## RELIGIOUS SERVICE

Tuesday night, July 18, 1968, Rev. Thomas Lee, District Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and Rev. Martin Cox, President of the California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, took part in a merging ceremony in which the California District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church and the California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America became the California District of The Wesleyan Church.

A communion service was celebrated, which was directed by Dr. George Failing.

The message of the evening was brought by Dr. J. D. Abbott, General Superintendent of The Wesleyan Church. He based his remarks on the message of the Apostle Paul to the elders of the Ephesian church as found in Acts 20:13-27. He called attention to Paul's attitude as expressed by the question of "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" Then he spoke of Paul's service as *humble service*, "serving the Lord with all humility of mind"; *tenderhearted service*, "with many tears and temptations"; *conscientious service*, "I kept back nothing"; *resigned service*, "I go bound in the spirit — but none of these things move me"; and *self-forgetful service*, "neither count I my life dear unto myself".

At the close of the service, Wilbur Smith, Charles E. Edwards and D. Dean Mills were ordained as elders in The Wesleyan Church.

# JOURNAL

## OF

### DAILY PROCEEDINGS

**OPENING:** The California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America met for its Forty-fourth Annual Session in the auditorium of the Turner Campus Center of Azusa Pacific College, Azusa, California on July 16, 1968 at 8:45 a.m.

**DEVOTIONS** were conducted by Dr. George E. Failing. He read Deut. 11:22-25 and spoke of the need to love the Lord, to drive out the nations, to start walking, to claim the whole land and not to be afraid as we build in the future.

**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order by the President, Rev. Martin W. Cox.

**THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE** read its report. It was corrected and adopted. See Report No. 1.

**ROLL CALL** slips were distributed and signed by 32 ministers and 40 lay delegates.

**HONORARY SEAT:** Mrs. George Failing was given an honorary seat within the bar.

**THE BAR** of Conference was designated as the first ten rows of seats of the center sections and the platform.

**THE AGENDA COMMITTEE** read its report. It was adopted. See Report No. 2.

**THE CONFERENCE PRESIDENT** read segments of his report. The report of his activities was accepted with thanks and appreciation. The Official Acts were approved by motion. A rising expression of appreciation was given the President. See Report No. 3.

**THE MINISTERIAL CHARACTER COMMITTEE** read its report. It was moved and seconded to accept the report. A motion carried that the names of Glenn D. Lauby and Robert D. Hughes be placed on the list. The report was adopted. See Report No. 4.

**HONORARY SEAT:** Mrs. Glenn Lauby was given an honorary seat within the bar.

**THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE** presented its report. A motion carried to receive the report of the Resolutions read by the Nominating Committee. Upon motion each of the four resolutions was approved. See Report No. 5.

**THE NOMINATIONS** for Sessions Committees were read. Upon motion the report was received. A motion carried to elect the committee en toto. See Report No. 5.

**THE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION** read a summary of its actions. It was approved. See Report No. 6.

**ITINERACY AND ELDER'S ORDERS:** The President appointed Wickard Steed, Harvey Ebert and Jay Baldwin as lay members of the Itineracy and Elder's Orders Committee.

**BOARD OF TRUSTEES:** The report of the Board of Trustees was read. A motion carried to accept the report and approve the actions of the Trustees. See Report No. 7.

**REPORTS:** The following reports were individually given and accepted:

**RECESS:** Upon motion the meeting recessed until 11:25.

CALL TO ORDER: After recess the meeting was called to order.

REPORTS: The following reports were given and accepted:

The recommendation made by the Trustees was adopted. See Report No. 19.

WESTERN EVANGELICAL SEMINARY TRUSTEES: By vote B. F. Wilson and Paul H. Whitmoyer were nominated as Trustees of Western Evangelical Seminary.

ITINERACY AND ELDER'S ORDERS: The report of the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders was read. It was accepted. See Report No. 20.

ELDER'S ORDERS: A motion carried to elect D. Dean Mills and Charles E. Edwards to Elder's Orders. See Report No. 20, Item 9.

HISTORIANS: The report of the Historians was read. It was accepted. See Report No. 21.

RECESS: A motion carried to recess until 1:30 p.m.

### SECOND SESSION, TUESDAY P.M.

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order.

ROLL CALL slips were distributed and signed by 27 ministers and 38 lay delegates.

THE CONFERENCE AUDITOR read his report. It was accepted. See Report No. 22.

THE CONFERENCE TREASURER read his report. A motion was made to adopt the report. It was carried by a rising vote of thanks for his services. See Report No. 23.

MERGER RESOLUTION: A motion was made and seconded to adopt the following resolution:

*"BE IT RESOLVED that the California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, a California corporation, be merged with the California District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of North America, a California corporation, to form the California District of The Wesleyan Church beginning July 17, 1968 at 9:00 a.m."*

The motion carried unanimously.

