MERGER—The proposed merger of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and the Pilgrim Holiness Church was again taken up. After considerable discussion, the Conference voted by ballot 81 to 37 in favor of merger.

BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION—The Board of Administration made the following recommendations which by vote of the Conference were adopted: The Board recommends that the Conference Officers be a Committee on Agenda for the Annual Conference session and that this become a standing Rule. (Passed by the necessary two-thirds majority.)

The Board recommends to the Conference that plans be made for the observance of the 75th anniversary of the Conference which will be in 1968. The Board also nominates the following as a committee to be in charge of plans for observance of our diamond anniversary: Karl W. Johnston, C. T. Bryant, J. B. Hilson, Mrs. J. B. Childs, G. Robb French, W. T. Hughey, Ross E. Gilstrap.

The Board recommends that the Conference adopt the following as a

Standing Recommendation: That all our churches use Wesleyan Methodist Sunday School literature.

The Board recommends Standing Rule No. 11 be deleted and that the other Standing Rules be numbered accordingly. Passed by the necessary two-thirds vote.

The Board recommends that a Conference Statistician be elected to do the work which has heretofore been done by the Committee on Statistics; with the thought that he keep the position over a period of years, so that the reports may be prepared more efficiently.

The Board recommends that all financial reports, except the budget items, be reported to the nearest dollar; thus eliminating the reporting of "cents."

This is to save printing space and time of the Statistician.

MINISTERS RETREAT—The Committee on Ministers Retreat gave its report. Report adopted. (See report No. 18).

CONFERENCE SOLICITOR—William R. French gave the report of the Conference Solicitor for church periodicals. Report adopted. (See report No. 17).

"SOUTH CAROLINA CHALLENGER"—J. Marvin Quarles gave the report of the Treasurer and Circulation Manager of the "South Carolina Challenger." Report adopted. (See report No. 22).

Dr. V. A. Mitchell, General Superintendent, gave an informal report regarding his work and asked for the prayers of the Conference in executing his duties. The Conference gave him a rising vote of appreciation for his service rendered.

1. Add five cents to the Conference Work Fund, making the total budget \$3.00 per member for active members and \$.90 dues for associate members.
2. The S. C. Wesleyan Youth adopt a special church extension project of \$1,200.00 toward the Mauldin project.
3. That a Pilot Committee be elected to promote a campaign in opposition to the coming liquor referendum. This committee is to be appointed by the W. Y. Executive Committee.
4. That a Teen Committee be elected to communicate ideas to the W. Y. Executive Council. The committee is to be composed of two teen-agers from each district with one from each of the Columbia sub-districts. The Conference W. Y. President is to be chairman of the committee.

Standing Rules

1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

2. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.

3. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds for an expansion program or to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. Whenever money is borrowed for use of a local church the local church shall agree to and be responsible for its payment.

4. In case of necessity in order that a duly authorized expansion, building, remodeling or relocating program may be carried out; or in case of the claim of a municipal government, state highway department, or any other governmental agency, the trustees of the South Carolina Conference be and they hereby are duly empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which transfer or sale is requested (this writing to become a part of the permanent record of the trustees), and where the sale or transfer of such conference, church, parsonage, or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board, and provided further that the trustees and the President of the said Conference are satisfied that the object for which the transaction is sought is both necessary and desirable. (1961)

5. During the interim of Annual Conference the Board of Church Extension and Evangelism shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Mountain Missions and Conference Missions, for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Board on Church Extension

sion and Evangelism, or signed by the President in behalf of the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism.

6. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a church building or a parsonage or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is advised to consult with the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location in the early stages of planning and final plans must be approved by said Board. (1964)

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

7. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.

8. Conference shall convene on Monday, after the second Sunday in July. (1964)

9. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close June 15. (1964)

10. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.

11. The Board of Administration shall appoint the Auditing Committee, the Statistician, and the Apportionment Committee at a proper time before Conference. (1966)

12. The Conference Officers shall be a Committee on Agenda for the annual conference sessions. (1966)

13. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.

