The thirty-third session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America met in the Greenville Wesleyan Methodist Church, November 24th, at 7:30 P. M.

The opening sermon was preached by Rev. W. D. Correll, who used Ephesians 4:10, 11, 12 as a text.

Rev. J. A. Wood, Superintendent of the Orphanage at Macon, Ga.; Rev. R. H. Gleason, of Falconer, N. Y.; Rev. E. F. McCarty, Foreign Missionary Secretary; Rev. J. P. Byers and Rev. R. H. Chambers, of the Methodist Church; Rev. E. W. Black, pastor of the West Asheville Wesleyan Church, and Rev. S. W. Philipps, a pastor in the North Carolina Methodist Church, were introduced to the Conference. Each made fitting remarks. PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

In accordance with the Discipline, I do hereby submit my official report as President of the Thirty-Third Annual Session of the South Carolina Conference, ending November 30, 1925.

Dear Brethren:—We are still on probation and are passing through the fiery trials that are appointed to try our Church. The days of sifting are at hand. Many are being tried beyond their power of resistance, and are forgetting the great objective, the second coming of Jesus. Signs are pointing toward that blessed day. Anarchy, rebellion, unbelief, infidelity and criticism are flooding the world and testing the saints, but we are commanded to "lift up our heads, for our redemption draweth nigh." Let me exhort you to re-confirm your faith in God and His Word, for holiness is real, the promises are sure, and the world is demanding that we practice what we profess and what the Bible teaches—Holiness.

We regret the fact that we cannot see any more visible results for the year's work, but we rejoice because we have seen more than 200 souls pray through and make a profession of salvation and holiness. We further rejoice for the wonderful spirit of unity and Christian fellowship that we have had working with the pastors and their churches. Grace and glory have been sprinkled all along the way. We have had no difficulty with any one, but have tried to observe the Word as recorded in Micah 6:8, "What doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" We could not have done much more in work.

Rev. J. H. Ernest resigned the Tuckaseegee work the first of September, and Leila Hughes was appointed to take his work.

By authority from the President, Rev. A. F. Connor organized a class with five members at Clifton No. 2. This class was received by the President November 22, 1925.

Rev. A. L. Vess was transferred to the North Carolina Conference October 28, 1925.

Rev. C. W. Simmons was received from the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in July. He was appointed to be pastor of the Greenwood class October 7, 1925. This church had been without a pastor until I held a meeting in July. The pulpit was filled by the following brethren: Revs. R. C. Mullinax, R. C. Kendrick and L. Lance.

A schoolhouse has been purchased for the sum of \$1.00, with an acre of land, near Charleston by Miss Leila A. Hughes.

There was a joint session of the Finance Committee of the College and the Trustees of the Hephzibah Orphanage held in the College building the week following the session of last Conference. As a result of this meeting a committee was appointed to investigate the Orphanage and report to this session of the Conference. Revs. L. H. Kelley and R. C. Kendricks were appointed as elders and Mr. I. B. Brannon as layman.

Rev. G. E. Crenshaw resigned his work in September and Rev. J. R. Davis was appointed to fill out his year.

We recommend that this Conference seat Miss Ruth Keeler as delegate for Rev. I. O. Gray. He holds his local membership in the North Carolina Conference.

I further recommend that the schedule of business be the same as last year.

I have appointed the following Committees: On Sunday Schools, Rev. A. F. Connor; Courtesy, Rev. D. O. Powers; Post Office Addresses, Rev. J. R. Green.

Special Orders—Wednesday morning, following the Special Committee reports, that the time be given Rev. J. A. Wood to make his official report as Manager of the Hephzibah Home. November 26th, 10:30 A. M., be set apart for the Harvest Day program for Central College.

REPORT OF ORPHANAGE TRUSTEE.

We are glad to report that the Home has run this year and paid a debt of \$1,436.00 and is in better condition now than it was at the beginning.

We now owe \$2,500.00 on the purchase price. The loan has been made by the Georgia Casualty Co. for three years, ending June, 1928.

The Board of Managers has voted to present the Institution to the Connection on conditions. This was done at the last February Book Committee meeting. They have not yet reported.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE TRUSTEES.

We, the Trustees of the South Carolina Conference, met November 27th, and the following business was transacted:

Item 1. We, the Trustees, indorsed a note and mortgage, in 1924 at the Bank of Landrum, S. C., for a loan of one thousand dollars to be applied on the Wesleyan Church in Landrum, S. C.

Item 2. We recommend that Rev. F. H. Pressley be granted the privilege of removing the Wesleyan Church in Iva, S. C., from its present location to a lot given by the Jackson Mill Company.

