DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday Evening Meeting.

The Champlain Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its eighty-first session at West Plattsburg, N. Y., April 25, 1922, at 7:30 P. M.

Rev. A. J. Allen, the President, called the Conference to order.

Song, "I Am Thine, O Lord," was sung, and the gracious presence of the Lord was felt. The President made some announcements, and made brief but stirring remarks, and fervent prayer was offered by Rev. E. D. Carpenter.

Scripture lesson was read from the book of Isaiah 11th chapter.

Rev. C. E. Hill was the preacher of the hour and brought the keynote message from the Word of God recorded in St. Luke 4th chapter and 18th verse: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the broken-hearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised." At the close of the sermon a number of testimonies were given to the saving and keeping power of God.

Benediction by Rev. T. P. Baker.

Wednesday Morning Meeting.

Devotional service in charge of Rev. F. E. Wood. Song, "Saviour, Like a Shepherd Lead Us," was sung. Scripture lesson was read from 2 Timothy, 2nd chapter.

Prof. J. S. Luckey led in a season of prayer.

By request Brother Wood sang a solo, "Jesus is Piloting Me."

The roll was called, to which eleven Elders, one Licentiate and eighteen Delegates were present to answer to the call of their names.

The Bar of Conference was fixed to include the first four rows of seats.

Voted that the time to open and close the daily sessions be fixed as follows: Open at 9 A. M., close at 11:30 A. M. Open at 1:30 P. M. and close by vote.

The Vice-President was called to the chair, while the President made his annual report. The same was adopted. See Report No. 1.

A Resolution on Evangelism was read, and the same was referred to the Committee on Evangelism.

A second Resolution was read, but action was deferred for the present.

A Committee on Passage of Character was appointed as follows: Rev. L. M. Hayes, Elder, and Ralph Gilson, Layman.

A Committee on Pastoral Relations was appointed as follows: I'resident A. J. Allen, E. D. Carpenter, C. E. Hill, Harley S. Hill, Elders; R. H. Keyes, Nathan Capen, and E. L. McKnight, Laymen.

The Committee on Courtesy introduced Professor J. S. Luckey, of Houghton Seminary, Houghton, N. Y.; Rev. J. S. Willett, the Connectional Agent; and Rev. T. P. Baker, the Connectional Missionary Secretary. All made encouraging remarks on the great work of the Lord which they represented.

Rev. H. R. LaVere, from the Lockport Conference, and Rev. II. J. Bullock, of the Lockport Conference, and Rev. F. L. Presley, of the Rochester Conference, were introduced and made interesting remarks.

Sister Clara E. Campbell, returned Missionary, and Mrs. Edith F. Lee, the Organizer of the Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society, were introduced and made very appropriate remarks.

The Committee on Orders of the Day made a report. The same was adopted, as follows:

Thursday 9: 30 A. M., election of Conference Officers. Thursday 10: 30, Connectional Representative, Rev. T. P. Baker.

Friday 10 A. M., Educational Representative, Prof. J. S. Luckey. Friday 2 P. M., meeting of the S. M. Association.

Friday 7:30 P. M., Missionary service, in charge of the W. H. & F. M. Society.

Saturday 10:30 A. M., Tithing Secretary.

Saturday, 7:30 P. M., Young People's Meeting.

The Committee on Evangelism elected by members of the Champlain, Lockport and Rochester Conferences sent a Resolution. The same was read and adopted. See Resolution No. 1.

Wednesday Afternoon Session.

Rev. E. Trowbridge had charge of the song service. Song, "Crown Him Lord of All," was sung. Scripture lesson was read from 2nd Corinthians 6th chapter. Prayer by Brother Trowbridge. The presence of the Lord was there in power.

The Roll was called, to which eleven Elders, one Licentiate and twenty-two Delegates responded.

Minutes of the first and morning sessions were read and the same was approved.

Voted that the Committee on Apportionment in their report include the apportionment to the Charges of the amount each charge should raise to defray the expense of Delegates to the next General Conference.

An invitation was extended from the Long Lake Church to entertain the next annual session, and the same was unanimously accepted. If for any reason the Conference could not be held there, it was left to the President and his Advisory Board to secure a place. The time was set for Tuesday, April 24, 1923, at 7:30 P. M. It was voted that Harley S. Hill should preach the opening sermon. C. L. Hill was appointed alternate.

The names of E. Trowbridge, S. A. Green, and J. J. Davison were called and their characters passed.

The Committee on Courtesy introduced the Rev. L. C. Mattoon, of the Lockport Conference, who made some very welcome remarks.

The names of S. C. Fox, A. E. and T. A. Moses, V. D. Otis, J. F. Wright and E. D. Carpenter were called and their characters passed.

