# Journal of Daily Proceedings.

The fifty-fourth annual session of the Kansas Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church assembled in the auditorium at Miltonvale, Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock, August 12th, 1924, President P. A. Miller presiding.

Devotions were led by Rev. S. F. Wilson, who read Hebrews 13 for a scripture lesson. Prayer was offered by Brother Cook. God's presence was graciously manifested in the opening service of the Conference.

Roll Call.—The roll was answered by eight elders and seven annual conference preachers.

### SABBATH SCHOOLS.

We deeply deplore the apparent lack of interest upon the part of many of our people with reference to the Sunday School. We fear that some of our pastors do not regard with real interest the Sunday School work. And this fact, no doubt, is responsible for the feeble condition of some of our charges. A good, live, spiritual Sunday School often lays the foundation for a good revival, and is one of the leading causes of bringing about the salvation of souls and greatly increasing the membership of the church.

As a means of promoting the Sunday School work of the Conference and increasing the membership, we beg leave to submit the following:

- 1. Since the plan discussed in the Sunday School Convention held at Miltonvale, Kan., August 11, 1924, has been the means of increasing the roll of attendance in other places in a remarkable way, without any exception, we recommend, therefore, that the pastors and superintendents on their respective charges introduce the same in the Sunday Schools.
- 2. We recommend that the pastors, and others, whom he may secure to co-operate with him, make a thorough canvass of the territory in which their Sabbath School is located, and that they make a complete list of all families and prospective pupils favorable to the Wesleyan Methodist Church.
- 3. That each of these pupils be enrolled as members of the Sunday School and assigned to certain classes, and teachers appointed for these classes, and that the teachers of each class visit each of the members enrolled in their class and be made responsible for their attendance and presence in the Sunday School.
- 4. That the pastor and superintendent re-construct their Sunday School organization to accommodate the said list. That is, if the Sabbath School has only numbered thirty in attendance, and if the above canvass gives an enrollment of sixty, that teachers and officers be elected to meet this need.
- 5. That a report of the results obtained be made by the pastor of each charge to the Sunday School Secretary not later than November 15, 1924, and that the Sunday School Secretary be requested to report the result through the Wesleyan Methodist.

We believe that every Sabbath School should have the best trained spiritual teachers and officers that it is possible to secure.

We believe that parents, pastors and evangelists should take an active part in the Sunday School.

We believe that the literature of our denomination is unexcelled,

and we recommend its use in all Wesleyan Methodist Sunday Schools.

Regularity and promptness should be encouraged in all, but especially upon the part of teachers and officers.

We re-iterate our unalterable opposition to the public dance hall and to all other forms of so-called amusements which arouse the sensuous natures of men.

We commend the retiring President of Miltonvale College, and his faithful faculty, for their untiring efforts to keep Miltonvale morally and spiritually safe for the sons and daughters of Wesleyan Methodism, for it is our belief that the rules and regulations which have governed the institution have been only such as have tended toward the development of strong moral and religious character.

### BOOKS AND PERIODICALS.

The object of education is to develop the mind given us by God and to prepare us for service among our fellowmen. The acquiring of an education is a continuous process from childhood to the close of life, whether it be at home, in school, in business or in any chosen calling.

Since books and periodicals are the principal sources of knowledge, it is fitting and proper that the subject be given a place in the minutes of this Conference.

Every city and some of the smaller towns have free public libraries and the minister should be ready to help his hearers select good wholesome material and discard the trash. Practically every school has a library for its students where we should find the very best literature.

But more important than public or private libraries is the literature in each home. Whether the family be that of layman or minister, great responsibility rests upon the parents to see that the children have the right kind of reading. If the mistake is made of providing nothing in this line, often it will be discovered later that the youth has himself obtained and read detective stories and books that do not help, but seriously hinder the mental and spiritual development and also destroy the taste for what is "worth while."

The preacher himself should of course have access to and read not only books and periodicals within his specific field of religion, but also those which treat economically, politically and socially upon the leading national and world problems, else, how can he fill his place as advisor, leader and shepherd of his flock.

Only a few specific suggestions can be made herewith:

### Books.

The Bible, the Word of God, the greatest book of all ages, should have first place in every home.

Pilgrims Progress, In His Steps, Pure Gold, and biographies of such men as John Wesley, Martin Luther, David Livingstone, John Wycliffe, Abraham Lincoln, and many others, have changed the whole life and destiny of many a young man or woman.

Catalogues of published books may be obtained at our publishing house in Syracuse as well as from other sources, which will greatly aid in making a selection.

### Periodicals.

The Wesleyan Methodist and the Wesleyan Missionary should of course be found in every Wesleyan home.

The Sunday School Times and the Sunday School Banner will be found very useful for study and reading.

The Christian Cynosure, on secret societies and World Dry, on prohibition, will furnish much material on these two issues.

The American Boy and the Youth's Companion will help to meet the need of the youth.

World and National topics of the day are presented and developed in a variety of periodicals such as: Current History, The Nation, Literary Digest, Current Opinion, Atlantic Monthly, North American Review, World's Work, The New Republic, The World Tomorrow.

In naming these periodicals it is not assumed that they are above criticism. For instance, The Literary Digest is the only periodical which proposes to present a digest of the news pro and con as found in print during the week. But it has evidenced a lack of unbiased presentation. The Wesleyan of December 19, 1923, reprints an article from the Christian Advocate showing a Literary Digest article was decidedly pro Catholic.

