DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday, 7: 30 p. m.

The forty-fifth session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened in the Ariel Mill Wesleyan Methodist Church at Easley, South Carolina at 7: 30 p. m., July 20th, 1937. Rev. R. C. Kendrick, the Conference President, delivered the Conference Sermon, using for a text 2 Timothy 4: 1-5. The subject was "Making Full Proof of the Ministry."

Wednesday, 8: 30 a. m.

The first business meeting was held Wednesday at 8: 30 a. m. The devotionals were conducted by Rev. R. C. Kendrick.

The conference was called to order by the President. The roll was called and 14 Elders and 12 Conference Preachers answered to their names.

Wednesday, 1:30 p. m.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. R. C. Mullinax.

Conference was called to order by the President.

The roll was called.

Mrs. Walter Jackson, Earl Alexander, and J. W. Sanders presented proper credentials and were enrolled as Lay Delegates.

The Vice-President was called to the Chair.

Committee to grade Church and Quarterly Conference Records was elected as follows: Mrs. J. B. Hilson, Miss Mary Warren.

In compliance with Paragraph 137 of the Discipline, it was moved and carried that the President and his Advisory Board constitute the Conference Committee on Church and Parsonage Building and Location. This is to be a standing rule until further modified by the Conference.

The President made a partial report. The report was adopted. See Report No. 1.

The Conference took up the election of the Committee on Pastoral Relations. It was voted that the number of nominees for each committeeman be limited to three. The vote was taken by acclamation. The Committee was elected as follows: "Elders—R. C. Mullinax, J. D. Elrod, J. D. Scoggin. Lay Delegates—J. F. Childs, F. L. Moore, C. C. Mason.

A motion was made and supported that the Conference elect a Nominating Committee of six (6) to nominate all the committees for the Conference of 1938. After considerable debate, the motion was tabled.

It was moved and carried that J. B. Hilson become a member of the Auditing Committee.

J. H. King of Whitmire Church; Edward P. Buck, Jr., L. F. Hartley, and Fred L. Elrod of Central First Church Charge, were recommended by their respective Quarterly Conferences to study under the direction of the Conference. On motion these names were referred to the Committee on Itinerary and Orders.

Rev. L. W. Barbee of the North Georgia Conference was introduced to the Conference and made a few appropriate remarks.

J. B. Hilson read his Statistical Report.

Conference adjourned on motion.

Wednesday, 7:30 p. m.

The Conference W. H. & F. M. S. held their public meeting. Miss Ina Gaines, the President, presided. Miss Gertrude Farmer spoke regarding the progress of the work at Glenville. Rev. Roy S. Nicholson, Connectional Sunday School Secretary and Editor, delivered a very impressive sermon on missions.

Conference was called to order by the President.

Roll was called.

Minutes were read and approved as corrected.

J. T. Carey gave a verbal report. Report was adopted and his character passed.

The Secretary read communications from, and the Statistical Reports of

The Secretary read a communication of greetings from Rev. A. L. Vess. By vote the Secretary was instructed to make an appropriate reply.

By vote Talmage Evatt was seated as a Delegate from the Central Second Church to represent Elder F. B. Williams.

John Youngblood resigned from the Committee on Statistics. By vote his resignation was accepted.

H. M. Moody was elected to the Committee on Statistics.

Rev. S. I. Keeler was called to the Chair.

Treasurer—Mr. Talmage Evatt. (Vote—61 of 64, first ballot.)

By ballot J. D. Elrod, C. E. Henderson were elected on the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees now stands as follows: Elders—J. D. Elrod, 3 years; D. O. Powers, 2 years; J. D. Scoggin, 1 year. Lay Members—C. E. Henderson, 2 years; W. M. Harris, 1 year.

It was moved and carried that the Conference Trustees be instructed to sell the old Fellowship Church property and make a deed with the reservation that the present graves thereon be not disturbed. The proceeds from this property is to be used by the church to remodel its present building.

It was moved and carried that the Conference Trustees be authorized to look into the Williamston Church Property question, and sell the portion necessary, or make whatever adjustment they deem best in regard to making proper adjustment with the city regarding the road the latter desires to work.

Clifford Roach of Providence Charge was recommended by his Quarterly Conference to study under the direction of the Conference. On motion this name was referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

After C. C. Mason had given a verbal report regarding Rev. I. O. Gray, the Conference voted to adopt this report and pass Rev. I. O. Gray's character.

G. E. Crenshaw made his report as Evangelist. The report was adopted and his character was passed.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

Thursday, 1:30 p. m.

Devotionals were conducted by Rev. L. Rigdon.

Conference was called to order by the President.

The roll was called.

Rev. Roy S. Nicholson was called to the Chair.

On motion Conference recessed until 3 o'clock.

At three o'clock Conference was called to order by the President for Special Orders.

Rev. Roy S. Nicholson, Connectional Sunday School Secretary and Editor, and Connectional Representative, gave the Connectional Address, which was very inspiring.

It was moved and carried that the President be empowered to appoint a committee to make recommendations regarding purchasing or building a parsonage for the Conference President.