14. Certificates of Citation are to be presented to each minister who has given twenty-five years of active service in God's Kingdom (twenty years in case of retirement or death) while he is a member of the South Carolina Conference. At retirement or death a certificate is to be given recognizing the total period of active service. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and the Secretary. (1964)

15. During the interim of the Annual Conference, the Committee on Finance shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Minutes, Conference Entertainment, Conference Parsonage, and President's Salary for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference; and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Committee on Finance or signed by the President by order

and in behalf of the Committee on Finance. (1957)

16. The local church officers shall be elected within thirty days of the close of the fiscal year of the local church, and they shall take office at the beginning of the fiscal year. (1958)

17. All pastors shall mail their Statistical Reports to the statistician by June 25. (1964)

18. Anyone employed by the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism shall not be a member of the Board. (1959)

19. The joint committee composed of the President and his Advisory Board, the Board of Trustees, and the Board on Church Extension and Conference Evangelism are authorized to draw on monies available in the Conference Budget for Church Extension and Evangelism to aid churches which, in the opinion of this joint committee, are faced by dire emergency.

20. During the interim of the Annual Conference the Conference Trustees shall be duly authorized to draw on funds for Conference Parsonage Maintenance, for the purpose for which it was raised, as the Trustees deem best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least a majority of the Conference Trustees, or signed by the President in behalf of the Conference Trustees.

21. The Conference Officers, President's Advisory Board, Conference Trustees, Committee on Church Extension and Evangelism, and Committee on Finance shall constitute a Conference Board of Administration as provided in paragraph 245 of the 1963 Discipline.

22. When any pastor in the conference is assigned to a church or charge, he is to move his church membership to said church or charge unless other plans are approved by the President and his Advisory Board. (1966)

Standing Recommendations

1. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold, if possible, a two weeks' revival during the year.

2. That all ministers faithfully tithe their income and that any minister failing to do so shall be considered delinquent in his duty. (1959)

3. That all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.

4. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation, with pay, each year.

5. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project should be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.

6. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve as Quarterly Conference Clerk.

7. We urge all pastors to seek earnestly to raise a full budget and that first consideration be given to the Pension Plan Budget. (1959)

8. That we adhere to Paragraph 132 (2) of our Discipline as long as there are ministers in our Conference who are qualified and who are available to take work. (1959)

9. Any pastor, or church, desiring to invite a convention or rally group other than Wesleyan groups should first secure the approval of the President and his Advisory Board. (1959)

10. It is recommended that all churches have their treasurers bonded.

11. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference, and the church is requested to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary. (1964)

12. The fiscal year of the local church shall end May 31. (1964)

13. All our churches shall use Wesleyan Methodist Sunday School Literature.

REPORTS

REPORT NO. 1

President's Report

Christian greetings to all members and friends of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church met in its 74th Annual Session this twelfth day of July, 1966.

We would be most ungrateful if we did not pause to give thanks to God for His hourly sustenance during the days and nights of this Conference year. His strong arm has been our stay in every hour of need. Also, I owe a debt of gratitude to my fellow-officers, Committee and Board members. I wish to thank each of them for their faithful labors. It has been a real pleasure to visit in the homes of our pastors and to minister to our congregations across the Conference. The fellowship and hospitality has been heart-warming.

GENERAL CONFERENCE

Our labors during the year included attendance at the General Conference held at Houghton, New York, in June. This was an Historic General Conference. By a vote of 130-33 merger with the Pilgrim Holiness Church was approved. Also, merger with the Reformed Baptist Alliance was approved by vote. This group is made up of some sixty churches with 2,500 members in the Maritime Province of Canada and in Maine. It operates a Bible College in New Brunswick. During this session of the Annual Conference you will have an opportunity to vote on the proposed merger with the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

In a move to "upgrade the ministry" the General Conference adopted a new Pension Plan. Seventy-five per cent of the laymen present and voting and 75% of the ministers present and voting, voted for the adoption of the plan. More will be said about these matters later in the Conference session.

STATE OF THE WORK

An over all view of the Conference would reveal conditions that would encourage and also some things that cause real concern. This has been a year when serious illness has plagued our parsonage families. This has restricted the activities of some of our preachers. However, God has answered prayer, and the outlook seems brighter at this time.

There has been a good bit of concern and confusion relative to the merger question. We must be careful to act responsibly in these matters. A lawless and reckless course that destroys rather than builds cannot be of God.

During these days of Conference let us ask God for a fresh anointing that

will make clear what our course should be and also give us Divine enablement to pursue that course. This can be a great year for all of us.

FINANCIALLY

The financial picture is encouraging. Forty-nine churches have paid a full budget this year in comparison with 47 in 1965 and 46 in 1964. This is commendable in the light of the fact that the budget askings were higher. Total budget paid in for this Conference year was \$60,050 as compared with \$55,289 last year which shows an increase of \$4,760 in budget payments. The increase in total giving for all purposes for this year exceeds by more than \$65,000 that of last year.