The following resolution was presented:

*"BE IT RESOLVED that the District Board of Administration of the merged district (The California District of The Wesleyan Church) be authorized to adopt a resolution to assume title to all properties now held in the name of the California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, Inc. Such resolution shall either establish a new California corporation or merge the existing corporations whichever is more acceptable on the advice of legal counsel."*

A motion carried to amend the resolution by adding "liabilities and assets" after "title to all properties."

The resolution, as amended, was adopted unanimously.

THE AUDITING COMMITTEE read a report. It was adopted. See Report No. 24.

THE TRUSTEES OF AZUSA PACIFIC COLLEGE gave their report. It was accepted. See Report No. 25.

RECOMMENDATION: A motion carried to recommend to the new merged district that the present relation with Azusa Pacific College be continued.



## DAILY PROCEEDINGS (Cont.)

**STATISTICAL REPORT:** A summary of the Statistical Report was read. A motion carried to adopt the Statistical Report. A rising vote of thanks was given to Galen Anderson. See Report No. 26.

**WESLEYAN YOUTH PRESIDENT:** The report of the Wesleyan Youth President was accepted.

The Wesleyan Youth President presented the following recommendation which was adopted: "We recommend to the California District of The Wesleyan Church that the District Wesleyan Youth President be a member of the California District Board of Administration of The Wesleyan Church, with voting power."

The following recommendation was also presented and adopted: "We recommend to the California District of The Wesleyan Church that the District Wesleyan Youth Convention be held at the same time and place as the District Conference of The Wesleyan Church in the District of California."

**THE MEMORIALS COMMITTEE** read its report. It was accepted. See Report No. 27.

**THE WOMAN'S MISSIONARY SOCIETY PRESIDENT** read her report. It was adopted. See Report No. 28.

**THE MERGING CONFERENCE DELEGATE COMMITTEE** read its report. A motion carried to adopt the report and to certify this as the roll of delegates to the Merging Conference. See Report No. 29.

**BOUNDARY CHANGE:** Robert Girard reported that the Scottsdale Church had voted 30 to 2 to permit their church to be included in the boundaries of the Arizona - New Mexico District of The Wesleyan Church.

Galen Anderson reported that the East Phoenix Church had voted 20 to 2 in favor of allowing their church to belong to the Arizona - New Mexico District.

A motion carried to approve a boundary change to allow these churches to be included in the Arizona - New Mexico District if the General Board approves and financial arrangements are worked out.

**APPRECIATION:** A motion carried to express to the Woman's Missionary Society appreciation for the work of Mrs. Arelene Eddy and the Missionary Society of the Arrow Highway Church for arranging last night's reception.

**AN ANNOUNCEMENT** was made of the availability of group insurance in the Blue Cross and also in a plan in effect in the Skyline Church.

**THE FINANCE COMMITTEE** read its report. A motion carried to adopt the report. See Report No. 30.

**THE PASTORAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE** read its report. It was adopted. See Report No. 31.

**APPRECIATION:** Edward Eddy spoke in appreciation of the work of Martin W. Cox as President.

A motion was made that the Secretary send a letter of appreciation to the Whittier Church for their willingness to share their pastor with the Conference. It passed by a rising vote of thanks to Rev. Cox and the Whittier Church.

**MINUTES:** A motion carried to refer the minutes to Charles Edwards, Robert Hempy and Donald Dorr for approval and report to the Board of Trustees.

**RECESSED** until 4:25 p.m.

**LAWNDALE:** October 10, 1967, approved remodeling plans for the church building and authorized the borrowing of \$10,000.00 from the Bank of America of Lawndale.

**LINCOLN OAKS:** May 28, 1968, gave approval of preliminary building plans for Sunday School rooms.

No school under church patronage and support shall be allowed to call in question, much less deny, the position of the church on any point of doctrine or church polity . . . we require, therefore, that no person be employed to teach in our schools who does not believe in and advocate the doctrine of entire sanctification as set forth in the articles of religion." Par. 383

Therefore, each minister and layman in our united church should be alerted to his personal responsibility. Utmost care should be exercised in the following areas:

1) to encourage schools to maintain a spiritual atmosphere in which to train students

