10. That each society contribute canned

goods and vegetables for the dining room during camp and conference. Also, that four canning kettles be purchased, dividing the cost between societies. It is suggested that Aumsville and Crawfordsville but one togather, and that the same be arranged by Salem and Vancouver, Russelville, and Division, and Central and St. John's. Each society should appraise their contributions according to the price set by the camp association, president's obtaining the price list from the dining room clerk.

- 11. That the president of each society appoint a committee of two to visit the sick.
- 12. That we urge the use of the prayer cycle, supplied by the conference president, as a stimulus to more earnest and fervent prayer. That the president of each local society arrange with the pastor for one public prayer meeting each month to pray especially for missions both at home and abroad.