ORPHANAGE COMMITTEE REPORT.

We, the Orphanage Committee, beg to submit the following report:

1. We visited the Orphanage at Macon and made a thorough investigation and found conditions favorable.

2. We do not recommend the sale or the changing of location of the Home for more than one reason. First, from a financial standpoint. The Home is located in the suburb of a progressive city where the price of real estate is advancing each year. Second, from a moral standpoint. The Home was established by the people of Macon, and they are still helping to support it. We are informed that at least one-half of the income of the Home comes from the people of Georgia and the surrounding states who are not members of our Church.

3. We indorse the present administration and could see signs of improvement in the last year.

4. We believe the Lord is pleased with us owning and operating this Home, and that it can be run in connection with our other institutions.

RESOLUTIONS.

Resolutions Adopted in 1898.

Resolved, 1st. That as a body in Conference assembled, we will not allow our pulpits or churches to be used by those who do not give evidence of being sound in the doctrines of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and true to our polity.

2nd. That as ministers and laymen we will use our best endeavors to prevent the promulgation of doctrines or usages not in accord with the Wesleyan Methodist faith.

Resolutions Adopted in 1905.

Resolved, 1st. That the law with regard to complaints or violations of orders and resolutions found on page 37 of our Discipline, and beginning with the words, "When the President," shall apply to all cases of the violators of our Discipline, and no charges shall be entertained by the Judiciary Committee without said previous investigation and labor.

2nd. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

Resolutions Adopted in 1907.

Resolved, 1st. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society.

2nd. That we believe that the preaching of Holiness that does not include a clear and distinct opposition to all secret societies is seriously lacking in the essential elements and must be more or less displeasing to God.

3rd. That we believe that the right type of Holiness preaching and teaching is the most effective means by which to induce men to separate themselves from all lodge entanglements; therefore, we will do our best to double our diligence in this line of effort.

4th. That we affectionately admonish our people to avoid all compromise with secrecy. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday Schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies; further-

more, those belonging to secret orders shall not be allowed to hold services in our churches.

5th. That we seriously urge upon all our brethren and sisters that they may be careful to maintain a consistent, but radical, attitude of opposition to all organizations, secret or open, which are opposed to Jesus Christ and His doctrine and principles of righteousness.

Resolutions Adopted in 1914.

Resolved, 1st. That all of our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work be required to preach at least once a month, or twelve times during the Conference year.

2nd. That in addition to the above resolution, we earnestly request all preachers not receiving a regular appointment by the Conference, except those attending school preparatory to the ministry, to hold, if possible, a two weeks' revival during the year.

3rd. That all preachers unemployed by the Conference during the coming year be urged to select a fellow-laborer with whom they can work harmoniously, and go out and try to build up new works as they may have opportunity, and revive the desert places.

4th. That in order that the foregoing resolutions may have the greatest effect possible, and that each preacher may have a higher estimation of the dignity of his calling, and that the burden for souls may be increased, and that they may feel the sympathy of the Church to which they belong, we urge each charge to pass like resolutions.

5th. That it is not only the duty, but binding on each Circuit preacher of our Conference, to receive whomsoever the Conference may designate as Quarterly Meeting Evangelist, and give him their hearty support and co-operation.

Resolution Adopted in 1919.

Be it Resolved, That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.

Resolutions Adopted in 1921.

Regarding the Orphanage.

Resolved, 1st. That we as a Conference continue W. D. Correll as Committeeman until next Annual Conference; also to act as Manager of the institution from this Conference.

2nd. That we meet the balance of \$7,000.00 on the purchase price of the property. We suggest that \$1.00 per member be asked for throughout the Conference, for 1924.

3rd. That a Committee of two be elected to associate with W. D. Correll as Committeeman.

4th. That this Committee appoint such financial agents or agent as necessary to carry on this work throughout the Conference, and that said agents be secured on such terms as can be agreed thereon by Committee and agents.

5th. That a special effort be made between now and the first of January by the pastors and Financial Agents to collect the amount subscribed during this Conference, and to add to it if possible, thereby saving interest and deferred payments.

6th. That the Conference Treasurer handle all cash and receipts on both the up-keep and the purchased price of the Orphanage; and that the produce be sent directly to Miss Bettie Tyler.

Resolution Adopted in 1922.

Regarding Tithing.

Resolved, That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.

Resolution Adopted in 1923.

Resolved, 1st. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.

2nd. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided this shall not interfere with previous arrangements between pastor and charge.
