Journal of Daily Proceedings

The first sitting of the Eighty-First session of the Wisconsin Annual Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle of the Burr Campground at 9:10 a. m., Tuesday, July 17, 1951.

Devotional Period—Rev. Tilman Hicks led the song service; Rev. Harold Johnson presiding at the piano. The Scripture lesson was read by our Conference President, the Rev. Loring Peterson; reading from I Cor. 13—then calling upon the Vice-President, Rev. Lloyd King to lead us to the throne of grace in prayer.

Conference Sermon—Rev. I. J. Butcher, pastor of the Hillsboro Charge brought to us the Conference Sermon. For a Scripture he chose II John Verse 8 "Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward." Rev. Butcher's theme was, "Values we may gain, and values we may lose." He mentioned the thought that "Values gained may be lost"—The responsibility of the ministry to present Christ to lost men—bringing us excerpts from the book "Ancient Fires on Modern Altars" by Bishop Adna Wright Leonard. Said Rev. Butcher, "We need to look to selves by: Waiting before Him—until—; By keeping all adjustments made, with God and with man; By living on the positive side; By living like we have the best thing in the world, which we have; and By having, and keeping the Spirit of Jesus." He then mentioned the rewards here in this life and the thought of eternal reward.

Communion Service—this was in charge of Rev. J. B. Clawson, assisted by a number of the brethren. As we partook of the sacred emblems, "God came down our souls to meet; and glory crowned the mercy seat."

Business Session—called to order by the Conference President, Rev. Loring Peterson.

Roll Call—showed 27 Ministers present.

Committee on Credentials—By motion Ronald Heavilin was made committee on Credentials—report of this committee showed 25 delegates present.

Bar of Conference—By motion the first 10 seats of the center section of the tabernacle are to serve as the Bar of the Conference.

Time of Conference—By motion the time of conference be the same as last year, namely: from 9:00 a. m. until 12:00 noon; and from 2:15 p. m. until 5:15 p. m.

Committee on Committees—Motion carried the committee on committees be as follows: Loring Peterson, Chairman; L. W. King, G. M. Hahn; Mrs. Spangler and Merle Kimpel.

The Vice-President was called to the chair—our Conference President brought to us a number of items for consideration—by the budget commit-

tee; Committee on minutes etc. Motion carried that a rising vote of thanks be given our Conference President for his labors among us.

Adjourned for Committee Work to the call of the Chair—adjourned by limitations of time.

Tuesday Afternoon Session—July 17, 1951

Devotional Period—Ronald Heavilin in charge of song service; Sister C. H. Butcher presiding at the piano. Song—"Near the Cross." Rev. Lloyd King read from God's Word—Eph. 5:1-7—Gilbert Mortimer led us in prayer.

Roll Call showed 28 Ministers and 27 Delegates present.

Committee on Credentials—gave a partial report; Credentials of Anna Walker of Trippeville; and Len Carlson of the Woodland Charge accepted. Given a seat within the Bar of Conference.

Minutes of the last session read and approved as read.

Committee on Committees gave their report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 12.)

Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day excused for work.

Courtesy Committee—presented Rev. O. S. Warner to the Conference—testimony; Mrs. Len Carlson of Woodland and Mr. and Mrs. Royal Bailie also presented.

Partial Report of Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day—Tuesday evening service, Rev. Roy S. Nicholson; Wednesday morning devotions, Rev. O. S. Warner; Wednesday 10:00 a. m. Orders of the Day—Election of Conference Officers; Wednesday afternoon devotions, Rev. Tilman Hicks; Wednesday evening service to be the Missionary Service. This partial report adopted.

President's Report—The Vice-President called to the Chair and the President, Rev. Loring Peterson gave his report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 1.)

Adjourned for Committee work to the Call of the Chair; Adjourned by limitation of time.

Wednesday Morning Session—July 18, 1951

Devotional Period—Rev. Clarence Titus led the song service. Sang "All for Jesus"—The devotions were in charge of Rev. O. S. Warner, past president of the Wisconsin Conference and one of the oldest elders in our midst. He read from I John 3—then brought to us some of his experiences. Rev. Carl Holder led us in prayer.

Roll Call showed 25 Ministers—28 delegates present.

Committee on Credentials—partial report—Charles Clock from Beulah seated.

Courtesy Committee presented Dr. R. S. Nicholson, our Connectional

President—also Rev. and Mrs. W. H. Titus of Iowa. These gave their testimony.

Minutes of the last session read and approved as read.

Memorial Service—motion carried that Rev. C. H. Butcher be chairman of a committee to arrange for a memorial service; he to draft others as he needed.