2) to help guide our schools away from non-Wesleyan teachings

3) to insist on quality education in our schools

## STANDING RULES

1. The voting body of the W.M.S. Conference shall consist of the Conference Officers, local Presidents, delegates, Pastors' wives, the Conference President's wife, and Y.M.W.B. Superintendents.
2. The Nominating Committee shall consist of two Pastors' wives, two local Presidents, and two delegates, together with the Conference W.M.S. President who shall be chairman. The Pastors' wives shall be elected at the time of the election of officers. At the same time the W.M.S. Conference shall name the societies whose delegates and Presidents, elected to the next session of Conference, shall serve on this committee. The committee shall then make nominations for officers, Session and Standing Committees, to be presented to the Conference at the proper time. Delegates shall send their credentials to the Conference W.M.S. Secretary who shall compile the roll of delegates.
3. Each local W.M.S. shall send a copy of their Annual Statistical Report to the Conference Statistical Secretary no later than 10 days before the rise of Conference.
4. All officers and standing committees shall take office as soon as elected except the Statistical Secretary whose term of office shall be from the rise of the Conference in which she is elected until the rise of the following Conference.
5. All Conference Officers and Standing Committees shall submit their reports to the Conference Secretary immediately after their report is adopted; these reports to be printed in the Conference Annual Minutes.
6. The General W.M.S. Plan of Work and Standard of Efficiency be in the Minutes annually for reference and planning.
7. The Agenda Committee shall be the Executive Board.
8. The W.M.S. President shall be included on the mailing list of all Conference officers.
9. Each local society shall pay 50 cents per active member into the Conference Working Fund.
10. The following Officers shall receive annually:  
President: \$25.00  
Secretary: \$15.00  
Treasurer: \$25.00  
Y.M.W.B. Supt.: \$15.00  
The same to be paid from the Conference Working Fund.
11. The local society is to provide the expenses for President (or vice-president), delegate, Y.M.W.B. Superintendent, and Pastor's wife (even though she may be a Conference officer), to attend annual Conference.
12. The Conference will provide for the Conference officers' expense (excluding those provided for by their local society). The amount to be determined by the Executive Board.

We deem that it would be wise to have two officers representing Pilgrim youth and two officers representing Wesleyan youth on the Executive Council of the Wesleyan Youth in the District of California for the following year. We have four men that we would like to recommend to you for consideration for the top two officers in the Wesleyan Youth Executive Council. They are as follows: Larry Shelton, Raymond Wells, Al Harlow and Art Whaling. In addition to these recommendations, we would also, with your approval, suggest that Jack and Jimmy remain in an advisory capacity to the Executive Council for this one year.

## **STANDING RULES COMMITTEE REPORT**

### **SECTION I: Reports**

- a. May 31, shall mark the end of the fiscal year of the District. All reports are to be in the mail and postmarked no later than June 10.
- b. All reports to the District Youth Convention are to be prepared in triplicate; one copy to go to the general secretary of Wesleyan Youth, one copy to the District Youth Secretary, and one copy to be given to the local Wesleyan Youth Secretary.
- c. The minutes of the District Youth Convention shall be printed in the district Journal and Minutes of the Annual District Conference. The District Youth shall bear the cost of such printing on a per-page basis.

### **SECTION II: Voting**

- a. The quorum of the Convention shall be 2/3 of the registered delegates.
- b. A delegate must be present at the time of roll call at all conference sessions in order to be eligible to vote.
- c. The nominating committee shall consist of one pastoral representative, and one representative from each zone as elected by a quorum of the conference together with the District Youth President, who shall be chairman.

### SECTION III: *Executive Officers*

- a. If at all possible, no one person shall hold two offices of the District Wesleyan Youth.
- b. The official name "Wesleyan Youth" shall be used on all materials and in all oral communications.

### SECTION IV: *Finances*

- a. The District Wesleyan Youth Treasurer shall be an ex-officio member of the Finance and Plan of Work Committee.
- b. The financial records of the District Wesleyan Youth:
  - 1. shall be ready for auditing by an auditor and/or an efficient book-keeper before the annual district convention.
  - 2. shall be ready for auditing no later than June 10.
- c. The district Wesleyan Youth President shall receive the greater of:
  - 1. 10¢ per mile by car or the lowest commercial travel rate by air for travel expenses made in an official capacity.
  - 2. or, the honorarium while serving in that capacity.
- d. Each local Wesleyan Youth or church shall be urged to pay the expenses of its delegates to the youth convention.

### SECTION V: *Zones*

- a. Each newly elected chairman shall secure the name, address and phone number of each local church youth society officer, and zone officers for the President. This information must be submitted in writing, for informational purposes, within 60 days following the convention, (district)
- b. Each zone chairman shall send a written quarterly report to the district youth president.

### SECTION VI: *Collegian Senate*

- a. One college-age representative from each local church in the conference shall comprise the collegian senate. This senate is to meet and discuss the collegian program and recommend for election its own slate of officers, which will be composed of:
  - 1. a pastoral director
  - 2. a collegian senate chairman
  - 3. publicity chairman for each zone
  - 4. any other officers felt necessary which will be appointed from the collegian senate officers.This slate of officers shall be approved annually by the Wesleyan Youth conference organization.
- b. The collegian Senate Chairman shall be an ex-officio member of the Wesleyan Youth Executive Council.
- c. All single young people from High School graduation through age 24 shall compose the college-age group. At least one collegian from each local church in the California District shall be sent as a delegate to the Annual Wesleyan Youth Conference. This group shall be amenable to the District Wesleyan Youth Convention for all activities.