The following committee was appointed: J. B. Hilson, W. L. Miller, C. H. Boggs, G. L. Stewart, R. G. Cudd.

The President of the Conference W. Y. P. S. presented the following plan as adopted by the Conference W. Y. P. S. for the administration of the South Carolina Conference W. Y. P. S. Ministerial Student Loan Fund.

South Carolina W. Y. P. S. Ministerial Student Loan Fund

The purpose of this loan fund is to aid worthy young preachers of the South Carolina Conference in securing a training for the ministry; and loans from this fund shall be subject to the following conditions:

1. No person may receive more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) aid during one school year.

2. No person may receive more than a total of three hundred dollars (\$300.00). Provided that after he has paid back a part or all of the \$300.00, he may be eligible to borrow again up to the amount he has paid back.

3. Not more than 6 per cent nor less than 5 per cent interest shall be charged on these loans.

4. The person receiving aid from this fund shall make payments on his indebtedness in the amount of not less than 10% of his gross income. The first of these payments shall come due when he has been out of

school four months and shall continue monthly until the total principal and interest have been paid. Provided, that the payments shall be suspended during all the time the person may be back in school.

5. The person receiving aid from this fund must be a member of some local church of the South Carolina Conference, and must agree to remain in the Conference until the indebtedness is paid in full.

6. The Conference W. Y. P. S. Executive Committee shall have complete control over this fund, shall decide whether or not a person is eligible to receive aid, shall give the Treasurer a written order to pay out whatever amount it may decide to loan to any person, and may make further requirements as it may see fit.

7. The Treasurer shall receive all money given to this fund or paid on any loan made from this fund.

8. No person is to receive aid from this fund to attend any school other than one of the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

Mr. D. L. Jones, Superintendent of the Hephzibah Home at Macon, Georgia was introduced to the Conference and made fitting remarks.

Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its first reading.

Rev. Roy S. Nicholson was called to the Chair.

Statistical Reports were read by the following: C. M. Elrod, J. D. Scoggin, G. L. Stewart, H. A. McCutcheon, J. H. Miller, W. B. Clubb, C. W. Nalley (Junior Pastor).

By vote the Conference instructed its Secretary to send greetings to Miss Ruth Kelley.

On motion Conference recessed subject to the call of the Chair.

Friday, 1:30 p. m.

Devotions were conducted by D. G. Matheny.

Roll was called.

It was moved and carried that Mr. D. L. Jones, Superintendent of the Orphanage at Macon, Georgia, be given the opportunity to address the Conference. He spoke regarding the work and needs of the home. He emphasized the necessity of the Wesleyans having a church at Macon, Georgia.

Rev. S. I. Keeler gave his report as an evangelist. His report was adopted and his character passed.

It was moved and carried that the next session of the South Carolina Annual Conference be held at the Conference Camp Grounds at Greer.

Rev. R. C. Mullinax resigned from the Committee on Apportionment. His resignation was accepted and Rev. G. E. Crenshaw was elected to the vacancy.

The committee appointed to make recommendations regarding a President's Parsonage recommended that twenty-five per cent (25%) of the budget for "Conference Work" be set aside for the purpose of building or purchasing a parsonage for the Conference President. On motion Conference to approve the recommendation.

Rev. Roy S. Nicholson was called to the Chair.

The report of Rev. D. T. Cain was read by the Secretary. His report was adopted and his character passed.

The following read their Statistical Reports: D. G. Matheny, J. R. Green, P. C. Lusk (read by the Secretary), F. H. Pressley (read by the Secretary).

Conference adjourned to the call of the Chair.

Saturday, 8:30 a. m.

Roll was called and minutes were read and approved.

The Committee on Apportionment recommended that the budget be apportioned as follows per member: Foreign Missions, \$2.00; Education, \$1.25; Home Missions, \$.50; Orphanage, \$.25; Conference President's Salary, \$.75; Conference Work, \$.45; Church Extension and Conference Evan-

gelism, \$.30; Superannuate Ministers' Fund, \$.20; General Conference Travels, \$.10; Conference Entertainment, \$.10; Minutes, \$.06. See Report No. 11.

On motion the report was adopted.

RESOLUTIONS

Resolutions Adopted in 1898

Resolved, 1st. That as a body in Conference assembled, we will not allow our pulpits or churches to be used by those who do not give evidence of being sound in the doctrines of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and true to our polity.

2nd. That as ministers and laymen we will use our best endeavors to prevent the promulgation of doctrines or usages not in accord with the Wesleyan Methodist faith.

Resolutions Adopted in 1905

Resolved, 1st. That the law with regard to complaints or violations of orders and resolutions found on page 37 of our Discipline, and beginning with the words, "When the President," shall apply to all cases of the violators of our Discipline, and no charges shall be entertained by the Judiciary Committee without said previous investigation and labor.

2nd. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

Resolutions Adopted in 1907

Resolved, 1st. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society.

2nd. That we believe that the preaching of Holiness that does not include a clear and distinct opposition to all secret societies is seriously lacking in the essential elements and must be more or less displeasing to God.

3rd. That we believe that the right type of Holiness preaching and teaching is the most effective means by which to induce men to separate themselves from all lodge entanglements; therefore, we will do our best to double our diligence in this line of effort.

