Standing Rules

- 1. The Treasurer shall be paid \$25.00 and the Secretary \$15.00 per year for their services.
- 2. Nominating Committee—There shall be four elected members and the President who is to be chairman. Two elected members to be elders and two lay delegates, to be designated by the selection of local churches who's delegate is to serve. It is understood that members of this committee are not to be from the same church.
- 3. That each pastor will have a two weeks vacation with pay, or if he desires to hold a two weeks meeting, that this will be considered in lieu of his vacation.
- 4. The President and his Advisory Board are designated a Deed Examing Committee. This committee shall inspect each deed for church or conference property before it is registered, and see that it contains the necessary disciplinary provisions to secure the property to the conference. It shall be the duty of each person charged with the responsibility of negotiating for or handling any deed for the church or conference properties to submit such a deed to the deed examining committee for inspection and approval before offering it for registration.
- 5. That any work or worker using the name "Weselyan Methodist" within the boundaries of this Annual Conference must have the approval of the Annual Conference or the President and his Advisory Board.
- 6. That no new work be organized until all involved property is duly deeded to the Annual Conference and local trustees, or such steps are being taken and has the approval of the Conference Trustees.
- 7. The date of the Annual Conference and Camp meeting shall begin the fourth Tuesday in June.
- 8. Fiscal year—the closing date of the fiscal year shall be May 31st. The Conference Treasurer's books close June 7th and no money or receipts shall be honored after that date. The Treasurer shall forward the statistical blanks to the statistical chairman.
- 9. The introduction of all new business of such nature as to require an election, must be presented not later than noon of the third day of Conference.
- 10. The Camp meeting and Campground committee shall also be the permanent Orders of the Day committee. They shall prepare the Conference and Camp meeting program in advance for publication.

- 11. Inasmuch as the pastor and delegates are actually representatives of the local church at the Annual Conference, we recommend the local church pay the expenses in advance of their pastor and delegates. This is to include transportation, meals, and lodging.
- 12. That each of our churches release their pastor, if on call and under the direction of the Conference President and his Advisory Board, to hold one evangelistic meeting on a new field or in one of the weaker charges, and that the local church continue to pay his salary during his absence.
- 13. The election of Conference officers shall be in the morning meeting of the third day of Conference.
- 14. The Conference Weselyan Youth President shall be a member of the Camp meeting Committee.
- 15. Each pastor is to take an offering at each Quarterly Conference for the Conference President's traveling expense. This is not to apply on Budget credit but is to be receipted to Conference Work Fund.
- 16. The Conference President shall be reimbursed for his traveling expense at .05 per mile. This to be paid from the Conference Work Fund..
- 17. The Conference President is to visit the local churches as he sees the need.
 - 18. Quarterly Conference business meetings to be held as follows: First Quarter—Last Wednesday in August Second Quarter—Last Wednesday in November Third Quarter—Last Wednesday in February Fourth Quarter—Immediately after May 31st.

When special services or other conditions make it inadvisable, observe a close date.

19. All pastors are to read these standing rules to his local church at least one month before Annual Conference. Furthermore, each pastor pay special attention to notes on the statistical blanks and to the first paragraph in particular.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Part I

To the members of the Seventh Annual Conference of Florida. God has helped us in the last conference year. We are aware of the fact that we have nothing to boast about, but for many things do we praise our Heavenly Father.

This has been a year of planning, investigating and work. We put quite a bit of manual labor on some of our churches. We made surveys for prospects of new works and did our best to get some pioneer work going.

With the gift of a \$1000.00 from Brother James Myers, we were able to make the down payment of the lots in West Tampa. The conference is carrying on the payments out of our Conference Church Extension Fund. Brother Leonard Catron, local preacher of the St. Petersburg Church has made several calls in the community and the prospects are good.

We are sure that there is a great future and need for the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Florida. First, because of the many thousands who are making their homes in Florida. Second, because of the industries that are coming here. Third, because of the heritage associated with the term Methodist, the inclusion of this term in our name impresses many people to come; then we have the opportunity to give them the Gospel. We do not claim to be the only church that has God's smile and blessing, but in churches that we have organized, we have reached some people for Christ that others have not been able to reach. That makes me realize that the more churches we get organized the more people we will be able to bring to Christ.

