference Campmeeting Board was elected as follows: Raymond Warren to fill out the two years in the vacancy caused by the transfer of H. H. Turner to the Indiana Conference. Mack Budde was elected as member for four years.

Rev. Eldred Perkins was elected to the Northern Campmeeting Board for three years.

Sylvia Lee was elected as Conference Education Secretary.

The Auditing Committee was elected as follows: Sylvia Lee, and G. M. Hahn.

Rev. Charles H. Butcher was elected as Conference Tithing Secretary.

The Superannuated Ministers Board was elected as follows: Rev. G. M. Hahn, chairman; Rev. Ernest Friebel, secretary; and Rev. I. J. Butcher, treasurer.

The matter of the conference sermon for 1945 was referred to the Committee on Religious Service and Orders of the Day.

Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day reported that the Connectional address would be given Thursday evening.

The Budget Committee report was read and accepted item by item except for one item which was referred back to the Committee for further consideration.

Sylvia Lee and Kenneth Hintz were elected as Statistical Committee.

Conference was adjourned by limitation of time.

The remaining item of the Budget Committee was read and accepted. The report was accepted as a whole.

The Treasurer of the Superannuated Minister's Board reported and his report was accepted following the acceptance of the Auditing Committee that his books were correct.

A motion was carried that we have a Committee on Church and Parsonage Building and Location. Upon motion it was decided that Conference Board of Trustees constitute this Board.

The conference adjourned for committee work.

FRIDAY MORNING

The conference session opened with a song service. Rev. Daren Durey led the devotion using I Cor. 1:1-10 as a scripture lesson.

The roll call showed 25 ministers and 21 delegates present.

The Statistical Committee reported and the report was accepted after necessary corrections were made.

The Conference Sunday School Secretary's report was read and accepted.

The Committee on Resolutions read their report which was accepted item by item except for those items referred back to the committee.

Upon motion the conference adjourned.

Upon motion it was decided that the delegates credentials should be in the hands of the Conference Secretary three weeks before conference.

Upon motion the Conference President and his Advisory Board were requested to look into the status with the church of Rev. D. J. McTavish.

The motion was made that we elect a Conference Evangelist; that Rev. and Mrs. Charles H. Butcher act as Conference Evangelists; that

paid by the conference; that we assess the Conference \$1.00 per member for Conference Evangelists Salary on the Budget; that they be permitted to hold not more than two campaigns out of the conference and that the offerings do not apply on salary. The conference upon vote instructed the Conference Trustees to give the Hayward and Spooner churches \$100.00 each from the fund in reserve.

Upon motion the Conference President was instructed to look into the matter of the legality of the placing in trust of the Anna Mortimer Endowment Fund.

The report of the Pastoral Relations Committee was read and accepted item by item and as a whole.

Upon motion it was decided to leave the time and place of the next conference in the hands of the Conference President and his Advisory Board.

The minutes of this session were approved and the minutes of the conference as a whole were accepted.

As a closing hymn we sang the Doxology.

Upon motion the conference adjourned.

4. The Executive Committee of the W. Y. P. S. be invited to sit with the Missionary Board in deliberation of the expenditures of the Conference Missions for Evangelism money.
5. The Conference Missions for Evangelism be set aside for the express purpose of opening new works and to help weaker charges employ evangelists, and that no funds be drawn from this fund without a requisition signed by the members of the Missionary Board, and that all money paid for Conference Missions for Evangelism and Conference Building Fund must go through the hands of the Conference Treasurer in order to count on Budget.
6. The Conference Building Fund be used for aid in building or buying church property.
7. One offering be taken in September for Conference Incidental Fund and that the various pastors realize the importance of taking this offering on time, and that they stress the necessity of a generous offering.