4th. That we affectionately admonish our people to avoid all compromise with secrecy. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday Schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies; furthermore, those belonging to secret orders shall not be allowed to hold services in our churches.

5th. That we seriously urge upon all our brethren and sisters that they may be careful to maintain a consistent, but radical, attitude of opposition to all organizations, secret or open, which are opposed to Jesus Christ and His doctrine and principles of righteousness.

Resolutions Adopted in 1914

Resolved, 1st. That all of our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work be required to preach at least once a month, or twelve times during the Conference year.

2nd. That in addition to the above resolution, we earnestly request all preachers not receiving a regular appointment by the Conference, except those attending school preparatory to the ministry, to hold, if possible, a two weeks revival during the year.

3rd. That all preachers unemployed by the Conference during the coming year be urged to select a fellow-laborer with whom they can work harmoniously, and go out and try to build up new works as they may have opportunity, and revive the desert places.

4th. That in order that the foregoing resolutions may have the greatest effect possible, and that each preacher may have a higher estimation of the dignity of his calling, and that the burden for souls may be increased, and that they may feel the sympathy of the Church to which they belong, we urge each charge to pass like resolutions.

5th. That it is not only the duty, but binding on each Circuit preacher of our Conference, to receive whomsoever the Conference may designate as Quarterly Meeting Evangelist, and give him their hearty support and coöperation.

Resolution Adopted in 1919

Be it Resolved, That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.

Resolution, Regarding Tithing, Adopted in 1922

Resolved, That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.

Resolutions Adopted in 1923

Resolved, 1st. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.

2nd. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided, this shall not interfere with previous arrangements between pastor and church.

Resolution Adopted in 1926

Resolved, That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.

Resolutions Adopted in 1931

Resolved, 1st. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.

2nd. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most earnestly to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. This Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the percentage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who are not giving at all.

3rd. That each pastor and church coöperate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.

Resolution Adopted in 1932

Whereas in America there seems to be a constantly increasing disregard for law and law observance, and whereas there has been a desire on the part of some to annul or repeal the Eighteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

Be it Resolved, That we unequivocally place ourselves in opposition to any plan whereby either this Amendment or the Volstead Act should be changed.

Be it further Resolved, That we will labor diligently in public and private to create that public sentiment for these laws that will not only keep them on our Statute books, but cause them to be more rigorously enforced.

REPORTS

Report Number 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the members of the South Carolina Conference: Greetings in the name of our Risen Lord! As we come to the close of this, the sixth year of our labors as your Conference President, I feel very unworthy of the trust you have placed in me; and if I have made any degree of success, it is due largely to the splendid coöperation which you have given me.

We have not grown so much in numbers, but there is a general progressive spirit that prevails throughout the Conference which is encouraging. This is evident by the building and repair projects that are on in the different churches.

Providence Church has built a new parsonage.

Glendale is building a nice five-room parsonage.

Greenville has done some interior work on their church, which has added much to the appearance as well as to the value of their property. They have also recovered and repainted their parsonage.

Eden, Oakway, Grahams Chapel, Carlisle and other of our rural churches have installed electric lights.

Liberty Church, which is only a few years old, is meeting its financial obligations nicely. They deserve commending for the splendid work which they have done.

The Walhalla Church has added a much needed extension to their building.

The Whitmire people have made improvements on their church to the amount of two thousand nine hundred and thirty-six dollars, by enlarging the main auditorium and adding a number of large Sunday School rooms. The building is nicely finished and they owe less than three hundred dollars.

The Conference Camp at Greer, S. C., has added a new dormitory this year. This 24'x50' building is equivalent to twenty rooms.

The Conference has purchased a new iron safe for the safe-keeping of the records. This was due to the efforts of our Conference Secretary, Rev. J. B. Hilson, without extra cost to the Conference.

As the result of a tent meeting conducted by our Conference Evangelist, the Rev. G. E. Crenshaw, and his co-laborers, there was a class of 12 members organized at Seneca, S. C.

Acts of Official Business Are as Follows:

On Sunday morning, November 15th, 1936, the Fellowship Church was destroyed by fire. We, with the assistance of the pastor, the Rev. W. L. Miller, purchased the Fellowship school building for a place of worship for the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Fifty dollars (\$50.00) of this amount was paid by the Conference and fifty dollars (\$50.00) was paid by the people of the community. The deed was made and recorded on March 4th, 1937.

On November 26th, 1936, the Committee on Apportionment made their report to the Conference President.

On November 27th, the Rev. E. W. Cartee resigned as pastor of the Anderson Church. On Dec. 28th, the Rev. W. R. Garner was appointed as pastor of the Anderson Church.

On January 7th, 1937, we received the transfer of Rev. W. R. Garner from the Alabama Conference.

On June 20th, 1937, the Rev. G. E. Crenshaw presented the church which he organized at Seneca, S. C. It was accepted and became a part of the South Carolina Conference. The Rev. J. H. Miller was appointed pastor of the afore-mentioned church.

On May 30th, 1937, we dedicated the church at Clifton, S. C.