I have a burning desire to see many of our churches built in this state so we might unite our prayers as a force against the Devil and pray down a Pentecost in these unsettled, strenuous, wicked modern times. Pray so that people will cry out, "What must we do to be saved?" My heart longs to see more become acquainted with Him.

Official Acts of the year:

April 24, 1955 received a letter of transfer from the South Georgia Conference for Rev. D. W. Williams.

June 21-29, 1955 served as delegate to the General Conference at Fair-mount, Indiana.

September 17, 1955 appointed T. A. Wilkins as pastor of the Pine

Island Church, who later had to leave because of ill health.

January 9, 1956 served on the Board of Trustees at Central, South Carolina.

February 4, 1956 the trustees voted to buy the land in West Tampa to start a new church. This is located at the corner of Pearl and Manhattan, a house partly finished and four lots for \$2800.00.

February 4, 1956 met with trustees to discuss selling the New Zion Church to Brother Hamrick for \$175.00. They voted to sell, since the New Zion congregation and the Pine Island congregation voted to unite and go to the Pine Island Church.

April 17-19 attended Leader's Conference at Central, South Carolina.

April 26, 1956 took some of the Conference Trustees to Perry, Florida to investigate some land for a new church.

June 4, 1956 appointed Brother Leonard Catron, a local preacher in the St. Petersburg Church, to take the West Tampa work.

COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

Dropped Standing rule No. 1.

No. 2 to become No. 1 and amended to read—The Treasurer shall be paid \$25.00, and the Secretary \$15.00 per year for their services.

No. 3 to become No. 2 and amended to read—Nominating Committee—there shall be four elected members and the President who is to be chairman. Two elected members to be elders and two lay delegates, to be designated by the selection of local churches who's delegate is to serve. It is understood that members of this committee are not to be from the same church.

No. 4 to become No. 3 and read the same.

No. 5 to become No. 4 and read the same.

No. 5—resolved that any work or worker using the name "Wesleyan Methodist" within the boundaries of this Annual Conference must have the approval of the Annual Conference or the President and his Advisory Board.

No. 6—resolved that no new work shall be organized until all involved property is duly deeded to the Annual Conference and local trustees, or such steps are being taken and has the approval of the Conference Trustees.

No. 7-Date of the Annual Conference and Camp meeting shall begin

the fourth Tuesday in June.

No. 8—Fiscal year—the closing date of the fiscal year shall be May 31st. The Conference Treasurer's books close June 7th and no money or receipts shall be honored after that date. The Treasurer shall forward the statistical blanks to the statistical chairman.

No. 9—Resolved that the introduction of all new business of such nature as to require an election must be presented not later than noon of the third day of Conference.

No. 10—The Camp meeting and Campground committee shall also bethe permanent Orders of the Day Committee. They shall prepare the Conference and Camp meeting program in advance for publication.

No. 11—Inasmuch as the pastor and delegates are actually representatives of the local church at the Annual Conference, we recommend the local church pay the expenses, in advance, of their pastor and delegates, this to

include transportation, meals, and lodging.

No. 12—We earnestly request each of our churches to release their pastor, if on call and under the direction of the Conference President and his Advisory Board, to hold one evangelistic meeting on a new field or in one of the weaker charges, and that the local church continue to pay his salary during his absence.

No. 13—The election of Conference officers shall be in the morning meeting of the third day of Conference.

No. 14—The Conference Wesleyan Youth President shall be a member of the Camp meeting Committee.

No. 15—Each pastor is to take an offering at each Quarterly Conference for the Conference President's traveling expense. This is not to apply on Budget credit but is to be receipted to Conference Work Fund.

No. 16—The Conference President shall be reimbursed for his traveling expense at .05 per mile. This to be paid from the Conference Work Fund.

No. 17—Resolved that the Conference President visit the local churches as he sees the need.

No. 18—Quarterly Conference Business meeting to be held as follows:

First Quarter—Last Wednesday in August Second Quarter—Last Wednesday in November Third Quarter—Last Wednesday in February Fourth Quarter—Immediately after May 31st

We request that these dates be observed. When special services or other conditions make it inadvisable, observe a close date.

No. 19—We request all pastors to read these standing rules to his local church at least one month before Annual Conference. Further, we request, all pastors pay special attention to notes on the statistical blanks and to the first paragraph in particular.