If we keep uppermost the will of God and the divine leadings of the Holy Spirit, we shall have the only safe guide for the selection of our reading as well as for the direction of every walk of life.

Second meeting December 5, 1923.

The interests of the Concordia Mission were discussed and subscribers to the Mission were to be written to about their pledges.

President Miller was instructed to visit and look into the conditions at Centerville, Kan., regarding meetings.

Third meeting February, 1924.

Rev. Miller reports on trip to Ottawa and looked into condition of work there.

At this meeting the Treasurer made a report of the expenses of meeting held at LeRoy. \$53.33 were paid Vera Macy and \$56 to Grace Davis, making a total of \$109.33.

The Board voted to give Brother Huscher \$50 at Kansas City and Brother Carkuff, New Hope, \$25.

The Board thought it best that those using the tent should pay transportation between Miltonvale and place of use, or the equivalent, and that the tent be returned in good condition. The March meeting discussed the Ottawa church situation. Brother Pressnall was given \$25.

April 24, 1924.

The most important work was planning to promote revivals and after much discussion and some suggestions it was thought unwise to start in revival work without well laid plans and prayers and advertising and that the Board should be consulted if it was to be expected to support any meetings.

The Board gave Brother Wilson \$20 for assistance in the Concordia Mission.

Lengthy discussion was carried on as to plans for entering new fields.

We also recommend that the Conference President's salary and expenses be paid from the Conference Fund and that the amount be apportioned among the several charges in proportion to their membership. We further recommend that the charge take the usual offering which shall be receipted for by the President and same to apply on his salary.

#### REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE.

The Conference last year voted to pay our President a salary of \$1,000.00, \$180 house rent and expenses which amounted to \$122.72, making a total of \$1,302.72. From this amount deducting \$676.26 received on the field and \$388.86 received from the Conference Treasurer, leaves a balance due on the President's salary of \$237.60, which we recommend be paid. We also recommend that Brother Miller be paid \$6.00 for postage and stationery.

Recommend that we allow the Conference Board of Trustees to take an offering next Sunday for the debt on the Kansas City church.

We also authorize the payment of \$5 to Brother Miller for additional expense of telegrams, etc.

We recommend the payment of \$180 to Brother I. L. DeWitt by the Conference Treasurer amount due him for one year's house rent as voted by the Conference last year.

That for the ensuing year the President's salary be \$1,000.00 and traveling expenses.

In view of the large deficit in the Conference Fund the Finance Committee has been consulted with reference to reducing the salary of the Conference Secretary and Conference Treasurer. We, therefore, recommend that for the ensuing year the Conference Secretary be paid a salary of \$15 per year and the Conference Treasurer a salary of \$10 per year instead of \$25 each as heretofore.

Gideon with his three hundred accomplished great things, because they were every man in his place, and the sword of the Lord and of Gideon was their battle cry. "God working with them."

Shall we, this new year, go forth in His name, Spirit-filled, Spirit-kept, and Spirit-led, "To attempt great things for God and expect great things from God?" And your labor shall not be in vain in the Lord. He it is who shall make our services effectual in the salvation of precious souls both here and over the seas.

#### REPORT OF ORGANIZER AND CONFERENCE Y. M. W. B.

Dear Sisters of the Kansas W. H. & F. M. S.:—I greet you in the name of our precious Saviour, and submit to you the following report:

I organized the Y. M. W. B. at Norton; a W. H. & F. M. S. and Y. M. W. B. were organized at the Fairview charge on the LeRoy work.

Formerly the North and South Church at Chapman Creek had but one Y. M. W. B. organization. Some desired to have them separated. Hence the Band was divided, and the one at the North Church was given the name Bethany Chapel Band, while the one at the South Church is called Wesley Chapel. It was done by Sister Vera Macy and reported to me.

With the aid of the Committee we prepared and sent out two quarterly programs, one on India and one on Africa. As very few used these programs, and as our conventions took up the study of Japan we did not prepare a program on that subject.

From the time of our election to this office we began to think and pray regarding the Missionary Conventions. By the help of God, the efficient services of Miss Greene, and the co-operation of our good people they were a success. We do praise God for all this and give Him all the glory. I found Miss Greene to be a genial companion in travel, a powerful speaker, and one who spread missionary enthusiasm wherever she went. Truly she did us much good.

Four Conventions were held, one at Norton, May 27, 28, 29; one at Morgan Chapel, May 3, 4, 5; one at Grace Chapel on the Langley charge, Friday afternoon, June 13; and one at Kansas City, June 21 and 22.

We wrote two hundred seventeen letters, and received five dollars and forty-three cents for postage and stamps. Total expense for conventions were thirty-nine dollars and thirty-six cents; received thirty-nine dollars and sixty-six cents. Received four dollars and eighty-six cents while at LeRoy to organize a Y. M. W. B.

We are glad for the privilege to serve you and God in this capacity. May His blessing continue to rest upon us through the coming year and cause us to triumph over all obstacles and difficulties.

  - 13. That a missionary prayer service be held as near the 20th of

each month as possible, the hour of 3:00 P. M. being given wholly to prayer.