A goodly number of our pastors have received salary increases and an increasing number of our churches are assisting their pastors with their Social Security taxes. There is still room for improvement in this area.

The Camp Meeting Sunday Offering amounted to \$1,697 in cash and pledges. The Rally Day offering, for the purpose of purchasing property in the Mauldin Area, amounted to \$1,156.

MATERIAL IMPROVEMENTS

LYMAN is nearing the completion of their new parsonage. It will have 2100 feet of floor space in the living area and a full basement. Estimated value when completed is approximately \$30,000.

FELLOWSHIP has completed their new parsonage at a cost of approximately \$13,000. It is of brick construction with three bedrooms, two bathrooms, living room, family room, kitchen, and a double carport.

ALLEN MITCHELL MEMORIAL'S new church building is nearing completion with occupancy scheduled for early in August. It will be our first church in the Conference with the laminated arch type of construction.

WHITMIRE, FIRST has installed an air conditioning system at a cost of \$4,800.

TUCKASEGEE has completed its basement Sunday School facilities providing rest rooms, storage room, large assembly room, and four class rooms. They have also sanded and finished the floors in their sanctuary. All of this was done at a cost of \$2,800.

WELCOME has built an addition to the church adding two rest rooms, an assembly room, and a class room. They also have panelled and celotexed two upstairs rooms in the parsonage.

OAKWAY has liquidated the indebtedness on their parsonage. This was done years ahead of schedule.

ALICE has purchased and paid for a Hammond Organ, installed a gas furnace, paved the parking area, put a new roof on the church, and tiled three Sunday School rooms at a cost of \$3,846.00.

PICKENS VIEW paid off its parsonage debt within a period of a little over six years. This was nearly four years before the maturity date of the note and mortgage.

SANS SOUCI has purchased a \$1,700 Baldwin Organ and liquidated the indebtedness on their parsonage.

EASLEY, FIRST has done extensive repair and remodeling in their Sunday School facilities. The men's classroom has been panelled and an assembly room has been provided for the Junior Sunday School. The cost of the work is in excess of \$1,000.

STARTEX installed a furnace in the church at a cost of \$1,084.

GLENWOOD continues to raise funds for a new church. The building fund now stands at more than \$13,000.

CARLISLE has installed a heating and an air conditioning system at a cost of \$6,800.

For other material improvements you are referred to the CHALLENGER.

OBSERVATIONS

A revival is absolutely necessary. We can and we must see it come to our Conference. We are reporting a membership loss of 37. Seventeen of these are in the Full Membership category. Other factors will be helpful in reversing this trend but nothing can replace fruitful spiritual awakenings. This, coupled with zealous, fervent promotion will bring wholesome progress.

A Committee to study ways that progress might be made in our Conference was elected by the Conference Board of Administration. It was made a continuing Committee. They have made some helpful suggestions. Some of these suggestions have been implemented, in part.

The Conference Ministerial Institute with its emphasis on personal soul-winning was an effort to broaden and strengthen our evangelistic outreach. It was also recognized that we must undergird our labors with a renewed prayer emphasis for the purpose of experiencing a spiritual awakening. We envision that the District Prayer League Secretaries can assist greatly in this work.

We hope to arrange informal discussion between this Committee on Progress and Conference groups such as the W. Y., The Sunday School Board, etc. Also an effort is to be made to hold workshops on the local or district level to discuss basic ideas and ideals.

The need for more and better trained ministers remains with us. We would urge all of our people to keep this before their young people and all of our men pursuing the Course of Study and attending our schools to make the most of every opportunity.

GOALS AND PROJECTS

These have been presented to you before and we lift them up again with very little change. You will receive them by mail so I will not lengthen out this report except to list one change. That property be purchased during this Conference year in the Mauldin area and that an organization be effected as soon thereafter as is practicable.

LOSS OF DEATH

Rev. A. E. Belk, who has lived out of the state and has been inactive for

some time, was called home during the year. An appropriate memorial service will be held in his memory.

REPORT NO. 3

Church Extension And Evangelism

ITEM I.

Business Transactions:

1. We referred the rental of the Belton Property to the Conference president and that the rent from the property be held for necessary repairs.
2. We voted that the necessary repairs be made on the three houses owned by the Conference in Columbia, 801 and 805 Calhoun Street and 2006 Gadsden Street, to meet the requirements of the Urban Department of the City of Columbia at a cost not to exceed \$3,500.
3. Approval was given for the following churches to vote on their pastors; Columbia, William R. French; Buck Creek, George M. Nalley; Belton, V. E. Gilreath; N. Charleston, J. C. Byars.