At this time a five minutes' recess was enjoyed by all.

The order of the day having arrived, song, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms," was heartily sung by all. Rev. L. M. Hayes offered prayer, while our hearts were moved by the power of God.

A Scripture lesson was read from the Word of God recorded in the first chapter of Romans, the first seventeen verses.

Florence Baxter sang a solo, "Moment by Moment,"

Dr. J. S. Willett was the preacher of the hour and used for his text Romans 1:16, "For I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek." We were all greatly edified and strengthened in the inner man through the preaching of the Word at this time. Song "Marching to Zion" was sung.

Moved to adjourn to give place for committee work. Benediction by W. F. Lewis.

Wednesday Evening Meeting.

Song and praise service in charge of W. F. Lewis.

Song "When We All Get to Heaven" was sung.

Scripture lesson was read from the fifth chapter of St. Matthew, first sixteen verses.

Prayer was offered by Brother Lewis.

Song "The Last Mile of the Way" was sung.

Rev. F. L. Presley was the preacher of the evening. Lesson was read from the eighth chapter of Deuteronomy. Prayer by Rev. H. R. LaVere. Duet by Rev. F. H. Wright and Miss Florence Baxter. The text was selected from the chapter read, the second verse: "And thou shatl remember all the way which the Lord thy God led thee these forty years in the wilderness, to humble thee, and to prove thee, to know what was in thine heart, whether thou wouldest keep the commandments or no."

Song "There is a Fountain Filled With Blood" was sung, while His people felt the cleansing power upon their hearts.

Benediction by F. H. Wright.

Thursday Morning Meeting.

The song and praise service was led by Wm. N. Osgood. "Blessed Assurance" was sung. Prayers were offered by George Osgood and Rev. F. E. Wood. The Scripture was read from St. Luke 11th chapter, first thirteen verses. God's blessing was manifest at this service.

The Roll was called, and twelve Elders, one Licentiate, and twenty-two Delegates answered to the call of their names.

The Minutes of the afternoon and evening sessions of the previous day were read, and the same was adopted.

Rev. H. R. LaVere was received into the Champlain Conference by unanimous vote.

A letter of greetings from the students of Houghton Seminary was read. It was voted that a letter in behalf of the Champlain Conference be sent to them, signed by the President and Secretary.

The Vice-President was called to the chair.

The name of A. J. Allen was called and his character passed. The order of the day having arrived, that being the election of Conference Officers. Wm. N. Osgood and W. E. Hanmer were appointed to prepare ballots. D. W. Summers and L. M. Hayes were appointed tellers.

Voted that the President nominate his Advisory Board. He nominated E. D. Carpenter and S. H. Miller, who were elected.

A five minutes' recess was enjoyed by all.

The order of the day having arrived, Rev. T. P. Baker spoke in behalf of the Great Missionary Cause. He said that we are workers together, and like the children of Israel, we must have the pillar of fire to follow if we are to succeed. This was a gracious service, owned and blessed of the Lord.

"All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" was sung. Benediction by H. R. LaVere.

Thursday Afternoon Meeting.

The devotional service was in charge of Rev. D. W. Summers. "I Will Praise Him" was sung. The Scripture lesson was read from 1 John 3rd chapter. Rev. H. J. Bullock offered prayer.

The Roll was called and fourteen Elders, one Licentiate, and twenty-three Delegates answered to the call of their names.

The minutes of the morning session were read and the same were adopted.

Rev. H. C. Shares, from the Rochester Conference, was introduced.

The Order of the Day having arrived, that being the Conference Sunday School Secretary, W. F. Lewis spoke. He emphasized the fact that we should have our Sunday Schools and Bible schools, with two-fold, yes, three-fold objects. First, to teach the Bible; Second, to teach Conversion; Third, to instruct in Christian Service.

Rev. T. P. Baker, Missionary Secretary, read from the Wesleyan Methodist an article on the Missionary and Sunday School, that was very helpful to all present.

The time having arrived for the preaching of the afternoon, Brother Willett, Connectional Agent and Treasurer, read for the lesson fourteen verses of the first chapter of Ephesians. Solo by Miss Baxter. Mr. Willett offered prayer and selected his text from the fourth chapter of Colossians, the last clause of the twelfth verse, "Complete in all the will of God." Brother Willett said that the Lord is sure to work His plan, and that it is His great will and plan that all His people be made perfect and complete in Him by being born again. This was a gracious hour. The blessing of the Lord was upon the message.

The message was blessed of the Lord and at the close a number requested the prayers of God's people by raising their hands. The altar call was given and some seekers came. A number of effectual prayers went up in their behalf, while they wept their way into the kingdom. The benediction of the Lord was upon this service.

