STANDING RULES

- I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.
- II. All visiting members of our own, or other churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.
- III. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.
- IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.
- V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his services in caring for the funds.
- VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.
- VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the Camp Meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee, or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpected balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.
- VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.
- IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

STANDING RULES-Continued

- X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.
- XI. The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.
- XII. In securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church shall be secured, if this can be done.
- XIII. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers, and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.
- XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.
- XV. The offerings for Superannuated Ministers shall be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.

Tuesday Evening Service

Wednesday Morning Session, July 6, 1932

The President's annual report was called for and given. See Report. This report was adopted as read.

Business.—Motion was made and carried that Conference elect the Committee on Pastoral Relations. Elders elected: W. F. Lewis, H. R. LaVere, A. J. Allen. Laymen: F. D. Mattoon, M. B. Wells and Charles Dayton.

Conference adjourned to meet at 1:30, to give place for committee work. Closed by benediction.

Wednesday Afternoon Session

Devotionals were conducted by the President. Brothers Hewitt and Jock offered prayer.

Business.—Roll call. Thirteen Elders, 1 Licentiate, 1 Deaconess and 15 Delegates answered to their names.

The name of E. D. Carpenter was called, and he gave his report as General Evangelist. His character was passed.

Time for the Order of the Day having come, the Houghton hour, Conference business gave way to this order. Mr. Lynford Sicard had charge of the Houghton hour and gave an address, also a report of Houghton College. The Houghton quartette sang two numbers at this time. Business.—Roll was called, to which 7 Elders, 4 Licentiates, 1 Deaconess and 13 Delegates responded.

Minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

Motion was made and carried that Howard Chapman be Superintendent of Young People's Society, also Convention Director. Elected as his assistants, Superintendent of the Y. M. W. B. and Conference Sunday School Secretary.

The Order of the Day having been fixed for this time, the Tithing Secretary, Dennis Osgood, gave his report. Report was accepted.

Report of Committee on Resolutions was given and accepted.

Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave their report, which was accepted. See Report.

Conference gave way to the Order of the Day, a memorial service in memory of Sister Flora Carpenter and Sister Jennie Wright. This meeting was in charge of the W. H. & F. M. Society. See their Report.

Conference again resumed business.

Report of the Committee on Pastoral Relations was called for, given and accepted. See Report.

Report of Committee on Apportionment was given, and accepted as corrected. See Report.

Motion was made and carried that the Conference get a court order for the transfer of the West Chazy church and parsonage from the local trustees to the Champlain Conference, Conference to bear the necessary expense.

Motion was made and carried that E. D. Carpenter be authorized to secure the necessary papers for the transfer of this and other properties that need to be transferred in the Conference.

Adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by Brother E. D. Carpenter.

Saturday Afternoon Session

PLAN OF WORK FOR LOCAL SOCIETIES

We recommend the following Plan of Work:

- 1. That each Local Society shall have some Missionary Study or Program at each meeting to enlighten our minds, broaden our vision and inspire our hearts to pray definitely for the missionary work in all its branches.
- 2. That each Society shall have a solicitor, who will earnestly endeavor to get new subscribers and keep account of renewals to the Wesleyan Missionary.
- 3. That all money raised by the Society shall be used for missionary work, and no money be paid out without a vote of the Society.
- 4. That one of the two Statistical Blanks sent to each Society, after being carefully filled out, is to be given to the Statistical Committee at the beginning of the Conference, the other to be retained by the Delegate and later read to the Local Society. Receipts and disbursments must be made to balance before being placed in the hands of the Statistical Committee.
- 5. That all missionary boxes be given proper credit, but not in the column with cash receipts and disbursements.
- 6. That all goods sent to our mission fields shall be sent to the pastors in charge of said work.
- 7. That the use of the Thank Offering Boxes be continued in each Local Society.
- 8. That we do not forget the sending of supplies to the foreign missionary fields, such as bandages, religious books, pictures or calendars.
