# JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The Lockport Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its fifty-fifth annual session in Cattaraugus Wesleyan Methodist Church, March 28, 1916, at 9 A. M.

On the previous evening a gospel sermon was preached by Rev. M. D. Warburton of the Rochester Conference.

The Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. Charles Sicard.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. D. S. Bedford.

Rev. D. H. Scott was made Committee on Credentials.

The Committee on Credentials made a partial report and the names presented were placed on the roll.

The President appointed J. S. Luckey, H. R. Barnett and Charles Lindquist a committee to make nominations for the temporary organization of the Conference.

A recess was taken for this committee to do its work.

The Conference having been again called to order by the President, the Committee appointed to make nominations for the temporary organization of the Conference reported through J. S. Luckey. The report was considered item by item, and adopted as read. See Report No. 1.

The bar of the Conference was made to include the first five seats across the body of the church.

The time of opening and closing Conference meetings was fixed as follows: Morning meetings to open at 9 A. M. and close at 11:30 A. M.; the afternoon meetings to open at 1:30 P. M. and close by vote.

The Committee on Credentials made a partial report and the names presented were added to the roll.

Rev. W. W. Rolf, of the Allegheny Conference, was introduced. Rev. D. H. Scott was elected to fill a vacancy on the Committee on Statistical Reports.

Rev. M. D. Warburton, of the Rochester Conference, was introduced.

Conference adjourned by vote. Benediction by Rev. W. W. Rolf.

# First Day-Afternoon Meeting, March 28

The Conference was called to order by the President. Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. H. R. LaVere. After the calling of the roll the minutes were read and approved.

Conference adjourned by vote. Benediction by Rev. N. F. Robb.

# Second Day-Morning Meeting, March 29

Conference was called to order by the President. The devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. Walter Readett.

The roll was called, and the minutes were read and approved. In the absence of credentials, Clare Baker, of the Allegany charge, having been duly elected, was seated as a delegate.

A partial report of the Committee on Credentials was adopted and the names presented were placed on the roll.

Mrs. N. J. Peck was made Conference Reporter.

The President's report was received and by vote was considered item by item. The report was adopted and the financial statement referred to the Board of Trustees and to the Auditing Committee. See Report No. 2.

A resolution referring to the establishment of a Bureau of Information by the Missionary Board was presented by H. R. Barnett.

The resolution was adopted. See Resolution No. 1.

A petition to have the name of the Huntley and Castle Garden charge changed to the Driftwood charge was referred to the Committee on Boundaries.

A recess was taken subject to the call of the President.

# Second Day-Afternoon Meeting, March 29

The Conference was called to order by the President.

Rev. George Bathurst conducted devotionals.

After the calling of the roll, the minutes were read and approved.

The Committee on Credentials made partial report, which was adopted and the names presented placed on the roll.

The names of the following ministers were called and their characters passed: George E. Bathurst, William Donaldson, H. R. LaVere, D. S. Bedford, W. A. Hazlett and J. L. Benton.

Rev. J. L. Benton's request to be placed on the Superannuated List was referred to the Committee on Pastoral Relations.

Reverends Merrill, pastor of the Cattaraugus Methodist Episcopal Church, Conrad Bachman, pastor of the German Lutheran church, and J. S. Willett, Connectional Agent and Treasurer, were introduced.

The election of Conference officers was made the order of the day for Thursday at 10 A. M.

All special orders were referred to the Committee on Religious Services.

On motion Conference adjourned to the call of the President.

# Third Day-Morning Meeting, March 30

Conference was called to order by the President.

Rev. G. H. Clarke conducted devotions, after which the roll was called and the minutes read and approved.

The Committee on Credentials reported additional names which were placed on the roll.

Rev. N. J. O'Brien and Rev. F. C. Adams, of the Champlain Conference, were introduced.