ITEM II.

We Recommend:

1. That when it becomes necessary for the Conference to aid New Churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by this committee and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said committee. We further recommend as long as a church receives aid from the Conference, it shall consult this committee before calling a pastor, or before borrowing additional funds.
2. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from this committee before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his said church during the year.
3. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference and who desires to move or to live away from said church or change his relation to the charge in any way must first consult this committee.
4. That when this committee is making payments on loans or church property, the payments shall be made directly to the mortgagee.
5. That the Conference President be Sales Manager of the Conference history book.
6. That we continue to assist in the payments on the loan on the North Charleston Parsonage.
7. That we give \$100 per month to Belton for the Purchase of a church building providing the local church assumes the \$50 a month rental allowance previously provided by the Conference Church Extension and Evangelism funds;

also with the understanding that the church, as they are able, assume as much of the payments on the building as possible.

8. That we pay the pastor of Tuckasegee \$25 a month from the Mountain Mission Budget.

9. That the Rally Day Sunday School Offering be for the Mauldin Project.

ITEM III

Secretary of Church Extension and Evangelism:

1. His duty is to conduct rallies and cultivate interest in church extension and explore prospective fields, and he shall work with and under the direction of the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee.

2. That the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee nominate the Secretary of Church Extension and Evangelism and the Conference elect, and further nominations may be made from the floor.

3. The committee on Church Extension and Evangelism nominates Rev. E. L. Alexander as secretary.

Finance Committee

We, the Committee on Finance, present the following Denominational Budget per member: World Missions \$2.00; Australia \$0.25; Brainerd \$0.25; Church Extension and Evangelism \$1.50; Pension Plan \$7.00; Church Administration \$2.15; General Conference Entertainment \$0.50; Hephzibah \$0.50; Education \$5.00; Seminary Foundation \$0.50; and Sunday Schools \$0.25 per member in main school.

We recommend that the Conference Budget be as follows per member: Conference Church Extension and Evangelism \$2.50; Conference Administration \$2.75; Conference Work \$0.75; Conference Entertainment \$0.50; Conference Minutes \$0.50; Mountain Missions \$0.25; Conference Parsonage \$1.25; Conference Group Insurance \$1.00; Conference Sunday School Work \$0.05 per member in main school.

We further recommend:

1. That the Conference President receive \$125.00 per week salary, one-half social security tax, parsonage rent and utilities, and that he be given two weeks' vacation with pay.

2. That the President be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside the Conference.

3. That the President hold one quarterly meeting or visit each charge at least once during the year and at other times as often as he is able.

4. That the President advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising plans for the better payment of pastors, including the church helping with their social security taxes and utilities and that he also shall counsel with the boards of stewards relative to the superannuate budget item.

5. That the Statistician's salary be \$100.00 to be taken from the Conference Work Fund.

6. That the Treasurer's salary be \$250.00 and the Secretary's Salary be \$150.00 to be taken from the Conference Work Fund.

7. That the President be authorized to draw on funds of Conference work for secretarial help, printing blanks, other such items, and also for flowers for the funeral of a minister or a minister's wife or widow, children or parents.

8. That all proceeds from sale of Conference History Books be put into Conference Work Fund.

9. That the President have the privilege of representing the Conference at meetings of the N. A. E. and N. H. A. with the expense being paid by the Conference.

3. That a table of contents be placed on the second or third page of

each record book. If no space is available, a sheet may be inserted with cloth tape.

4. That the preceedings of each business meeting of the church be recorded in the form of minutes.

5. That the minutes be placed in chronological order.

6. That the church clerks read carefully paragraph 131, 270 (10) of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline.

7. That the roll be kept up to date and that it include as complete as possible the following information: the names of members, dates received, how received and removal.

8. That if a church fails to send a record, its grade becomes zero.

9. That all pastors call attention to their church clerks and quarterly conference clerks to these recommendations.

10. That the following method of grading be used for the church and quarterly conference records: completeness of records 20%—divided as follows: for quarterly conference books—title page, 5%; completeness of minutes, 15%; for church or combined books—title page, 5%; completeness of minutes 10%; church roll, 5%; binding, 10%; table of contents, 10%; permanency of records, (ink or typewritten), 10%; cleanliness and neatness, 10%; penmanship, 10%; date at top of page, giving day, month, and year, 10%; composition and grammar, 10%; spelling, 10%.