Moved and carried that the President send a letter of greeting to A. E. and T. A. Moses in behalf of the Conference.

The Committee on Resolutions made their report. The same was approved with the understanding that the Resolution of Appreciation of the Conference for their good entertainment while here in West Plattsburg be read Sunday morning. See Resolution No. 2.

Committee on Itineracy and Orders made their report. The

same was adopted. See Report No. 4.

The Order of the Day having arrived, Professor J. S. Luckey, Professor F. H. Wright and Stanley Lawrence, spoke in behalf of the educational interests, and said many helpful and encouraging things about the work at Houghton. It was moved and carried that we approve of the effort to secure a College Charter for Houghton, and invite the completion of the Campaign for endowment during the coming year.

Friday Afternoon Meeting.

Moved and carried to adjourn. Benediction by E. D. Carpenter.

Saturday Afternoon Meeting.

Song and praise service in charge of O. G. Wyman. "If Jesus Goes With Me" and "The Blood Has Never Lost Its Power" were sung. The Scripture was read from the twelfth chapter of Isaiah. Rev. F. H. Wright offered prayer.

The Roll was called and 16 Elders, 1 Licentiate and 23 Delegates answered to the call of their names.

Minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

The Committee on the Eighteenth Amendment made their report. The same was adopted. See Resolution No. 3.

Prayer was offered by E. D. Carpenter.

Moved and carried to adjourn.

"Blest Be the Tie that Binds" was sung and the benediction was pronounced by A. J. Allen.

Saturday Evening Meeting.

Song service was in charge of Rev. H. C. Shares, of the Rochester Conference. "Blessed Assurance" was sung, and Brother Shares offered prayer. Many of the promises of God were repeated. Solo by Dorothy Trowbridge.

Prayer was offered by Rev. L. C. Mattoon, of the Lockport Conference, and nine young men sang the Y. M. W. B. Song.

Sister Mary Lane Clarke, the Connectional Superintendent of the Y. M. W. B., gave a stirring address in behalf of the great work being done by the Band.

The new Superintendent of the Conference Y. M. W. B., Mrs. George Stevenson, made some very welcome remarks.

A duet was sung by Mildred Stevenson and Gwendolyn Hayes. Rev. J. S. Willett gave the young people a very helpful talk. He spoke of the great necessity of being saved while they were young. When the altar call was given seventeen came seeking the Lord. Many others came to consecrate their lives to the service of of the Master. A number came seeking the blessing of heart purity. Reject that and you have a religion, but not the Christian religion. One fact emphasized tremendously in Scripture is the death of Jesus, and that His death was necessary for the forgiveness of sins. The proof of the divinity of Jesus, and the value of his death, is found in living

monuments of grace. Saved by the "blood of the Lamb." This is the burning message of the early apostles and the Christians, and is seen in their preaching and in the hymnology of the Church. No other doctrine is of such importance. It should have a primary place in our preaching. At the close of this message a number came to the altak seeking salvation.

Sunday Afternoon Meeting.

A. J. Allen was in charge of the song and praise service. The "Everlasting Arms" and "I Will Trust Jesus" were sung.

H. C. Shares and H. R. LaVere offered prayers. A male quar-

STANDING RULES.

At the session of Conference the following Standing Rules of Conference were adopted:

- I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.
- II. All visiting members of our own or other churches in harmany with our principles shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.
- III. The Conference President shall receive \$20.00 per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.
- IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive \$15.00 per year for his labor and incidental expenses.
- V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive \$10.00 per year for his services in caring for the funds.
- VI. In making his report the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books April 15th of each year.
- VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the camp meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpended balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.
- VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.
- IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.
- X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.
- XI. In each month having five (5) Sundays, the Sunday School offering of the fifth Sunday shall be given to Home Missions.

RESOLUTION No. 5.

The Committee to whom was referred the question of Prohibition Enforcement reports as follows:

1. Because of flagrant violations of the Volstead law for the enforcement of Prohibition and the demand from certain quarters for the doing away with said law, or the modifying it to the extent that much of its vital force shall be destroyed,

Therefore, we, the members of the Champlain Annual Conference, hereby enter our emphatic protest against the weakening of the Volstead act in any way, but, if necessary, there be the strengthening of enforcement laws that there may be a more rigid enforcement of Prohibition.

- 2. We recommend that none of our people vote for representatives in Congress, whether in the House of Representatives or in the Senate, who do not stand for the enforcement of the Eighteenth Amendment, through the enforcement of the Volstead Act or a stronger one.
 - 3. That the Secretary of the Conference send a copy of this

action to the members of the House of Representatives from the districts covered by the Champlain Conference. Also, that he send a copy to each of the United States senators from the states of New York and Vermont.