The Committee on Religious Services reported special orders which were adopted as follows: Thursday A. M., following election of Conference officers, the vote on the Tobacco Amendment; Thursday 2 P. M., Publishing interests; Friday 10 A. M., Sunday School interests, Aggressive Evangelism and Budget Commission; Friday 2 P. M., Public meeting of the W. H. & F. M. Society; Saturday 2 P. M., Educational interests.

The names of the following ministers were called and their

characters passed: Walter Readett, D. H. Scott, C. B. Whitaker, J. R. Babcock and G. H. Clarke.

The Committee on Credentials reported a name which was placed on the roll.

Miss Grace Cole presented the financial report of Bethesda Home. See Report No. 3.

Tithing Secretary, H. R. Barnett, presented his report, which was adopted. See Report No. 4.

The order of the day having arrived, the President appointed Walter Readett and Harry Morley as tellers.

The whole number of votes cast for President was 37, of which Rev. Charles Sicard received 27 and was declared elected.

In the absence of the regularly elected delegate, E. S. Davidson, an alternate, was seated as delegate from Houghton charge by vote of Conference.

The whole number of votes cast for Vice-President was 37, of which Rev. J. R. Babcock received 32 and was declared elected.

The Committee on Credentials reported a name which was added to the roll.

The whole number of votes cast for Secretary was 37, of which D. S. Bedford received 35 and was declared elected.

By vote the Secretary was given the privilege of nominating the Assistant Secretary.

The name of E. S. Davidson was presented and the tellers were instructed to cast the ballot of the Conference for him as Assistant Secretary.

The whole number of votes cast for Treasurer was 38, of which Rev. H. R. LaVere received 36 and was declared elected.

Conference adjourned by limitation of time.

# Third Day-Afternoon Meeting, March 30

The Conference was called to order by the President.

After the calling of the roll, the minutes were read and approved.

Rev. F. C. Adams was received upon his transfer from the Champlain Conference.

The whole number of votes cast for Conference Sunday School Secretary was 36, of which Rev. C. B. Whitaker received 21 and was declared elected.

On motion H. R. Barnett was elected Tithing Secretary.

The whole number of votes cast for first ministerial member of the Board of Trustees was 41, of which Rev. Charles Sicard received 36 and was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for second ministerial member of the Board of Trustees was 41, of which Rev. Herbert LaVere received 36 and was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for lay member of the Board of Trustees was 39, of which Henry R. Barnett received 35 and was declared elected.

The following standing committees were elected by acclamation: Advisory Board: E. B. Houghton, J. R. Babcock.

Judiciary Committee: H. W. McDowell, D. S. Bedford, C. B. Whitaker, H R. LaVere.

Missionary Board: H. W. McDowell, President of the W. H. & F. M. Society, Mrs. F. E. Gentle, G. H. Clarke and President ex-officio.

On motion the Committee on Nominations for temporary organization was asked to bring in nominations for the remaining committees.

The order of the day was taken up and the Conference voted upon the proposed Tobacco Amendment. The whole number of votes cast was 38, those favoring 19, those opposing 19.

Rev. J. S. Willett, Connectional Agent and Treasurer, presented the Connectional interests.

The names of the following ministers were called and their characters passed: N. E. Heald, R. McConnell, A. J. Taylor.

By vote the Statistical Committee was authorized to make incomplete reports tally with last year.

Conference Secretary was ordered to secure the publication of 300 copies of the Conference Minutes and distribute on the same basis as formerly.

After a general discussion, the matter of changing the time for the sessions of the Annual Conference was referred to a committee, and D. S. Bedford, C. B. Whitaker and E. B. Houghton constituted such a committee.

After informal discussion, the matter referring to a Traveling President was placed in the hands of a Committee. J. S. Luckey, Walter Readett, H. R. Barnett, E. A. Purdy and H. R. LaVere were constituted such a committee.

Conference adjourned.

Conference adjourned by vote to the call of the President.