4. That we encourage participation and support of the Alston Wilkes Society for the rehabilitation of released prisoners.

Some verses which tell us that this peace is for us are: Psalms 119:164, Gal. 5:22, Romans 14:17, Romans 8:6, and Isa. 32:17."

He closed his remarks with prayer that we may in these difficult days of uncertainty learn these lessons of complete trust and rest.

It was voted to change the orders of the day to postpone the giving of two reports until the afternoon session.

Adjourned by motion.

TUESDAY, JULY 12, 1966, 1:30 P. M.

The afternoon session reconvened by singing the theme song, led by Mrs. Naomi Hughey, accompanied at the piano by Mrs. Ann French.

Rev. Ridgeway again stirred our hearts in continuing the devotional message on the great subject of "Peace."

I John 3:18 was chosen for a basis, the theme being, "If Our Hearts Condemn Us Not."

"Peace of mind involves peace *with* God, followed by peace *of* God. Peace *with* God is the foundation for the peace *of* God. Two things involved in laying a good foundation are: 1. There must be reconciliation between God and self, brought about by forgiveness which brings about restoration of peace, and 2. There must be maintenance of quietness and assurance by simple trust and obedience. Faults must be handled to assure peace. Where faults are taken lightly, there is no deep work of grace. Where they are taken too seriously it causes uncertainty and unrest."

Brother Ridgeway offered special prayer for Mrs. Lillian Barr who is in ill health while separated from her husband who is serving our country in Viet Nam.

The Reading Course secretary gave her report. Report adopted. (See report). There were 102 gold certificates and 31 blue certificates awarded. A rising vote of thanks was given Mrs. Evatt.

The Projects Committee Chairman, Mrs. Katherine French, presented the project for the new year. Since Marie Evatt does not need our support any longer, the government of Sierra Leone having assumed such, it was voted to undertake the support of our missionaries, Rev. and Mrs. James Wiggins, in Sierra Leone, West Africa.

Rev. and Mrs. Edwin Cowart, former missionaries to India, were introduced and spoke briefly.

The Literature Committee presented the literature.

Offerings were received for Rev. Ridgeway, and to defray the cost of the printed programs.

Roll was called with 10 officers, 31 presidents, and 33 delegates answering.

Pledge cards for the conference project were distributed.

The delegates to General Conference reported by means of a round table discussion.

The conference adjourned by motion.

TUESDAY EVENING, JULY 12, 1966, 7:30 P. M.

The public service was held in the main tabernacle at 7:30 under the direction of Mrs. Margaret Childs. Led by Mrs. Naomi Hughey, accompanied at the piano by Mrs. Ruth Rampey, the congregation sang "To God Be The Glory." This was followed by the choir of ladies singing the theme chorus "Like a River, Glorious."

Mrs. Loney Cowart brought greetings from India, after which Rev. Edwin Cowart gave the devotional part of the service, reading Acts 23:11, upon which to base his message. He closed his remarks with prayer.

Rev. Wesley Lovin, secretary of Church Extension and Evangelism, was introduced and spoke concerning a few of the burdens which lie close to his heart.

The Central College Quartet sang "Teach Me To Love Thee As I Ought."

An offering in cash and pledges amounting to \$3,060.97 was received for Rev. and Mrs. James Wiggins.

Rev. James Ridgeway from Australia was presented and brought the main message of the evening, basing his remarks on Revelation 3:7, 8. Later he presented the work in Australia and New Guinea by means of slides.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 13, 1966, 8:30 A. M.

The Wednesday morning session opened with a time of spiritual refreshing in song. Mrs. Hughey led the singing with Mrs. Margaret Childs at the piano. For the special song, the Central College Quartet beautifully sang "My Jesus I Love Thee."

Rev. Ridgeway's devotional was rich as he continued to enlarge on the subject of "Peace." He quoted I Thes. 5:13, Acts 2:41, and I John 4:21.

He used the idea of the practicality of "Being at Peace Among Yourselves," using Acts 2:41 to illustrate.

"We are so important to each other."

"How good and pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity."

"Let brotherly love continue."

"By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples."

"The *human element* makes it difficult to fully appreciate each other. Some things that add to the difficulty are:

1. Faulty judgments
2. Inner conflicts
3. Character weaknesses

Some of these weaknesses are:

- a. Misjudgment—(Matt, 7:3)
- b. Selfishness—(James 1:4)
- c. Thoughtlessness—(James 3:2)

"Some principles necessary to retain this peace are found in being able to overlook weaknesses in others, to rise above faults of others, to forgive others, to esteem others above self, to understand, and to attempt to be reconciled.

