CALLED MEETING OF THE INDIANA CONFERENCE

Fairmount, Ind., August 23rd, 1940.

The Indiana Conference convened on the campground at the call of the Chair on Friday, August 23rd, 1940 at 8:00 a. m.

After an opening prayer the President stated the purpose of the meeting and the Conference proceeded to the transaction of the business in hand.

The President expressed his desire for the approval of the Conference in appointing Edward Angell as pastor of the Laketon Charge.

A motion prevailed that we stand unanimously behind the President and his Advisory Board in the selection of a pastor for Laketon.

Adjourned upon motion.

RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF THE INDIANA CONFERENCE

1. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be open to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments. And waiving of the above resolution by a contract or lease of building must be obtained through the Board of Trustees of the Indiana Conference.

2. Be it resolved, That the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders shall require all those desiring to unite with us from any other denomination or Annual Conference to present credits equivalent to our Conference Course of Study, regardless of their standing in the body of which they have been a member, and if they cannot do this they shall be required to meet the same conditions as our local preachers before ordination.

3. That any candidate for Elder's Orders or traveling under the direction of the Conference, who fails to attend the Institutes and the examinations of the Committee, without sufficient cause, shall be deemed unworthy of the trust and care of souls, and refused a place among us as a minister of the Gospel, and when they shall fail to attend the Institute for two successive years they shall be dropped from the roll.

4. The Committee on Elder's Orders is hereby to transfer all persons to the study list who may have been recommended to travel and may not have been given work.

5. All charges with a membership of twenty-five or more shall in addition to the regular stipulated salary, assume the responsibility of providing a suitable home in which the Pastor may live.

6. Be it resolved, That it shall be the duty of the Pastors to look after the insurance of our church and parsonage properties. All insurance shall provide for losses caused by fire and lightning, hail and tornado. A failure on the part of the Pastor shall be a censurable offense. If the church fails to insure their property upon reasonable effort of the pastor to secure the same, then said failure shall be reported to the President of the Conference who shall then have the property insured. In such case all insurance monies received from losses by fire, lightning, hail, and tornado shall be used in Church Extension work as the Conference Board of Trustees deems best.

7. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the Pastor

moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said Pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided this shall not interfere with the previous arrangements between Pastors and charges. That where the Conference demands the services of any one, that it shall bear the moving expenses, if any expense shall thus be incurred.

8. Each Pastor shall file a duplicate statistical report with the Committee before the close of the fifth day of August with the exception of Pastor's salary and Membership. These items to be reported the first day of Conference, said report to be kept on file one year, and hereafter the full reports shall not be read in open Conference. The official character of any Pastor shall not be passed until he shall have submitted a satisfactory report, including statistics.

9. All unaccounted for members appearing in the statistics in the membership list shall be referred to the discontinued list. All members in excess of the number reported shall be reported received. The roll of all the classes upon the charges shall be put in the hands of the Pastors and they shall have charge of the same and make all entries therein.

10. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked by vote that the President shall receive \$35.00, the Secretary \$50.00, the Treasurer \$100.00, the Assistant Secretary \$25.00, each member of the Auditing Committee \$10.00, each member of the Statistical Committee \$25.00, Assistant to the Treasurer \$10.00, the same to be apportioned pro-rata among the various funds of the Conference. The Conference Sunday School Secretary shall receive \$50.00 and each of the other members of the Conference Sunday School Board shall receive \$25.00, the same to be paid out of the Sunday School Treasury.

11. It shall be a standing rule until revoked by this body that the President shall nominate his Advisory Board and the Conference shall elect his nominations.

12. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference that in the examination of character the Conference officials shall be called first.

13. The Conference shall elect three members of the Camp Meeting Committee, one to be elected each year for a term of three years.

14. The Pastor shall bring a report to each Quarterly Meeting and send a duplicate to the Conference President quarterly on blanks furnished by the Conference.

15. Whereas, our people are being deceived by the erroneous teaching that Divine healing of the body through faith in the atonement is the same as for sin, therefore:

Be it Resolved, That we record our belief that the healing of the body is among the gifts of the Spirit according to 1 Corinthians 12:7-11, hence not for all Christians at all times as it is not always the will of God to heal the body.

16. Let it be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked, that no charge shall call any one as pastor, or to supply the work by ministers coming from other denominations as long as there are ministers in our Conference qualified and available to take work; Further, we urgently request our President after he has exercised his prerogative in the reception of ministers coming from other denominations, to immediately refer them to the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders, who shall make a thorough investigation as to the ministry and life of such applicants, who shall report their findings to the President, after which, appointments may be made.