# Report No. 5-Sunday School Board

We believe the Sunday School to be one of the most important branches of church work. It is the Church engaged in the study of God's Word, with the ultimate aim of "leading men to Christ, training them up in Christ, and sending them out for Christ." The work of the Sunday School is more largely preservative than reformatory. It deals with the child in his most impressionable period of life and

seeks to pre-occupy the soil of the soul by placing in it the good seed of the Kingdom of God. It deals with the young people at the period of their greatest danger from the unholy influences of an ungodly world. It gives to the middle-aged an opportunity to work for Christ in the most altruistic service, and to the old an opportunity to perfect their own knowledge of the blessed Word of God and to lend their influence to the cause of righteousness. The Sunday School should be fervent in its spirit, sound in its teachings of revealed truth, and helpful as an influence and working force in the community. We hope the time may soon come when our Sunday Schools shall be more earnest in their evangelistic efforts as well as more efficient in their methods. To this end we recommend the following for your consideration:

- 1. That the conventions be continued, and so far as possible be arranged for before the close of Conference.
- 2. That all our schools begin at once to bring themselves to the efficiency of our denomination, and especially would we recommend the organization of a teachers' training class.
- 3. That the Conference Sunday School Secretary be requested to attend the State Convention, and that the necessary railroad expense be paid out of the Conference budget.
- 4. That the pastors be more diligent in carrying out the disciplinary instructions for putting their schools under the control of the Church, and having the full report of their schools made at each Quarterly Conference.
- 5. That each pastor devote at least one regular service to present the interests of Sunday School work.
- 6. We recommend that the pastors and superintendents give more attention to Cradle Roll and Home Departments as a means of extending the influence of the Sunday School and stimulating greater interest in Bible study.
- 7. That the pastors urge upon the teachers their opportunity for evangelism, and that systematic effort be made to bring the pupils to Christ and into the Church.
- 8. That every effort be made to organize mission schools in outlying districts with a view to evangelism and the formation of churches.

# Report No. 15-Committee on Budget

1. The part of the budget for Education is \$1,000.00, and all money paid for current expenses of Houghton Seminary, all money paid on Educational pledges for Houghton Seminary, and all interest (but not principal) paid on Educational notes for Houghton Seminary may count toward this budget.

2. The part of the budget for Home and Foreign Missions is \$1,000.00, and all money paid for current expenses for Home and Foreign Missions, all money appropriated for this purpose by the W. H. & F. M. Society, and all money paid by the Y. M. W. B., may be counted toward this budget.

3. We recommend that the part of the budget for Conference be \$1,000.00; that nothing but cash may count toward this budget, and that this amount shall cover all Conference expenses except the funds for Superannuated Ministers.

4. We recommend that the charges raise all three parts of the budget as a whole; that this total budget shall be raised and paid over quarterly; that for all money not paid to the Conference Treasurer a duplicate receipt shall be given, which receipt shall be given to the Conference Treasurer; that it shall be optional with each charge to divide this total budget or to pay it over undivided,

and that undivided parts must be paid to the Conference Treasurer.

- 5. If a charge divided its total budget, we recommend that this rule be followed: All money designated by the donor shall be placed in the fund designated, but all money not designated by the donor shall be so distributed that, so far as possible, each fund, including the sums designated for that fund, shall have the same per cent of its apportionment. This rule shall apply until each fund is complete; after that the charge shall divide as it sees fit.
- 6. We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be instructed to remit to the Connectional Treasurer at least quarterly all money received definitely for Education, or definitely for Missionary work, but that undivided budget may be retained until it is evident where it will be needed to maintain a balance between the benevolences, and should then be distributed so as to maintain this balance.
- 7. We recommend that no charge shall receive credit on its budget except for cash or receipts sent to the Conference Treasurer.
- 8. We recommend that each pastor shall include in his statistical report these items: Total budget assigned, and total budget raised; that the second item shall not be filled in till the pastor has settled with the Conference Treasurer, and that the amount placed in this second item shall be the amount reported to the pastor by the Conference Treasurer.
- 9. We recommend that the Conference authorize each pastor to hand the Budget Committee at the next Annual Conference a list of the members on his charge under sixteen years of age, provided he declares that he knows personally each one on the list is under sixteen. This list shall then be deducted from the number determining budget apportionment on that charge.
- 10. We recommend that Allegany, Hamburg, Olean and Bradford be rated at three-fourths membership; that Cameron, Higgins, Wyoming and Short Tract be rated at one-half membership; that Delevan and Machias, Holland, Napoli and Westons Mills be rated at one-fourth membership, and that the total budget be then apportioned pro rata. On this basis the apportionment is as follows:

