Standing Rules

1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of his church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deeds and who is empowered to rent safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable Conference papers, the Conference to pay rent on space.
2. The President and his advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for the churches, parsonages, or other Conference property to be submitted to them for examination before being recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.
3. That each pastor is to bring his statistical report in full ready to be read the first day of Conference.
4. All pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their reports.
5. Our members are solicited to faithfulness in tithing and our churches are to consider the storehouse plan.
6. The campmeeting and Conference are to be held together with the date of Conference to be set by the Book Committee with the suggestion that if possible it be incorporated at the beginning or at the close of Campmeeting.
7. That each year there shall be held at least one Ministerial Institute.
8. That an assessment of 25¢ per member yearly for a General Conference Delegates Fund be provided for.

9. That each local church is responsible to pay moving expenses of the pastor whom they have called.
10. The standing rules of the Conference are to be included in the minutes from year to year.

Plan of Work

1. That we observe the red Letter Days as recorded
in the efficiency each using own schedule.

2. That each society raise the assignment of six dollars as far as possible for Home Missions.
3. That the plan of work, Moral Reform, and reminders be read at least four times a year.
4. That our dues be \$1.00 a year, twenty-five cents of the dues be sent through the Conference Treasurer. Also, that twenty-five cents should be retained in the Conference Society for expenses, and that twenty-five cents be placed in the General Conference Delegate Fund, and that the remaining twenty-five cents be applied on the church budget to be voted out as each society desires. We urge all money be sent through the Conference Treasury.
5. That all books be closed and the money sent in fourteen days before opening of Annual Conference session, no money to be received after Conference and local treasurer's books are closed.
6. That we continue the use of Quadrennial books and that the receipts be brought with the annual report, striving to measure up to the standard of efficiency in our societies and putting the grade on the report.
7. That each society contribute canned goods, fruits and vegetables for the pinning room, also, that each society bring two quarts of jelly or jam and a gallon of pickles.
8. That each president appoint a committee of two to visit the sick.
9. That we urge the use of prayer cycles supplied by the Conference President as a stimulus to more earnest prayer.

10. That each society provide bandages, Biblepictures charts, and cards to be collected and sent in at the notice of the Missionary headquarters,
11. That one joint Missionary Convention be held this year and that each district hold at least one convention under the direction of their organizer.
12. That the president of each local society arrange with the pastor for one public meeting each month to pray especially for missions at home and abroad.
13. We recommend that each organizer be invited to visit each local society in her district once during the year.
14. That our president correspond with some missionary recently returned from the field arranging a plan whereby he or she may travel the Conference.
15. That each society select a solicitor for the Wesleyan Missionary.
16. That November be Men and Missions month. Program shall be sponsored by the men.
17. That an effort be made by each society to secure subscriptions to the Card Call plan either by individuals or by societies.
18. That each society establish a Circulating Missionary library and thereby stimulate the reading of Missionary books, and that record of books read be kept by each reader on Work Chart. (Library to be in hand of librarian elected by society) Allow no books to become part of library which have not first been approved by the pastor of the church and president of the society.

Moral Reforms

We find from the study of God's word that His chosen people fell into carelessness, first, because they did not take time to be holy, and they began to desire to be like other people. They failed to cast out the enemies that God had told them to utterly destroy and as a result again and again they fell into terrible bondage.

Similarly, many people today desire to look like others, first excusing then condoning the appearances, the conversation, and practices of the world.

We believe that womanhood guides our nation in her choice for right and wrong, and we urge our women to consistent and deep spiritual christian living. I Timothy 2:9-10 "In like manner also that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; Not with broided hair, or gold or pearls, or costly array, but which becometh godliness with good works."

As the time draws nearer to the coming of our Lord, we feel urgently more than ever the need of denouncing the many sins of our land, we would denounce anew the movies, the dance, public bathing places, popular music, and popular fiction. Since the prevalence of semi-nudeness among children young people is destroying all sense of modesty in this war emergency, we would very earnestly beg that our missionary women refrain from dressing their children and themselves to any degree in banknets, shorts, slacks, (Deuteronomy 22:5) coulottes and sunsuits. We urge that for Jesus sake our Missionary women refrain from short sleeves, short skirts, and form fitting dresses. Like wise from adornment of jewelry of any form.

We believe in the natural adornment of hair dress as becometh holiness and do denounce beauty parlors

or any such places.

May our Wesleyan homes speak of the one whom we serve. May they be neat clean, but modestly furnished. Let us sift from our magazine racks and library tables such questionable magazines and story papers as introduce the deeds of sin and the movies into our homes and see that only religious papers or other clean, wholesome reading material is placed before our children and before any who may be entertained or chance into our homes. Let us earnestly seek to glorify God with the songs and music used and seen on our pianos and radios.

There is a tide of irreverence sweeping through our churches today from the pulpit to the pew that is bringing disastrous results to our services and we fear, greatly greiving the Spirit of our God. While it is most noticeable among children in their behavior during services, we find among adults a tendency to irreverence in visiting before services, entering services during prayer to the extent of disturbing those praying, whispering and holding consultations during prayer and song services. In Ecclesiastes 5:1 this admonition is given: "Keep thy foot when thou goest to the house of God, and be more ready to hear, than to sacrifice of fools: for they consider not they they do evil." Older children and even young people visit and read Sunday School literature during services. We believe this is displeasing to God and is bringing a reproach upon our churches.

These are days when most of us are prospering financially. There is a temptation to self-indulgence and unnecessary spending but may we as true followers of Jesus practice self-denial by refraining from excess spending for such items as Coca-Colas, soft drinks, and various confections. Let us be true stewards of the money God has entrusted to us, always keeping in mind the furtherance of the kingdom of Christ. May we be faithful in holding the standards of His word High, always remembering that we are to walk through this world as

as living epistles of His love and grace.