"Most criticism stems from not being able to 'face up,' or from enviousness."

The quartet sang "Wonderful, Wonderful Jesus."

The conference was called to order by the president.

Roll call revealed 11 officers, 23 presidents, and 33 delegates present.

The Central, Columbia, and Spartanburg District Chairmen reported. Reports adopted.

Motion prevailed to change the orders of the day to postpone the caucus meetings until after the other reports.

The W. W. F. secretary reported. Report adopted. (See report). Appreciation for her work was expressed.

Mrs. Cowart expressed words of appreciation for the work of the prayer partners.

The president urged the pushing of the work of the Women's World Fellowship.

Letters to the conference from Miss Marie Evatt and Mrs. James Wiggins were read by Mrs. Martha Evatt and Mrs. Ruth Johnston respectively.

A march offering for the Cowarts in appreciation for the reprieve in the weather was received. This amounted to \$41.00.

Mrs. Carroll Hutcheson, wife of the pastor at Westminster, was presented to the conference.

Mrs. Carrie McKee, Missionary Magazine Solicitor reported. Report adopted. (See report)

Motion prevailed that samples of the promotional poster suggestions be sent to the Magazine Editor. An expression of appreciation for the work of the conference magazine solicitor was given by the president.

Mrs. Naomi Hughey was appointed to send greetings to Marie Evatt, Mrs. Ethel Quarles to Rev. and Mrs. Wiggins, Mrs. Dova Gravely to Bernice Quarles, and Mrs. Pickel to Virginia Hooker.

The district caucus groups assembled.

The conference reassembled and the reports of the actions taken were given.

Mrs. Martha Evatt further presented the literature.

Announcements were made.

Adjournment.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 13, 1966, 1:30 P. M.

The conference reconvened at 1:30 p. m. Mrs. Sylvia Gentry led an inspirational song service. Mrs. Ruth Rampey accompanied at the piano.

The Courtesy Committee presented Rev. V. A. Mitchell, General Superintendent, Mrs. Mitchell, and Rev. Wesley Lovin. Each brought words of greeting.

A soul-stirring devotional message based on I John 3:20 was shared by Rev. Ridgeway. Quoting numerous scriptures, he encouraged us to do all we can to maintain the peace of God. "After we have peace with God and our fellow-men, we may still not have peace with ourselves. Some things we must do to obtain peace with ourselves are: 1. Learn to accept self, 2. Learn to forgive self, and 3. Obtain deliverance from double-mindedness. There is nothing more

needed in the holiness movement than a clear-cut experience of a clean heart."

In closing he carried our hearts to the throne in prayer.

In remembrance of them, Mrs. Lola Harris offered prayer that we who remain may carry on faithfully the work they laid down. The conference stood and sang "When We All Get To Heaven."

Minutes were read and adopted.

A motion prevailed to permit the Secretary to edit the minutes.

Adjourned by motion.

THURSDAY, JULY 14, 1966, 8:30 A. M.

The Y. M. W. B. Superintendents met on Thursday morning at 8:30 o'clock for a very profitable workshop. Mrs. Virginia Allred presided. The new Conference Superintendent, Mrs. Clara James, was presented. She spoke briefly of the Lord's assurance to guide. The Y. M. W. B. looks forward to a wonderful year under the very capable leadership of Mrs. James.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.

2. The W. M. S. dues for this Conference will be one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per member. Fifty cents (50c) of this to be retained in the Conference treasury for working fund.

3. Y. M. W. B. dues will be sixty (60c) per member for this Conference. Fifty-two cents (52c) is to be used for Foreign Missions, five cents (5c) for desk expense, and three cents (3c) for General Conference travel expense of the Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.

4. All money should be in the hands of the Treasurer by June 1. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by June 15.

5. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study Group, and a large Women's Fellowship Circle.

6. The Executive Board will serve as a nominating committee to nominate secretaries and committees as deemed necessary before the opening of Conference.

7. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the honor roll.

8. Each district will elect the following officers: Chairman, Secretary, Magazine Solicitor, Mission Study Promoter, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.

9. Each district should plan at least three district meetings annually—one each quarter in which workshops will be held for: local presidents, treasurers, magazine solicitors, Women's World Fellowship secretaries, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendents.

10. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists, and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expense on said visits.