17. Resolved, That the Treasurers shall submit their reports to the Auditing Committee who shall audit the same and in their report to this body they shall show they have audited the same.

18. Inasmuch as the Pastor's statistics reveal the true condition of the work as much as anything that might be said, therefore be it resolved, That the Pastors report in open Conference the amount of Pastor's salary received, the amount of budget raised and the loss or gain in membership, also the number of Wesleyan Methodist papers and Wesleyan Missionary magazines taken.

19. It shall be a standing rule of the Conference until revoked that the Board of Trustees shall authorize all disbursements not otherwise provided for.

20. Let it be the standing rule of this Conference that each Pastor whose total pastor's receipts exceed \$1000.00 a year shall seek to organize a new class or give his services in a revival meeting to one of the weaker churches—whose total pastor's receipts are \$500.00 or less—to help establish it. And that the church which he pastors grant him such privileges without censure and with full remuneration of salary while in such a meeting.

21. Let it be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked that the Storehouse Tithing Plan shall be the Conference plan for financing the Church work and the following percentage basis be the rule for distributing the same: Local Church Work, 70%; Budget, 30%. Further, that a Tithing Secretary be elected and that one evening service in the Conference Session be given for a Tithing Service and all Tithing Bands or Churches of the Conference be called to give their yearly report, and that some minister be chosen to preach on the Storehouse Tithing Plan. The expenses of Tithing Literature and Postage to be paid from the Conference Claims Fund and that churches desiring literature may secure the same from the Tithing Secretary. Further, that this service be a Special Order of the Conference.

22. Let it be a standing rule of this body until revoked that the Assistant-Secretary act as reporter of the Conference and Camp Meeting to the Marion daily papers.

23. We recommend that ten percent of the "Conference Missions" Budget be applied on the arms liabilities as the nature of the liabilities demand, and, that the Conference Treasurer disburse the unrestricted receipts in the "College Building Fund" as the nature of the liabilities demand, with the approval of the Conference Board of Trustees.

24. By decision of the Conference President, the first Sunday of the Annual gathering shall belong to the old year, and the second Sunday of the Annual gathering shall belong to the new year.

25. Let it be a standing rule of this Conference that the Camp Meeting Committee nominate and the Conference elect the one to preach the opening sermon of the next Conference Year with his alternate.

26. Let it be a Standing Rule of this Conference that the President of the Conference be given each year a two weeks' vacation with pay, said vacation to be at a time of his own choosing.

27. Let it be a Standing Rule of this Conference until revoked that all building and repair on Conference property which the local church is unable to provide for satisfactorily shall pass the approval of the Conference Building Committee before obligations are assumed.

28. Resolved, That when churches which have been placed in the hands of the President, if they can and do decide as to who shall be their pastor before the Minutes are sent to the press, the same shall be entered in the minutes the same as if ordered by this Conference.

29. Let it be a Standing Rule until revoked by this Conference, That in case of an emergency the President and the Board of Trustees shall be empowered to make a special assessment to meet the need, and that the funds be sent to the Conference Treasurer and credited to the Sick Preachers Benefit fund.

30. Let it be a standing Rule of this Conference that the President of the Conference be given each year a two week's vacation with pay, said vacation to be at a time of his own choosing.

31. We recommend that each charge grant to its pastor each year a two week's vacation with pay.

32. Let it be a Standing Rule of this Conference until revoked that no pastor whose total receipts are \$1,200.00 shall hold more than two revivals yearly away from his charge, unless by consent of the President and his Advisory Committee.

REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

We are glad to be able to report to you that some progress has been made in our Sunday-school work during the past year.

Three new schools were added during the year, and an increase of three hundred eighty-four in enrollment is shown over last year, and an increase in average attendance.

In evangelistic effort we have five hundred eighty-two conversions, with two hundred fifty-one additions to the Church. This is a gain in each of these items.

The benevolences were a little less than last year.

In October of last year a series of conventions were held which were well attended and a good degree of interest was shown. We especially appreciate the splendid coöperation of our district leaders and the fellowship enjoyed.

We recommend that the conventions be held in the districts during the first two weeks of October. This work is already outlined and our Connectional Secretary and Editor will be with us in these conventions. We urge the people to learn the date of these district conventions and plan to attend.

We would like to urge our people to give more attention to our Departments. We believe that it will raise the amount of our benevolences and that much can be done by way of education along the line of temperance.