Pastor's Reports—L. W. King, Eau Claire Charge; Mrs. King her testimony; Harold Johnson of Baraboo.

Courtesy Committee—presented Mrs. Lienard of Kansas City, testimony.

Partial Report of Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day—Connectional Address, Wednesday at 2:30 p. m.

Orders of the Day—Wed. 10:00 a. m. Election of Officers.

Tellers—Carl Holder, Chairman; Ernest Friebe, David Peterson, Harold Johnson. Motion that the tellers retire to canvass the vote. Motion carried that the first ballot be an electing ballot.

By vote the following were elected: President, Loring Peterson; Vice-President, L. W. King; Secretary, Sylvia Lee; Treasurer, Norma Mortimer; Ministerial Trustee for three years, Clarence Mason; Lay Trustee for three years, John Lang.

Between balloting the following business was taken care of:

Pastor's Report—Harry Johnson of Beulah charge; Sylvia Lee, Burr and Valley.

Motion carried that when the Missionary Board is elected, one member is to be from the Wisconsin Conference W. Y. P. S.

Motion carried that Pearl Thrasher be given charge of holding children's meetings and that she draft anyone else she needs to help her.

Motion that a committee of three be elected to study the proposition of the Wisconsin Wesleyan—amended to include the financial part as well—to bring a report before the conference body.

Committee to study Wisconsin Wesleyan—Robert Matke; Loring Peterson; L. W. King.

Representative of Local Board of Managers of Miltonvale Wesleyan College until 1955 Conference—L. W. King.

Adjourned for committee work—adjourned by limitation of time.

Wednesday Afternoon Session—July 18, 1951 •

Devotional Period—Song "He Ransomed Me"—led by Rev. Tilman Hicks—Scripture Lesson found in II Kings 18:18 and Isa. 50:10 read by Rev. Hicks.

Roll Call showed 28 Ministers and 26 delegates present.

Minutes of last session read and approved as read.

Orders of the Day—2:30 p. m.—Connectional Address given by our Connectional President, the Rev. Roy S. Nicholson. His theme was the "Ideal Wesleyan Methodist Church"—Scripture text was I Thess. 1:7.

8. Whose members are loyal to their plighted faith and duty.
9. One who is willing to adjust to meet the needs of the masses.
10. Have some God-given convictions that will keep us from being stampeded by the enemy.
11. A Church that is unworldly and not a compromiser.
12. One that puts Christ in the center and judges everything else in relation to Him.

Motion carried that a Book Club committee consisting of Harold Johnson; I. J. Butcher; and Robert Mattke meet and bring a report before the Conference Body.

Motion carried that in the remitting of funds the various treasurers be instructed to remit in round figures only—that is, in even dollars.

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It is an honored privilege to report to you of the 81st Annual Conference. It is through the providence and mercies of God that we can come together for this gathering. Only God will know the true worth of any of our reports of labor. This year has proved to be one of adjustment and problems. Most have been very kind in helping get adjusted to the new work. As of August 1, 1950 we were left without a home with a new and a difficult task before us. In spite of such limited abilities, God has provided some advance. To Him be given the Glory. It is recognized that this human instrument has unknowingly been a hindrance and a retarding influence on occasions. As to the entirety of the Wisconsin Conference it seems to be in a position where it can and will make advances in the near future.

Activities

Following is, in part, a report of my activity during the past Conference year. As instructed by the Conference last year I endeavored to hold 2 quarterly meetings on each charge. Looking back I find that there could have been better scheduled arrangements.

I preached 160 times.

I held 7 revival meetings, 6 within the Conference. (All but one on new or weaker charges.

Without the Conference I held one revival at Waterloo, Iowa (2) Attended, with the Vice-President the Leaders' meeting in the same city, April 3-5; (3) Official conference with Dr. Roy S. (5) Attended as your delegate, the 28th Quadrennial session of the General Conference June 27-July 3rd.

I spoke at one Y.F.C. One tri-county ministerial association and one Fellowship gathering, attending two others.

In September I received and recognized Paul Heavilin as a suitable supply pastor for a rural work near Cornell called Eleanor.

On March 22nd, a very wintery and snowy Good Friday, I organized a very promising Church at Stevens Point, Wisconsin, with a membership of 29. Also on that day I assisted Rev. Charles Butcher in one of the most gracious and God-felt Baptismal services, when nearly twenty new members were baptized.

I appointed Rev. Royal Bailie pastor of the Milwaukee work, as of July 1, 1951.

I edited and published the WISCONSIN WESLEYAN with the very able assistance of Rev. and Mrs. Robert Mattke.
