STANDING RULES

1. All Trustees of the Oklahoma Conference shall reside within the bounds of the Conference.

2. When a pastor provides his own place of residence, all rent from

regular parsonage shall be paid to such pastor.

The treasurers of the various Conference Funds shall close their books on July 20th. No budget credit shall be given after that date. Money received after that time shall be applied on the next year's business.

The Conference Trustees shall be the Committee on Church and

Parsonage Building and Location.

5. The Committee on Religious Services shall consist of the Conference President; W.M.S. President; W.Y. President; and the Conference President's Advisory Board.

6. We recommend that the following order of business be observed in

our Annual Conference sessions:

Tuesday, 3:00 P.M.—Conference convenes Tuesday evening—Conference sermon Wednesday, 1:30 P.M.—Election of Officers Friday—Report of Committees Saturday—W. Y. Business Sessions

7. A Nominating Committee shall be elected composed of three elders, one of which shall be the Conference President as chairman, exofficio, and the delegate-elect from two churches designated by the annual conference; these churches to be designated in alphabetical order. This committee shall first examine the credentials of all delegates to the annual conference, and secondly, nominate all session committees, not already provided for, and be prepared to report at the first meeting of Conference.

report at the first meeting of Conference.

 The Conference fiscal year shall end on June 30, and all statistical reports shall be based on monies received up to and including that date. When the receipts for the final budget payments by the various departments of the church are turned to the pastor, he shall fill out a statement of the amount of budget credit he wishes to receive for monies not sent to the Conference Treasurer, according to the receipts he has on hand. This, with the final budget payment, if any, should be sent to the Conference Treasurer as soon as possible after the close of the conference year. The Treasurer will then send each pastor a statement of total amount credited to his church for budget during the year.

9. Two copies of each written report shall be given to the secretary of the Conference. These shall be typewritten and double spaced. Size of paper, 8½ by 11 inches.

10. The Conference Treasurer shall be a member of the Finance Committee, and an honorary member of the conference body, with a right to speak, but not to vote.

- 11. The annual conference shall elect a Spiritual Life Conference Committee composed of seven members. This committee shall plan for the coming together of Christian workers of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. This Committee includes the Conference W.M.S. President, W.Y. President, and Conference President. The Conference President shall appoint a Chairman of the Spiritual Life Committee.
- Conference shall convene annually on the Tuesday following the first Monday of August.
- 13. In case of a change of pastors, the out-going pastor shall be paid a salary for the two Sundays of Conference and Camp.
- 14. The Conference Treasurer shall be paid \$50.00 and the Conference Secretary, \$25.00, annually for their services.
- 15. The Conference President and the Conference Presidents of W.M.S. and the W.Y. shall serve as members of the Missionary Board, with five other members.
- 16. The Treasurer of the various Conference funds are to bring their account books, receipts, check books, cancelled checks and the latest bank statement to conference and place these books in the hands of the Auditing Committee on the first day of the Conference session.
- 17. The Conference body recommends that each pastor and the Conference President, while employed as full-time President, be given a two-week vacation, exclusive of the Conference and Camp Session. This vacation is to include two Sundays with pay.
- 18. Each pastor shall send a complete Statistical Report to the Conference Treasurer for his signature not later than July 20th and he, in turn, will send the completed Statistical Report to the Chairman of the Statistical Committee; all financial statistics, with the exception of item for budget, be reported to the nearest dollar.
- 19. The chairman of the Statistical Committee, the chairman of Memorials Committee, the chairman of the Auditing Committee shall be elected a year ahead of Conference and their names included in the Minutes with the Standing Committees.
- 20. Each church shall be entitled to count in local Sunday School attendance the number of their members in attendance at Sunday School at the location of the Annual Conference. The responsibility of identification shall rest with the visiting members and the Sunday School Secretary of the host church. This shall be applicable to the two Sundays of Conference and Camp.
- 21. The budget, not including Sunday School assessments, shall be figured on the full membership as reported in Item III of the Statistical Report of the current Conference minutes. The Sunday School assessments shall be figured from the total number in the main school as reported in Item IV of said minutes.
- 22. The Conference Secretary is authorized to prepare short form blanks of pastor's report on conference floor each year.
- 23. The Religious Services Committee shall prepare a mimeographed agenda; and a copy to be sent to each pastor prior to conference and a supply to be available at conference time for ministers and delegates. Said agenda to list time various committees are to report; name of one to bring devotions at each meeting, and dates and hours for special services.
- 24. We recommend that the local churches pay one-half of local pastor's Social Security assessment, based on salary paid by local church.
- 25. The Pastor of any church in the conference shall be free to hold at least one revival meeting during the year, wherever he sees fit, and it is recommended that his salary be paid to him while he is absent.26. Since considerable expense of transferring automobile title and
- 26. Since considerable expense of transferring automobile title and license attends the moving of a pastor from one state to another, we recommend that where possible the calling church bear this expense.

My heart is being stirred to the necessity of a greater missionary vision. I feel as the poet, "Stir me, Oh stir me, Lord, for I can see, thy glorious triumph day, begin to break the eastern sky." In this last hour of time our Commission is more urgent than ever. There are those who have never heard of Jesus yet, there are those who do not have the Word of God in their own language and there are those still who are refusing to hear. Jesus said "Other sheep I have which are not of this fold, them also I must bring." Jn. 10:16. Have we been faithful to these "other sheep" for whom Jesus died that they might enjoy the same privileges we enjoy and in the end inherit eternal life.

As leaders in our Conference and Church we must be on guard against modernism, materialism, secularism, anything that would divert us from the Great Commission Jesus left us.

As our missionary work must needs begin on the home base we must be faithful to guide the footsteps of our youth and children into the paths of righteousness and usefulness. If we fail God will have no one to send to the mission field tomorrow.

From home our misionary work goes to our neighbor and the Community and to the darkest heathen heart. Because we may be far

removed from many of these needs does not excuse us from the responsibility of them. Let our deepest hearts desire be as the Prophets, "Lord here Am I send me."

For all that has been accomplished this past year, we give God the honour and praise, with your faithfulness and prayers and tears, your persistance to the task, which I know you have not always found easy, you have reached the goal, together you have accomplished the gains.

I have appreciated your co-operation this past year, the good work of each Conference official, the faithfulness of each of the president, the labour of love in each society and with you I say, "Praise the Lord,"

for helping us and answering prayer, guiding us through the year.

I planned the itenary of Miss Cleo Williams, arranger for Rev.

Liddick to be our Missionary speaker. I attended all called Missionary board meetings, attended the Spiritual Life Committee meeting and met with the Religious Life committee.