We have been grateful for the increase of interest shown in Teachers Training. There are fifty students enrolled in the Certificate Course and a total of twenty-three graduated during the past year. The Conference Secretary had the privilege of conducting graduating exercises for a class at Nelson Street and one at Lafayette. These classes add greatly to the work of the Secretary in correspondence and grading of papers, but we are glad to do this for we know it will mean much to the local Sunday school.

We recommend the continuation of the ten cents per member assessment of main school for Connectional and Conference work.

We recommend that the districts remain the same as last year and that Superintendents continue the same with the exception of the Southern District, Western Section, for this we recommend Carlos Coats as Superintendent.

With the challenge that was presented to us in the Conference sermon, may God help us to catch the vision and with loyalty to God and the Church let us indeed be on the march to take possession of more of the land before us. Whether an active Sunday-school worker or not we solicit the prayers of God's people that He may help us "Go Forward."

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND APPROPRIATIONS

We, your Committee on Finance and Appropriations, offer the following report:

Item 1. That the President shall have supervision of the work of the Conference, and shall hold at least one quarterly meeting on each charge during the year, and also shall render whatever assistance he may find necessary to the weaker charges of the Conference, as his time will permit. He shall coöperate with the pastors in the raising of their budgets and render assistance as needed in organizing the financial system of the charges to conform as nearly as possible with that adopted by the Conference. The salary of the President shall be \$1,600.00 per year and expenses incidental to his work.

Item 2. Conference Missions:

A. That the Conference be divided into sections corresponding to the Sunday-school sections as of 1938 and 1939.

B. That a Superintendent and Advisory Committee of two members be nominated for each section by the Committee on Pastoral Relations and elected by the Conference.

C. That the Sectional Superintendent and his Advisory Committee shall have authority to call to their aid evangelistic help as they may deem advisable, subject, however, to the approval of the Missionary Board, who shall have general supervision of all work in these sections; and that the traveling expenses of the Superintendents shall not exceed three cents per mile. Also, that all expenses incidental to the work in any section shall be raised, if possible, on the local field; and should there be a deficit it shall be met by the Conference Missions Arm, as funds are available.

Item 3. That the Conference Claims Budget be forwarded quarterly to the Conference Treasurer, excepting that the Quarterly Meeting Apportionment shall be paid to the President when he holds the Quarterly Meeting on the respective charges; and the Conference Treasurer shall pay the Conference President's salary and his expenses from this fund monthly.

Item 4. That the Sunday-school offerings of the first Sunday of each month be divided by the local Treasurer equally between Home and Conference Missions and shall be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer at least quarterly; and the Conference and Connectional Sunday-school Apportionment shall be ten cents per member of all enrolled in the main school.

Item 5. Since the Storehouse Tithing Plan has been adopted by this Conference as the financial plan of the Conference, we urge our churches to conform to this plan as soon as possible.

Item 6. That each church that is not using the Storehouse Tithing

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

Plan, shall elect a Board of Stewards of at least three members whose duty shall be to coöperate with the pastor in raising the budget, and that the pastor shall forward the same to the proper Treasurer at least quarterly.

Item 7. Budget:

A. In order to eliminate the burden of the tedious Sunday morning finance calls, we recommend: 1. The reduction of budget apportionment of College Building Fund to 25 cents per member and the budget item to be hereafter known as Conference College Building Debt. 2. The reduction of Superannuate Apportionment to 25 cents per member. 3. A new budget item of 75 cents per member to be known as Camp Meeting Expense Fund. 4. The Camp Meeting Committee shall have the privilege of putting out pledge cards in the congregations, receiving these pledges from friends, taking cash offerings throughout the camp, and designating one or two nights during the camp as dollar nights when the people may be asked to bring in a dollar offering on such nights.

These pledges and offerings are not to be credited on any church's budget.

B. We recommend that the Budget Apportionment per member be as follows: Foreign Missions \$2.00; Orphanage, 25 cents; Connectional Education, \$1.50; Conference Claims, 75 cents; Conference Missions, 75 cents; Home Missions, 50 cents; Conference College Building Debt, 25 cents; Superannuates Fund, 25 cents; Camp Meeting Expense Fund, 75 cents.

C. That the price of the Conference Minutes shall be 25 cents per copy, and should there be any deficit occur in this fund that it be met pro rata by the various Conference arms.

Report No. 12

RESOLUTIONS OF THE INDIANA CONFERENCE

We believe this to be the sentiment of the Indiana Conference when expression is made in appreciation of the Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society, the Y. M. W. B., the W. Y. P. S., and the Sunday school for faithful coöperation and unity in desire, faith and spirit, for their prayers, their support, their interest in the work of the kingdom, at home and abroad.