Haines, Surveyor, be is further

Resolved, that said Conference take such legal steps as may be necessary to obtain said record title to said real estate, and also to sell and convey the same for a sum not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), and that we hereby appoint Henry R. Barnett, one of our Board, to act for us in the premises; and hereby authorize and empower him and the officers and Trustees of this Conference to execute all petitions, deeds and other legal papers, and to do and perform all necessary acts and things in order to carry this resolution into effect.

On motion, the Secretary in notifying the Organizer of her election should say that owing to her home duties the society does not expect her to travel, but to hold a supervisory relation, directing the work through correspondence and securing dates for missionaries to speak, etc., aiming at a W. H. and F. Missionary Society and a Y. M. W. B. on every charge, but would be glad to have her hold meetings as is convenient for her.

On motion, fifty cents (\$.50) be drawn from the Treasury to pay Mrs. Peck for postage.

Meeting called to order by the President. Singing.

Devotionals were led by Sister Grace Cole.

Minutes were read, corrected and approved.

Committee on Credentials rendered a further report, which was adopted and names placed on roll.

Olean, Forestville and Cameron Societies reported.

Sister Cole gave a very encouraging report of the work in Bethesda Home, told some of the needs in the way of furnishings for the Home, also told us something of the condition the girls are in when brought to the Home and their improvement while there.

Brother George Clarke spoke for a few minutes on the African work. As ever, he is full of interest in the foreign work and has great hopes for the future.

Mrs. Sicard rendered a further report of the Y. M. W. B., which included plans for increasing the membership and offerings. Report was adopted.

Mrs. Sicard brought an inspiring mesasge from Sister Hartson, whose heart is full of love for the work that God has called her to, and faith that there are better days in store for the Band.

On motion, Mrs. Crandall was given a rising vote of thanks for the faithful and efficient work as Treasurer of the Missionary Society.

Meeting adjourned, subject to the call of the chair.

A public missionary meeting was held in the church Friday afternoon. Mrs. N. R. Shaffer read the Scriptures and offered prayer. Alitha Wilder sang, after which Irene Luce gave a recitation. Sister Hartson sent greetings by Brother Willett, who presented them in his usual enthusiastic manner when talking on the Band work. If every pastor could get a vision of the possibilities of the Y. M. W. B. such as Brother Willett has we are sure that branch of the work would be pushed this coming year as never before. Sister Fero read a most interesting and instructive paper, subject, "Beginning at Jerusalem," impressing us with the thought that while we are to reach out and help those who are in the darkened lands across the seas, there are those near at home who need a helping hand, and we

must not neglect them. A male quartet sang, after which Brother Sicard preached an excellent missionary sermon. Then for a few minutes Brother Clarke presented the African work, dwelling upon the need of preparation for manual training for the boys, making a plea for funds toward this end, which was responded to in pledges and an offering amounting to \$121. Brother Whitaker asked God's blessing upon the offering, after which Brother Fero pronounced the benediction.

Sister Cole would be glad to correspond with the President of any Society desiring to do this kind of work. The plan of work suggested was approved by the Society.

The President read a letter from Sister Dickens, also one from Brother Roberts, of Alabama. Both were full of encouragement and hopes for the future. Sister Dickens wrote of the need of text books on cooking and dressmaking, to be used in the school.

On motion, the Secretary was instructed to correspond with Sister Viola Dickens and instruct her to buy the needed text books and draw an order on the treasury of this Conference Society for a sum not to exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) to pay for the same.