Be it Resolved, That even greater attention be given to the cause of evangelism, education, morals and reform, and the Church with her boundless interests.

THE INDIANA CONFERENCE

1. Evangelism. "Lift up your eyes and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest." The commission and challenge then is, "Go ye." We urge that every pastor and church should prayerfully, aggressively and zealously undertake evangelism, first at home, then in an adjoining community where Wesleyan Methodism is needed. This is the step toward a greater Wesleyan Methodist Church, and a step which will merit heaven's favors. This is the Church's opportunity to be the good Samaritan to a world robbed of its virtue and eternal heritage. We further urge the support of the arms of the budget which will enable this Conference to finance moves into new fields. With certainty God is calling our Church to definite Pentecostal Evangelism.

2. Education. The forces of evil as represented by Communism, Nazism, Fascism, and the general materialistic philosophies of our day all are directing their attention toward the seduction of youth. The Christian College as a training center for the Church is particularly under pressure from the skilled propagandists of these groups which seek to undermine not only the Church in America but also democratic government. Therefore, we urge our people that by their prayers, their influence, and their financial support, they stand by Marion College as the instrument through which the youth of the Church may be trained for future usefulness in the Master's kingdom.

3. Morals and Reform. There is one safe guide for moral conduct, namely, the Bible, the inspired Word of God.

We reaffirm our belief in the Biblical and disciplinary principle which will prevent further breakdown of general moral standards. That a genuine experience of salvation and vital spirituality will solve these moral problems. Be it Resolved, That we pledge our cooperation with any organization which stands with firm conviction for higher standards of ethical idealism.

We reaffirm our belief in the principle of religious freedom, free speech and freedom of press, and stand in united opposition to the present subversive organizations which attempt to eat the heart out of the constitution, wreck the Church and to steal from the individual his rights to worship in accordance with the dictates of his conscience.

We arise in protest to the unlimited debauchery of human life wrought by the liquor traffic and narcotics which is responsible for this decay of American Youth and has been licensed by the present state and federal officials.

4. Church. Resolved: That we give ourselves to a Church loyalty which demands our presence in all the services of the church; which calls for the use of our Church periodicals; which obligates us to support all arms of the work.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

That we give special attention to instruction in the Word of God and the doctrines of the Church; using the Catechism which has been provided by the General Conference, Daily Vacation Bible School material, and all other means which the Church provides for the instructing of our people.

5. Conscription. We as a Church disapprove of peace time conscription and the agitation of war, believing this will lead us to war rather than peace.

REPORT OF PLANS COMMITTEE

We, the Plans Committee, beg leave to submit the following report:

1. The Committee recommends that the Conference be divided into four divisions and that a Superintendent be elected for each division. The divisions to be as follows: The Northwestern Division, consisting of Plymouth and Wabash districts; the Northeastern Division, consisting of Fort Wayne, Warren and Bryant districts; the Southwestern Division, consisting of Bakers Corner, Kokomo and LaFayette districts; and the Southeastern Division, consisting of Shelbyville, New Castle and Fairmount districts.

2. We recommend that each district coöperate with the following state program as to rallies:

(a) Two group rallies a year to be held in each division.

(b) That each Divisional Superintendent with a corps of workers visit each charge in their division for at least one service.

We further recommend that the District President coöperate with the Divisional Superintendent while visiting their district.

(c) District rallies to be held to the satisfaction of the District.

3. We recommend that the Divisional Superintendent be given at least two weeks notification by the District Secretary as to the time and place of each District Rally, and that he attend at least one of them with expenses being paid by that District.

4. We recommend that at least one service, early in the year, include a careful study of the Connectional Constitution and that all societies work earnestly toward complete organization according to the constitution.

5. We recommend that our young people give their hearty support to the Wesleyan Methodist and Young People's Journal and the use of the same in their services.

6. (a) We recommend and urge that each district sponsor a revival, at least two weeks in length in a new field in that district, using a tent where advisable.

(b) We recommend that the Divisional Superintendent with each District President serve as an Evangelistic Committee to work in harmony with the Conference President for the promotion of evangelistic work in new fields. That this Committee shall carefully select a location in which to hold a meeting and to choose such workers as they count advisable.

7. Whereas the need of Hepzibah Orphanage in Macon, Ga. is so great, we recommend that the Conference W. Y. P. S. raise money for its assistance and forward it to the state treasury.

8. We recommend that each District coöperate as far as possible with the Connectional Home Missionary Secretary, in the Church Extension Program.

9. We recommend that the President appoint some one to meet with the Camp Meeting Committee in the selection of a Young People's Worker for the Camp Meeting.
